REQUEST TO CHANGE THE VACCINE ADMINISTRATION FEE October 21, 2008

BACKGROUND

The Cumberland County Department of Public Health had been charging \$30.00 Administration Fee for vaccine administration regardless of how many vaccines a patient received.

Pursuant to the North Carolina Medicaid Special Bulletin II as it relates to Health Check Billing Requirements, Providers must use CPT Code 90471 or 90465 for one unit of administered vaccine. Providers must use CPT Code 90472 or 90466 for two or more units (each) of administered vaccine.

RECOMMENDATION

The Medicaid reimbursable rate for 90471/90465 is \$17.25 and 90472/90466 is \$9.71. We are requesting that the vaccine administration fee be changed to \$18.00 and \$10.00 respectively.

Background: Service America Corporation d/b/a Centerplate currently has the concession franchise at the Crown Center under a contract dated July 14, 2007. Centerplate is being merged into and will become a wholly-owned subsidiary of an affiliate of Kohlberg & Company LLC. Centerplate has requested that the County consent to this transaction. Rina Teran, Vice President and General Counsel of Centerplate has confirmed that after the merger and its acquisition by Kohlberg that Centerplate will continue to be subject to and honor all its contractual obligations under its concessionaire contract for the Crown Center. She also advised that Centerplate management will remain in place after the transaction.

BACKGROUND

On August 4, 2008, the Board of Commissioners awarded a contract to M&E Contracting in the amount of \$240,699.00 for the Life Safety Improvements Project at the Ann Street Landfill Baling Facility. The scope of work included repair to the automatic sprinkler system, fire alarm system, electrical system and other improvements in the baling facility required by the City Fire Marshall's Office for continued use of the building by the Solid Waste Department.

Attached is Change Order G-2 in the amount of \$42,274.13 for additional work on the above referenced project. The additional work is outlined in the Change Order document and includes items required by the City Fire Marshall's Office as well as replacement of defective plumbing, electrical and fire sprinkler system components that were not discovered until work began on the project. Change Order G-1 in the amount of \$16,778.27 was previously approved by the County Manager and was funded from the contingency established by the Board at the time of bid award. Sufficient monies are available in the Solid Waste Department budget to fund this Change Order.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

The recommendation of the County Engineer, Solid Waste Director, Detter & Associates, and management is to:

- 1. Approve Change Order G-2 for M&E Contracting in the amount of \$42,274.13 and increase the total contract amount to \$299,751.40 for the Life Safety Improvements Project at Ann Street Landfill Baling Facility.
- 2. Approve the attached budget revision.

That the signage for this Gevelopment be in accordance with the applicable sign regulations as set forth in Article XIII of the County Zoning Ordinance and that the proper permit(s) be obtained prior to the installation of any permanent signs on the property. Note: This conditional approval is NOT approval of the size, shape, or location of any signs.
- That all uses and setbacks be compatible with those permitted and approved for the MXD/CUD zoning classification.
- 10. That all applicable portions of Section 3.20 "Lot Standards" and 3.21 "Group Development", of the County Subdivision Ordinance be complied with.
- 11. That the developer shall contact Diane Shelton at 678-7665 for street name approval prior to submission of the final plat for approval. (Note: The approved street name shall be reflected on the final plat.)
- 12. That street name signs, in compliance with the Cumberland County Street Sign Specifications, shall be installed prior to final plat approval. The developer is responsible for contacting 678-7665, once the street name sign(s) are installed, to schedule an inspection of said sign(s) and notice of a satisfactory inspection must be received by Land Use Codes prior to the approval of the final plat.
- That Sections 4.1.c, "Curb and Gutters", 4.1.d, "Required Drainage", 4.1.e, and 4.3.g, "Fire Hydrants", and 4.3.h "Underground Utilities", of the Cumberland County Subdivision Ordinance must be adhered to.
- 14. That the final plat must be submitted to the Land Use Codes Section for review and approval for recording; and that the plat must be recorded prior to any permit application on any structure and/or prior to the sale of any lot or unit in this development.
- 15. That any/all easements appear on the final plat.
- 16. That all structures shall be shown on the final plat or that the final plat shall reflect the following statement:

"Nonconforming structures have not been created by this subdivision."

