



# Cumberland County Workforce Development Center Workforce Investment Act Programs A Summary of Services

The Workforce Investment Act is the nation's principal workforce development legislation, providing federal funds to states and local areas to address the employment and training needs of adults, dislocated workers and youth. The Act creates a comprehensive workforce investment system. In North Carolina this system is the JobLink Career Center system. It is intended to be customer-focused, to help individuals access the tools they need to manage their career through information and high quality services. The JobLink Career Center system also helps businesses find skilled workers.

#### Adult Services

Adult services includes a wide range of employment and training services from very basic job getting and job keeping skills, to help with improving basic education skills, to occupational skills training. Job search and job placement assistance services are also available to adults. Other services may include on-the-job training, skill upgrading, adult education and literacy activities.

#### Dislocated Worker Services

Dislocated workers are individuals who have been terminated or laid off, or have received notice of termination or layoff. In instances of permanent closure or layoff, the Workforce Development Center sends a rapid response team to meet with affected employees. Often dislocated workers are eligible for unemployment insurance while they receive assistance from the Workforce Investment Act. Dislocated services include all of the services mentioned above in adult services.

#### **Youth Services**

The Workforce Investment Act provides services to eligible low-income youth ages 14-21. They must also meet one additional barrier to employment, i.e., basic skills deficient, school dropout, homeless, foster child, pregnant or offender. We prepare our young customers for postsecondary educational opportunities or employment. Services are designed to link academic and occupational learning. They may include the following:

- ♦ Tutoring
- ♦ Alternative secondary school services
- Summer employment opportunities
- Paid and unpaid work experience
- Occupational skills training
- Leadership development activities
- Adult mentoring and supportive services

#### BACKGROUND

In 1991, the North Carolina General Assembly passed Senate Bill 165, Chapter 241, which requires the Division of Aging to administer a Home and Community Block Grant for Older Adults. In order to implement the 1991 legislation, each county designated a lea d agency to work with appointed members on a planning committee to make funding recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners. The Commissioners designated Mid-Carolina Area Agency on Aging as the lead agency for planning and coordination of the County's Funding Plan for Older Adult Services. Attached is the Agreement for the Provision of County-Based Aging Services between the County of Cumberland and the Mid-Carolina Area Agency on Aging.

The Funding Plan is a means to provide coordination through community-based resources in the delivery of comprehensive aging services to older adults and their families. Contracts for FY06 are included in the Funding Plan. The total Block Grant for FY06 is \$1,235,846, with a local match in the amount of \$137,316 (County) and \$410 (Other).

#### RECOMMENDATION

Ms. Carolyn Tracy, Aging Administrator – Area Agency on Aging, and the Home and Community Block Grant Committee, recommends that the FY07 Funding Plan for the Home and Community Block Grant for Older Adults be approved.

#### PROPOSED ACTION

Approve the FY07 Home and Community Block Grant for Older Adults Agreement, and the 2006-2007 County Funding Plan.

#### Home and Community Care Block Grant for Older Adults

#### Agreement for the Provision of County-Based Aging Services

This Agreement, entered into as of this I" day of July, 2006, by and between the County of Cumberland (hereinafter referred to as the "County") and the Mid-Carolina Area Agency on Aging, (hereinafter referred to as the "Area Agency").

#### Witnesseth That:

WHEREAS, the Area Agency and the County agree to the terms and conditions for provision of aging services in connection with activities financed in part by Older Americans Act grant funds, provided to the Area Agency from the United States Department of Health and Human Services through the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services (DAAS) and state appropriations made available to the Area Agency through the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services, as set forth in a) this document, b) the County Funding Plan, as reviewed by the Area Agency and the Division of Aging and Adult Services, c) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, d) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Service Standards Manual, Volumes I through IV, and, e) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Community Service Providers Monitoring Guidelines.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises, and mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. As provided in the Area Plan, the facility(ies) designated in the County to encourage maximum collocation and coordination of services for older persons is (are) as follows:
  - Cumberland County Coordinating Council on Older Adults, Inc.
- 1.(a) The Community Service Provider(s), shall be those specified in the County Funding Plan on the <u>Provider Services Summary</u> format(s) (DOA-732) for the period ending June 30, 2007.

- 2. <u>Availability of Funds</u>. The terms set forth in this Agreement for payment are contingent upon the receipt of Home and Community Care Block Grant funding by the Area Agency.
- 3. <u>Grant Administration</u>. The grant administrator for the Area Agency shall be Carolyn Tracy, Aging Administrator. The grant administrator for the County shall be the County Manager.

It is understood and agreed that the grant administrator for the County shall represent the County in the performance of this Agreement. The County shall notify the Area Agency in writing if the administrator changes during the grant period. Specific responsibilities of the grant administrator for the County are provided in paragraph seven (7) of this Agreement.

