About UNC Tomorrow

University of North Carolina Tomorrow: Leading, Connecting, Transforming

Our Mission

The University of North Carolina is dedicated to the service of North Carolina and its people.[1] In order to efficiently and effectively fulfill its three-pronged mission of education, research and scholarship, and public service in the 21st century, the University should proactively anticipate and identify the needs facing our state over the next twenty years and, consistent with its mission, develop and implement responses to those needs.

Our Goals

Our goal is to produce a more proactively responsive University focused on meeting the challenges of the state over the next 20 years. To achieve this goal, we must answer three basic questions:

- 1. What challenges facing our state do North Carolinians want UNC to respond to?
 - 2. How can UNC best respond to these challenges?
 - 3. How can UNC sustain this focus over the long-term?

To answer the first two questions, we will identify what challenges our state faces both now and in the future, how we are currently meeting them, where there are gaps, and how we can close those gaps efficiently and affordably. We will examine issues facing our state in areas such as community and economic transformation, technology transfer, innovation and entrepreneurship, education, health, environmental and natural resources, cultural and societal enrichment through the arts and humanities, and civic engagement. We will identify ways to meet those needs through programs and curricula, scholarship and research efforts, and public service engagement.

Recognizing that the needs of our state will evolve over time, we must do more than *become* more demand-driven – we must *remain* demand-driven. To answer the third question, we will identify systemic changes in our own processes, such as program consideration and long range planning, so that we can, in future years, identify needs proactively, respond nimbly, and assess our effectiveness.

Our work will center on the three prongs of UNC's mission: Teaching, Research and Scholarship, and Public Service.

Recommendations and responses will be identified within each of these areas.

Our Process

With our partners and oversight by the UNC Board of Governors, UNC will undertake this initiative through a four-part process:

1) Preparation - February - July 2007

Work with campuses to analyze *what* they are currently doing to meet present and future challenges facing our state and their region and *how* they identify those challenges; conduct internal review of existing resources; and synthesize and update existing reports and studies.

2) Assessment - August 2007 - January 2008

Meet with business, nonprofit, community, policy, and governmental leaders in each of the state's regions and in statewide sectors to hear from them what they need from UNC over the next twenty years; Commission issues report and recommendations to UNC BOG.

3) Response - February 2008 - May 2008

Develop a response to identified needs by UNC and each campus consistent with UNC's mission as well as systemic changes to internal processes to ensure continued focus in future years. The UNC BOG will approve response plans.

4) Implementation - June 2008 - January 2012

Implement responses at the UNC and campus level by integrating responses into missions, programs, and curriculum, and assessing progress toward goals.

Our Partners

- The UNC Board of Governors will oversee the initiative, ensure that the work remains appropriately focused, and participate in campus-related work and regional public meetings. The Board has final approval of all recommendations.
- Campuses will be asked to form work groups to analyze past response to the state's needs, determine campus
 capacity to respond going forward, and to follow, inform, and respond to the findings of the Commission. Campus
 participation includes administration, faculty, and students.
- The **UNC Tomorrow Commission**made up of business, education, government, and nonprofit leaders from across the state will be charged with learning "what the people of North Carolina need from their University over the next twenty years" and making recommendations to the Board of Governors.
- Faculty will provide both research and advice to the Commission through a Scholars Council. The Council will synthesize previous studies, research relevant issues and trends, develop focused "framing" questions for regional and sector public meetings, attend meetings, and assist the Commission in developing its recommendations.
 - UNC General Administration will direct the day-to-day work of staff, campuses, the Commission and the Scholars Council throughout the initiative.
- A **Response Team** made up of General Administration staff and representatives from the Scholars Council, the Commission, and the Board of Governors, will develop a clear, comprehensive plan for responding to and implementing approved recommendations.