- 17. That notarized owners' signature(s) and certifications appear on the final plat prior to approval.
- 18. That the NC Department of Transportation approves street plans and that the street(s) be constructed to the N.C. Department of Transportation standards for secondary roads.
- 19. That the NC Department of Transportation stamp be affixed to the final plat prior to final plat approval by the Land Use Codes Section.
- That the developer needs to obtain a driveway permit from the NC Department of Transportation.
- 21. Turn lanes may be required by NC Department of Transportation.
- 22. That a 10' x 70' sight distance easement shall be required at the intersection of the Hope Mills Bypass and the proposed right-of-way.
- 23. That a 25' right-of-way radius shall be required at all intersections.

- 24. That all lighting shall be directed internally to the property and shall meet the standards of Section 1102.M, Outdoor Lighting, Cumberland County Zoning Ordinance.
- 25. That a solid buffer in accordance with Section 1102.G., Cumberland County Zoning Ordinance, be complied with.
- 26. The developer shall summit two copies of a revised plan to the Land Use Codes Staff for approval showing the location of all dumpster, garbage, and utility areas prior to permits being issued.
- 27. That all dumpster, garbage, and utility areas shall be located on concrete pads and screened on a minimum of three sides.
- 28. That all required parking spaces shall be a minimum of 9' X 20' and shall be surfaced and striped with a permanent material such as asphalt or concrete.
- 29. That off-street loading areas shall be provided in accordance with Section 1203, County Zoning Ordinance, and that a revised plan showing the required loading spaces shall be submitted to the Land Use Codes Section for approval prior to any permits being issued.
- 30. That the owner/developer is responsible and liable for maintenance and upkeep of this site, all structures, and appurtenances, to include insuring that the site is kept free of litter and debris, all grass areas mowed, all buffers and shrubbery kept trim and maintained, so that the site remains in a constant state of being aesthetically and environmentally pleasing.
- 31. That the developer not be required to connect to the street stub shown as "Sycamore Drive" in the adjacent subdivision since this portion of the right-of-way is blocked and the developments are naturally separated by a creek.
- 32. That the site be developed in accordance with the application and site plan.
- 33. That all Federal, State, and local regulations be complied with.

In addition to the approval by the Board of Commissioners, a permit is required to be obtained from the Code Enforcement Section, Planning and Inspections Department. They are located at 130 Gillespie Street, Room 101 and can be reached at 321-6654.

- ACTION: Members present at the October 21, 2008 meeting voted unanimously to recommend approval of Conditional Use Permit, the Board also approved motor vehicle sales and trailer rentals.

MINUTES OF OCTOBER 21, 2008

Mr. Lloyd reviewed the site information and stated the staff recommends approval of the request for C(P) Planned Commercial/Conditional Use District for retail and other permitted uses; however, the staff does not recommend approval of all the requested uses; the staff's recommended allowable uses for this district are:

- a. Apparel & Accessory Sales
- b. Locksmith, Gunsmith
- c. Photography Studio
- d. Repair, Rental & Servicing
- e. Retail or Servicing
- f. Office Use
- g. Restaurant
- h. Variety, Gift & Hobby Supply Sales

This recommendation is based on the following:

- 1. Even though the C(P) Planned Commercial district is not consistent with the 2010 Land Use Plan, which calls for medium density residential at this location, the recommendation is reasonable because the area is in transition to non-residential uses; and
- 2. The recommendation would allow for uses appropriate within an *entrance corridor* to both the County and the Town of Hope Mills.

The C1(P) Planned Local Business and C2(P) Planned Service and Retail districts could also be found suitable at this location.

The Planning & Inspections Staff also recommends approval of the Conditional Use Permit based on the following:

- 1. The recommended use will not materially endanger the public health and safety if located according to the site plan submitted;
- The use will meet all required conditions and specifications if constructed according to the site plan, application and conditions – a copy of the Ordinance-Related Conditions pertaining to this site is attached; and
- 3. The location and character of the use, if developed according to the site plan as submitted, will be in harmony with the area in which it is to be located.

