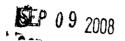

## <u>MEMORANDUM FOR BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MEETING OF NOVEMBER 3,</u> 2008

SUBJECT: PUBLIC HEARING ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVE

AGREEMENT WITH GOODYEAR TIRE & RUBBER COMPANY

**BACKGROUND:** The County has agreed in concept to provide an economic development incentive to Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company through 2021 in consideration of the Company making a capital investment of at least \$200 Million and up to \$300 Million in Cumberland County. The County's obligation to make any economic development incentive payments would be contingent upon payment of all property taxes due from the Company and would be determined by a formula based on property taxes actually collected.

The Company entered into a JMAC Grant Agreement with the State of North Carolina on September 17, 2008 providing for State grants of up to \$30 Million over a ten year period for capital investment of at least \$200 Million and maintaining 2,398 direct employees. The County's participation in economic development incentives to the Company, as provided in the proposed economic development incentive agreement, is a condition of the Company receiving the State JMAC Grant.

North Carolina requires that the Board of Commissioners hold a public hearing on the proposed economic development incentive agreement.

Under the agreement, the Company would invest at least \$200 million by December 31, 2013. The County would provide an incentive payment to the Company of half the property taxes actually paid by the Company, up to \$300 million investment by the Company through December 31, 2021. Incentive payments would be adjusted pro rata should the applicable property tax rates change. Also under the agreement, the Company would spend an amount equal to half of the fire and recreation taxes it pays to fund its fire brigade at the plant and to provide park and recreation services to its employees.

The incentive payments will be paid from the new, additional property tax revenues paid to the County on the Company's new capital investment of \$200 to \$300 million above the amount of the Company's taxable property as of January 1, 2007. Assuming an additional investment of \$237 million by December 31, 2013, and no change in applicable property tax rates, the Company would receive \$7,760,396.56 through January 31, 2022 in County incentive payments.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Hold public hearing to consider a proposed economic development incentive agreement with Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company and consider whether to approve agreement.

# THE GOODYEAR TIRE & RUBBER COMPANY AND CUMBERLAND COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

INCENTIVE AGREEMENT

Dated Effective as of January 1, 2008

INCENTIVE AGREEMENT

THIS INCENTIVE AGREEMENT is dated effective as of January 1, 2008 (as supplemented or amended, the "Agreement"), and is between THE GOODYEAR TIRE & RUBBER COMPANY, an Ohio business corporation (the "Company"), and CUMBERLAND COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, a public body politic and a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina (the "County").

#### RECITALS:

The purpose of this Agreement is to describe certain incentives to be provided by the County to the Company in connection with the Company's modernization of tire plant line[s], refits[s] and/or upgrade[s] and related improvements in the County to allow the Company better and more efficiently to respond to competitive market conditions and meet market demand for premium tire products, including refits and upgrades which the Company may undertake in the near future.

In connection with that purpose, the County's Board of Commissioners held a public hearing November 3, 2008, on the proposed incentives to be provided by the County to the Company, which incentives are set forth in this Agreement, and the Board of Commissioners found such incentives and this Agreement to be in the public interest and to further the public health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereby agree as follows:

#### ARTICLE I

#### DEFINITIONS; RULES OF CONSTRUCTION

1.01. <u>Definitions</u>. For all purposes of this Agreement, unless the context requires otherwise, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

"Business Day" means any day that is not a Saturday or a Sunday, or a day on which banks in the State are required by law to be closed.

"Direct Investment" means the cumulative total by the Company or on its behalf on the increase in taxable ad valorem value of all buildings, property, furniture, fixtures and equipment installed by the Company, including, without limitation, the value of capital and operating leases, regardless of funding source for any such items, over the ad valorem taxable value of such property as listed effective January 1, 2007. "Project" means the tire plant line[s], refit[s] and/or upgrade[s], and related improvements, to allow the Company to better and more efficiently respond to competitive market conditions and meet market demand for premium tire products, including refits, upgrades and associated improvements, which the Company has undertaken since January 1, 2007 and may undertake in the near future, to be constructed, renovated and/or added by the Company at its Site located on North Ramsey Street, Cumberland County, N.C. (the "Facility"), and includes all capital structures, furniture, fixtures and equipment used in connection therewith.

"Property taxes" means all ad valorem property taxes levied by the County, including its general county-wide levy, fire tax district taxes, fire service district taxes, and recreation service district taxes.

