



OVERHILLS SUBDIVISION.

BACKGROUND

The Overhills Subdivision just north of the Town of Spring Lake off of East Manchester Road near Highway 210 has experienced numerous septic tank failures in recent years. This has resulted in several homes having to be vacated and are now for the most part abandoned and in foreclosure. In an effort to obtain grant funding a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) had been requested by Cumberland County. The Engineering firm of Marziano & McGougan was selected to perform this work.

The next step in this process is to find funding to allow for the construction of this collection system. With the stimulus monies becoming available it is prudent for us to have the design completed as quickly as possible to aid in having a shovel ready project as required by the stimulus programs. As with any grant program, it has always been the responsibility of the County to provide the funding for any and all engineering work related to the project. (Three years ago, \$3,000,000 was authorized for the County in a bill through Senator Dole's office; however, this funding has never been appropriated).

Attached are copies of the Contract to perform the design of the Overhills Sanitary Sewer Collection System.

Celebrating Our Past... Embracing Our Future

The amount of this contract is not to exceed \$198,000.00. The Engineer has been proceeding with work (at risk) even though a contract is not in place in an effort to expedite the process.

RECOMMENDATION:

The County Public Utilities Director and Management recommend that the Board of Commissioners:

- 1. Approve a Contract in the amount not to exceed \$198,000.00 with the firm of Marziano & McGougan for the design of the Overhills Sanitary Sewer Collection System.
- 2. Approve the attached budget revision. Funds are available in the Water & Sewer Fund for this phase of the project.

SHORT FORM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN OWNER AND ENGINEER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

alternatives" for Overhills Subdivision dated July, 2008 by the Engineer.	

Owner and Engineer further agree as follows:

1.01 Basic Agreement

A. Engineer shall provide, or cause to be provided, the services set forth in this Agreement, and Owner shall pay Engineer for such Services as set forth in Paragraph 9.01.

2.01 Payment Procedures

- A. Preparation of Invoices. Engineer will prepare a monthly invoice in accordance with Engineer's standard invoicing practices and submit the invoice to Owner.
- B. Payment of Invoices. Invoices are due and payable within 30 days of receipt. If Owner fails to make any payment due Engineer for services and expenses within 30 days after receipt of Engineer(s) invoice, the amounts due Engineer will be increased at the rate of 1.0% per month (or the maximum rate of

interest permitted by law, if less) from said thirtieth day. In addition, Engineer may, without liability, after giving seven days written notice to Owner, suspend services under this Agreement until Engineer has been paid in full all amounts due for services, expenses, and other related charges. Payments will be credited first to interest and then to principal.

3.01 Additional Services

- A. If authorized by Owner, or if required because of changes in the Project, Engineer shall furnish services in addition to those set forth above.
- B. Owner shall pay Engineer for such additional services as follows: For additional services of Engineer's employees engaged directly on the Project an amount equal to the cumulative hours charged to the Project by each class of Engineer's employees times standard hourly rates for each applicable billing class; plus

reimbursable expenses and Engineer's consultants' charges, if any.

4.01 Termination

A. The obligation to provide further services under this Agreement may be terminated:

1. For cause,

a. By either party upon 30 days written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the Agreement's terms through no fault of the terminating party.

b. By Engineer:

- 1) upon seven days written notice if Engineer believes that Engineer is being requested by Owner to furnish or perform services contrary to Engineer(s) responsibilities as a licensed professional; or
- 2) Upon seven days written notice if the Engineer(s) services for the Project are delayed or suspended for more than 90 days for reasons beyond Engineer(s) control.
- Engineer shall have no liability to Owner on account of such termination.
- c. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement will not terminate as a result of a substantial failure under paragraph 4.01.A.1.a if the party receiving such notice begins, within seven days of receipt of such notice, to correct its failure and proceeds diligently to cure such failure within no more than 30 days of receipt of notice; provided, however, that if and to the extent such substantial failure cannot be reasonably cured within such 30 day period, and if such party has diligently attempted to cure the same and thereafter continues diligently to cure the same, then the cure period provided for herein shall extend up to, but in no case more than, 60 days after the date of receipt of the notice.
- 2. For convenience, by Owner effective upon the receipt of notice by Engineer.
- B. The terminating party under paragraphs 4.01.A.1 or 4.01.A.2 may set the effective date of termination at a time up to 30 days later than otherwise

provided to allow Engineer to demobilize personnel and equipment from the Project site, to complete tasks whose value would otherwise be lost, to prepare notes as to the status of completed and uncompleted tasks, and to assemble Project materials in orderly files.

5.01 Controlling Law

A. This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the state in which the Project is located.

6.01 Successors, Assigns, and Beneficiaries

- A. Owner and Engineer each is hereby bound and the partners, successors, executors, administrators, and legal representatives of Owner and Engineer (and to the extent permitted by paragraph 6.01.B the assigns of Owner and Engineer) are hereby bound to the other party to this Agreement and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators, and legal representatives (and said assigns) of such other party, in respect of all covenants, agreements, and obligations of this Agreement.
- B. Neither Owner nor Engineer may assign, sublet, or transfer any rights under or interest (including, but without limitation, moneys that are due or may become due) in this Agreement without the written consent of the other, except to the extent that any assignment, subletting, or transfer is mandated or restricted by law. Unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement.

