Sept. 2016 Workforce Development Activities at the Cumberland County Public Library

<u>Highlights</u>

At the annual Library Job Fair, 40 local organizations recruited candidates from a pool of 517 job seekers. In conjunction with the job fair, 133 job seekers took the opportunity to have their resumes reviewed, improve interview skills, complete online job applications and learn job searching skills using *NCWorks*.

September's Book-a-Librarian sessions included staff assisting 35 customers with resume help and registering for *NCWorks*. An additional 35 people received help with online employment applications to area businesses including Walmart, Cumberland County Government, Burger King, Sears, Harris Teeter, Kelly Temp Services, Department of Motor Vehicles, Toys R Us, Macy's, Delta, Miller Motte College, IHOP, PWC, Roses and Dollar General.