"Site" means the real property in the County upon which the Facility is located, as more specifically described in Exhibit A.

"State" means the State of North Carolina.

- 1.02. Rules of Construction. Unless the context otherwise indicates.
- (a) words importing the singular shall include the plural and vice versa, and words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine and neuter genders as well;
- (b) all references to Articles, Sections or Exhibits are references to Articles, Sections and Exhibits of this Agreement;
- (c) all references to officers are references to County officers, except for any reference to an officer of the Company; and
- (d) the headings herein are solely for convenience of reference and shall not constitute a part of this Agreement nor shall they affect its meanings, construction or effect.

#### ARTICLE II

#### FACILITY AND SITE RENOVATIONS

The Company is refitting and/or upgrading at the Site its tire manufacturing business and ability to respond to market demand for premium tire products, and intends and expects to undertake additional investments from time to time up to and including December 31, 2021. The Company currently operates a tire manufacturing plant at the Facility. The Company agrees that, in consideration of incentives for direct investment provided herein, it will make the Direct Investment. The incentives are intended to assist the Company in the expense of the Project.

The Company agrees that construction shall be, or has been, carried on in material compliance with all applicable State and local laws and regulations. The parties agree that the provision of water service, waste water services, roads, electric service, and telephone service to the boundaries of the Site are not the responsibility of the County.

#### ARTICLE III

## INCENTIVE PAYMENTS IN CONSIDERATION OF BENCHMARK MINIMUM LEVEL OF DIRECT INVESTMENT

The County approves an authorization for an inducement to the Company (the "Direct Investment Authorization") based on up to \$300,000,000 Direct Investment by the Company over the period up to and including December 31, 2021. Of that amount, the Benchmark Minimum Level of Direct Investment shall be \$200,000,000. The Company agrees to make the Benchmark Minimum Level, according but subject to the terms of this Agreement, and may but shall not be obligated to make additional Direct Investment above the Benchmark Minimum Level. If the Company in its discretion does make additional Direct Investment above the Benchmark Minimum Level ("Additional Direct Investment") the County agrees to provide the Company the incentive payments associated with such Additional Direct Investment, according but subject to the terms of this Agreement.

This Agreement is intended to be an inducement to the Company to provide Direct Investment in land, buildings, furniture, fixtures and equipment, including, without limitation, the value of capital and operating leases. The County agrees to make certain incentive payments to the Company as described and on the terms set forth herein, if the Company meets the Benchmark Minimum Level (as hereinafter defined); provided, however, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to require the Company to continuously operate the Facility, or to employ any number of individuals or make any required expenditures. Should the Company not meet the Benchmark Minimum Level as set forth below, the Company shall be entitled to receive only the adjusted amount of incentives as set forth in this Agreement, but under no circumstances shall the Company be obligated to make any payments to the County.

The Benchmark Minimum Level shall be as follows:

By 12/31/2013: \$200,000,000 Direct Investment

#### ARTICLE IV

#### **INCENTIVE PAYMENTS**

The County will fund and pay incentives to the Company associated with the Benchmark Minimum Level under this Agreement, payable to the Company in annual installments in amounts and for the period as set forth herein. The Company shall certify to the County Tax Administrator in January of each such calendar year of this Agreement the Direct Investment, for the year ended December 31 immediately preceding, whether or not the amount of the Direct Investment has changed during such year, beginning with January of calendar year 2008.

The County will provide the Company an annual incentive calculated as follows:

- i. The Target Annual Incentive Payment shall be \$554,314.04 based on the Benchmark Minimum Level of Direct Investment (estimated as 50% of the average annual property taxes projected to be paid by the Company through the fourteen year period ended December 31, 2021 on \$237,000,000 of Direct Investment);
- ii. The Target Annual Incentive Payment shall be multiplied by a percentage related to the Company's actual annual taxes paid, which percentage shall be calculated by dividing the actual annual property taxes paid by \$1,108,628.08.
- iii. The resulting product shall be the Actual Annual Incentive Payment.

Projected county-wide property taxes are calculated on an anticipated rate of 86 cents per hundred dollars of valuation. Projected fire protection district property taxes are calculated on an anticipated rate of 10 cents per hundred dollars of valuation. Projected fire protection service district property taxes are calculated on an anticipated rate of ½ cent per hundred dollars of valuation. Projected recreation service district property taxes are calculated on an anticipated rate of 5 cents per hundred dollars of valuation. The amount of any actual annual installment of an incentive payment will be adjusted to reflect any increase or decrease in those County property tax rates.