7.01 General Considerations

- A. The standard of care for all professional engineering and related services performed or furnished by Engineer under this Agreement will be the care and skill ordinarily used by members of the subject profession practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and in the same locality. Engineer makes no warranties, express or implied, under this Agreement or otherwise, in connection with Engineer(s) services. Engineer and its consultants may use or rely upon the design services of others, including, but not limited to, contractors, manufacturers, and suppliers.
- B. Engineer shall not at any time supervise, direct, or have control over any Contractor(s) work, nor shall Engineer have authority over or responsibility for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction selected or used by any contractor, for safety precautions and programs incident to a Contractor(s) work progress, nor for any failure of any contractor to comply with laws and regulations applicable to Contractor(s) work.

- C. Engineer neither guarantees the performance of any contractor nor assumes responsibility for any Contractor(s) failure to furnish and perform its work in accordance with the contract between Owner and such contractor.
- D. Engineer shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of any contractor, subcontractor, or supplier, or of any Contractor(s) agents or employees or any other persons (except Engineer(s) own employees) at the Project site or otherwise furnishing or performing any of construction work; or for any decision made on interpretations or clarifications of the construction contract given by Owner without consultation and advice of Engineer.
- E. The general conditions for any construction contract documents prepared hereunder are to be the "Standard General Conditions of the Construction Contract@ as prepared by the Engineers Joint Contract Documents Committee (No. C-700, 2002 Edition).
- F. All design documents prepared or furnished by Engineer are instruments of service, and Engineer retains an ownership and property interest (including the copyright and the right of reuse) in such documents, whether or not the Project is completed.
- G. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Owner and Engineer (1) waive against each other, and the other's employees, officers, directors, agents, insurers, partners, and consultants, any and all claims for or entitlement to special, incidental, indirect, or consequential damages arising out of, resulting from, or in any way related to the Project, and (2) agree that Engineer's total liability to Owner under this Agreement shall be limited to \$50,000 or the total amount of compensation received by Engineer, whichever is greater.
- H. The parties acknowledge that Engineer(s) scope of services does not include any services related to a Hazardous Environmental Condition (the presence of asbestos, PCBs, petroleum, hazardous substances or waste, and radioactive materials). If Engineer or any other party encounters a Hazardous Environmental Condition, Engineer may, at its option and without liability for consequential or any other damages, suspend performance of services on the portion of the Project affected thereby until Owner: (i) retains appropriate specialist consultants or contractors to identify and, as appropriate, abate, remediate, or remove the Hazardous Environmental Condition; and (ii) warrants that the Site is in full compliance with applicable Laws and Regulations.

8.01 Total Agreement

A. This Agreement (consisting of pages 1 to 4 inclusive together with any expressly incorporated appendix), constitutes the entire agreement between Owner and Engineer and supersedes all prior written or oral understandings. This Agreement may only be amended, supplemented, modified, or canceled by a duly executed written instrument.

Dispute Resolution

The parties must resolve any claim, dispute or other matter in contention arising out of, or relating to, this Contract which involves \$15,000 or more through the following procedure. The parties shall first negotiate in good faith to reach an equitable settlement to the dispute. If a negotiated settlement cannot be reached within 10 business days, the parties shall submit to mediation. The parties shall select a mediator, licensed by either the North Carolina or federal courts and mutually agreeable to all parties in the dispute to conduct the proceedings which shall be held at the Owner' = s place of business. If the parties cannot select a mediator within 10 business days, then the Owner shall select a mediator (or, if the Owner is a party to the dispute, the Cumberland County Trial Court Administrator). The mediator's cost shall be equally shared by all parties to the dispute. If a mediated settlement cannot be reached, the final recourse to the aggrieved party is legal action instituted and tried in the General Court of Justice of North Carolina under North Carolina Law with venue for trial being Cumberland County. No party shall have a right to resort to litigation until mediation shall first have occurred and not been successful.

In accordance with North Carolina General Statute 143-135.26(12) and as a condition to this Contract, the prime contractor shall incorporate this dispute resolution clause in any and all contracts with first-tier subcontractors who in turn shall incorporate this clause in any contracts with lower-tier subcontractors.

BACKGROUND

In October 2007, the Board of County Commissioners awarded a contract to Shaw Environmental & Infrastructure, Inc., in the amount of \$1,699,710 for installation of the Ann Street Subtitle D Landfill Gas Collection & Control System - Phase I. The work was completed in June 2008.

Attached is Change Order #1 (Final) for Shaw Environmental in the deductive amount of \$91,647. This change order reconciles the actual quantities of materials installed versus the bid quantities which resulted in a net decrease in the contract sum from \$1,699,710 to \$1,608,063.

The change order document has been reviewed by the County Attorney's Office for legal sufficiency.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

The recommendation of the County Engineer, Solid Waste Director, CDM, and management is to approve Change Order #1 (Final) for Shaw Environmental & Infrastructure, Inc., in the deductive amount of \$91,647 for the above referenced project and reduce the contract amount to \$1,608,063.

