

Enclosed you will find the FY 2008 Community Transportation Program Grant Application and all supporting documentation. It is requested that the Public Hearing be held on November 6, 2006 at the 9:00 am Commissioners' Meeting. In addition to holding the Public Hearing on that date, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners approve the application as presented. The application was approved by the Transportation Advisory Board on October 10, 2006. The due date for the project to be turned in to the NCDOT Public Transportation Division is November 17, 2006.

The CTP Grant consists of administrative and capital funds in order to run the Cumberland County Community Transportation Program. The administrative funds covers costs such as: salaries, fringe benefits, drug and alcohol testing for our drivers, office supplies, marketing and legal advertising. The capital funds cover the cost to maintain our MapInfo software. There is a 15% local match requirement for administrative funds and a 10% local match requirement for capital funds.

We are requesting a total of \$65,134 in administrative funds and \$348 in capital funds, with a grand total of \$65,482. The local share for administrative funds would be \$9,770 and for capital funds would be \$35, with a grand total of \$9,805.

The staff is headed by Judicial District Manager Wayne Marshburn, Assistant Judicial District Manager Jonette Quenum, and six Chief Probation/Parole Chief Probation/Parole Officer Kathy Officers. Blackmon supervises our Judicial Services unit housed at the Cumberland County courthouse. This unit is responsible for processing probationers from court, submitting crime versions on inmates who will be released at some future time, plus supervising approximately 300 offenders who have rated as low risk/low need offenders. This unit also includes community service coordinators supervising approximately 360 probationers who have been sentenced to do community service.

Chief Probation/Parole Officer Paul Hatch supervises our Special Operations unit which specializes in administering several sanctions and programs to include the Day Reporting Center, the Sex Offender Control program, the Electronic House Arrest program, and Drug Treatment Court. The remaining Chief Probation/Parole officers, Gearonie Locklear, Jim Massengill, Terry Paige, and Sharon Young supervise field units located at the Community Correction Center at 412-A West Russell Street.

We have a total of sixteen Community Officers supervising approximately 1,300 regular probation cases, twenty four Intermediate Officers supervising approximately 1,125 intermediate cases, one intermediate officer serving on the U.S. Marshal's Task Force, seven Intensive Case Officers supervising approximately 175 intensive cases, and nine Intensive Surveillance Officers supervising approximately 425 absconders. This past fiscal year we averaged supervising 3,195 offenders.

### Our Partners

The Division of Community Corrections shares facilities with the Cumberland County Day Reporting Center and Treatment Accountability for Safer Communities (TASC). Also housed in our facility is the Substance Abuse Screening Lab which serves not only the Division of Community Corrections but the Division of Prisons, Court, TASC, the Office of Juvenile Justice, and the Juvenile Detention Center. Our set-up is unique within the state and is ideal for the treatment and control of the offenders.

Last year the Day Reporting Center, whose director is Callie Gardner, provided the following services to 152 offenders: Substance Abuse Education/Monitoring, Intensive Substance Abuse Counseling, Employment Services, Educational Services, and Social/Life Skills training. The average cost per day for the Day Reporting Center is \$11.68 as opposed to \$63.56 a day to house these same offenders in the county jail or state prison.

TASC, headed in Cumberland County by Elizabeth Caldwell, is a specialized community resource agency equipped to work with chemically dependent offenders who are sentenced to Probation and/or who are involved within the criminal justice system. TASC identifies the offender's needs and matches them with available treatment services within the Area Program and other community resources. TASC served 1,304 offenders during the last fiscal year.

### **New Initiatives**

In September 2004, Probation/Parole Officer Bert Turner was assigned to the U.S. Marshal's Fugitive Apprehension Task Force. This involves a two year commitment from our agency to have three officers work full time with the U.S. Marshals apprehending high profile violent absconders. Cumberland county and Wake county were selected as the initial counties to provide officers who would train with the Marshals and serve on the Task Force. From July 2005 until June 30, 2006 the total number arrested by this Task Force statewide was 303. The number arrested in Fayetteville was 188. Twenty-two probation fugitives were apprehended. This task force has played an important role in apprehending some forty plus offenders who committed homicides and twenty plus sex offenders. We hope to continue a vital working agreement with the U.S. Marshal's Fugitive Apprehension Task Force next fiscal year.

