Agenda item 2. Data and Progress Updates

Louis Leake:

Cumberland County

-60 Opioid overdose emergency department visits for 2023 YTD

-Traditionally, numbers rise during the summer months

-782 NC ED visits for opioid overdose: March 2023 in comparison to 754 March 2022.

- The number of individuals that were being treated were uninsured/self-paid.

-1506 NC ED visits for overdose involving medications or drugs with dependency potential: March 2023

-959 NC EMS encounters suspected opioid overdose: March 2023 compared to 1,029 in March. 2022.

NC-Harm Reduction:

-Approximately 1800 outreach contacts during the first quarter of 2023

-Just over 2,000 doses of Narcan's distributed during the first quarter of 2023

-Increase in reports of peer-to-peer overdose reversals

-A slight trend down this year for overdose calls compared to last year

-Seeing less EMS responses because of apparent peer-to-peer overdose reversals

Charlton Roberson/ Greg Berry:

-Sunrise is totally peer run; 4-5 peer support specialist on duty at a time

-There are no community partners present at Sunrise providing services

-The CFORT center will have community partners onsite to directly link people to services

-They (Sunrise) have a full-time person going out in the community identifying funding sources and donations from the community

-The Sunrise center is well staffed

-They (Sunrise) have significant support from community partners outside of their center