Inherent in this recommendation, the Planning & Inspections Staff recommends that the Permit be restricted so that any use allowed cannot generate outside display and/or outside storage at this location.

Vice-Chair Epler asked for clarification purposes, if the requested uses that Mr. Lloyd read were the requested permitted uses, not what the planning staff recommends.

Mr. Lloyd stated that was correct.

Mr. Lloyd stated that the Planning & Inspections staff has no problem with the uses listed in the recommendation, but because this is an entrance corridor and the size and shape of the lot, more specifically the size of the lot, buffering would be virtually non-existent. For that reason we feel that any outside display or storage wouldn't be appropriate at this location.

Mr. Morris stated that this request doesn't comply with any of our existing setbacks. If the site plan is approved will a variance be provided for the setback?

Case P08-40 Continued

Mr. Lloyd stated no, the site plan as submitted will be approved by the conditional use permit, which essentially grants an alternate yard requirement for the setbacks.

Mr. Morris stated that we're granting a variance to the existing setbacks.

Mr. Lloyd stated in essence that was correct.

Micheal Nelson stated that he would prefer not to be sworn in because he is a pastor. Chair McLaurin had Mr. Nelson affirm to tell the truth.

Chair McLaurin swore in Mr. John Dawson Graham.

Mr. Nelson spoke in favor. Mr. Nelson stated that he is the applicant, and appreciates all the work that has been done on this. This piece of property is totally encompassed by highway. There is Department of Transportation property completely surrounding the subject property. Mr. Nelson stated that he concurs with what was approved, but would like to ask for some other approvals. He was advised that going through the conditional use process he would need any approval for any future uses he may have. Mr. Nelson stated that currently he is a licensed and bonded North Carolina car dealer. The vehicles that he sells are quality merchandise which is kept inside. Mr. Nelson stated that he feels he is being denied usage of some of these items which are already concurrently being used around this piece of property. Mr. Nelson stated that basically he agrees with what has been approved, but would like to also be able to use his motor vehicle dealer's license there. Mr. Nelson stated that he doesn't plan on storing vehicles at this location; a fence has been placed on the property where he may display vehicles if it's ever needed, because there is a theft problem in the area. Mr. Nelson plans to clean the property up, removing and tearing down some unsightly buildings that are on the property. This will improve the tax base and also improve the gateway into Fayetteville. Mr. Nelson stated that he can't see any reason why he can't have some of the requested uses. He has no plans to deface the County; he would just like to improve upon his chances for a successful business.

Chair McLaurin stated that when requesting a conditional use you're asking for special consideration and for that consideration you greatly reduce the uses and generally we know exactly what you are going to do. The conditional use was designed for special needs.

Mr. Lloyd stated that in the past, any use that the applicant feels they may want to do in the future has to be considered now.

Mr. Nelson stated that he was advised that he should list any uses that he might use it for. He was told a conditional use would have better success than a total rezoning to C(P). It is at present a more restrictive zoning, in fact it's M(P) Manufacturing with C(P), which already has display on it. I am actually putting it at a better use with what is being recommended.

Chair McLaurin asked if under the present zoning how many uses you have.

Mr. Nelson responded a manufacturing site for storage buildings and sales and other miscellaneous things.

Mr. Lloyd stated that Mr. Graham is the owner and Mr. Nelson is the prospective buyer.

Chair McLaurin stated that generally when a conditional use is granted here we usually know, within reason, what is going to be taking place. You have uses that vary greatly.

Mr. Nelson stated that the only reason he listed those uses was because it was recommended that he do so.

Case P08-40 continued

Vice-Chair Epler asked Mr. Nelson about the statement he made about keeping his vehicles inside.

Mr. Nelson responded that presently he keeps all of his vehicles stored indoors in Cumberland County.

Vice-Chair Epler clarified that the vehicles are displayed indoors.

Mr. Nelson responded yes indoors, they are specialty cars, they are not normal cars. But he wants to be able to display the cars outdoors for sale. There is a problem in the area with theft and the plans are to place fencing up.

Vice-Chair Epler asked about Mr. Nelson's statement to enhance the property. Vice-Chair Epler asked if he was going to keep the existing building.

