MOHAMMAD BHUIYAN, Ph.D.

Dr. Mohammad Bhuiyan is the Endowed Professor of Entrepreneurship and the Director of the Center for Entrepreneurship at Fayetteville State University. He has over eighteen years of experience in dealing with entrepreneurship issues. For his outstanding work in the entrepreneurship field, Dr. Bhuiyan was awarded 2005 Prestigious Appel Prize by Babson College. He is also the President & CEO of Global Trading and Consulting, Inc., a company that works with start-up ventures as well as major corporations. He also has been the director of a national entrepreneurship program for last seven years, where he works very closely with many Fortune 500 companies, federal agencies, all branches of military, MIT, Stanford University, Syracuse University, Carnegie Mellon University, Babson College, Dartmouth College, UT Austin, Rice University, Emory University, Northwestern University, Indiana University, University of Michigan, Duke, UNC Chapel Hill, and many others.

Dr. Bhuiyan received his Ph.D. degree from the University of Florida, two MBAs from Georgia State University and the Indian Institute of Management-Bangalore. He has also received leadership and other educational trainings from the Center for Creative Leadership, Emory University, Duke University, American Council on Education, UC-Berkley, MIT, Harvard University KSG and Harvard Business School.

He has worked as a marketing executive and consultant for the British American Tobacco, Pfizer, UNDP, FAO, and a number of other corporations. Before joining Fayetteville State University, Dr. Bhuiyan served as Assistant Dean, Department Head, and faculty member at Hampton University, Fort Valley State University, Clark Atlanta University, Savannah State University, University of Florida and the University of Dhaka. His main teaching and research interest are in the areas of international business management and entrepreneurship. He offers training programs for business executives and others on "Global Business Culture" (how to deal with people from different cultures and different ethnic background), "Leadership Development," and "Negotiations."


As a true international expert, he has lived in, worked and traveled to Argentina, Australia, Bangladesh, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, France, Germany, Greece, India, Italy, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, Peru, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, South Africa, Spain, Switzerland, Taiwan, Thailand, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom and the United States. For his outstanding contribution and leadership, The City Council of Savannah adopted a proclamation to proclaim May 31, 1996 as "Dr. Mohammad Bhuiyan Day," and The County of Chatham Commission also adopted a proclamation to proclaim May 24, 1996 as "Dr. Mohammad Bhuiyan Day," Dr. Bhuiyan also received numerous awards including Outstanding Teacher and Outstanding Leadership Awards.



Judicial District 12, Division of Community Corrections continues to provide quality supervision to probationers, parolees, and/or post release offenders with our primary mission being public safety.

Staff

In Judicial District 12, the emphasis is on managed treatment for offenders under a strict regimen of treatment, monitoring, and supervision. The Division of Community Corrections has a staff of 74. The staff is headed by Judicial District Manager Wayne Marshburn, Assistant Judicial District Manager Jonette Quenum, and six Chief Probation/Parole Chief Probation/Parole Officer Kathy Blackmon supervises our Judicial Services unit housed at the Cumberland County courthouse. This unit is responsible for processing probationers from court, submitting crime versions on inmates who will be released at some future time, plus supervising approximately 150 offenders who have rated as low risk/low need offenders. This unit also includes service coordinators community supervising approximately 350 probationers who have been sentenced to do community service.

Chief Probation/Parole Officer Paul Hatch supervises our Special Operations unit which specializes in administering several sanctions and programs to include the Day Reporting Center, the Sex Offender Control program, the Electronic House Arrest program, and Drug Treatment Court. The remaining Chief Probation/Parole officers. Gearonie Locklear, Jim Massengill, Terry Paige, and Sharon Young supervise field units located at the Community Correction Center at 412-A West Russell Street.

We have a total of fifteen Community Officers supervising approximately 1,250 regular probation cases, twenty six Intermediate Officers supervising approximately 1.270 intermediate cases, one intermediate officer serving on the U.S. Marshal's Task Force, six Intensive Case Officers supervising approximately 185 intensive cases, and nine Intensive Surveillance Officers supervising approximately 410 absconders. For this past fiscal year we averaged supervising 3.143 offenders.