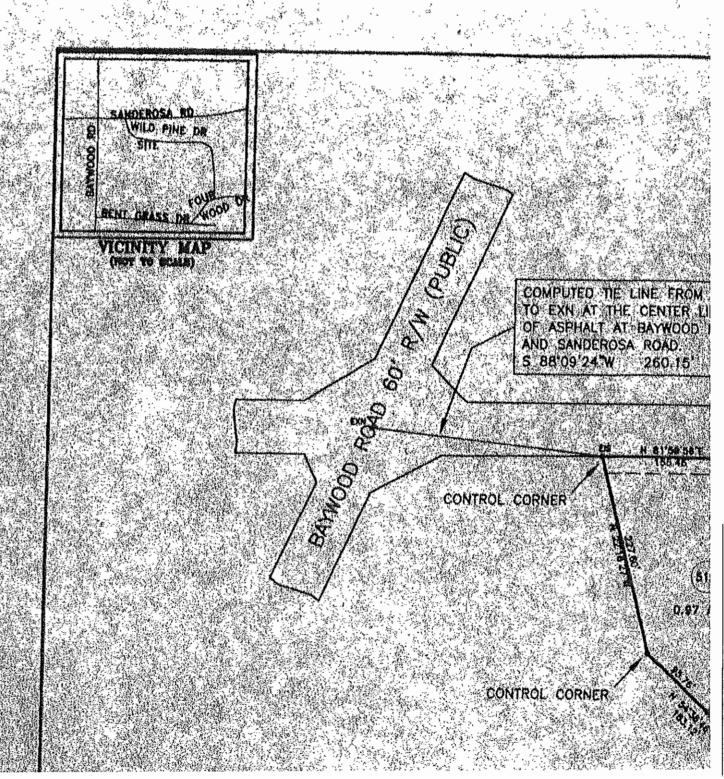

FOR ANN STREET LANDFILL - GAS COLLECTION & CONTROL SYSTEM

BACKGROUND

Cumberland County entered into an agreement with Camp, Dresser & McKee (CDM) in March, 1993, to provide engineering services for the design of a lateral expansion of the Ann Street Landfill in compliance with Federal RCRA Subtitle D requirements. These regulations require lateral expansions of landfills to be fully lined with synthetic liners and provide leachate collection and treatment systems. The agreement with CDM has been amended during the past 14 years to incorporate revisions to the scope of services as the Subtitle D landfill has expanded.

Attached is a copy of Amendment #7 to the agreement to provide engineering services related to the expansion of the Gas Collection & Control System (GCCS) at the Ann Street Landfill. The County is required to install and operate a GCCS in compliance with the requirements of the New Source Pollution Standards (NSPS) which are administered by the NCDENR-Division of Air Quality (DAQ). The County entered into a Special Order by Consent (SOC) with the NCDENR-Environmental Management Commission, effective December 5, 2007, which sets forth the terms and timetable for compliance. The scope of services, some of which have been completed in advance of this amendment, are described in detail in the amendment and are summarized as follows:

- 1. <u>Pre-permitting Assistance</u> CDM has assisted the County with correspondence, supporting data and attended meetings with DAQ, County representatives and DTE Biomass to support the County's position with respect to compliance with NSPS and the Notice of Violation (NOV) from DAQ.
- 2. <u>Permitting</u> CDM has prepared and submitted to DAQ an addendum to the original GCCS permit with documentation and data necessary to identify the sufficiency of the existing GCCS within the Subtitle D landfill. Based on information provided by DAQ, CDM prepared and submitted a new GCCS Design Plan meeting the requirements of NSPS.

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- 3. GCCS Final Design CDM has prepared the GCCS final design incorporating the design plan approved by DAQ with the most recent landfill survey. Construction plans, specifications and an opinion of probable costs have been prepared. CDM has provided assistance with bidding the project, review of bids and prepared a certified bid tabulation and recommendation of contract award for the County's consideration.
- 4. General Services During Construction (Construction Administration) CDM will provide construction administration services which shall include construction oversight estimated at 3 days per week during the construction of the GCCS. CDM will conduct construction meetings at least two per month, prepare written minutes of the meetings, review contractor submittals, respond to contractor requests for information, review and approve monthly pay applications and other administrative services. CDM will attend Substantial and Final Completion walkthrough, review record drawings, and prepare, certify and submit the construction quality assurance report to DAQ.
- 5. <u>Special Order by Consent Assistance and Support</u> CDM has assisted the County through the development of the SOC and will provide necessary compliance documentation as a part of the construction administration services outlined above.

Compensation for services rendered will be on a time and material basis in accordance with Exhibit "C", Rate Schedule, and shall not to exceed \$317,301.00. The general breakdown of costs is \$61,788 for preparation of the Construction Documents and Bidding Assistance, \$136,924 budgeted for Construction Services, and \$118,589 for Pre-permitting, Permitting and SOC Assistance which represents about 60% of CDM's actual costs for these services.

In a spirit of compromise and as an accommodation to the County, Amendment #7 also provides for CDM to pay, on behalf of the County, the Environmental Management Commission the sum of \$35,000 as stipulated in the SOC.

The County Attorney's Office has reviewed this amendment for legal sufficiency and monies are available in the Solid Waste Department Fund Balance to fund this request.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

The recommendation of the County Engineer, Solid Waste Director and management is to:

- 1. Approve Amendment #7 of the Agreement with CDM for engineering services related to the Gas Collection & Control System Phase I for the Ann Street Subtitle D Landfill in the amount not to exceed \$317,301.00.
- 2. Approve the attached budget revision.

