Community Outreach:



The library staffed an outreach table at the *Boomers & Seniors Expo* held at the Crown Expo Center. The free event was sponsored by the Fayetteville Observer. The library petitioned its survey for the Long Range Plan throughout the day.

Headquarters Library

Success Stories:

- ★ A staff member from the City of Fayetteville Development Services needed a historic pamphlet that mentioned a 1814 city ordinance and asked Local & State History Librarian I Gaby Kienitz for assistance. The library did not have the pamphlet but Kienitz was able to work with some academic archive departments and got a copy of the pamphlet to the customer later that day. The next day, Dr. Gerald Newton, Director of Development Services stopped by the library to personally thank Kienitz for getting a copy of the pamphlet to him so quickly.
- ★ Local & State History (L&SH) Library Associate Sana Moulder helped a customer from Linden find information about the rail service that used to be a part of the town. Working with L&SH department resources, along with the database for Historic NC Newspapers, Moulder was able to find announcements and advertisements relating to rail service in Linden in the early part of the 20th Century. The customer was very pleased to have this information to use in her newsletter article.
- ★ When Library Associate Wendy Olsen introduced the library's new *Freegal* resource to a customer who regularly checks out CD's, the customer said, "This is like Apple iTunes, except I do not have to buy the music! It is all free in my own account and is simple and friendly. Thank you for taking the time to tell me about this."
