

## <u>HIGHLIGHTS</u>

November's Book-A-Librarian sessions included staff assisting 35 customers with computer skills, job searching and completing employment applications to several local businesses including Walmart, Cumberland County Government, D&D Trucking, Harris Teeter, Smithfield and Uber. An additional 31 library customers attended job and career and small business programs where they were introduced to *NCWorks* and learned computer skills, job searching, marketing a small business, and career development.

A customer approached IS Librarian I Matt Kleven to tell him she had gotten a job interview after he helped her with her resume. She said if it weren't for Kleven's help she never would have gotten the interview. She was excited about how well it went and she was waiting to hear from the company.

Bordeaux Branch Manager Mary DiRisio assisted a man who said he was looking for a job with a trucking firm. She showed him how to search online and then walked him through the application process. He came back every day for a week to use the computer to apply for trucking jobs. Several weeks later he returned to tell DiRisio that he had recently started driving a truck for a trucking firm and that it was the best job he'd ever had! He was very grateful that the public library has computers and friendly staff available to help customers.