Our Partners

The Division of Community Corrections shares facilities with the Cumberland County Day Reporting Center and Treatment Accountability for Safer Communities (TASC). Also housed in our facility is the Substance Abuse Screening Lab who serves not only the Division of Community Corrections but the Division of Prisons, Court, TASC, the Office of Juvenile Justice, and the Juvenile Detention Center. Our setup is unique within the state and is ideal for the treatment and control of the offenders.

Last year the Day Reporting Center, whose director is Callie Gardner, provided the following services to 145 offenders: Substance abuse education/monitoring, intensive substance abuse counseling, employment services, educational services, and social/life skills training. The average cost per day for the Day Reporting Center is \$13.70 as opposed to \$68.45 a day to house these same offenders in the state prison.

TASC, headed in Cumberland County by Elizabeth Caldwell, is a specialized community resource agency equipped to work with chemically dependent offenders who are sentenced to Probation and/or who are involved within the criminal justice system. TASC identifies the offender's needs and matches them with available treatment services within the Area Program and other community resources. TASC served 1,085 offenders during the last fiscal year.

Ongoing Initiatives and Programs

For the past three years Probation/Parole Officer Bert Turner has been assigned to the *U.S. Marshal's Fugitive Apprehension Task Force*. This involves a commitment from our District to have an officer work full time with the U.S. Marshals apprehending high profile violent absconders. Our officer is cross trained and is a sworn U.S. Marshal. From July 2006 until June 30, 2007 the total number arrested by this Task Force statewide was 895. The number arrested in Fayetteville was 390. Thirty eight probation fugitives were apprehended. This task force has played an important role in apprehending some dangerous offenders. We plan to continue a vital working agreement with the U.S. Marshal's Fugitive Apprehension Task Force this next fiscal year.

Since December 2004 Judicial District 12 has operated a *Drug Treatment Court*. This is one of our toughest sanctions with emphasis being placed on managed treatment for offenders under a strict regimen of monitoring, court appearances, curfew, and social responsibility. The Division of Community Corrections plays a vital role in the supervision of offenders selected to participate in this program. During the past fiscal year we supervised thirty-six probationers. We have twenty-one now enrolled. We had six graduations with eight graduates. Statistics reveal that offenders have an 80% chance of never being a recidivist if they successfully graduate from Drug Treatment Court.

The Division of Community Corrections continues addressing the problems of gangs through our Community Threat Group Program. The goal is to identify and document gang offenders, identify and deter patterns of gang activity, and target offenders for appropriate supervision and treatment. Intensive Officer Robert Porter continues to serve as our

Community Threat Group Officer. As such he works closely with local law enforcement as well as state resources on gang problems.

Operation Cease Fire is a joint venture with federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies, as well as community resources cooperating, in a unified offensive to identify violent and repeat offenders and employ prevention and intervention techniques to stop the violence in our neighborhoods. Lisa Jayne is the Cease Fire Coordinator. Our probation officers continue to provide valuable assistance in identifying targeted offenders, transportation to the "call-in" meetings, and rapid response to violations of probation. During FY2006-2007 three call-in meetings were held; 89 offenders were targeted and 47 participated.

This year two additional officers joined the Sex Offender Management Program as Global Positioning System Sex Offender Officers. New equipment has been obtained which allows for improved supervision of sex offenders in our community. New laws have been passed giving stricter guidance in the supervision of sex offenders. On January 1, 2007 our first sex offender was hooked-up for global positioning We are working closely with the Sheriff's Department in identifying and supervising those cases that are eligible for this type of supervision. Improved system-wide management of sex offenders in the community is our goal. The ultimate goal is to prevent further victimization. Treatment, behavior modification, and supervision along with interagency collaboration and sex offender registration are all components of the Sex Offender Management Program. Our Sex Offender Officers consistently maintain a total caseload of 110 to 120 sex offenders.

Our *Domestic Violence* initiative provides a strong family violence intervention program which includes victim safety, punishment and control of the offender and appropriate batterer's treatment. In Cumberland County we have three officers who specialize in supervising offenders convicted of domestic violence crimes. They work closely with the Department of Social Service's CARE Program, court officials, law enforcement agencies, victim advocates, and treatment providers in an attempt to break the cycle of violence within our families and communities.

