

North Carolina County Alert System


- 818 cases last 7 days
- 1,425 cases last 14 days
- 330 deaths total
- 15% case positivity
- Increasing hospitalizations





Vaccination Data


- CDC Data Tracker
 - 55.1% of population age 12 and older fully vaccinated
 - 58.3% of adult (18+) population fully vaccinated
 - 82.5% of population 65+ fully vaccinated

Delta Variant Updates

- Delta spreads more than twice as easily from one person to another, compared with earlier strains.
- Delta has most recently surged to become the predominant variant from <1% in May to over 80% of cases in July.
- People infected with Delta have higher viral loads—meaning more virus in their body—than with previous variants.



Delta Variant Updates

- Some vaccinated people can get Delta in a breakthrough infection and may be contagious.
 - In North Carolina, 94% of new cases and deaths are among the unvaccinated
- Even so, vaccinated individuals represent a very small amount of transmission occurring around the country.
- Virtually all hospitalizations and deaths continue to be among the unvaccinated
- In NC, the Delta Variant has been the most commonly circulating variant since the week ending June 26, 2021.
 - No County level data



CDC and NC DHHS Guidance Updates

- In areas with substantial and high transmission, CDC recommends that everyone (including fully vaccinated individuals) should wear a mask in public indoor settings
 - Includes Cumberland County
- Universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status.
- Fully vaccinated:
 - Get tested if you have any symptoms of COVID-19.
 - After an exposure to COVID-19, get tested 3-5 days after exposure and wear a mask around others until you get a negative test result.

- Distribution of at home COVID test kits
- Vaccination locations
 - Health Department, Monday-Friday
 - 5 rotating library locations on Saturdays
- Back to school immunizations/COVID vaccine clinic

 - Healthier Together
 - College and university students
 - Fayetteville Millennial Council
