INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH TOWN OF EASTOVER

FOR FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT SERVICES

BACKGROUND

With the recent incorporation of Eastover as a municipality in Cumberland County, the Town must make application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to become a participant in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). The Town is requesting the County administer their floodplain management program through an interlocal agreement. The Town intends to adopt the County's Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance and will request FEMA produce new Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) for the corporate limits of Eastover.

Attached is the interlocal agreement that provides for Cumberland County through its Engineering Department to administer the floodplain management program required by FEMA. The Town of Eastover has formally approved the agreement. Presently, the County administers the floodplain management program for the Towns of Falcon, Godwin, Linden, Stedman and Wade. The interlocal agreement with Eastover mirrors the agreements in place with the above mentioned towns.

Administration of the floodplain management program for Eastover by the County Engineering Department will not have any adverse impacts on the department.

The interlocal agreement has been reviewed by the County Attorney's Office for legal sufficiency.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

The recommendation of the County Engineer and management is to approve the interlocal agreement with the Town of Eastover for floodplain management services.

The proposed action by the Board is to follow the staff recommendation.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS the COUNTY enforces the North Carolina Building Code in accordance with the provisions adopted by the Building Code Council and the Commissioner of Insurance; and

WHEREAS the TOWN has a current agreement with the COUNTY for enforcement of building code regulations within the TOWN; and

WHEREAS the COUNTY has adopted and enforces a Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance, and the TOWN will adopt the Cumberland County Flood Prevention Ordinance but does not have the capabilities for enforcement; and

WHEREAS the TOWN requests that the COUNTY administer and enforce the Cumberland County Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance within the TOWN, and the COUNTY has agreed to do so; and

WHEREAS the COUNTY and the TOWN, in order to set out the provisions and conditions under which said services will be provided to the TOWN by the COUNTY, enter into this interlocal agreement as authorized by Chapter 160A, Article 20, Part 1 of the General Statutes of North Carolina;

NOW THEREFORE, the COUNTY and TOWN agree that:

- 1. Purpose. The purpose of this agreement is to set forth in writing the terms and conditions upon which the COUNTY will furnish to the TOWN flood damage prevention administration and enforcement within the TOWN.
- 2. Term. This agreement shall begin <u>January 7</u>, 2008 and expire <u>June 30</u>, 2008, but shall be automatically renewed from year to year unless one party shall give to the other written notice of its intention to terminate the agreement at the end of the then current term, such notice to be given at least ninety (90) days prior to the end of such then current term.
- 3. Services to be provided. The COUNTY will administer and enforce its Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance within the TOWN.
- 4. Compensation. The COUNTY shall receive and retain as its compensation for its services provided hereunder all fees provided by ordinance for such services.
- 5. Amendments. Any amendment to the agreement shall be in writing and executed by the COUNTY and TOWN.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this agreement to be executed, and their official seals to be affixed by their duly authorized officers, in duplicate originals, one of which is retained by each part, the day and year first above written.

Approval of Proposed Waiver of the Fee for the Flu Vaccine

BACKGROUND

At the Board of Health meeting on December 18, 2007, the Board unanimously approved to waive the \$30.00 fee for the remaining doses of Flu Vaccine. There are approximately 800 available doses of purchased influenza vaccine in our inventory. The incidence of influenza has been minimal this year but the potential for illness remains until usually the spring of the year. With the increase in other community providers offering the vaccine, the demand has diminished. There are additional patients that will take the vaccine if it offered free of charge. This is helpful to those who have no health insurance or do not qualify for the free state vaccine. Waiving the \$30.00 fee increases the protection of the public's health.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

Management requests to have this item placed on the next County Commissioners' meeting agenda for their approval to waive the \$30.00 fee for Influenza vaccine for the remaining doses in inventory.

Subject: Bid Approval for New Roll-Off Container Trucks

A Pre-Bid Conference was held on August 14, 2007 prior to receipt of bids on August 22, 2007 for two new Roll-Off Container trucks. Three of the six bidders submitted two bids each.