Mr. Nelson stated that he was going to tear down about three structures that are on the property now and remove other debris.

Ms. Hall asked Mr. Nelson about his indication of wanting motor vehicle sales, the question was can he have sales without storage.

Mr. Nelson responded that what he needs is sales. He feels that he should have the capability to conduct sales. Mr. Nelson stated that he was advised that he should list any uses that the property might be used for in ten years, and that's what he did.

Ms. Hall asked if motor vehicle sales covered retail and wholesale.

Mr. Lloyd stated that it does.

Ms. Hall stated that wholesale wouldn't be needed, just sales.

Mr. Graham spoke in favor. Mr. Graham stated that he was present to answer any questions that the Board may have. Mr. Graham stated that it was his understanding that what was on the property now needs to be removed.

Vice-Chair Epler asked Mr. Graham if he lived down the street from the subject property.

Mr. Graham stated that was correct.

Vice-Chair Epler asked if he was aware of the permitted uses that were being asked for and if he would continue to be a neighbor of the property and if there were any uses that he would have a problem with as a neighbor.

Mr. Graham stated no. He stated that he had been in the area for twenty years, and he doesn't believe anyone would oppose.

Public hearing closed.

Mr. Morris stated that it worries him that we would provide all of these variances.

Vice-Chair Epler asked if the landscape requirement could be met with the current site plan.

Mr. Lloyd stated that they should be with the setback waivers.

Vice-Chair Epler stated that in granting the waivers we are not granting a variance to the landscaping ordinance.

Mr. Lloyd stated no.

Mr. Morris asked if a waiver was being created with the parking at four thousand square feet and seventeen parking places.

Mr. Lloyd stated no, the parking, unless specifically listed which is just the dimensional uses, the other requirements can be met, with the waiver on the setbacks.

Mr. Morris asked what the current setbacks are.

Mr. Lloyd stated the setbacks are 50' for the front and 30' for the side and rear.

Mr. Morris stated that his dilemma is if we don't do something with the property it will become a wasteland and will stay that way. The other thing is if we start using site plans to create waivers and variances than we open Pandora's box. We need to be clear on that.

Mr. Turner asked how many residences are around the subject property and were they notified about this case.

Mr. Lloyd stated that thirty-five addresses were notified.

Ms. Hall asked Mr. Lloyd if the applicant could, with the C(P)/CUD with limited uses including the motor vehicle sales come back at a later date and request something else.

Mr. Lloyd responded that the applicant could do that.

Mr. Morris asked what the speed limit was in the area.

Chair McLaurin stated it was 45 on Marracco Dr. and 55 on Highway 301.

Vice-Chair Epler stated that she would really like to see this property improve. She doesn't necessarily agree with all of the requested permitted uses, some of those we might be able to include and add to the staff recommendations. I don't have a problem adding motor vehicle sales or trailer rentals. The rest of the requests, even though there is mini-warehousing and storage facilities in that area, I don't feel the site is large enough to add those. We don't typically see those on a site this small. I'm afraid if that business were

tried on this area it might not make it and we would end up with another dark building. I would like to see that property improve and I don't have a problem adding those two uses to the ones that the staff has recommended. I understand his desire to watch out for his future as a business owner and the future of his family that he may leave this to someday, but we also have to see this from the point that you may decide that five years from now this site isn't working for you and your son may decide that he doesn't want to use it either, we have to keep in mind that what we approve here tonight may go to someone that doesn't have quite as noble motives as you do down the road. We really have to watch out for that neighborhood and that corridor into our town and into our County.

A motion was made by Vice-Chair Epler and seconded by Ms. Hall to approve the Conditional Use Permit as recommended by the staff for apparel & accessory sales, locksmith, gunsmith, photography studio, repair, rental & servicing, retail or servicing, office use, restaurant, and variety, gift & hobby supply sales, the Board also recommends approval of the uses of motor vehicle sales and trailer rentals after finding that when completed, the proposal: 1) will not materially endanger the public health and safety; 2) will not substantially injure the value of adjoining or abutting property; 3) will be in harmony with the area in which it is to be located; and 4) will be in conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan or other plan officially adopted by the Board of Commissioners. Unanimous approval.