The proposed action by the Board of Commissioners is to follow the staff recommendation.

AMENDMENT NO: 7 TO AGREEMENT BETWEEN OWNER AND ENGINEER

This Amendment No. 7 is made and entered into this ______ day of December, 2007 to the Agreement between Camp Dresser & McKee ("ENGINEER") and Cumberland County ("OWNER") dated March 12, 1992, ("the Agreement").

WHEREAS, ENGINEER and OWNER entered into the Agreement for the Professional Services related to engineering; design; bidding and construction for the Ann Street Landfill, and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the Agreement so as to amend the scope of work, time periods of performance and payment, and/or responsibilities of OWNER; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provides that any amendments shall be valid only when expressed in writing and signed by the parties.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual understandings and Agreements contained herein, the parties agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

1. The Basic Services of ENGINEER as described in the Agreement are amended and supplemented as follows:

BACKGROUND:

Cumberland County owns and operates an active municipal solid waste (MSW) landfill in Fayetteville, Cumberland County, North Carolina. The MSW landfill is located at the County's facility known as the Ann Street Landfill (Landfill). The Landfill is located at 698 Ann Street in Fayetteville and serves as a collection and disposal point for the MSW generated within Cumberland County.

Cumberland County has assigned the ownership rights to the landfill gas at the Landfill to DTE Biomass Energy, which in consideration of this transfer of rights has installed, operates, and maintains the Gas Collection and Control System (GCCS). On January 24, 2002, the County submitted the initial GCCS Design Plan to the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources, Division of Air Quality (DAQ); which addresses the collection and control of landfill gas in the closed out portion of the Landfill and identifies the means for collection of landfill gas during early operational stages of the Subtitle D landfill. On January 31, 2002, DAQ approved the initial GCCS Design Plan.

Upon construction of the Phase I expansion of the Subtitle D landfill, the County exceeded the design capacity (in-place waste plus unused permitted capacity) and had a calculated uncontrolled non-methane organic compound (NMOC) emission rate over 50 Mg/yr. As a result, the County was required to install and operate a GCCS meeting the performance criteria of the New Source Pollution Standards.

The County initially relied upon connection of the GCCS to the leachate collection system for gas collection since Phase I was in the early operational stages and had not yet reached elevations appropriate for additional vertical gas collection wells. This system for gas collections is typical for landfills with insufficient waste heights to facilitate the installation of vertical gas collection wells. The expansion of the GCCS, via the leachate collection system, provided sufficient gas collection based upon the quarterly surface emissions monitoring results, which indicated no reportable emission exceedances in accordance with NSPS guidelines. Due to the consistent and positive quarterly surface emission results, the County continued to follow the existing GCCS Design Plan. In June 2005, the DAQ conducted a second review of the initial GCCS Design Plan and determined that the Design Plan for the Subtitle D portion of the Landfill was insufficient. The determination that the initial GCCS Design Plan was incomplete prompted the DAQ to rescind the original GCCS Design Plan approval and issue the County a Notice of Violation (NOV).

Since September 2005 CDM has worked in support of the County to gain an understanding of and address DAQ's specific concerns outlined in the NOV. CDM also worked to develop and gain DAQ approval of an amendment to the County's GCCS Design Plan. From September 2005 through June 2006, CDM attended four meetings between the County and DAQ and one meeting between the County and DTE Biomass. CDM also prepared, for the County, informational packages and written correspondence as requested by DAQ and worked with the County's legal staff to assist in review and negotiations of the DAQ's Special Order by Consent (SOC), eventually resulting in a negotiated settlement between DAQ and the County that requires amendment to the existing GCCS, payment of a \$35,000 fine, and other requirements.

CDM has supported the County's efforts to plan, permit, design, and construct a GCCS suitable to DAQ through the performance of the tasks defined below.

Task 1 – Pre-permitting Assistance

Since receipt of the NOV in June 2006 and prior to submission of the Final GCCS Design Plan, CDM has supported the County's position of compliance by providing, at the request of the County, historical data and documentation dating back to the original approved GCCS Design Plan such as: the original approved GCCS Design Plan; results of the quarterly emissions monitoring conducted in accordance with the guidelines set forth by NSPS showing no emissions in exceedance of the NSPS guidelines; and rationale and data supporting the sufficiency of the existing GCCS in the Subtitle D landfill.

CDM has prepared correspondence, which presented this data in support of the County's position and has also prepared correspondence in response to a number of requests made by DAQ. CDM views the preparation of this correspondence and participation in these meetings essential in providing a basis of understanding for DAQ's expectations for the GCCS and for satisfactory resolution of the SOC.