After receiving the bids on the roll-off trucks and going through the bid specs we found that the \$239,900 two Tri-Point Sterling trucks were the low bids that met specs. Since we had never had any experience with a Sterling truck we knew that Atlantic Contract Company owned two trucks that were Sterling's. We had the opportunity to inspect these trucks for normal wear and tear versus design and construction of the vehicle. Based upon our inspection, we found the doors and dashing system to be in extreme poor conditions based on age of the vehicle; therefore we believe the bracing of the plastic dash is not sufficient to take the vibrations caused by conditions at the landfill. Since we have several Volvo trucks it is of our opinion that our second lowest bid truck that meets specs which is two Volvo trucks of \$242,166 would be the bid that we need to go with.

Cavalier equipment bid a truck that did not meet specs because of the wheel size and Amick Equipment Company bid a first truck that did not meet specs because of the engine size.

After reviewing the bids for the roll-off trucks, I recommend bid #2 from Amick Equipment for two Volvo trucks at a cost of \$121,083.00 each, total of \$242,166.00.

BACKGROUND: The Civic Center and the Fayetteville indoor football team (formerly the "Guard") have agreed to a License Agreement that provides for the team to play regular season homes games annually at the Coliseum. The team will play in and obtain a franchise from the American Indoor Football Association league. The license agreement will run for three seasons, through July 1, 2010, with a possible option term for a further three years. The team will pay \$4,000 for each pre-season, regular season or post-season home game, except that games on a legal or county holiday will be charged \$5,500. The Civic Center will receive other revenues from facility surcharges on ticket sales, concession sales, certain advertising signage, etc. The agreement provides for the team to provide a letter of credit to protect the Civic Center's interest. The License Agreement has already been approved by the Civic Center Commission and signed by Paul Beard as Interim CEO and on behalf of the team.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve consenting to renewal of License Agreement between the Cumberland County Civic Center and Fayetteville Sports and Entertainment, Inc., and authorize the Chairman to execute. A copy of the full agreement is available for review in the County Attorney's Office.


REAL PROPERTY ACQUIRED BY TAX FORECLOSURE

BACKGROUND: On or about October 4, 2004, the County acquired, by tax foreclosure sale, property previously owned by Joni and Gerald L. Wood at 5383 Ruffin Dr., Hope Mills, located in Grays Creek Township. The amount owed on the foreclosure judgment plus interest and costs is \$5.985.56.

Mr. & Mrs. Wood, who are living in the house and a former owner, has offered as the former owners to purchase the County's interest in such property and exercise their equity of redemption for \$5,985.56 and have deposited the \$5,985.56 with the Finance Office.

North Carolina General Statutes 105-376 and 160A-267 authorize the Board to resell property acquired by tax foreclosure to the former owner or any person having an interest in the property for an amount not less than the costs associated with the foreclosure and subsequent resale. This allows former owners or any person with an interest in the property to re-purchase their property, so long as the County is made whole, rather than putting the property on the open market.

PROPOSED RECOMMENDATION AND ACTION: That the Board of Commissioners consider whether to accept the offer of Mr. & Mrs. Wood to exercise their equity of redemption to repurchase the property described above for \$5,985.56.

PROGRAM APPLICATION

BACKGROUND: The State of North Carolina enacted the Job Maintenance and Capital Development Act (the "Program") to provide certain grants for companies that agree to invest at least \$200 million in capital expenditures, maintain at least 2,000 full time employees, and meet other specified criteria. Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company ("Goodyear") operates a manufacturing plant in Cumberland County which may qualify for grants under the Act. Goodyear has advised the County that it intends to apply for a grant under the Act.

One requirement of grants under the Act is that local government entities must participate in retention efforts and provide incentives equivalent to a tax credit of fifty percent of the additional incremental ad valorem taxes payable by Goodyear on the company's investment required under the Act, and such incentives must be provided over a period not less than five years or greater than ten years. The enclosed Resolution would commit the County to participate in providing such an economic development incentive, as required by the Act, which would be memorialized in an economic development incentive agreement to be entered into by the County and Goodyear after a public hearing as required by law.

Approving the Resolution would assist Goodyear in expediting submittal of its grant application to the North Carolina Department of Commerce.

RECOMMENDATION: Consider whether to approve Resolution agreeing to provide economic development incentives to Goodyear in support of its Job Maintenance and Capital Development Fund Program grant application, and authorize the Chairman to sign letter of commitment to State.