- 4. Services authorized through the County Funding Plan, as specified on the <u>Provider Services Summary</u> format(s) (DOA-732) are to commence no later than July 1, 2006 and shall be undertaken and pursued in such sequence as to assure their expeditious completion. All services required hereunder shall be completed on or before the end of the Agreement period, June 30, 2007.
- Assignability and Contracting. The County shall not assign all or any portion of its interest in this Agreement. Any purchase of services with Home and Community Care Block Grant for Older Adults funding shall be carried out in accordance with the procurement and contracting policy of the community services provider or, where applicable, the Area Agency, which does not conflict with procurement and contracting requirements contained in 45 CFR 92.36. Federal funds shall not be awarded to any subrecipients who have been suspended or debarred by the Federal government. In addition, Federal funds may not be used to purchase goods or services costing over \$100,000 from a vendor that has been suspended or debarred from Federal grant programs. The County designates the Area Agency to procure services of the Home and Community Care Block Grant which are provided by Private For Profit Agencies.
- 6. <u>Compensation and Payments to the County</u>. The County shall be compensated for the work and services actually performed under this Agreement by payments to be made monthly by the Area Agency. Total reimbursement to the community service providers under this Agreement may not exceed the grand total of Block Grant funding, as specified on the <u>Provider Services Summary</u> format (DOA-732).

#### (a) Interim Payments to the County

Upon receipt of a written request from the County, the Division of Aging and Adult Services, through the Area Agency, will provide the County Finance Officer with an interim payment equivalent to seventy percent (70%) of one-twelfth (1/12) of the County's Home and Community Care Block Grant allocation by the 22nd of each month.

#### (b) Reimbursement of Service Costs

Reimbursement of service costs are carried out as provided in Section 3 of the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

#### c) Role of the Area Agency

The Area Agency shall be responsible for disbursing Home and Community Care Block Grant Funding to Community Service Providers in accordance with procedures specified in the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

- (d) The Area Agency will invoice County for all required match and any overmatch budgeted. This match will be disbursed to the proper agencies by the Area Agency.
- (e) Payment of Administration on Aging Nutrition Services Incentive Program (NSIP)
  Subsidy

NSIP subsidy for congregate and home delivered meals will be disbursed by the Division of Aging through the Area Agency to the County on a monthly basis, subject to the availability of funds as specified in Section 3 of the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Services Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

If through the US Department of Agriculture Area Agency on Aging Elections Project, the County elects to receive a portion of its USDA entitlement in the form of surplus commodity foods in lieu of cash, the Area Agency will notify the County in writing of its community valuation upon notification from the Division of Aging and Adult Services. The delivery of commodity and bonus foods is

subject to availability. The County will not receive cash entitlement in lieu of commodities that are unavailable or undelivered during the Agreement period.

7. Reallocation of Funds and Budget Revisions. Any reallocation of Block Grant funding between counties shall be voluntary on the part of the County and shall be effective only for the period of the Agreement. The reallocation of Block Grant funds between counties will not affect the allocation of future funding to the County. If during the performance period of the Agreement, the Area Agency determines that a portion of the Block Grant will not be expended, the grant administrator for the County shall be notified in writing by the Area Agency and given the opportunity to make funds available for reallocation to other counties in the Planning and Service Area or elsewhere in the state.

The Area Agency may authorize community service providers to implement budget revisions which do not cause the County to fall below minimum budgeting requirements for access, in-home, congregate, and home delivered meals services, as specified in Division of Aging and Adult Services budget instructions issued to the County. If a budget revision will cause the County to fall below minimum budgeting requirements for any of the aforementioned services, as specified in Division of Aging and Adult Services budgeting instructions issued to the County, approval for the revision from the Area Agency prior to implementation by the community service provider is required, so as to assure that regional minimum budgeting requirements for the aforementioned services will be met.

In the event the Service Provider's rate of progress on the contract is leading to underspending at the end of the contract period the Area Agency may reallocate Home and Community Care Block Grant funds within the county as necessary to most effectively utilize funds.

Unless community services providers have been given the capacity to enter data into the Aging Resources Management System (ARMS), Area Agencies on Aging are responsible for entering amended service data into the Division of Aging Management Information System, as specified in the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

8. Monitoring. This Agreement will be monitored to assure that services are being provided in compliance with the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Service Standards Manual, dated July 1, 1992, and the N.C. Division of Aging Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997. Further, compliance with updated monitoring requirements, as specified in Office

of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-l33 and NC General Statute 143-6.2 shall be carried out. Monitoring shall also include compliance with conflict of interest requirements. Monitoring requirements are discussed in Section 308 of the AAA Policies and Procedures Manual (7/1/03). Private non-profit service providers will be monitored to ensure compliance with conflict of interest policies, as stated in DoA Administrative Letter No. 03-14.

The monitoring of services provided under this Agreement shall be carried out by the Area Agency on Aging in accordance with its Assessment Plan and/or by the DAAS Program Compliance Representative (PCR). Local Departments of Social Services providing Adult Day Care, Adult Day Health Care, Housing and Home Improvement, and/or In-Home Aide (all levels) through the Home and Community Care Block Grant will receiving monitoring by the State PCR. All other services and grantees are monitored by the Area Agency on Aging serving the counties' PSA.