Task 1.1 - Pre-permitting Correspondence

CDM has prepared and submitted on behalf of the County correspondence with supporting data to DAQ to both support and clarify the County's position, and in response to comments received by DAQ. CDM has also provided correspondence to the County Manager and DTE Biomass. The date and purpose of each correspondence submitted by CDM is as follows:

- February 2, 2006 Preparation of Response to DAQ Comments
- March 14, 2006 Preparation of Response to DAQ Comments (Data Request)

- April 18, 2006 Preparation of Response to DAQ NOV and letter to County Manager
- May 8, 2006 Preparation of Response to DAQ
- May 13, 2006 Preparation of Response to DTE Biomass Letter
- June 29, 2006 Preparation of Response to DAQ

Task 1.2 - Meetings with DAQ and Biomass

CDM also attended five meetings involving the County and DAQ or DTE Biomass. These meetings were held to discuss the requirements of the NSPS and the existing GCCS, clarify the reason for the NOV and discuss the compliance issues related to the NOV as viewed by DAQ. Preparation and attendance for the following meetings are included in this task.

- September 19, 2005 Meeting with County and DTE Biomass
- October 28, 2005 Meeting with DAQ and County
- January 25, 2006 Meeting with DAQ and County
- June 6, 2006 Meeting with the County and DTE Biomass
- July 19, 2006 Meeting with DAQ and County.

Task 2 - Permitting

As part of the approved permit and SOC, Cumberland County is required by the DAQ, through the SOC, to install and have operational Phase 1 of the Cumberland County Ann Street GCCS no later than June 1, 2008. As part of the requirements of the SOC and to ensure the deadlines set forth by the SOC are met, CDM has provided and is currently providing professional design and construction services for the County, which include completion of the final GCCS design, preparation of Construction Documents, assistance during the Bid process and administration and oversight of the Construction Contract. The tasks for said work are detailed below.

Task 2.1 - Permitting - September 2006 Addendum

CDM prepared an addendum to the original GCCS for submittal to DAQ on September 22, 2006 in response to previous meetings and correspondence. The purpose of the submittal was to amend the original GCCS permit, providing documentation and data identifying the sufficiency of the existing GCCS within the Subtitle D landfill. The amendment included documentation identifying the requirements of the NSPS and how the requirements were met by the existing system, LANDGEM results showing the gas generation over the life of the Landfill, and the existing collection system data based on information provided by DTE biomass. A portion of the documentation used in the addendum along with the LANDGEM results were also used in the final GCCS Design Plan .

Task 2.2 - Revised GCCS Permit Submittal

Based on information provided to CDM by DAQ during a meeting on January 19, 2007, CDM prepared and submitted a new GCCS Design Plan on February 15, 2007 to meet the requirments set forth by the draft SOC. The new GCCS Design Plan submittal included a written narrative, supporting calculations, drawings, and details for the GCCS at the time of landfill buildout as requested by DAQ. The submittal was reviewed by DAQ and comments were submitted to the County asking for additional information. CDM responded to comments received by DAQ on April 5, 2007. Following the response, DAQ requested the County and CDM attend a meeting at DAQ's office to discuss the previous submittals. The meeting was held on April 20, 2007. CDM presented a summary of the overall GCCS design and answered questions from DAQ during the meeting. As a result of the meeting, CDM was asked to revise the GCCS Design Plan to include the GCCS phasing of the overall GCCS Design Plan previously submitted for the Subtitle D landfill. The phasing included preparation of additional drawings, which delineated GCCS installation and other specific work to be accomplished as the Subtitle D landfill's elevations changed up to final Subtitle D landfill buildout. The GCCS Design Plan was also amended to provide additional measures as required by DAQ to ensure coverage of the GCCS, which were outside of CDM's recommendations. CDM resubmitted the GCCS Design Plan on April 27, 2007, which was conditionally accepted with minor modifications. The final GCCS Design Plan submittal, which included the revisions as part of the conditional acceptance were submitted by CDM on June 14, 2007.

The costs incurred by CDM for the February 15, 2007 submittal and April 5, 2007 response to comments were covered under CDM's 2006-2007 Professional Services Contract between CDM and the County. Costs incurred beyond the April 5, 2007 submittal were not accounted for in CDM's 2006-2007 Professional Services Contract with the County and have resulted in CDM incurring additional costs. A breakdown of the costs incurred are provided as follows:

Meeting - April 20, 2007 - \$4,740 Submittal - April 28, 2007 - \$15,627 Final Submittal - June 14, 2007 - \$1,037

Task 3 – GCCS Final Design Services

Task 3.1 -GCCS Final Design

CDM prepared the GCCS final design by incorporating the approved GCCS Design Plan with the most recent landfill survey. CDM also reviewed the updated topographical survey with the County to discuss immediate operational changes needed to expedite construction and potentially reduce construction costs and long term operational changes needed for future GCCS development. Once final operational decisions were agreed upon, CDM provided final GCCS design plans and specifications, which incorporated operational decisions and provided gas collection for Cells 1 through 8 based on the most current landfill grades, while maintaining the intent of the approved GCCS Permit.