Ordinance Related Conditions

Pre-Permit Related:

- 1. Prior to application for any permits, the storage building manufacturing and sales currently approved for this site must have ceased with all display buildings removed from the site.
- 2. Prior to application for any permits, the developer must submit for staff site plan review and approval for the initial uses(s) and also submit for re-approval of any subsequent change in use(s).

Permit-Related:

- 3. The owner/developer(s) of these lots must obtain detailed instructions on provisions of the County Zoning Ordinance and permits required to place any structure within this development from the County Code Enforcement Section, Room 101 in the Historic Courthouse at 130 Gillespie Street. For additional information, the developer should contact a Code Enforcement Officer.
- 4. The County Health Department must approve sewer plans prior to application for any permits. Site and soil evaluations must be conducted on the property by the County Environmental Health Department prior to application for permits. <u>A copy of the Health Department approval must be provided to Code Enforcement at the time of application for any building/zoning permits</u>. (Note: All Health Department requirements must be met prior to issuance of final permits.) (Section 2306 A, Water and Sewer, County Subdivision Ordinance)
- Connection to public water is required; the Public Works Commission (PWC) must approve water plans prior to application for any permits. <u>A copy of the PWC approval must be provided to Code Enforcement at the time of application for building/zoning</u> permits. (Section 2306 A.1, Public Water and Sewer Systems County Subdivision Ordinance)
- 6. The developer must provide a site-specific address and tax parcel number at the time of building/zoning permit application.
- 7. Landscaping must be provided in accordance with Section 1102 N, Landscaping, County Zoning Ordinance and/as shown on the site plan. The following are the minimum standards for the required landscaping of this site:
 - a. Twelve large shade trees or 23 small ornamental trees within the front yard setback area along US HWY 301 (Gillespie Street);
 - b. Three large shade trees or six small ornamental trees within the front yard setback area along Crossover Road;
 - c. Twelve large shade trees or 24 small ornamental trees within the front yard setback area along SR 2274 (Marracco Drive);
 - d. Five ornamental trees and 48 shrubs are required in the building yard area;
 - e. One large shade tree or two small ornamental trees are required within the parking area.

In addition:

- a. Required plant materials shall be maintained by the property owner, including replacing dead or unhealthy trees and shrubs.
- b. All yard and planting areas shall be maintained in a neat, orderly, and presentable manner and kept free of weeds and debris.
- 8. The building final inspection cannot be accomplished until a Code Enforcement Officer inspects the site and certifies that the site is developed in accordance with the approved plans.

Site-Related:

9. All uses, dimensions, setbacks and other related provisions of the County Subdivision and Zoning Ordinances for the C(P)/CUD zoning district must be complied with, as applicable.

Note: See case file, minutes of the meetings and the final approval letter for restricted list of allowable uses.

- 10. This conditional approval is not approval of the permit for the freestanding sign. Attached signage for this development must be in accordance with the applicable sign regulations as set forth in Article XIII of the County Zoning Ordinance and that the proper permit(s) must be obtained prior to the installation of any permanent signs on the property. (Note: This conditional approval is not approval of the size, shape, or location of any signs.)
- 11. For all new development, an adequate drainage system must be installed by the developer in accordance with the NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources' (NCDENR) *Manual on Best Management Practices* and all drainage ways must be kept clean and free of debris. (Section 2306 D, County Subdivision Ordinance)
- 12. For all new construction, all utilities, except for 25kv or greater electrical lines, must be located underground. (Section 2306 C, County Subdivision Ordinance)
- 13. The developer must obtain a driveway permit from the NC Department of Transportation (NCDOT). <u>A copy of the approved</u> driveway permit must be provided to Code Enforcement at the time of application for building/zoning permits.
- 14. All lighting is required to be directed internally within this development and comply with the provisions of Section 1102 M, Outdoor Lighting, County Zoning Ordinance.
- 15. All dumpster, garbage, and utility areas shall be located on concrete pads and screened on a minimum of three sides.
- 16. All required off-street parking spaces shall be a minimum of 9' x 20' and shall be surfaced, with a permanent material such as asphalt or concrete, and striped prior to application for the building final inspection. A minimum of 20 off-street parking spaces are required for this development.
- 17. A minimum of one off-street loading space measuring 12' x 25' with a 14' overhead clearance is required to be provided for this development.
- 18. In the event a use is approved that would allow for outside open storage, the outside storage area must be completely screened from view from any public right-of-way; chain link fencing cannot be used to satisfy the buffer requirement. (Sec. 1102.G, County Zoning Ordinance) (Note: The staff recommendation is for no outside storage and no outside display to be permitted on this site.)
- 19. All notes and calculations as shown on the site plan are to be considered as a part of this conditional approval.

