<u>HIGHLIGHTS</u>

August's Book-A-Librarian sessions included staff assisting 75 customers with job applications, resumes and cover letters to businesses such as Butterball Foods, Cape Fear Staffing, Cumberland County, Fayetteville State University, Lowes Home Improvement, Publix, Smithfield Foods, Taco Bell, U.S. Postal Service, VA Hosptial and Walmart. Staff provided guidance for employment in the fields of certified nursing assistant, culinary arts, federal government contracting, flight attendant, and the oil & gas production industry. Staff taught job seekers how to register for *NCWorks* and how to search for jobs through the library's Job & Career Center. Small business owners learned how to: find resources to create a marketing plan, find small business grants, create mailing lists, and use social media and e-commerce sites specializing in hand-crafted items.

Customer Comments/Success Stories:

Librarian I/FTCC Liaison Theresa Wagner helped a customer with instruction on using computers and tips for her resume and English skills. A native speaker of Korean, the customer desired to improve her language skills to find a part-time job.

Library Associate Dee Turner helped a customer fax his resume to Cape Fear Valley Hospital. A few weeks later, he returned to the library wearing hospital scrubs and told Turner that he had recently been hired at the hospital thanks to her assistance.

IS Librarian I Robin Deffendall helped a customer create a marketing plan for her employer. Deffendall helped the customer find statistical information, taught her advanced searching techniques and suggested useful trade associations. The customer was thrilled with the new access to the ressources.

NCWorks News:

East Regional library hosted the program **Veteran Employment Assistance**. *NCWorks* staff presented a class that focused on helping veterans who struggle with barriers to employment.



Cliffdale Regional library and West Regional library hosted the program **Crowdfunding Do's and Dont's**.