Task 3.2 - Construction Document Preparation

CDM prepared a set of Construction Documents suitable for bidding, which included Construction Drawings and Construction Specifications for the GCCS. The Construction Documents included preparation of six Construction sheets and preparation of Specifications, which included the County's front end documents and followed the EJCDC format. The Construction Sheets included: existing conditions, project control, two GCCS layout sheets, and two detail sheets.

Task 3.3 - Project Review Meetings

CDM attended two meetings with the County during the design and one meeting with DTE Biomass to review the GCCS Construction Documents.

Task 3.4 - Opinion of Probable Construction Costs

CDM provided the County with a revised Opinion of Probable Construction Costs at 95 percent completion.

Task 3.5 - Bidding Services

CDM assisted the County in advertising and obtaining bids for the GCCS project. CDM organized and attended a pre-bid conference and maintained a record of prospective bidders to whom Bid Documents were distributed. CDM sold and distributed the Bid Documents directly to Bidders and used the money received from the sale of the Bid Documents to offset the costs of shipping and duplication. CDM attended the bid opening, tabulated the results, and provided a recommendation for award of the contract.

Task 3.6 - Re-advertisement for Bid

CDM assisted the County in readvertising the project due to insufficient Bidders. As part of this readvertisement CDM prepared a final addendum, which changed the Bid date and answered final Contractor questions. CDM also attended the Bid opening resulting from the readvertisement.

Task 3.7 - Erosion and Sedimentation Control

CDM contacted NCDENR Land Quality in reference to the project Erosion and Sedimentation Control Plan to indicate that the project will use existing measures to capture runoff from construction activities.

Task 4 - General Services During Construction

Task 4.1 - General Services During Construction

General services will include both administrative services and construction oversight. Administrative services will include administering the contract, review of shop drawings and payment applications, response to contractor questions and preparation of change orders (if needed). The project is estimated to be substantially complete within 26 weeks. Construction oversight is estimated for three days per week during the 26 week period ending at substantial completion and includes travel from CDM's Raleigh office to the landfill and onsite representation for 10 hours each day to ensure that construction is in compliance with the Contract. Given the importance of the project, CDM has budgeted two construction progress meetings per month not including substantial and final completion. In addition, CDM has included a contingency in the event of unforseen conditions during construction, which require the Engineer's presence for more than 3 days per week or longer than 10 hours per day.

Task 4.2 - Project Closeout

Project closeout will include attendance of a Substantial and Final Completion walkthrough, review of record drawings, and preparation and certification of the construction quality assurance report to the DAQ following completion of the Phase 1 installation of the GCCS.

Task 5 – Special Order by Consent Assistance and Support

<u>Task 5.1 – Special Order by Consent Assistance and Support</u>

CDM assisted the County with the review of multiple iterations of DAQ's SOC, the development of recommended revisions in the County's best interest for use during negotiations, review and research into the technical aspects of the gas collection system, coordination with DAQ staff on technical matters, preparation for hearings with DAQ, the compilation of files requested by DAQ, and the preparation for planned depositions by the Attorney General's office that were cancelled once an equitable settlement was reached between the County and DAQ. This effort was critical to reducing the fine recommended by DAQ by over \$35,000.

2. The responsibilities of OWNER as described in the Agreement are amended and supplemented as follows:

The Owner will provide CDM an updated topographical survey of the Subtitle D Landfill Cells 1-8.

3. The time periods for the performance of ENGINEER's services as set forth in the Agreement are amended and supplemented as follows:

CDM will provide Construction Documents, ready for advertisement within 30 days of the approval of the GCCS Permit.

CDM will deliver the final bid evaluation and recommendation within 7 days of the Bid Opening.

CDM will provide final closeout documentation including the construction quality assurance report to NCDENR DAQ and the OWNER within 60 days Final Completion.

