Chairman Floyd Johnson called the meeting to Order at 5:30PM, and presented the Agenda.

ACTION:

Member Grimes moved to approve the Agenda as presented.

Seconded and approved unanimously 5-0.

Chairman Johnson recognized County Attorney Rick Moorfield to present, and explain to the board, the process concerning the Protest Petition signed and delivered by Chief Justice Cheri Beasley.

County Attorney Moorfield explained that this Preliminary Hearing on a Protest Petition is being heard as soon as possible after it was received to determine whether the petition complies with the requirements of NCGS 163-182.9, as it relates to the grounds of protest contained in the petition.

- 1. A defect in the manner by which votes were counted or results tabulated, and
- 2. A violation of election law, official misconduct, or irregularities.

The board must also determine whether the protest was timely brought, and if so, whether the information in the protest is sufficient to establish probable cause to proceed to a full hearing.

Attorney Moorfield proceeded to breakdown the items in the Protest Petition, and identify items that mention data from Cumberland County.