Counties and community service providers will receive a written report of monitoring findings in accordance with procedures established in Section 308 of the AAA Policies and Procedures Manual (7/1/03) and DOA Administrative Letter No. 98-13. Any areas of non-compliance will be addressed in a written corrective action plan with the community service provider.

9. <u>Disputes and Appeals</u>. Any dispute concerning a question of fact arising under this Agreement shall be identified to the designated grants administrator for the Area Agency. In accordance with Lead Regional Organization (LRO) policy, a written decision shall be promptly furnished to the designated grants administrator for the County.

The decision of the LRO is final unless within twenty (20) days of receipt of such decision the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners furnishes a written request for appeal to the Director of the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services, with a copy sent to the Area Agency. The request for appeal shall state the exact nature of the complaint. The Division of Aging and Adult Services will inform the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of its appeal procedures and will inform the Area Agency that an appeal has been filed. Procedures thereafter will be determined by the appeals process of the Division of Aging and Adult Services. The state agency address is as follows:

- 10. Termination for Cause. If through any cause, the County shall fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this Agreement, or the County has or shall violate any of the covenants, agreements, representations or stipulations of this Agreement, the Area Agency shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners written notice of such termination no fewer than fifteen (15) days prior to the effective date of termination. In such event, all finished documents and other materials collected or produced under this Agreement shall at the option of the Area Agency, become its property. The County shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any work satisfactorily performed under this Agreement.
- II. Audit. The County agrees to have an annual independent audit in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes, North Carolina Local Government Commission requirements, Division of Aging and Adult Services Program Audit Guide for Aging Services and Federal Office of Budget and Management (OMB) Circular A-133.

Community service providers must provide a copy of their year end financial statements, and any required audit, to the Area Agency on Aging. Community service providers, as specified in paragraph one (I) are subject to audit and fiscal reporting requirements as stated in NC General Statute 143-6.2 and OMB Circular a-133, where applicable. Home and Community Care Block Grant providers are not required to submit Activities and Accomplishments Reports. For-profit corporations are not subject to the requirements of OMB Circular A-133, but are subject to NC General Statute 143-6.2 and Yellow Book audit requirements, where applicable. Federal funds may not be used to pay for a Single or Yellow Book audit if the provider receives less than \$500,000 in state funds. The Department of Health and Human Services will provide confirmation of federal and state expenditures at the close of the state fiscal year. 12. Audit/Assessment Resolutions and Disallowed Cost. It is further understood that the community service providers are responsible to the Area Agency for clarifying any audit exceptions that may arise from any Area Agency assessment, county or community service provider single or financial audit, or audits conducted by the State or Federal Governments. In the event that the Area Agency or the Department of Health and Human Services disallows any expenditure made by the community service provider for any reason, the County shall promptly repay such funds to the Area Agency once any final appeal is exhausted in accordance with paragraph nine (9). The only exceptions are if the Area Agency on Aging is designated as a community service provider through the County Funding Plan or, if as a part of a procurement process, the Area Agency on Aging enters into a contractual agreement for service provision with a provider which is in addition to the required County Funding Plan formats. In these exceptions, the Area Agency is responsible for any disallowed costs. The County or Area Agency on Aging

All information which is existing, readily available to the Area Agency without cost and reasonably necessary, as determined by the Area Agency's staff, for the performance of this Agreement by the County shall be furnished to the County and community service providers without charge by the Area Agency. The Area Agency, its agents and employees, shall fully cooperate, with the County in the performance of the County's duties under this Agreement.
- Rights in Documents, Materials and Data Produced. The County and community service providers agree that at the discretion of the Area Agency, all reports and other data prepared by or for it under the terms of this Agreement shall be delivered to, become and remain, the property of the Area Agency upon termination or completion of the work. Both the Area Agency and the County shall have the right to use same without restriction or limitation and without compensation to the other. For the purposes of this Agreement, "data" includes writings, sound recordings, or other graphic representations, and works of similar nature. No reports or other documents produced in whole or in part under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright by or on behalf of the County.
- 17. <u>Interest of the Board of Commissioners</u>. The Board of Commissioners covenants that neither the Board of Commissioners nor its agents or employees presently has an interest, nor shall acquire an interest, direct or indirect, which conflicts in any manner or degree with the performance of its service hereunder, or which would prevent, or tend to prevent, the satisfactory performance of the service hereunder in an impartial and unbiased manner.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Bids were received on April 6, 2006, for Phase I - Courthouse Lobby Addition & Plaza Renovation Project, however, an insufficient number of bids were submitted. The project was re-advertised and bids were again taken on April 20, 2006. Attached is a copy of the certified bid tabulation and letter of recommendation from the architect. Bids were received for the base contract work which includes construction of the new lobby addition, demolition and replacement of the stairs and landings at the main entrances to the Courthouse and LEC, new ADA ramps and handrails, and new waterproofing at the tunnel between the buildings. Alternate bids were taken for brass handrails in lieu of aluminum handrails (Alternate G-1) and painting all exterior concrete stairs (Alternate G-2). The low base bid was submitted by Grahams Construction in the amount of \$797,980 which is approximately \$150,000 more than the engineer's estimate of construction costs for this phase of the project. The total construction budget for the project is \$2.2 million. Phase II - Plaza Renovations & Security Enhancements and Phase III - Parking Lot Improvements are to be undertaken after completion of Phase I work. In an attempt to reduce the cost of this work, the project architect submitted a list of scope reduction items to the contractor for pricing. The credit offered by Grahams Construction of \$53,000 was not acceptable to the architect.