Criminal behavior is often the result of an erroneous thought process. This concept behind Cognitive Behavioral Intervention (CBI) entails having an understanding of the thinking behind our behavior and the consequences of our actions. Cognitive behavioral training can enable changes in the criminal thought process, producing more socially acceptable behavior. Cumberland County Division of Community Corrections has five trained facilitators in CBI with two being Master Trainers. Partnering with other trained facilitators from the Day Reporting Center, an eleven week course titled "Thinking for a Change" is offered to the offenders through the Day Reporting

Center. Last fiscal year fifty-six offenders participated in CBI.

In 2003 Judicial District 12 established the Soldiers Project in conjunction with the Fort Bragg Provost Marshal's Office to ensure that U.S. Military service members and their dependents which are under our supervision are fulfilling the provisions of their probation and any court-ordered treatment. We work closely with the military chain of command providing and receiving appropriated information and having ready access to our offenders. An office is provided at the Provost Marshal's Office on Fort Bragg. A Memorandum of Agreement was renewed this past fiscal year.

Public Relations

This past fiscal year Combined Campaign, headed by Assistant Judicial District Manager Jonette Quenum, again exceeded our goal of \$4,000 by collecting \$5,583.46. For the third consecutive year our staff was presented a state award for the most per capita giving for the State Employees Combined Campaign. Our staff participated in the March of Dimes Walk America and received the circle of champions bronze award. Our staff was also responsible for collecting \$1.043 for Muscular Dystrophy. We also helped organize and participated in two blood drives. Our staff takes pride in community participation.


This past year District 12 was again honored to have the Division Officer of the Year. Hubert "Bert" Turner was selected for his "contribution to the Department, which was above and beyond the call of duty" and "high productivity, having a significant positive effect on a program and exceptional work."

Officer Turner, who works with the U.S. Marshal's Fugitive Apprehension Task Force, was also honored as one of four state-wide winners.

On December 22, 2006 Officer Bert Turner was at Ruby Tuesday Restaurant in Hope Mills when one of the patrons began having a stroke. The restaurant General manager, Victor T. Mason, writes: "Upon our incident of a patron having a stroke in our restaurant, Bert Turner, took total control of the situation and kept everyone calm, as the patron's wife was borderline hysterical. He was quick, professional, and had already called paramedics before I knew what was happening." Mr. Mason adds, "He was obviously trained well to act under pressure."


In another letter of commendation received from Harry E. Tyson, Chief of Police Wilson, North Carolina, he writes: "We would like to commend you for your efforts and involvement in the recent investigation of an Aggravated Assault that occurred in the City of Wilson on August 7, 2006. This was a very violent crime because the victim was shot numerous times and will be paralyzed due to his injuries." Speaking of Bert and the other members of the Task Force, Chief Tyson says..."they did an outstanding job and are assets to the department."

End of Fiscal Year Parole/Post Release Population




The population for Parole/Post Release supervision has increased by 9% from FY2002-FY2007 but decreased by 5% since FY2006.





BACKGROUND:

Attached is Change Order #1 (Final) for Owens Roofing Inc., in the amount of \$14,417.00 for additional work required on the Winding Creek Mental Health, Mental Health Annex and DSS Facilities Roofing Project. This project is a unit price contract and the change order reconciles the actual quantities installed versus the estimated quantities in the contract. It includes credits to the County of \$4,190.00 and additions to the Contractor of \$18,607.00 for a net increase of \$14,417.00. The significant item encountered during construction was the poor condition of the metal deck on the roof of Winding Creek Mental Health Center discovered after the roof was removed. There was an allowance of 100 sf of metal deck replacement in the contract, however, 3,062 sf of metal deck was actually replaced at an increased cost of \$14,810.00.

At the time of bid award, the Board established a contingency in the amount of \$9,700.00 for the project. The shortfall of \$4,717 required to fund this change order will come from the line item established for roof maintenance and repair work in 4195 - General Government Budget.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

The recommendation of the County Engineer, Mactec Engineering, and management is to approve Change Order #1 (Final) for Owens Roofing, Inc., in the amount of \$14,417.00 for the above referenced roofing project and increase the contract amount to \$208,131.00.

The proposed action by the Board is to follow the staff recommendation.

RECOMMENDATION OF FINANCIAL ADVISOR

BACKGROUND

Management made a recommendation, at the August 2, 2007 Finance Committee Meeting, that the County seek the services of a Financial Advisor for our upcoming debt issuance. We believe that this issuance of debt will require a high level of planning and coordination and that County staff will benefit from the assistance of experts in municipal finance that have no financial stake in the financing. The Committee agreed that Management should proceed forward by issuing a Request for Proposal (RFP).