In December 2004 Judicial District 12 initiated a Drug Treatment Court. Planning and preparation began in 2001. The operating name selected for our Court is STARS, an acronym for Supervised Treatment and Rehabilitation Services. The emphasis is on managed treatment for offenders under a strict regimen of treatment, monitoring, court appearances, curfew, and social responsibility. The Division of Community Corrections plays a vital role in the supervision of offenders selected to participate in this program. During the past fiscal year we supervised twenty-five probationers. We have fourteen now enrolled. We have had two graduations with two graduates. This is one of our toughest sanctions but statistics reveal that offenders have an 80% chance of never being a recidivist if they successfully graduate from Drug Treatment Court.

In August 2005 the Division of Community Corrections initiated a Community Threat Group Program to address the emerging problems that Gangs constitute. The goal is to identify and document gang offenders, identify and deter patterns of gang activity, and target offenders for appropriate supervision and treatment. Intensive Officer Robert Porter was named as our Community Threat Group Officer.

#### **Ongoing Programs**

Operation Cease Fire is a joint venture with federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies, as well as community resources cooperating, in a unified offensive to identify violent and repeat offenders and employ prevention and intervention techniques to stop the violence in our neighborhoods. Kim Thomas is the Acting Cease Fire Coordinator. Our probation officers continue to provide valuable assistance in identifying targeted offenders, transportation to the "call-in" meetings, and rapid response to violations of probation. During FY2005-2006 three call-in meetings were held, 60 offenders were targeted, and 43 participated.

Since 1997 Judicial District 12 has been a site for the Sex Offender Control Program. The aim of this approach is to improve the system-wide management of sex offenders in the community while holding the offender consistently accountable for the damage caused by sexual abuse. The ultimate goal is to prevent further victimization. Through treatment, behavior modification, and close supervision sex oftenders are taught how to achieve a measure of personal control of their inappropriate impulses, feelings, and behaviors. The Sex Offender Control Program promotes interagency collaboration and the open exchange of information to promote community notification, sex offender registration, victim awareness and advocacy. Lewis Croom, Amy Porter, and Mary Freeman are our Sex Offender Officers and consistently maintain a total caseload of 110 to 120 sex offenders.

The purpose of the *Domestic Violence* initiative is to provide a strong family violence intervention program in an effort to provide victim safety, punishment and control of the offender, appropriate batterer's treatment, and increased recognition of the issue of domestic violence. In Cumberland County we have four officers who specialize in supervising offenders convicted of domestic violence crimes. Our officers, Sherry Joines, Tara Jones, Wanda Jordan, and Regina Whitted, work closely with the Department of Social Service's CARE Program, court officials, law enforcement agencies, victim advocates, and treatment providers in an attempt to break the cycle of violence within our families and communities.

Criminal behavior is often the result of an erroneous thought process. This concept behind Cognitive Behavioral Intervention (CBI) entails having an understanding of the thinking behind our behavior and the consequences of our actions. Cognitive behavioral

training can enable changes in the criminal thought process, producing more socially acceptable behavior. Cumberland County Division of Community Corrections has five trained facilitators in CBI with two being Master Trainers. Partnering with other trained facilitators from the Day Reporting Center, an eleven week course titled "Thinking for a Change" is offered to the offenders through the Day Reporting Center. Last year thirty-three offenders participated in CBI.


Beginning in fiscal year 2003-2004 Judicial District 12 established the Soldiers Project in conjunction with the Fort Bragg Provost Marshal's Office to ensure that U.S. Military service members and their dependents who are under our supervision are fulfilling the provisions of their probation and any court-ordered treatment. Forty-two offenders are in the program. Working closely with the military chain of command our officers have ready access to these offenders and share appropriate information. An office is provided at the Provost Marshal's Office on Fort Bragg. Our Memorandum of Agreement was renewed this past fiscal year.

#### **Public Relations**


From participating in the state's Combined Campaign and Special Olympics, to speaking at schools, community watch groups, civic clubs, organizing blood drives, and serving on our department's Emergency Response Team, our staff takes pride in community participation. Not often are achievements noted nor hours of volunteering recorded. Listed below are two examples of what our staff is doing or has achieved.