In view of the current construction market and the competitive price from Grahams Construction relative to the other bidders, the recommendation of the project architect and County Engineer is to accept the bid from Grahams Construction for the Base Bid and Alternate G-2 in the amount of \$800,980. Currently there are sufficient monies in the project budget to fund this phase of the work, however, when the subsequent phases of the project are bid, there may be a need to increase the project budget or look for opportunities to reduce costs.

The County Facilities Committee was given an update on the project at its May 9, 2006, meeting. No action was requested from the committee at that time because the architect had not yet concluded his negotiations with the contractor.

#### RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

The recommendation of the County Engineer, Gordon Johnson Architecture, and management is to:

- 1. Accept the bids for Phase I Courthouse Lobby Addition & Plaza Renovation Project.
- 2. Award a contract to Grahams Construction, in the amount of \$800,980 which includes the Base Bid and Alternate G-2.
- 3. Approve the associated budget revision.

The proposed action by the Board is to follow the staff recommendation.

Please find attached a certified bid tab and original copies of all bids presented on April 20, 2006, for the above referenced project. The low bidder is Grahams Construction of Delco, NC with a base bid of \$797,980. This low bid amount is currently over our last estimate of \$650,000. We attempted to negotiate a lower total project cost with the two low bidders but could not achieve reasonable values for the reductions in the scope. We believe an attempt to re-bid the project with a reduced scope would not net any better results at this time, therefore; we recommend you award the project to Grahams Construction for the stated bid amount. We also recommend you accept alternate G2 for \$3,000 to paint all of the exterior concrete railings to match the building walls. The total construction contract value if all of the above is accepted would be \$800,980.


**BACKGROUND:** On or about December 8, 2005, the County acquired by tax foreclosure the above property. The amount currently owed on the foreclosure judgment including interest and costs is \$6,692.93.

Costa Builders, LLC, through its agent Christina Hill of Keller Williams Realty has offered to purchase the County's interest in the property for \$6,692.93 and has deposited \$669.30 in the Finance Office. The tax value of the property is \$5,000.00.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Board of Education has requested the Board of Commissioners' approval of the attached Resolution.

Also attached is a copy of an e-mail received May 26, 2006 from Rebecca Troutman, NCACC Research Director, regarding the subject of using Lottery Funds for School Construction. Ms. Troutman makes three key points about the use of lottery funds:

- There is discussion regarding a statewide school bond to be repaid with lottery proceeds earmarked for county school construction needs. Two bills (H2830 and S2031) have recently been filed in the General Assembly which call for the state to use the County portion of the lottery proceeds to issue \$2.1 Billion in limited obligation bonds.
- 2) The short track record (two months) of the lottery funds may limit a County's marketability of debt to be paid from its share of the lottery proceeds.
- 3) Counties should, as with all new revenue sources, tread lightly in relying on lottery revenues.

The Board may wish to consider the Board of Education's request to issue COPs in the broader context of other alternatives being discussed at the state level for school construction needs.

If there is concern about approving COPs as a result of these uncertainties or others, perhaps an option for the Board to consider is to refer this matter to its Finance Committee for further clarification of the alternatives and to review with our Cumberland County Legislative delegation the prospects for a state-wide approach to school construction needs.

**Subject:** Lottery Funds for School Construction

Dear Managers and Finance Officers,

We continue to get questions about whether counties should budget lottery monies directed for school construction in their 2006-07 budgets. We want to revisit our advice set forth in the April budget forecast and bring you up to date on any statewide conversations on the use of lottery school construction proceeds.

After numerous discussions with Executive and Legislative fiscal staff, we have concluded that the General Assembly intended the lottery proceeds dedicated to school construction to be treated in a similar fashion to the corporate income tax funds that now go to Public School Building Capital Fund (ADM Fund). For the most part, the same forms, definitions, and processes apply. However, there are three major exceptions to the similarities: the General Assembly must appropriate the estimated lottery receipts annually to the ADM Fund, which we assume will be in conjunction with the adoption of the state budget; lottery funds require no county match; and lottery funds cannot be used for technology.

Some counties appropriate ADM funds in their annual budget ordinances, some amend their budgets upon receipt of the funds, still others use a project ordinance. You may wish to budget lottery funds by the same method that you budget your ADM funds. Regardless of how you account for these funds, they are to be accessed just like those in the ADM Fund-- by submitting a specific project request through the ADM Fund process. This applies to lottery and ADM funds used for debt service as well. Remember that lottery funds may be used for debt incurred on or after January 1, 2003. For your information, \$1.8 billion in county school bonds have been approved since 2003, with \$800 million approved solely in 2003.