The parties acknowledge and agree that the methodology, calculations and examples above reflect and are derived from the "Values By Year" and "Goodyear Ten Year Rolling Incentive" spreadsheets both dated February 25, 2008, attached as Exhibit B and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.

The County shall calculate the incentive due the Company under this Agreement, and shall make the payment, if any, due the Company hereunder by issuance and delivery of its check (or other payment mechanism as agreed by the County and the Company) to the Company by January 31 of the next calendar year, provided ad valorem taxes applicable to the Direct Investment have been paid. The County shall make the first Actual Annual Incentive Payment to the Company for Direct Investment listed as of January 1, 2008, on or before January 31, 2009, and thereafter annually through a final payment due on or before January 31, 2022 for Direct Investment listed as of January 1, 2021.

In addition to incentives associated with the Benchmark Minimum Level, the County authorizes incentives to the Company for Additional Direct Investment up to a cumulative total of \$300,000,000 Direct Investment.

The County will provide the Company additional annual incentives on the Company's Additional Direct Investment above the Benchmark Minimum Level of \$200,000,000 up to the Direct Investment Authorization of \$300,000,000, if that additional investment above the Benchmark Minimum Level is listed on or before January 1, 2021. The amount of the additional annual incentives shall be calculated using the same method set forth above in this Article IV for the Benchmark Minimum Level of Direct Investment. The Company shall certify to the County Tax Administrator in January of each year of this Agreement (or to such later date as may be allowed by law for listing of its personal property and equipment), up to and including the year ended December 31, 2021, its Additional Direct Investment, if any, for the year ended December 31 immediately preceding.

Each Actual Annual Incentive Payment shall be subject to and contingent upon the Company having paid all property taxes applicable to the Direct Investment. The County shall make any incentive payment due the Company under this Agreement associated with the

Additional Direct Investment by issuance and delivery of its check (or other payment mechanism as agreed by the County and the Company) to the Company by January 31 of the next calendar year, provided ad valorem taxes applicable to the Additional Direct Investment have been paid.

The Company shall certify its Direct Investment and/or Additional Direct Investment as required above by providing accurate documentation as a supplement to its annual tax listing forms submitted to the Cumberland County Tax Administrator, which supplement shall be reasonably satisfactory to the Tax Administrator, showing the initial ad valorem taxable value of property for which investment is claimed in any year (including for operating leases even if listed in the name of a party other than Company) as of the tax listing date applicable to such property. With respect to the Direct Investment, the County will use the depreciation schedules as directed or recommended from time to time by the Property Tax Division of the North Carolina Department of Revenue.

In no event shall the County be obligated to make cumulative incentive payments in excess of the maximum stated above.

#### ARTICLE V

#### DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES

The Company acknowledges that the County has not designed the Facility, or supplied any plans or specifications with respect thereto and that the County (a) is not a manufacturer of, nor dealer in, any of the component parts of the Facility or similar facilities, (b) has not made any recommendation, given any advice nor taken any other action with respect to (1) the choice of any supplier, vendor or designer of, or any other contractor with respect to, the Project or any component part thereof or any property or rights relating thereto, or (2) any action taken or to be taken with respect to the Project or any component part thereof or any property or rights relating thereto at any stage of the construction thereof, (c) has not at any time had physical possession of the Project or any component part thereof or made any inspection thereof (other than in its normal course of inspections, if any, as such relate to construction of any such Project in the County) or any property or rights relating thereto, and (d) has not made any warranty or other representation, express or implied, that the Project or any component part thereof or any property or rights relating thereto (i) will not result in or cause injury or damage to persons or property, (ii) has been or will be properly designed, or will accomplish the results that the Company intends, or (iii) is safe in any manner or respect.

The County makes no express or implied warranty or representation of any kind whatsoever with respect to the Project or any component part thereof, including but not limited to any warranty or representation with respect to the merchantability or the fitness or suitability of it for any purpose, and further including the design or condition thereof; the safety, workmanship, quality or capacity thereof; compliance thereof with the requirements of any law, rule,

specification or contract pertaining thereto; any latent defect; the Project's ability to perform any function; or any other characteristic of the Project. The Company shall bear all risks relating to the Project, the completion thereof or the transactions contemplated thereby, and the Company hereby waives the benefits of any and all implied warranties and representations of the County.