For the second consecutive year Surveillance Officer, Garry Garner has been selected as Officer of the Year for District 12. He was selected for his "contribution to the Department, which was above and beyond the call of duty" and "high productivity, having a significant positive effect on a program and exceptional work." On January 4, 2006 while off duty, Officer Garner spotted one of his absconders at Cross Creek Mail. He alerted a deputy and the two chased the offender into a bus where he was apprehended. On April 28, 2006 Officer Garner received a tip that one of his absconders had left Fayetteville on a Greyhound bus headed for Queens. NY. He contacted police in Richmond, Virginia. When the bus stopped there the offender was apprehended and extradited back to North Carolina. On another occasion Officer Garner was the first on the scene of an accident where a woman's car had hydroplaned into the woods. He spotted the car, helped the woman back up to the road, had the Fayetteville Police Department dispatched, and then stayed with the accident victim until her husband, who was a State Trooper, arrived.


This past fiscal year *Combined Campaign*, headed by Assistant Judicial District Manager Jonette Quenum surpassed our goal of \$3200 by collecting \$4734.







WHEREAS. The Cumberland County Board of Commissioners has determined a serious public health problem exists in the Windridge Subdivision, with contaminated individual water supply systems; and

WHEREAS, the property owners within the Windridge Subdivision have petitioned the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners to extend public water within the subdivision, and

WHEREAS, the Cumberland County Health Department has researched its records for water quality complaints and recommends the Board of Commissioners undertake a special assessment to finance water extensions for the Windridge Subdivision as shown on the attached map.

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners, pursuant to Article 9 of Chapter 153A of North Carolina General Statutes, hereby adopts the following special assessment resolution:

- Į. Need for Project: The Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County hereby undertakes a project to extend public water to the Windridge Subdivision. This project is required to eliminate the use of contaminated individual groundwater wells for consumptive and hygienic purposes. the Cumberland County Health Department and the State's Epidemiologist's Office conducted a review of water quality complaints in the abovereferenced area and found high levels of arsenic and other compounds hazardous to health in the well water at many homes within this subdivision.
- II. General Description of the Project: This project will include installation of approximately 5,650 total linear feet of water main extending from an existing 8 inch water main along Chickenfoot Road near the Windridge Subdivision, including all appurtenances, to serve 80 residences within the Windridge subdivision.
- III. Ownership: The water line extensions will become the property of the Public Works Commission of the City of Fayetteville and will be operated and maintained by PWC as part of its comprehensive public water system throughout its service area.
- IV. Proposed Basis of Assessment: The proposed basis of assessment will be at an equal rate per lot in the project area along which public water is extended.
- V. Percentage of Cost to be Assessed: The total engineering, construction and administrative costs shall be assessed against the benefited properties in this special assessment project.
- VI. Abeyance: No assessment will be held in abeyance.
- Terms of Payment: The assessment will be payable in ten (5) annual installments and the VII. first installment with interest will be due sixty (60) days after the date that the assessment roll is confirmed. One installment with interest is due on the anniversary date in each successive year until the assessment is paid in full. The interest rate shall be set at eight percent (8%) per annum. The assessment may be paid in full without interest anytime up to sixty (60) days after the confirmation of the assessment roll is published.

**BACKGROUND:** Property owners H and H Constructors Inc. petitioned that a portion of Sahara Place located on the eastern margin of Hidden Oasis Drive in Eastover Township be closed. The petition is attached as Exhibit A. A map of the area is attached as Exhibit B.

The Department of Transportation confirms that Sahara Place is not a State maintained road and has no objection to the abandonment. The Fire Marshall and Planning Department also do not object.

Pursuant to G. S. 153A-241, if the Board desires to honor the request, the Board must declare its intent to close a portion of Sahara Place and call for a public hearing on the matter. I have attached a resolution for your consideration. The resolution will (1) authorize the Board to set a public hearing to consider whether to close a portion of Sahara Place, (2) direct that notice be published once a week for four successive weeks before the hearing, and (3) direct that a notice of the closing and public hearing be prominently posted in at least two places along the street during that time. Staff will also mail a copy of the notice to the other property owners adjoining Sahara Place.

**RECOMMENDATION AND PROPOSED ACTION:** That the Board of Commissioners consider adoption of the attached resolution calling a public hearing to consider the petition to close a portion of Sahara Place and declaring the Board's intent to consider the petition to close a portion of Sahara Place.

## RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO CLOSE PUBLIC ROAD AND CALL FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON THE QUESTION

WHEREAS, H and H Constructors Inc. have submitted a petition to the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners (the "Board") to close a portion of Sahara Place located on the eastern margin of Hidden Oasis Drive, in Eastover Township, Cumberland County; and





#### BACKGROUND:

Attached is a copy of Change Order STC-1 in the amount of \$97,503.00 for Bordeaux Construction Company to install the standby power generator in the Sheriff's Training Center. At the time the bid was accepted for the project, the alternate bid for the generator was not accepted due to insufficient funds in the Sheriff Drug Forfeiture Fund Balance. Monies are now available in the fund balance which can be used to put the generator back into the project negating the need to revise the emergency exit and lighting within the facility which would have been required without the generator.

A meeting with the Sheriff and his staff was held in May 2006 to discuss the need for the generator and the Sheriff agreed that it was in the best interest of the project to use available drug forfeiture funds to put the generator back into the project.

The change order has been reviewed by the County Attorney's Office for legal sufficiency.

#### RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

The recommendation of the County Engineer, Sheriff, and management is to:

- 1. Approve Change Order STC-1 for Bordeaux Construction Company in the amount of \$97,503 and increase the contract amount for the Sheriff's Training Center Project to \$3,280,347.
- 2. Approve the attached budget revision.

The proposed action by the Board is to follow the staff recommendation.



- 1. **PURPOSE:** The COUNTY agrees to retain the CONTRACTOR and the CONTRACTOR agrees to provide certain services under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 2. **TERM OF AGREEMENT**: The term of this Agreement shall begin December 1, 2006, and continue through June 30, 2007, unless sooner terminated as provided herein. Either party may terminate this Agreement prior to the expiration of the term on ten days' prior written notice, but if the CONTRACTOR fails or neglects to furnish or perform the necessary services to the reasonable satisfaction of the COUNTY, the COUNTY may terminate this Agreement on seven days prior written notice.
- 3. **SERVICES PROVIDED:** CONTRACTOR shall provide running the cablecasting origination cameras during meetings of the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners.
- 4. **PAYMENT**: The COUNTY will pay CONTRACTOR for her services at the rate of \$50.00 per meeting for service provided hereunder, up to a maximum of \$750.00.
- 5. **NOTICES:** Any notice required or permitted hereunder shall be deemed served if personally hand-delivered, or mailed certified mail return receipt requested, to:

6. **BENEFIT**: This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties, their legal representatives, successors, and assigns, provided that the provisions with respect to assignment and delegation are fully complied with.

- 7. **ASSIGNMENT**: The CONTRACTOR shall not assign all or any part of her contract rights under this Agreement or delegate or subcontract any performance hereunder, without first obtaining the COUNTY'S written approval thereof.
- 8. **COMPLIANCE WITH LAW**: CONTRACTOR will comply with all local, state, and federal laws in carrying out her responsibilities hereunder.
- 9. APPLICABLE LAW: This Agreement shall be governed by the internal laws of the State of North Carolina without regard to the conflict of laws provisions thereof, and the parties mutually agree that the courts of the State of North Carolina shall have exclusive jurisdiction of any claim arising under the terms of this Agreement.
- 10. **MODIFICATION**: This Agreement may be modified only by an instrument duly executed by the parties or their respective successors.
- 11. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR: CONTRACTOR is an independent CONTRACTOR and not an agent, officer or employee of the COUNTY and shall have no authority to act as an agent of the COUNTY, nor enter any Agreement for or in behalf of the COUNTY. The parties agree that the relationship of CONTRACTOR with the COUNTY is as an "independent contractor", as that term is defined by the law of the State of North Carolina, and that CONTRACTOR is not a "common law employee" of the COUNTY, as that term is defined and that status is treated by the Internal Revenue Service. CONTRACTOR's sole compensation shall be the per meeting fee set forth above. COUNTY shall not be obligated to provide CONTRACTOR any group insurance, health benefits, worker's compensation benefits, unemployment insurance, or retirement benefits. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for the payment of all Federal, State, and Local taxes, which may be due as a result of this Agreement.
- 12. AGENCY AND AUTHORITY: The COUNTY hereby designates its Clerk to the Board of Commissioners as its exclusive agent with respect to this Agreement. The COUNTY authorizes its Clerk, on its behalf, to negotiate directly with CONTRACTOR on all matters pertaining to this Agreement and, personally or through her designee, to submit objectives and tasks to the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this Agreement. CONTRACTOR agrees that all of her dealings in respect to the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be exclusively with the said Clerk.

MOTION: Commissioner Henley moved to approve.