There has been much discussion regarding a statewide school bond to be repaid with lottery proceeds earmarked for county school construction needs. On the deadline for bills to be filed, two identical measures – one in the House and one in the Senate – were submitted in the General Assembly. <u>H2830</u> (Yongue, Goforth, Sherrill and Carney) and <u>S2031</u> (Rand) call for the state to use the county portion of the lottery proceeds to issue \$2.1 billion in limited obligation bonds. The monies would be distributed to counties through an as yet undetermined grant process.

We have informed state leaders that many counties have already committed their projected 2006-07 lottery proceeds to their ever-growing school capital needs, and others are considering issuing new bonds to be paid for with their share of the lottery proceeds. Conversations with the State Treasurer's Office indicate that the short track record of these funds may also limit the bond marketability.

We have also pointed out that counties face, and face up to, an ever-growing need for county school operating dollars. Our budget and tax surveys indicate that counties have increased appropriations for school current expenses by 33 percent in just five years, with another 22 percent increase in school capital appropriations. While

the \$170 million in lottery proceeds is very much appreciated and needed, counties continue to appropriate more and more county tax dollars to improve what happens in the classroom--both operating and capital. It is important to communicate and demonstrate your county's past and future commitment to school improvements as you budget your lottery proceeds to specific projects. While state leaders may bandy back and forth charges of supplanting, all counties can and should show how important county funds are in supplementing state appropriations to schools.

So, what should be budgeted? As we discussed at the spring NCACC regional meetings, lottery revenues have a two-month track record to date, and as with all new revenue sources, counties should tread lightly in relying on these dollars. There have been a number of proposed bills to alter the allocation formula--while the 65 percent pool should be a reliable estimate, the 35 percent pool may be revisited. And, please remember, school construction lottery proceeds have yet to be appropriated to the ADM Fund.

OPERATIONS AREA CONSERVATION AND PROTECTION

AGREEMENT WITH MCCORMICK FARMS LIMITED PARTNERSHIP

As a response to the Fort Bragg Regional Land Use Advisory Commission's report regarding the one mile buffer area around Fort Bragg and Pope Air Force Base the Board of Commissioners adopted a policy suggested by Commissioner Henley to offer owners of critical and important tracts of five acres or more incentives not to develop their properties for urban purposes. In adopting that policy, the Board of Commissioners affirmed that Fort Bragg and Pope A.F.B. should be positioned to enhance and expand their military readiness missions as a result of force re-alignments which will result from the Base Realignment and Closure re-alignment.

The Small Area Plan Study conducted by the Planning Department proposed allowing land uses compatible with military activities, such as factory or defense contractor uses, or agricultural uses, on Critical and Important parcels in the buffer area. Parcels were designated Critical or Important because of noise, accident potential, or endangered species (red cockaded woodpecker) factors.

The Board of Commissioners policy offers owners of critical or important tracts of over five acres a *voluntary* financial inducement to conserve and protect those tracts from urban development. The Board also approved a general form of easement agreement that had been presented at a public hearing of the Joint Planning Board. The agreement would compensate an owner an annual amount measured as 48% of property taxes paid for an agreement to keep land substantially in its current state and/or uses for a term of from five up to ten years. For a term of ten years or more, the compensation would be measured as 96% of property taxes paid. If an owner were to breach an agreement or withdraw early, the owner would have to reimburse all compensation paid for the first five years and, if applicable, half of the compensation payable after the fifth year. The agreement would grant the County a right of first refusal to match any offer to buy the property. After five years, an owner could terminate the agreement early on one year's notice.

We contemplated at the time the Board of Commissioners adopted this policy that the agreement could be "tailored" in non-essential respects to accommodate the needs of various property owners. During this past fall and winter Tom Brooks, of McCormick Farms Limited Partnership, and I met and exchanged a number of drafts of the agreement, intended to promote the County's objectives and at the same time preserve flexibility to McCormick Farms to conduct over its proposed ten year term a variety of agricultural activities and uses very closely related to agricultural activities (for example, a retail nursery operation selling flower and plants, etc.).

We have now agreed on the terms of a conservation and protection agreement between the County and McCormick Farms and present it to the Board for its consideration and approval. McCormick Farms has asked that we enter into separate agreements for the respective tracts covered, but I attach for your review and consideration one of what would be identical agreements except for property identifying references.

The proposed agreements would cover 17 tracts with a cumulative total of an estimated 1,574.16 acres. Much of this land is already currently in the use value program, so the property is assessed for property tax purposes at a significantly reduced level. The current amount of property taxes received annually from the portion of these tracts that would be subject to conservation and protection agreements is \$9,29.70. Please refer to the attached Exhibit A for tract PINs, estimated acreages, current property taxes and proposed conservation and protection agreement payments.

Because the discussions with McCormick Farms commenced early in the fall last year, I believe it appropriate to recommend to the Board that the effective date of this agreement be October 1, 2005. This would provide that, for tracts as to which property taxes were timely paid for 2005, conservation and protection agreement payments would be due in January, 2007. For the ten year conservation and protection agreements presented for your consideration, the annual payment to McCormick Farms would be \$9,532.51, assuming no change in the property tax rate for 2006 or subsequent years.