The provisions of this Article shall survive the Agreement's termination.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### EXPIRATION OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall expire, without further action on the part of either the Company or the County, upon payment in full of any amounts due from the County to the Company pursuant to, and in accordance with, the terms hereof.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### TEMPORARY REDUCTIONS IN BENCHMARK MINIMUM LEVELS

Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, if the Company shall be prevented or delayed from fulfilling the Benchmark Minimum Level as set herein, by reason of a:

- (a) Government moratorium;
- (b) Delay in obtaining any governmental or quasi-governmental approvals, permits or certificates, despite reasonable efforts by the Company to obtain same;
- (c) Enemy or hostile governmental action;
- (d) Act of God, including but not limited to hurricane, tornado, snowstorm, windstorm, earthquake or flood, fire or other extreme weather conditions or other casualty;
- (e) Strike, lockout, work stoppage or a labor dispute involving the Company or entities other than the Company which causes the Company an inability to obtain labor or materials;
- (f) Delay in funding any incentive to or for the benefit of the Company; or

(g) Any other event, other than normal business conditions, which is beyond the reasonable control of the Company;

then the Benchmark Minimum Level for the year(s) in which such event occurred shall be equitably reduced to reflect the effect of such event. The parties shall negotiate in good faith to make an equitable reduction in the Benchmark Minimum Level for an affected year(s). However, if the parties cannot in good faith reach an agreement as to such adjustment, the parties agree to submit this issue to binding arbitration on an expedited basis.

#### ARTICLE VIII

#### FIRE PROTECTION

The Company maintains and operates, and covenants and warrants that during the term of this Agreement it will continue to maintain and operate a fire brigade at the Site to provide fire protection and first responder services to that Facility. The Company acknowledges and agrees that a portion of the funds provided by the County to the Company hereunder are dedicated for the purpose of providing fire protection services, as those services are defined by North Carolina law. The Company covenants and warrants that it will expend on such fire protection services in each year during which this Agreement is in effect an amount equal to or greater than fifty percent (50%) of the fire protection district tax paid by the Company to the County on its Direct Investment in each such year. In any year during the term of this Agreement, the Company shall not be in breach of this Agreement if it expends less than such amount, provided that (i) in such year it shall have expended at least forty percent (40%) of the fire protection district tax paid by the Company to the County on its Direct Investment in each such year, and further provided that (ii) it shall make up any shortfall within the two calendar years immediately following such year. The Company also covenants and warrants that it will provide such fire protection services in compliance with North Carolina law, and to such standards as may from time to time be mutually agreeable to the Company and the County Fire Marshal, and also that it will participate in mutual aid services as may from time to time be mutually agreeable to the Company and the County Fire Marshal, The Company shall provide a report to the County annually by March 31, with respect to each calendar year this Agreement is in effect, documenting funds expended hereunder for fire protection services.

#### ARTICLE IX

#### RECREATION

The Company acknowledges and agrees that a portion of the funds provided by the County to the Company hereunder are dedicated for the purpose of providing recreation services, as those services are defined by North Carolina law. Because the Company is one of the County's largest employers, there is a benefit to the public welfare, to the welfare, wellness and morale of the

Company's employees, and to the Company, in the Company providing a variety of recreation programs and/or facilities. The Company therefore covenants and warrants that during the term of this Agreement it will continue to offer a variety of recreation services and/or facilities at the Site to provide recreation services to employees at that Facility. The Company further covenants and warrants it will expend on such recreation services in each year during which this Agreement is in effect an amount equal to or greater than fifty percent (50%) of the recreation service district tax paid by the Company to the County on its Direct Investment in each such year. In any year during the term of this Agreement, the Company shall not be in breach of this Agreement if it expends less than such amount, provided that (i) in such year it shall have expended at least forty percent (40%) of the recreation district tax paid by the Company to the County on its Direct Investment in each such year, and further provided that (ii) it shall make up any shortfall within the two calendar years immediately following such year. The Company shall provide a report to the County annually by March 31, with respect to each calendar year this Agreement is in effect, documenting funds expended hereunder for recreation services.