2. Consideration of a request from the Fire Chief's Association for the County to fund a match for a grant for radios (Freddy Johnson, Sr.)

BACKGROUND: Freddy L. Johnson, Sr. President, Fire Chief's Association, requested the Board of Commissioners provide matching funds for a \$1 million grant to equip all volunteer fire departments with 800MHz digital radios. If the grant is approved, the local match is 20% or \$240,878.

The County Manager recommends approval as follows:

 $\frac{1}{2}$  of the match will come from the special fire district tax (the special fire district tax is distributed as follows -60%, to fire departments and 40%, to the Fire Chief's Association); from the 40% that the Fire Chief's Association receives;

½ of the match will be funded by the County (the County will loan the Fire Chief's Association the money to complete the match requirement); the Association will repay the County over a five year period.

Mr. Johnson said no fire department would see a deduction in any special district tax funds it receives. Matching funds will come from the 40% money that goes to the Fire Chief's Association.

Commissioner Henley inquired if work on fire department contracts had been completed and specifically if there was a requirement in the contract that if a fire department is dissolved, such as because of annexation, reserves (funds) will return to the County. Mr. Johnson said work is being done on modifications to the contract. The County Attorney indicated there have been discussions and agreement reached on almost all issues, but no agreement and been reached on this specific issue. He said the attorney for the Fire Chief's Association had some concerns about agreeing that such funds should be returned to the County. He said he thought work on the contracts could be completed by early in the year to be effective the first of July (beginning of the new fiscal year). The commissioners present expressed a consensus that the fire department contracts include such a provision because these funds are the public's tax moneys.

The Committee asked staff to provide it with an audit of the funds that were disbursed when the City of Fayetteville annexed two volunteer fire departments.

James Martin, County Manager, noted the importance of the fire departments having the 800MHz capability.

As background information, the Manager noted that the State of North Carolina used Homeland Security funds to establish major tower structures for an 800MHz system, referred to as the VIPR system. The County would pursue using the VIPR system radios through the State system at no cost for hours used. In addition, the Manager noted that there may be some issues with the Sheriff's Office radio system coverage and "dead spots" that the cost to address those problems could be as much as \$8-10 million.

Commissioner Blackwell said he had heard the VIPR system has experienced some coverage difficulties in some of the mountain counties. Mr. Doc Nunnery, Director, Emergency Management Department, noted some of those problems were encountered because there were not enough towers. The mountainous topography made it difficult to communicate without towers placed closer together. Mr. Nunnery said that would not be a problem here.

Commissioner Henley noted the importance of having a contract with the volunteer fire departments that set out a policy on how reserve money would be disbursed if that fire department were annexed into the City. Other commissioners present concurred.

MOTION: Commissioner Henley moved that the Finance Committee recommend to the Board of Commissioners approval of the 20% match as recommended by the Manager and outlined above.

SECOND: Commissioner Edge VOTE: UNANIMOUS

3. Consideration of funding options for a new health department building, as requested by the Board of Health.

The County Manager noted the options for funding are as follows:

General Obligation Bonds Certificates of Participation (COPS) Pay as you go (not feasible)

He said staff did not have a recommendation at this time because they wanted to take into consideration total other capital needs in a comprehensive manner. He noted the request from the school system for \$55 million with a potential need of \$155 million. He also noted library needs and administration space needs.

Commissioner Wheatley noted some Mental Health facilities may become vacant which could be sold and the money used for capital outlay needs. It was noted that if a new health department building was constructed, the old building could be sold and the funds used to help pay back the debt. Commissioner Blackwell indicated that Fayetteville State University may be looking for a nursing facility and that the County should approach the University to see if it might be interested in the current health department building.

Commissioner Henley said a new health department building makes sense and we need to move on it quickly.

The County Manager said he could have recommendations back to the Board regarding funding options for capital needs in the next 60 days. Chairman Edge said he thought the full Board could talk about this issue at its Retreat in January or February. Commissioner Henley said he would like to have Mr. Martin's recommendation prior to the Retreat so the Board will have some time to review it.

The Local Government Commission has changed its position that the County must state it will increase the tax rate if needed to pay back any COPS debt for capital needs. Lottery proceeds can now be designated as the payback source, with a proviso that if lottery proceeds fall short, the balance will come from available general fund sources.

Chairman Edge said he believed the school system may not have looked at all of its options as far as school space is concerned, i.e., year-round schools.