4. The payment for services rendered by ENGINEER shall be as set forth below:

The services described in Section 1 of this Amendment will be completed on a time-and-material basis for a not to exceed fee of \$317,301. Labor costs will be charged in accordance with the rates outlined in Exhibit C. Direct project expenses and outside consultant costs (if necessary) will be charged at cost as described in the original Amendment and are included in the not-to-exceed fee. The not-to-exceed fee will not be exceeded without prior written authorization from the OWNER. For informational purposes only, the not-to-exceed is broken by task as follows:

- 5. Except as herein modified, all terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. The following Special Provisions are hereby made part of this Amendment:
 - 1. Cumberland County (OWNER) has entered into a Special Order by Consent ("SOC") dated November 28, 2007 and made effective on December 5, 2007 with the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources Environmental Management Commission ("COMMISSION") for the Cumberland County Ann Street Landfill ("LANDFILL");
 - 2. Section II I. of such SOC reads as follows: "The LANDFILL [Cumberland County] agrees to pay or cause to be paid to the COMMISSION \$35,000. This sum is due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this ORDER. This payment shall not be used in any way by the DAQ as an admission of any of the facts or conclusions asserted in any of the documents referenced in paragraph I.G. or 1. I"
 - 3. ENGINEER agrees, in a spirit of compromise and as an accommodation to OWNER, to pay on behalf of OWNER, the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources Environmental Management Commission the sum of thirty five thousand dollars (\$35,000). Such payment will be made before December 31, 2007 following execution of this Amendment No. 7.
 - 4. For and in exchange for the payment referenced in Paragraphs 3 above, the compromises represented by such payment and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, OWNER does hereby for itself and its successors and assigns release, quitclaim, and forever discharge ENGINEER and any and all of its related, predecessor, affiliated and subsidiary companies and divisions and each of their insurers, shareholders, directors, officers, agents and employees, successors and assigns from any and all claims, rights, demands, causes of action, losses, damages, actions, suits, obligations, contracts and liabilities (hereinafter collectively referred to as "claims") of any and every kind and description, whether known or unknown, and whether arising at law or equity, which it now has or may have in the future regarding or in any way relating to the additional costs and attorney fees the OWNER incurred relating Cumberland County Ann Street Landfill v. North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources Division of Air Quality, (Administrative Hearing 07 EAR 0604 and 0664 and to defend its position against the COMMISSION, and to negotiate and implement the SOC.
 - 5. ENGINEER and OWNER understand, covenant and agree that the Special Provisions of this Amendment No. 7 is a compromise of disputed claims and that the payment herein is not to be construed as an admission of liability on the part of either of them, both of whom expressly deny any liability to the other.

6. ENGINEER and OWNER state that representatives of each of them have carefully read these Special Provisions and know and understand the contents and effect thereof, and that the legal effect of these Special Provisions has been fully explained to each Party by each Party's counsel, and that the execution of the same is a purely voluntary act. The Parties further agree that any rule of construction of contracts resolving any ambiguities against the drafting parties shall be inapplicable to this Agreement.

These balers have not been in service since 1997/1998 and to have them removed it would cost us \$110,000. The person purchasing the balers will remove them from the building at no cost to the County.

MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 20, 2007

Mr. Lloyd reviewed the site information and stated the staff recommends approval of the R40A district based on the following:

- Although the request is not consistent with the 2010 Land Use Plan, which calls for Low Density Residential at this location, the request is consistent with current and proposed developments in this area; and
- 2. The R40A district is in character with the current uses and zoning of the properties in the general area.

Case P07-81 Continued

The R40 zoning district is the other suitable zoning district to be considered for this site.

Mr. Lloyd stated there was one person to speak in opposition. Neither the applicant nor owner was present.

Public Hearing opened.

Mr. George R. Hatcher spoke in opposition. Mr. Hatcher stated that this rezoning is not consistent with the 2010 plan. Mr. Hatcher stated that a plan should be provided and he will continue on with his opposition. Mr. Hatcher stated that to his knowledge there have been no tests done as to the suitability of the land for structures to be placed on it. He has not been furnished with any information about what is going on with the land around him. Mr. Hatcher stated that there is a water table problem in the area. In order for him to accept the zoning, it should be rezoned to R40. Mr. Hatcher also recommended city water be in place before the first mobile home is built. Rezoning R40 with septic tanks is acceptable, but there should be some kind of approved drainage system in place.

Vice-Chair Epler asked Mr. Hatcher how large the property is that Mr. Hatcher owns, with the single wide mobile home.

Mr. Hatcher responded 2.43 acres.

Vice-Chair Epler stated that within that 200 ft. stretch of highway, there are 8 mobile homes. Vice-Chair Epler asked if Mr. Hatcher felt that the proposed mobile homes would not be consistent with the 8 that are currently there.

Mr. Hatcher stated that he owned a mobile home, owned three at one time and has one left, which he will not have much longer.

Mr. Turner asked Mr. Hatcher how much of the area is wetlands on the subject property.