#### ARTICLE X

## REIMBURSEMENT TO COUNTY FOR FAILURE TO MEET MINIMUM BENCHMARK MINIMUM LEVEL OF DIRECT INVESTMENT

No later than March 31, 2014, the Company shall reimburse to the County pro rata any Actual Annual Incentive Payment to the extent the Company fails to meet the Benchmark Minimum Level of Direct Investment by December 31, 2013, and thereafter the County shall have no further obligation hereunder to provide any Actual Annual Incentive Payment.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### JOB TRAINING

The County agrees to cooperate with and assist the Company in obtaining for the Company and its employees job training and funds which may from time to time be available through Fayetteville Technical Community College ("FTCC"), at no cost to the Company, and through the Jobs Training Partnership Act and other federal and state programs, but the parties acknowledge that the County does not control the funding or job training in connection with these programs.

#### ARTICLE XII

#### ASSIGNMENT

Neither party shall transfer or assign any interest in or obligation under this Agreement without the prior express written consent of the other; provided, however, that this Agreement may be assigned by the Company to any parent, subsidiary or affiliate of the Company, or to any person or entity to which the operations at the Project are transferred so long as such operations are continued substantially as contemplated herein and for the term hereof, without the County's consent.

#### ARTICLE XIII

#### LIMITED OBLIGATION OF COUNTY

NO PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE CONSTRUED OR INTERPRETED AS CREATING A PLEDGE OF THE FAITH AND CREDIT OF THE COUNTY WITHIN THE MEANING OF ANY CONSTITUTIONAL DEBT LIMITATION. NO PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE CONSTRUED OR INTERPRETED AS DELEGATING GOVERNMENTAL POWERS NOR AS A DONATION OR A LENDING OF THE CREDIT OF THE COUNTY WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION. THIS AGREEMENT SHALL NOT DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY OR CONTINGENTLY OBLIGATE THE COUNTY TO MAKE ANY PAYMENTS BEYOND THOSE APPROPRIATED IN THE COUNTY'S SOLE DISCRETION FOR ANY FISCAL YEAR IN WHICH THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE IN EFFECT. NO PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO PLEDGE OR TO CREATE A LIEN ON ANY CLASS OR SOURCE OF THE COUNTY'S MONIES, NOR SHALL ANY PROVISION OF THE AGREEMENT RESTRICT TO ANY EXTENT PROHIBITED BY LAW, ANY ACTION OR RIGHT OF ACTION ON THE PART OF ANY FUTURE COUNTY'S BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS. TO THE EXTENT OF ANY CONFLICT BETWEEN THIS ARTICLE AND ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT, THIS ARTICLE SHALL TAKE PRIORITY.

Notwithstanding any other provisions to the contrary in this Agreement, if any payment of incentives due under this Agreement is not made to the Company as required herein, in addition to entitling the Company to exercise its rights and remedies at law or in equity, the County and the Company intend that on a cumulative carry-forward basis from year to year during the term hereof, any shortfalls in annual incentive payments due hereunder from the County to the Company shall be paid to the Company as soon as such funds reasonably are available, and from whatever source (including amounts allocated to fund the County's obligations under this

Agreement in future years). Such amounts not funded by the County and owing to the Company shall not bear any interest.

#### ARTICLE XIV

#### MISCELLANEOUS

14.01. Governing Law; Venue. The parties intend that this Agreement shall be governed by the law of the State of North Carolina without regard to the conflict of laws provisions thereof and that exclusive venue as to any dispute arising hereunder shall be in the State of North Carolina.

#### 14.02. Notices.

- (a) Any communication required or permitted by this Agreement must be in writing except as expressly provided otherwise in this Agreement
- (b) Any communication shall be either delivered by hand or mailed by certified first-class mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, and addressed as follows:

- (c) Any addressee may designate additional or different addresses for communications by notice given under this Section to the other.
  - (d) All notices shall be effective only upon actual receipt.