### 4. Update on school funding formula

The County Manager said he was optimistic the county staff and school staff would be able to work out a formula that everyone could live with.

Commissioner Henley suggested that the County request more financial information from the school system so it could better understand the request for funding for new school buildings, etc.

Commissioner Blackwell noted the School Board approved funding for three School Resource Officers (SRO's). Commissioner Blackwell suggested that perhaps the County

could partner in some way to provide more SRO's. Commissioner Wheatley noted that the Governor is reviewing safety plans for schools and it could be premature to address this issue now. Chairman Edge noted the difficulty in three SRO's providing security among so many schools. SRO's are funded locally and with state money.

2. Discussion of Policy to Address Land Divestiture Issues

Grainger Barrett, County Attorney, stated that this item was referred from the Facilities Committee to consider if a policy should apply in instances where property is becoming available again because it is not continuing to be dedicated to a certain purpose. Some considerations include: Is there a County or other agency need for the facility? If County general fund dollars were used to acquire a property, should the County General Fund recoup those dollars before any other distribution of dollars is considered? If the County General Fund recoups dollars as capital assets, is there a desire for the funds to be designated for future capital projects generally, and reserved to be allocated specifically at a later date by the Board of Commissioners? If reacquired properties are to be reconveyed to for-profit entities, should that occur at or near market value? James Martin, County Manager, said it is management's recommendation that proceeds from the disposition of any land or buildings owned by Cumberland County be returned to the County General Fund. Commissioner Wheatley said it was the major recommendation of the Facilities Committee that since the capital needs are so great in the County, these monies come back to the County and be designated for capital needs.

MOTION: Commissioner Henley moved to recommend to the Board of Commissioners that upon the disposition of land or buildings that have

been in the name of Cumberland County and no longer being used for previously designated purposes, those proceeds be returned to the

General Fund and established in a capital reserve fund.

SECOND: Commissioner Blackwell

#### VOTE: UNANIMOUS

3. Consideration of Funding a Water Extension Feasibility Study for the Town of Falcon

Tom Cooney, Public Utilities Director, said that on May 31, 2005, the Board of Commissioners met in a joint meeting with the Town Boards of Falcon, Godwin and Wade at the Wade Civic Center. At that time Mayor Lucas of the Town of Falcon requested that the County look into the possibility of funding a feasibility study to examine the expansion of its water distribution system. The Board requested that Community Development staff look into the possibility of funding the study. At that time the Town did not identify a specific project. The Town of Falcon now has proposed two projects. The first is the extension of water services along Smithfield Road to the District Seven School as well as an extension north of Godwin along Sweetwater Drive, and the second project would be to expand the water storage capacity within the Town of Falcon. The Town has received an estimate from their engineering firm in the amount of \$5,775.00 to perform the study related to the water line extensions and has not provided an estimate for the study of the additional storage issue. In the past the County has not provided grant funding for an entire study, but has participated as much as 50% of the study cost, and in some cases more. The County does not have funds available for the actual construction of any water line extensions that may be recommended by the study.

Mayor Wayne Lucas, Town of Falcon, said Falcon purchases water from the Town of Dunn. That line extends through the Town of Godwin and to Falcon. He regularly receives requests for water from two areas. One area is to extend a water main to serve approximately 30 residents along Sweetwater Drive. The other area extends approximately four miles from Falcon to District Seven School. The Falcon Town Board has met with representatives of the school system and they expressed a desire for the water. If the study is funded, the Town of Falcon would seek money from the state and federal level. Discussion followed. The County Manager recommended that the County provide 50% of the cost of the study. Commissioner Wheatley suggested that Mid-Carolina Council of Governments be contacted and asked to assist in funding the study as that is one of their major legislative goals next year.

MOTION: Commissioner Blackwell moved to recommend to the Board of

Commissioners that Cumberland County pay 50% of the cost of the Water

Extension Feasibility Study for the Town of Falcon.

**SECOND: Commissioner Henley** 

**VOTE: UNANIMOUS** 

Because of the possibility that Wade and the Eastover Sanitary District may also ask the County to participate in funding Water Extension Feasibility Studies, Commissioner Blackwell asked the County Attorney to arrange a meeting with Attorney John Jackson Attorney for the Town Boards, Tom Cooney, a representative from Rural Development, Mid-Carolina COG, the school system, and each of the Town Board's. He requested this be arranged within the next 90 days.