Other Relevant Conditions:

- 20. Any changes to the desired uses require re-submittal and re-approval by the County Board of Commissioners for the Conditional Use District; any changes to the Permit, including the site plan and/or layout of this site, must be submitted for review and approval and dependant upon the extent of the approval may require re-submission to the County Board of Commissioners.
- 21. The applicant is advised to consult an expert on wetlands before proceeding with any development.
- 22. The owner/developer is responsible for ensuring easements which may exist on the subject property are accounted for, not encumbered and that no part of this development is violating the rights of the easement holder.

23. Every deed created for a lot being served by an on-site water and/or sewer system must contain the following disclosure when filed with the County Register of Deeds:

"Public water and/or sewer services are not available as of the date of the recording of this deed. On-site sewer disposal systems must be approved by the County Health Department."

SUBJECT: REPORT ON PARKS AND RECREATION BOND REFERENDUM AND FUNDING OPTIONS

BACKGROUND

At the June 16, 2008 meeting, management was directed to report back in November regarding a Parks and Recreation Bond issue and options for funding.

City and County Staff have met to consider these matters and our consensus is that the timing and current economic conditions are not right for a bond referendum for the foreseeable future. Funding options are attached for funding "Joint Projects".

Further, County staff believes there is a need for a unified method of funding both the County and City Parks and Recreation operations in order to facilitate a true consolidation of operations.

Currently, the City operates the County recreation district separate from the City system. This is due to dedicated funding from the Parks and Recreation Tax District for the County program and the need to account for these funds separately from City funds. This would advance a goal and need that was recognized in the contractual framework at the time of consolidating County Parks and Recreation with the City.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

Consider authorizing management to pursue with City Management, the development of a funding model that would not increase the current tax rate of the City or County, but perhaps would create a unified funding method.

Parks and Recreation Funding Options for "Joint Projects" October 30, 2008

Proposed Attributes of a "Joint Project"

- Located within Fayetteville or an unincorporated area of Cumberland County
- Available to all citizens of Cumberland County, or is designed for a group of citizens within Cumberland County such as senior citizens or individuals with disabilities
- Unique in character that will attract residents and visitors from all areas of Cumberland County
- Both entities consider the project a high priority and are willing to jointly fund the project

50/50/Basis

- □ City and County split the cost for joint projects 50/50
- □ Proposed by Parks & Recreation Advisory Board
- Observation:
 - The 50/50 basis would share the cost equally between the entities; however, City residents would pay more than their fair share if the County's share would be paid out of the County-wide general tax rate.
 - If the County's share would be paid out of the P&R district, those County residents would pay more than their fair share due to the population/tax base in the district vs. the population/tax base in the City.

Location Basis

- Location of the facility determines which entity pays
 - o City pays 100% if located within the City
 - o County District pays 100% if located within the County District
- o Observation:
 - Does this method really spread the cost to those residents that would use the facilities?
 - For example, if a regional sports field is constructed in the City for the purpose of providing fields for teams located throughout the County, is it appropriate for only City residents to pay for the facility?

Ropulation Basis

- City and District share in the cost of joint projects based on their relative share of total population
- Observation: Recommend City population exclude Fort Bragg residents since no property tax revenues come from residents living on the base.

Taxable Property Valuation Basis

 City and District share in the cost of joint projects based on their relative share of taxable property values

County-Wide Basis

- □ County pays 100% of the cost of joint projects.
- Observation:
 - Can hold a bond referendum
 - If projects benefit everyone in Cumberland County, including its municipalities, then all residents contribute an equitable share.