- 14.03. <u>Non-Business Days</u>. If the date for making any payment or the last day for performance of any act or the exercising of any right shall not be a Business Day, such payment shall be made or act performed or right exercised on or before the next preceding Business Day.
- 14.04. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement shall be determined to be unenforceable, that shall not affect any other provision of this Agreement.
- 14.05. Entire Agreement; Amendments. This Agreement, including any exhibits which may be attached, and which are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, constitutes the entire contract between the parties. This Agreement shall not be changed except in writing signed by authorized representatives of both parties. The parties acknowledge that they have entered into an Incentive Agreement dated November 19, 2004, which provides for the County to make certain installment incentive payments to the Company for capital investment by or on behalf of the Company which added to the County's property tax base. Upon the execution of this Agreement by the parties, all incentive payments by the County for Direct Investment by the Company on and after January 1, 2007 shall accrue, be calculated, and be paid pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. The County shall continue to make those installment incentive payments accrued, and to which the Company is entitled, through December 31, 2012 under the parties' Incentive Agreement dated November 19, 2004.
- 14.06. <u>Binding Effect.</u> Subject to the specific provisions of this Agreement, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of and be enforceable by the parties and their respective successors and assigns.
- 14.07. <u>Time.</u> Time is of the essence in this Agreement and each and all of its provisions.
- 14.08. <u>Liability of Officers and Agents.</u> No officer, agent or employee of the County or the Company shall be subject to any personal liability or accountability by reason of the execution of this Agreement or any other documents related to the transactions contemplated hereby. Such officers, agents, or employees shall be deemed to execute such documents in their official capacities only, and not in their individual capacities. This Section shall not relieve any such officer, agent or employee from the performance of any official duty provided by law.
- 14.09. <u>Counterparts.</u> This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, including separate counterparts. Each shall be an original, but all of them together constitute the same instrument.

Cumberland County Division of Community Corrections has a staff of 72. The staff is headed by Judicial District Manager Wayne Marshburn, Assistant Judicial District Manager Jonette Quenum, and six Chief Probation/Parole Officers. Probation/Parole Officer Kathy Blackmon supervises our Judicial Services unit housed at the Cumberland County courthouse. This unit is responsible for processing probationers from court, submitting crime versions on inmates who will be released at some future time, plus supervising approximately 160 offenders who have rated as low risk/low need offenders. This unit also includes community service supervising approximately coordinators supervised and unsupervised probationers who have been sentenced to do community service.

Chief Probation/Parole Officer Paul Hatch supervises our Special Operations unit which specializes in administering several sanctions and programs to include the Day Reporting Center, the Sex Offender Control program, and Drug Treatment Court. Chief Probation Parole Office James Massengill supervises a quasi Special Ops Unit composed of Domestic Violence Officers, an Electronic House Arrest Officer, and two Community Threat Group Officers. The remaining Chief Probation/Parole officers, Gearonic Locklear, Terry Paige, and Sharon Young supervise field units located at the Community Correction Center at 412-A West Russell Street.

We have a total of fifteen Community Officers supervising approximately 1,208 regular probation cases, twenty six Intermediate Officers supervising approximately 1,343 intermediate cases, one intermediate officer serving on the U.S. Marshal's Task Force, six Intensive Case Officers supervising approximately 180 intensive cases, and seven Intensive Surveillance Officers supervising approximately 398 absconders. For this past fiscal year we averaged supervising 3,338 offenders.

#### Our Partners

The Division of Community Corrections shares facilities with the Cumberland County Day Reporting Center and Treatment Accountability for Safer Communities (TASC). Also housed in our facility is the Substance Abuse Screening Lab who serves not only the Division of Community Corrections but the Division of Prisons, Court, TASC, the Office of Juvenile Justice, and the Juvenile Detention Center. Our setup is ideal for the treatment and control of the offenders.

Last year the Day Reporting Center, whose director is Callic Gardner, provided the following services to 114

offenders: Substance abuse education/monitoring, intensive substance abuse counseling, employment services, educational services, and social/life skills training. The average cost per day for the Day Reporting Center is \$15.03 as opposed to \$66.10 a day to house these same offenders in the state prisons.

TASC, headed in Cumberland County by Angela Covington, is a specialized community resource agency equipped to work with chemically dependent offenders who are sentenced to Probation and/or who are involved within the criminal justice system. TASC identifies the offender's needs and matches them with available treatment services within the Area Program and other community resources. TASC served 952 offenders during the last fiscal year.

#### Ongoing Initiatives and Programs

For the past four years our District has committed an officer to work full time with the *U.S. Marshal's Fugitive Apprehension Task Force*, apprehending high profile violent absconders. Our officer is cross trained and is a sworn U.S. Marshal. From July 2007 until June 30, 2008 the total number arrested by this Task Force statewide was 1737. The number arrested from the Fayetteville office was 274 with 57 being state probation violators. These arrests included several homicides, sex offenders and gang members.