Mr. Hatcher said 3 acres and the wetlands is scattered throughout.

Mr. Lloyd stated that the wetlands would have to be delineated.

Mr. Lloyd stated that we now fall under Phase II Stormwater regulations. The development of the subject property is going to be more than an acre; therefore, the NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) will have to approve drainage plans of all subdivisions approved since July 1. With respect to stormwater drainage, it will be reviewed by DENR at the State level. R40 is also a suitable district.

Vice-Chair Epler asked if R40 was low density.

Mr. Lloyd stated that R40 would be a lot less units than this. R15 and R10 are considered low density.

Vice-Chair Epler asked if the 2010 Land Use Plan calls for this property to be low density.

Mr. Lloyd stated that this would be fewer units than the 2010 Plan recommendation.

Case P07-81 Continued

Public Hearing closed.

Mr. McLaurin stated that there have been a lot of single and double wide mobile homes in this area, but there are also quite a few abandoned homes in the area right now. It seems that the whole road has been evolving for quite some time. It seems that the direction that this road is going, from what I see, as well as what the 2010 Plan asks for, the staff said it is consistent with proposed developments, what proposed developments that I know of and developments that are going on right now, are not consistent with anything that's happening. Everything that's going on out there is stick built type dwellings and there are some very nice dwellings down Cedar Mills Road from there all the way up. Things are evolving, so I would not say that this zoning request is consistent with the direction that this neighborhood is headed, and it's not consistent with the 2010 Plan.

Mr. McNeill stated that since the applicant is not here, and I know he is not requesting R40, he's requesting R40A, has the possibility of R40 been discussed?

Mr. Lloyd stated that it had been discussed with the applicant's agent. The agent said that that R40 would be alright.

Ms. Speicher stated that the agent said R40 would be alright with him, but he couldn't get in contact with his client, so he couldn't say how the client would feel.

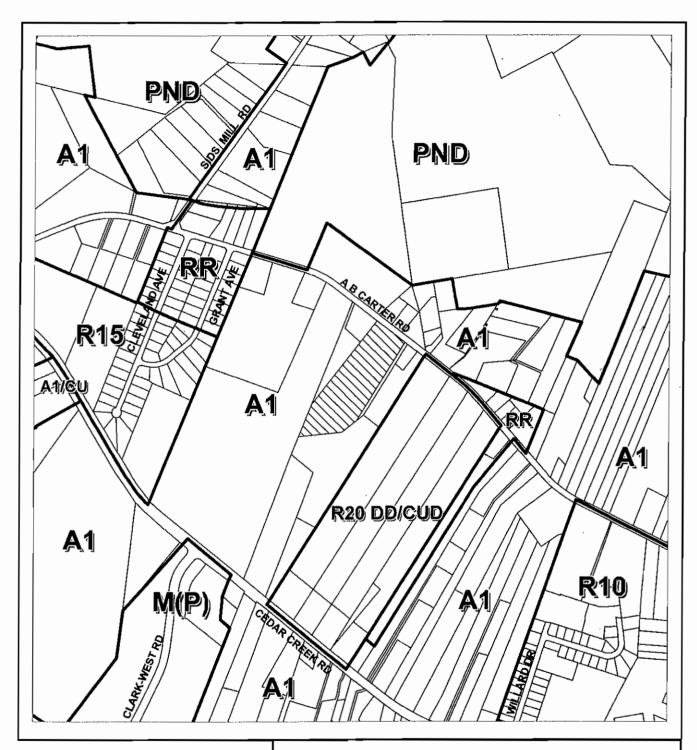
Mr. McNeill stated that it looked like R40 zoning would satisfy at least two of the three parties involved. I always think that R40 is preferable to R40A, simply because there is more protection for the surrounding property owner. But, I'm a little disappointed that the petitioner is not here and has not responded, and his agent did not give a definitive answer. I would like to see the petitioners answer the question, and that may answer some of Mr. Hatcher's concerns, if R40 is acceptable to the petitioner.

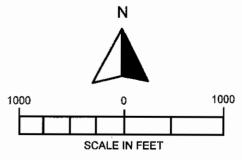
Mr. Lloyd stated that the petitioner was notified and knew the meeting was tonight.

BACKGROUND:

On October 16, 2006, the Board of Commissioners adopted a revised Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance and new Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) for Cumberland County resulting from the North Carolina State 2001 Floodplain Mapping Program initiative. The revised ordinance and maps became effective on January 5, 2007.