A RFP was developed and sent to eight firms. The RFP included the following scope of services to be provided:

- 1. Review and evaluate the County's financing plans, policies and practices and recommend an overall financing strategy.
- 2. Assist the County in preparing for and structuring individual financings including: advice on financing structure and assistance in the development of official statements, legal documents, and other documents.
- 3. Assist the County in obtaining credit ratings and/or municipal bond insurance including development of a rating agency presentation.
- 4. Keep the County apprised of capital market conditions and trends and make recommendations regarding the timing of sales and structuring of offerings so as to achieve the lowest possible interest rates.
- 5. Assist the County and underwriters in developing marketing plans for the offerings that meet the capabilities of the underwriters and insure the lowest possible interest rates.
- 6. Provide advice and recommendations on the day of sale regarding interest rate levels, issue structure, and effectiveness of the marketing effort.

- 7. Following a sale, assist the County with matters pertaining to closing and settlement, advice on efficient investment of proceeds to maximize earnings, and follow-up calculations for the official statement, tax certificates, and other legal documents.
- 8. Additionally, assist the County in evaluating other possible financing issues such as: a synthetic (swap-based) advance refunding and review of a public-private venture.

We received five responses to the RFP for Financial Advisor Services. Management reviewed these proposals and selected two firms for formal presentations to a committee made up of Management and Finance Office staff. We also included the Finance Officer from the Board of Education on the committee due to the potential public-private venture for the new Western Elementary School. Presentations were given by DEC Associates, Inc. and First Southwest Company to our committee on October 24th and October 25th respectively.

First Southwest Company is a national financial advisory and investment banking firm, with a branch office in Charlotte. They maintain their own trading and underwriting desk in Texas which will assist them in monitoring market conditions. Their staffing for the project includes a former credit rating analyst based in Texas and the former director of the debt management section of the Local Government Commission.

DEC Associates, Inc. is a small, one office firm that specializes only in financial advisory services to clients. As a result, they monitor market conditions through advice from trading desks from several large firms. They believe this to be an advantage since they have the perspective from more than one underwriting desk. The principal of the firm is Doug Carter who spent most of his career at the Local Government Commission and then at the City of Charlotte as Finance Officer before moving into the public finance business as a Financial Advisor.

The committee unanimously agreed that both firms are highly competent and technically proficient and both firms are poised to serve the County as Financial Advisor. After much consideration, it was decided that DEC Associates, Inc. should be the recommendation to the Finance Committee. That recommendation is based upon the following.

- Their overall approach to this financing by establishment of a financial plan after development of a thorough understanding of the County.
- Their extensive experience with public-private ventures.
- Their enthusiasm on the rating agency presentation and the potential for a bond rating upgrade.
- Their knowledge and understanding of Cumberland County and other local governments in North Carolina.

The fee proposed by DEC Associates, Inc. for the financial advisory services related to the COPS issuance is \$35,000 and out-of-pocket expenses capped at 10% of the fee. The expense for these services will be incorporated into the total financing package.

RECOMMENDATION

Management recommends engaging DEC Associates, Inc. as Financial Advisor for the upcoming COPS issue for the County.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

BACKGROUND

On October 15, 2007, the Board approved an interlocal agreement between the Board of Commissioners and the Board of Education which allows the schools to receive sales tax refunds from school construction projects. Under this agreement, the County will designate the Board of Education as its agent for letting contracts, funding the project within an established budget, and for supervising construction.


BACKGROUND: On or about July 6, 2006, the County acquired by tax foreclosure the above property. The amount currently owed on the foreclosure judgment including interest and cost for the property is \$3,184.60.

Sondra Roberts was the last and highest bidder offering to purchase the County's interest in the property for \$4,662.58 and has deposited \$466.26 in the Finance Office. The tax value of the property is \$9,850.00.

This property is surplus to the needs of the County and, according to N.C.G.S. 153A-176 and N.C.G.S. 105-376, the County has the authority to sell such property. Management has reviewed this offer and it is now being submitted for the Board to consider whether or not to accept Ms. Roberts' bid. The property has been advertised and several upset bids were received; however, Ms. Roberts was the final and highest bidder. The bid period is now closed.