If the Board of Commissioners approves this agreement, I would seek to finalize conservation agreements with some five other property owners that have indicated an interest in this program.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Consider whether to approve conservation and protection agreements with McCormick Farms Limited Partnership for the tracts listed on Exhibit A and authorize the Chairman to sign on behalf of County.

This MILITARY MISSION AND OPERATIONS CRITICAL AREA CONSERVATION AND PROTECTION AGREEMENT FOR A DEFINITE TERM ("Agreement") is made on this 1<sup>st</sup> day of October, 2005, by MCCORMICK FARMS LIMITED PARTNERSHIP ("Grantor"), and the COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, North Carolina, ("Grantee"), a body politic and corporate and a subdivision of the State of North Carolina, P.O. Box 1829, Fayetteville, N.C. 28302.

#### **RECITALS & PURPOSES**

- A. Grantor is the sole owner in fee simple of the property ("Property"), being approximately 229.47 acres, in the County of Cumberland, State of North Carolina and being all of those tracts identified in Exhibit A attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein; and
- B. The Grantee has authority in Part 4, Art. 19, of Chapter 160A of the North Carolina General Statutes to acquire, lease and/or enter into deeds, easements and other agreements to preserve and conserve open space and natural resources; and
- C. The Property is located in the Fort Bragg Land Use Study Area conducted by the Fort Bragg Regional Land Use Advisory Commission, and is designated a military mission and operations critical or important tract in the Cumberland County Planning Department Small Area Land Use Study for such area; and
- D. Fort Bragg and Pope Air Force Base missions are critical to the security and well-being of the nation, and are central to the identity, quality of life and economic vitality of the Cumberland County community; and
- E. The overall aggregate pattern of development of land uses around Fort Bragg and Pope Air Force Base directly affects the suitability and compatibility of military missions which can be performed at the bases; and
- F. It is in the public interest to maintain and enhance the military missions of Fort Bragg and Pope Air Force Base, and that further intense and/or urban development of tracts five acres or larger designated military mission and operations critical and important in the study area be minimized, while protecting property owners' property rights, economic interests and investment expectations; and
- G. It is in the public interest that Cumberland County afford owners of tracts five acres or larger designated military mission and operations critical and important in the study area a voluntary opportunity to enter into Agreements intended to minimize further intense and/or urban development of their tracts during the term of the Agreement by maintaining (i) open spaces, or (ii) woodland, agricultural, or rural settings, scenic vistas and natural views, or

(iii) natural resources such as pastures, meadows, fields, rock outcroppings, creeks, streams, wetlands, croplands, etc.

NOW, THEREFORE the Grantor hereby unconditionally and irrevocably bargains and sells and conveys to Cumberland County, its successors and assigns, an easement for the term stated below for conservation and open space and natural resources protection purposes. Grantor covenants and agrees, for the direct benefit of Cumberland County, to preserve and conserve the Property substantially in the same condition and state of development as exists on the effective date hereof for the term of ten (10) years from the date this Agreement is recorded in the Cumberland County Registry, terminable as set forth herein.

The effective date of this Agreement shall be the date it is recorded in the Cumberland County Registry. Grantor may terminate this Agreement effective no sooner than five years from the commencement hereof, but only on at least one year's prior written notice to County.

Article I. Uses and Activities.

#### A. Definitions.

- 1. Current Uses include agriculture generally, such as farming, livestock, husbandry, horticulture, silvaculture, nursery, timber, forest products, and other miscellaneous uses. Activities associated with livestock uses include raising, feeding, breeding, herding, moving, loading, buying and selling horses, cattle, goats, chickens, and dogs. Current Activities associated with agriculture uses include disking, fertilizing, and applying herbicides, insecticides, pesticides and fungicides to cropland and pasture. They also include planting, sowing, harvesting, cutting, raking, baling, milling, grinding, and storing row crops, hay, grass, and straw. Current Activities associated with timber uses include planting, fertilizing, burning and applying herbicides, insecticides, fungicides, and pesticides to timberland. They also include harvesting, felling, logging, loading, transporting, and selling timber, logs, poles, pulpwood, and firewood. Current Activities associated with forest products include clearing, burning, and applying herbicides, insecticides, pesticides and fungicides to timberland. They also include raking, baling, loading, storing, and selling pine straw. Other Miscellaneous Uses and Activities include hunting, fishing, trapping; leased hunting, fishing and trapping rights; riding horses, mules and ponies; clearing land, removing stumps; drilling wells; installing water and electric lines, and building driveways, unimproved roads, fire lines, farm residences, farm buildings, well houses, and sheds in support of farming and agriculture. Current Uses and Activities also include the rental and maintenance of the three dwellings that currently exist on the Property.
- 2. Commercial Uses. Industrial, manufacturing or commercial uses and activities not directly related to or supportive of agricultural, horticultural, silvacultural, forestry, nursery or other uses permitted under the A-1 zoning classification.
- 3. Development. Development includes the construction, building, sale, lease, rent, and maintenance, of houses, offices, plants, facilities, buildings, roads, parking lots, grounds and associated infrastructure not directly related to or supportive of agriculture, horticulture, silvaculture, forestry, nursery or of other uses permitted under the A-1 zoning classification.
- B. Prohibited and Restricted Uses and Activities.