Drug Treatment Court, is one of our toughest sanctions, with emphasis being placed on managed treatment for offenders under a strict regimen of monitoring, court appearances, curfews, and social responsibility. The Division of Community Corrections plays a vital role in the supervision of offenders selected to participate in this program. During the past fiscal year we supervised sixty-two probationers. We had six offenders graduate from Drug Treatment Court. We presently have thirty eight enrolled. This program has expanded to the point where an additional probation officer is helping to supervise this caseload.

The Division of Community Corrections continues addressing the problems of gangs through our Community Threat Group Program. The goal is to identify and document gang offenders, identify and deter patterns of gang activity, and target offenders for appropriate supervision and treatment. We now have two Community Threat Officers who work closely with local law enforcement as well as state resources on gang problems.

Operation Cease Fire is a joint venture with federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies, as well as

community resources, cooperating in a unified offensive to identify violent and repeat offenders and employ prevention and intervention techniques to stop the violence in our neighborhoods. Lisa Jayne served as the Cease Fire Coordinator. Our probation officers continue to provide valuable assistance in identifying targeted offenders, transportation to the "call-in" meetings, and rapid response to violations of probation. During FY2007-2008 two call-in meetings were held; 67 offenders were targeted and 27 participated.

We continue to have four officers working with the Sex Offender Management Program. Two officers are legislatively mandated to serve as Global Positioning System Sex Offender Officers. Global positioning equipment allows for improved supervision of sex offenders in our community. New laws have been passed giving stricter guidance in the supervision of sex offenders. We work closely with the Sheriff's Department in identifying and supervising those cases that are eligible for this type of supervision. Improved system-wide management of sex offenders in the community is our goal. The ultimate goal is to prevent further victimization. Treatment, behavior modification, and close supervision along with interagency collaboration and sex offender registration are all components of the Sex Offender Management Program. Our Sex Offender Officers consistently maintain a total caseload of 110 to 120 sex offenders.

Our Domestic Violence initiative provides a strong family violence intervention program which includes victim safety, punishment and control of the offender and appropriate batterer's treatment. In Cumberland County we have five officers who specialize in supervising offenders convicted of domestic violence crimes. They work closely with the Department of Social Service's CARE Program, court officials, law enforcement agencies, victim advocates, and treatment providers in an attempt to break the cycle of violence within our families and communities. Our domestic violence numbers continue to grow. This past year all domestic violence officers were gathered under one Chief Probation Parole Officer. We have requested additional resources to help in this area for the next fiscal year.

Criminal behavior is often the result of an erroneous thought process. This concept behind Cognitive Behavioral Intervention (CBI) entails having an understanding of the thinking behind our behavior and the consequences of our actions. Cognitive behavioral training can enable changes in the criminal thought process, producing more socially acceptable behavior. Cumberland County Division of Community Corrections has five trained facilitators in CBI with two being Master Trainers. Partnering with other trained facilitators from the Day Reporting Center, an eleven week course titled "Thinking for a Change" is offered to the offenders through the Day Reporting Center. Last fiscal year fifty-three offenders participated in CBI and forty seven graduated.

Judicial District 12's Soldiers Project, a joint venture with the Fort Bragg Provost Marshal's Office, works to ensure that U.S. Military service members and their dependents which are under our supervision are fulfilling the provisions of their probation and any court-ordered treatment. We work closely with the military chain of command providing and receiving appropriated information and having ready access to our offenders. An office is provided at the Provost Marshal's Office on Fort Bragg for our two officers who work with this initiative.

#### **Public Relations**

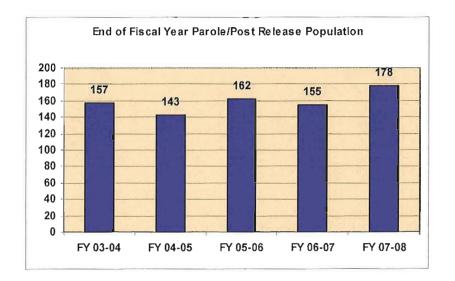
This past fiscal year Combined Campaign, headed by Assistant Judicial District Manager Jonette Quenum, again exceeded our goal of \$5,000 by collecting \$5,407.50. For the fourth consecutive year our staff was presented a state award for the most per capita giving for the State Employees Combined Campaign. Our staff participated in the March of Dimes Walk America and raised \$470.00. Our staff was also responsible for collecting \$650.00 for Muscular Dystrophy.