### 4. Discussion of Community Branding Initiative

Sara VanderClute reported that she and Angie Cunningham attended a recent meeting led by FACVB (Fayetteville Area Convention and Visitors Bureau) regarding the Community Branding Inititative. Ms. Cunningham provided examples of how some internal documents might look using the new branding guide. The goal is to combine the County identity with the guidelines. The cost of adding additional colors to printed materials was discussed. The Committee agreed that colors be used at the discretion of the Print Shop Supervisor and the County Manager. Mr. Martin said that management recommends approval of incorporating the community branding initiative into the County identity. Commissioner Edge recommended submitting a request to the Department of Transportation to update the signs coming into Cumberland County to include the County seal.

MOTION: Commissioner Blackwell moved to recommend to the Board of

Commissioners to approve the branding for the County and pursue a

request to DOT to change the signs coming into Cumberland County.

### **BACKGROUND**



### Dear Chairman King:

Over the past three years, the annual private investment in downtown has grown from \$1.5 million to \$13 million per year with over \$23 million presently under construction. Retail and office space have been absorbed at the rate of 40,000 square feet per year, increasing the occupancy rate from 47 percent to 81 percent. Because of this growth, the City of Fayetteville, through the Cumberland County Business Council (CCBC), recently completed a parking study prepared by the McLaurin Parking Company. The study evaluated the present and projected downtown parking demand and inventory; and determined that by the year 2008, the occupancy of the existing inventory would exceed that generally accepted for downtowns. It therefore recommended an 850-space parking complex be constructed.

Based on the study recommendations and feedback from presentations to the City Council, County Commissioners and staff, the CCBC recommends the development of an approximate 850-space parking deck on the City-owned parking lot behind the old courthouse between Franklin and Russell Streets, with construction and operations to be paid from a joint City/County parking fund created from incremental tax revenue generated within the Municipal Service District. In addition, the CCBC recommends the development of an overall parking fee and use strategy for all of downtown.

To this end, the City would like to invite the County Commissioners to join in the formation of a Municipal Parking Committee. The committee will prepare recommendations for the City/County for the development and use of public parking assets to meet the projected downtown parking needs for the next eight years. The Committee will be made up of a City Council Member and a senior staff person from the City, a County Commissioner and senior staff from the County, a member of the Board of Directors from the Downtown Alliance, and a member of the Board of Directors from the Cumberland County Business Council. The committee will be co-chaired by the City Council Member and the County Commissioner. Technical and administrative support will be provided by the CCBC. Over the next six months, the committee should address and provide recommendations on the following issues:

- 1. The design and location of parking structures as deemed necessary to satisfy the projected demand;
- 2. The development and operating costs and financing approach for the proposed structure;
- 3. A unified City/County parking fee strategy for all of downtown that will consider the unique need for some free parking for the courthouse patrons and the need to maximize free short-term parking adjacent to core retail area; and
- 4. An organizational structure that would oversee the parking operations for all of downtown including the development of proposed parking structure.

I hope that the County will join the City in this pursuit. And, I look forward to working with you.

Pursuant to conversations with you and the Chairman yesterday afternoon I am pleased to respectfully ask that the Commissioners consider our (theTPCOC) request for one surplus vehicle to be set aside and given, by the County, to the subject 501-3C community service activity. The vehicle preferably would be one of the surplus vans scheduled by the County for public auction this coming Saturday, October 28, 2006.

The TPCOC will relocate early in 2007 to a building on Russell Street generously provided by Michael Green and partner. We anticipate that this new location will meet the needs of the bicycle program insofar as restoration and distribution is concerned. It will not, beyond a temporary basis, be satisfactory for the computer repair and distribution program. Many of us strongly feel that the computer program will play an extremely important role in the future in assisting young students with their schoolwork, both on the facility site and in their homes.

Because the TPCOC will be operating in two locations, transportation between the two sites will be necessary on a routine and daily basis. Also both programs require constant trips for parts, to collect donated computers and sometimes bicycles. Mr. Mathis and Mr. Owens use their personal vehicles for these purposes. A passenger car is generally not satisfactory to transport multiple bicycles which are often available if they can be picked up.

Your good offices and those of the Commissioners in facilitating the above described request will be greatly appreciated by everyone that participates with Mr. Mathis in his most worthwhile endeavors.

My personal thanks to each and everyone involved in this decision.