Subsequent to this action, several errors in the FIRMs, which were identified during the public comment period prior to adoption, have now been corrected resulting in new FIRMs being published. The revisions of maps/indexes to the FIRMs include:

- Revised map index 37051CIND0B effective June 18, 2007, 37051CIND0C effective July 17, 2007, and 37051CIND0D effective December 18, 2007.
- Revised FIRMs map panels 3720044700K and 3720051300L effective June 18, 2007, 3710956000M effective July 17, 2007 and 3710956000L effective December 18, 2007.

The County's Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance does not have an automatic adoption clause for updates, therefore any changes to the FIRMs or ordinance requires that the FIRMs be readopted and that the ordinance be reapproved with the changes. Attached is a copy of the draft revised Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance. The ordinance has been revised to incorporate changes in the NC Model Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance developed by NCDEM - Floodplain Management Branch in 2007 as well as to incorporate the map revisions. The significant changes are marked in bold typeface. NCDEM recommends that communities use the model ordinance and tailor it to the specifics of the community.

Celebrating Our Past...Embracing Our Future

The County must adopt the revised ordinance and FIRMs on or before December 18, 2007. Failure to do so may result in suspension from the National Flood Insurance, revocation of all flood policies, and becoming ineligible for Federal and State disaster assistance.

In addition, to the County's requirements for amending our ordinances, there is a procedure from NCDEM and FEMA which must be followed that includes:

- Publication of the Notice of Public Hearing which must be no less than a one-half page notice in a
 newspaper with general circulation in the community. We intend to combine the notice for the
 unincorporated portion of the County together with the notice for the small municipalities (Falcon,
 Godwin, Linden, Stedman, Wade and Eastover (pending)) whose floodplain management programs
 we administer through interlocal agreement.
- Notice of Public Hearing must be posted throughout the community. We intend to post the notice
 at the Volunteer Fire Departments.
- Property Owners within the SFHA that do not reside in the community must be given notice by first class mail. The small towns will be responsible for any first class mailings required in their community.

The proposed schedule to complete these tasks is as follows:

- Present the draft ordinance to the Board of Commissioners at its November 19, 2007 meeting and request the date for the public hearing be set for December 17, 2007.
- Publish Notice of Public Hearing in the Fayetteville Observer on November 26, 2007.
- Post Notice of Public Hearing at volunteer fire departments during the week of November 26-30, 2007.
- Develop list of property owners in the SFHA that do not reside in the community and require notification by first-class mail. Notification of the public hearing will be mailed no later than November 30, 2007.
- Public Hearing on December 17, 2007 at which time the Board adopts the revised ordinance and FIRMs.

The revised ordinance has been reviewed by the County Attorney's Office for legal sufficiency.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

The recommendation of the County Engineer, County Attorney and management is to set the date for the required public hearing on the proposed revisions to the Cumberland County Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance and FIRMs for 7:00 pm, December 17, 2007 and instruct staff to proceed with the tasks outlined above in the proposed schedule.

The proposed action by the Board is to follow the staff recommendation.

The property owner who will be titled as the owner of the land within the right-of-way must ensure that a "No Approval Required" recombination plat be approved by the Planning and Inspections Department and recorded in the Cumberland County Registry, thus absorbing the land area within the right-of-way to be closed into the adjoining properties.

The Board has called a public hearing to consider this request. The Board may close the road if it finds that no person will be denied reasonable egress or ingress to his/her property.

RECOMMENDATION AND PROPOSED ACTION: If the Board of Commissioners makes the required statutory finding and decides to close Gray Street, that the Board adopt the attached resolution and direct the staff to record it in the Cumberland County Registry.

NOW THEREFORE, the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners hereby RESOLVES, pursuant to authority granted by G.S. 153A-241, that the public street more particularly described below be, and it is hereby, closed, subject, however to the continued dedication and preservation of an easement therein for existing and future utilities, and of an easement therein for public safety emergency vehicle access:

Beginning at the southwest corner of Lot 4 as shown on Plat Book 14, Page 9, entitled Property of Brooks Peele as recorded in the Cumberland County Registry; thence with the eastern most margin of Gray Street North 435.6 feet to the northwest corner of

Lot 10 of said plat; thence with a northwestern direction 22 feet along the southern property line of Charles M. Dent property (Book 5178, Page 888) to the northeast corner of Lot 11 of said plat; thence with the western most margin of Gray Street South 435.6 feet to the southeast corner of lot 3 of said plat; thence with the northern margin of Bonnie Doone Road (now Shaw Rd) 22 feet east to the beginning.

And the Board further RESOLVES, that a certified copy of this Resolution be recorded in the Cumberland County Registry.

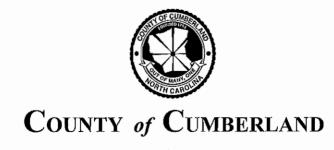