This past year Probation Parole Officer Audra Basaldu was named District 12's Officer of the Year. She was selected for her "contribution to the Department, which was above and beyond the call of duty" plus "exceptional work." On July 15, 2008 she was honored as one of eight statewide winners. Officer Basaldu speaks Spanish fluently and serves as an interpreter for offenders who only speak Spanish. Upon my request she translated the basic probation rules into Spanish. She serves as Assistant Wellness Coordinator for our District and helps produce a wellness newsletter. She also serves on our District Cabinet which is responsible for planning activities to increase employee morale.

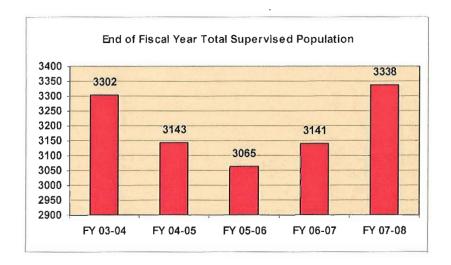
In September 2007, Officer Basaldu and Officer Earl Horan were returning from a home contact when they came upon a disabled vehicle in the middle of Ramsey Street belonging to an older gentleman. The car was out of gas and the gentleman had no money. The two officers assisted the man in getting the car off the street. Officer Basaldu then called for roadside assistance and left the man \$20 to pay for the gas.

On another occasion in September 2007, white verifying a residence Officer Basaldu and another officer came upon a domestic violence dispute where a young man was attacking a young female in the middle of the street. With little regard for her own safety, Officer Basaldu exited the vehicle and assisted in breaking up the assault. Officer Basaldu then helped the female call 911 and provided her with comfort until the police arrived.

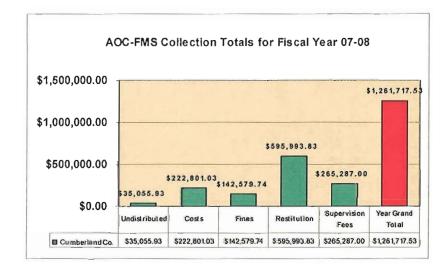
Officer Basaldu's professionalism, teamwork and selfless caring attitude make her a good ambassador for the Department of Correction and District 12 in particular.

Request permission to purchase a used CAT 2005 Model 725 Truck w/Tailgate serial number AFX01451 with approximately 4100 hours on it for use at the landfills. Gregory Poole has a used machine for \$168,784.00. Solid Waste Management has been renting this machine and Gregory Poole will apply 50% of rental payments (\$8,500 per month) to the purchase price of this machine, resulting in a total cost of \$139,671.38. If we do not purchase this machine, then we will have to pay rent for the month of October, but if we do purchase this machine we will not have to pay the \$8,500 for rental in October. 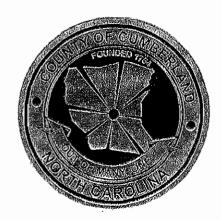

**BACKGROUND:** N.C. General Statute 105-317(b)(1) requires that uniform schedules of values, standards, and rules be prepared for each revaluation of real property, one for appraising property at market value and one for appraising agricultural, horticultural, and forest land at its present-use value. The Board of Commissioners shall review and approve these values, standards, and rules before January 1 of the year they are applied. Before final approval, notice must be published and the public must be given an opportunity to comment on the purposed schedules. Once the Board of Commissioners adopts the schedules of value, there is a 30 day appeal period to the North Carolina Property Tax Commission.

Notice was published on October 7, 2008, notifying the public that the Schedules of Value were available for public inspection in the Tax Administrator's office, and also that a Public Hearing concerning the Schedule of Values would be held on October 20<sup>th</sup>.

The Board held a public hearing on the proposed 2009 Schedules of Value on October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2008. No speakers appeared at the conclusion of the hearing. Further, the statutes require the Board of Commissioners to wait at least seven (7) days after the public hearing before adopting the Schedules of Value.

- Approve and adopt the proposed Schedules, Standards, and Rules for the 2009 Revaluation (in one motion)
- Approve and adopt the proposed Use-Value Manual for the 2009 Revaluation (separately from the above motion)

  - b.) A property owner who asserts that the Schedules, Standards and Rules or the 2009 Use-Value Manual are invalid may take exception thereto and appeal to the Property Tax Commission within 30 days of the date this notice was first published, November 4, 2008.
- Publish notice on November 4, November 11, November 18, and November 25, 2008