During the term of this agreement, the following activities are prohibited or restricted:

- 1. "Commercial Uses" and "Development" as described in Article I, Paragraph A. are specifically prohibited.
- 2. Grantor may not itself, or permit others to, dump trash, ashes, garbage, waste, abandoned vehicles, appliances, or machinery, or other materials on the property.
- 3. Filling, excavation, dredging, mining or drilling, or removal of topsoil, sand, gravel, rock, peat, minerals or other materials, or changes in the topography of the land shall be prohibited except as necessary for the purposes of combating erosion or as incidental to Permitted Uses and Activities allowed by this Agreement.

- 4. Although permitted uses in the A1 zoning classification, quarries, airports, assemblies, motor vehicle service stations and borrow source operations shall not be permitted under this Agreement.
- 5. The Property may not be subdivided, or partitioned, except that the Property may be subdivided into tracts five acres in size or larger.

#### C. Permitted Uses and Activities.

- 1. Current Uses and Activities described in Article I, Paragraph A. are permitted and can be expanded or extended without limitation or restriction.
- 2. Additional Uses or Activities, i.e., any uses or activities that are not Current Uses and Activities and that are not Prohibited and Restricted Uses and Activities, but are related to or extensions of Permitted Uses and Activities shall be considered Permitted Uses and Activities, however, Best Management Practices associated with those Additional Uses or Activities must be implemented. The term "related to or extensions of Permitted Uses and Activities" shall be construed and interpreted broadly consistent with the intent of this Agreement, to allow the widest variety of agricultural uses, including, by way of example but not of limitation, directly supporting retail uses such as feed stores or blacksmith shops and retail outlets for agricultural products such as nurseries or wineries, while avoiding urban-type development not appropriate, consistent with proper land use planning, to be located near active military uses now existing or existing during the term of this Agreement. The term "related to or extensions of Permitted Uses and Activities" shall be construed and interpreted broadly to allow Grantor wide flexibility in adapting to and evolving changed agricultural conditions and best management practices.

Such Additional Activities may include, for example, farming, silvaculture, husbandry, timber, forestry, horticulture, nursery or related uses or businesses (such as, by way of example but not by way of limitation, agricultural supply or nursery wholesale and retail sales). Best Management Practices may include, for example, taking appropriate steps to maintain water quality, minimize sedimentation in or over the Property or into surface waters, etc.

In adopting Additional Uses and Activities, the parties desire to conserve, where consistent with such uses, the Property's (i) open spaces, and/or (ii) woodland, agricultural or rural settings, and/or (iii) scenic and natural vistas, and/or natural resources such as meadows, pastures, fields, woods, croplands, rock outcroppings, creeks, streams, wetlands, etc.

#### Article II. Enforcement and Remedies.

- A. Upon any breach of the terms of this Agreement by Grantor that comes to the attention of the Grantee, the Grantee shall notify the Grantor in writing of such breach. The Grantor shall have ninety (90) days after receipt of such notice to begin undertaking actions that are reasonably calculated to correct promptly the conditions constituting such breach. If the breach remains uncured after ninety (90) days, the Grantee may enforce this Agreement by appropriate legal proceedings including for injunctive and other related relief.
- B. Grantee, its employees and agents and its successors and/or assigns, shall have the right, with reasonable notice and at reasonable times, to enter the Property for the purpose of inspecting the Property to determine whether the Grantor and its successors and/or assigns are complying with the terms, conditions and restrictions of this Agreement. Grantor shall not be liable to Grantee, its employees and agents and its successors and/or assigns, for any personal injury or damage which may result from Grantee's exercise of this right of inspection, and Grantee shall, to the extent allowed by law, hold harmless and indemnify Grantor against any such personal injury or damage which may result from Grantee's exercise of this right of inspection.
- C. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to entitle Grantee to bring any action against Grantor for any injury or change in the Property caused by third parties, resulting from causes beyond the Grantor's control, including, without limitation, fire, flood, storm, and earth movement, or from any prudent action taken in good faith by the Grantor under emergency conditions to prevent, abate, or mitigate significant injury to life, damage to property or harm to the Property resulting from such causes.

#### Article III. Documentation and Title.

- A. Property Condition. The parties acknowledge that the Property is currently developed to the following extent, as generally described in Exhibit B, attached hereto and incorporated by reference, which sets forth a narrative description of the general extent of use and/or development of the property as of the date hereof. Exhibit C, attached hereto and incorporated by reference, is an aerial photograph of the Property from the County's GIS system.
- B. Title. The Grantor covenants and represents that the Grantor is the sole owner and is seized of the Property in fee simple and has good right to grant this Agreement and convey the easement rights hereby conveyed, that the Property is free and clear of any and all encumbrances, except agreements of record, and Grantor covenants that the Grantee shall have the use of and enjoy all of the benefits derived from and arising out of the aforesaid Agreement.

#### Article IV. Compensation.

- A. In consideration of this Agreement, Grantee shall pay to Grantor \$\_\_\_\_\_\_\_.00 annually on each February 1 that this Agreement is in effect, contingent upon (i) Grantor's compliance herewith, and (ii) Grantor's timely payment of ad valorem property taxes attributable to the calendar year preceding such February 1. [Amount to be calculated at time of signing of agreement and to equal to 96% of ad valorem property taxes paid, expressed as absolute dollar amount]. Grantor acknowledges that such payment is made in consideration of the term hereof being at least ten (10) years. If Grantor shall terminate this Agreement in his, her or its discretion prior to expiration of the stated term hereof, then Grantor shall reimburse to Grantee a pro rata portion of the compensation payments made hereunder, as follows: (I) if termination occurs during the first five years, Grantor shall reimburse Grantee all amounts paid by Grantee as compensation hereunder; (II) if termination occurs after the fifth year, then Grantor shall reimburse Grantee half [50%] of all amounts paid by Grantee as compensation hereunder attributable to any period after the fifth year of the term hereof. Grantor shall make such payment to Grantee within 45 days after the effective date of a termination triggering such reimbursement obligation.
- B. In further consideration of this Agreement, Grantee shall assess, during the term of this agreement, Grantor's Property for ad valorem property tax purposes at the lower of its current assessment or the assessment which Grantee's Tax Administrator would apply to the Property were the Property zoned CD (Conservation District). The Grantor and Grantee acknowledge that Grantee's Tax Administrator assesses CD real property at the rate of \$700 per acre.
- C. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to affect or otherwise alter the zoning classification of the Property at the end of the term of this agreement. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to affect or otherwise alter the Grantor's use of the Special Use tax program at the end of the term of this agreement.

#### Article V. Miscellaneous.

- A. Subsequent Transfers. Grantor agrees for itself, its successors and assigns, to notify Grantee in writing of the names and addresses of any party to whom the Property, or any part thereof, is to be transferred after the effective date hereof at least ten business days prior to the time said transfer is consummated. Grantor, for itself, its successors and/or assigns, further agrees to make specific reference to this Agreement in a separate paragraph of any subsequent lease, deed or other legal instrument by which any interest in the Property is conveyed.
- B. Conservation Purpose. Grantee, for itself, its successors and assigns, agrees that this Agreement shall be held by it exclusively for conservation of natural resource, agricultural, agroforestry, silvopasture, forestry, horticulture, silvaculture, open space purposes or related uses as more fully described above.
- C. The parties hereto agree that the benefits of this Agreement are not assignable.
- D. Construction of Terms. This Agreement shall be construed to promote the purposes of the North Carolina enabling statute set forth in N.C.G.S. 160A-401 et seq., which authorizes the creation of open

space and natural resource conservation agreements, easements, deeds, etc. for purposes including those set forth in the recitals herein.

- E. Entire Agreement. This instrument sets forth the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the Agreement and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, understandings or agreements relating to the Agreement. If any provision shall be found to be invalid, the remainder of the provisions of this Agreement, and the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is found to be invalid, shall not be affected thereby.
- F. Recording. The Grantee may record this instrument and any amendment hereto in timely fashion in the official records of the Cumberland County, North Carolina Registry.
- G. Notices. Any notices shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed in the case of Grantor, to McCormick Farms Limited Partnership, 8195 McCormick Bridge Road, Sping Lake, NC 28390, and in the case of Grantee to Cumberland County, c/o County Manager, P.O. Box 1829, Fayetteville, N.C. 28302, or to such other addresses such party may establish in writing to the other.
- H. Environmental Condition of Property. The Grantor warrants and represents to the Grantee that to the best of its knowledge as of the date hereof there are no hazardous materials, substances, wastes, or environmentally regulated substances located on, in or under the Property or used in connection therewith. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantor expressly advises Grantee that asbestos was a common building material at the time many structures on the Property were constructed, and Grantor makes no warranty or representation to Grantee as to the presence or absence of asbestos in any particular structure on the Property. Grantor further expressly advises Grantee that use of regulated or restricted chemicals incorporated into pesticides, insecticides, herbicides, etc. is customary, common and normal incidental to the activities carried on by Grantor and permitted hereunder, and Grantor makes no warranty or representation to Grantee as to the presence or absence of such regulated or restricted chemicals on the Property.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD unto Cumberland County, North Carolina, its successors and assigns, forever on the terms above stated. The covenants agreed to and the terms, conditions, restrictions and purposes imposed as aforesaid shall be binding upon Grantor and Grantor's successors and/or assigns, and shall continue as a servitude running during the term of this Agreement with the Property.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, Grantor and Grantee by authority duly given, have hereunto caused these presents to be executed by their respective officers and their corporate seals affixed, as of the date first appearing hereinabove, to be effective upon the date of recordation in the public registry of Cumberland County, North Carolina.