The proposed action by the Board is to follow the staff recommendation.

BACKGROUND

In May, 2008, the Board entered into a contract with Rentenbach Constructors, Inc., in the amount of \$22,190,429 for construction of the New Public Health Center Project. The Board also approved the project budget which included an Owner Construction Contingency of \$537,435. Construction of the new facility is about 50% complete and to date Change Order #1, a credit of \$87,446 has been approved of which a copy is attached for reference.

Attached is Change Order #2 in the amount of \$122,479 for additional work on the New Public Health Center Project. A cost summary sheet is provided in the change order document and includes both additive and deductive work items. The changes can be summarized as follows:

•	Replacement of unsuitable soils in various areas.	ADD \$55,220
•	Water and Sewer utility revisions.	ADD \$37,211
•	Owner requested revisions to Dental Clinic area.	ADD \$21,345
•	Code Compliance revisions.	ADD \$10,413
•	Miscellaneous building revisions.	ADD \$13,740
•	Building and site revisions resulting in a credit to the Owner.	DEDUCT \$15,450

With approval of Change Order #2, the net increase in the contract price is \$35,033 which equates to 0.16% of the original contract amount. Sufficient monies are available in the project contingency to fund this change order. The change order document has been reviewed by the County Attorney's Office for legal sufficiency.

BACKGROUND:

The County owns, via tax foreclosure on October 30, 2008, five parcels of property formerly belonging to National Advancement Community Development Corporation., Tyrone A. Williams, President. Four of the properties are located within the Hope VI Project area on Carbonton Street and one is located off Ramsey Street on Wall Street.

On December 30, 2008 the County Legal Department, per the surplus land policy, sent to all County Departments and the City of Fayetteville an inquiry as to whether any of the Departments or the City had a use for the property. On January 6, 2009 the City of Fayetteville stated its interest in purchasing the four properties located on Carbonton Street for inclusion in its Hope VI project. On January 26, 2009 Legal received a call from Mr. Williams stating that he wanted to redeem all five properties but he did not have all the funds on hand and he requested and was given until February 3, 2009 to redeem the properties. On February 16th the City's real estate officer inquired as to whether the property had been redeemed and again expressed that the City was ready, willing and able to purchase the property for the \$14,280.76 at which the four properties the City desires had been bid by the County. On March 4, 2009, over a month after the deadline he requested, Mr. Williams arrived with the monies, \$17,808.47, needed to redeem all five properties.

The cost to redeem 504, 510, 512 & 514 Carbonton Street is \$14,280.76, 203 Wall Street is \$3,527.71 and all five parcels \$17,808.47.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION:

There appear to be four possible actions the Board may wish to consider:

- 1. Approve conveyance of parcels listed at 504, 510, 512, & 514 Carbonton Street to the City of Fayetteville for the Hope VI Project for the sum of \$14,280.76, allow Mr. Williams to redeem the remaining property at 203 Wall Street for the sum of \$3,527.71 and authorize the Chairman and Clerk to execute a deed conveying those properties
- 2. Approve conveyance of the five parcels to Tyrone A. Williams for the sum of \$17,808.47 and authorize the Chairman and Clerk to execute a deed conveying the properties.
- 3. Approve a conveyance to the City with a stipulation that the City purchase all five parcels for the sum of \$17,808.47 and if the City so agrees the Chairman and Clerk are authorized to execute a deed conveying the properties.
- 4. Approve a conveyance of the parcels listed at 504, 510, 512, & 514 Carbonton Street to the City of Fayetteville for the Hope VI Project for the sum of \$14,280.76 and retain the property at 203 Wall Street as County surplus property.







MINUTES OF DECEMBER 16, 2008

Mr. Lloyd reviewed the site information and stated the staff recommends approval of R30A Residential district based on the following:

- 1. The request is consistent with the 2010 Land Use Plan, which calls for low density residential at this location;
- 2. The request is consistent with the land uses currently allowed within the general area; and
- Public utilities are available to the site.

There was one person to speak in favor and five people to speak in opposition.

Mr. Thomas Neville spoke in favor. Mr. Neville stated that he appreciated the opportunity to speak before the Board. Mr. Neville stated that prior to coming to the meeting he drove through the area and saw what was consistent with the different zoning areas, in that there are a variety houses in the area. There are some houses whose values are in excess of three hundred thousand dollars; there are also a lot of smaller houses on this very road. As you pull onto Cypress Lakes Road, one of the first things you see on the left is what is commonly referred to as a Jim Walters home, if you look to the right pretty soon you will see what was originally a mobile home that was later bricked up on the sides, if you continue further down you will see my clients house which is a Class A manufactured home, if you go a little bit further you will see a true mobile home from some years ago still there, and intermingled within all of this you will see a number of very nice homes that appear to be well over a quarter million dollars. There's a little bit of everything out there, there are areas that were predominately agricultural. You take the good with the bad, of course the good and bad is not always defined by the same people and the definition is not always the same. What you do find is a consistent feeling or theory that one has a right to do with his property what he desires to do, as long as it is consistent with the area and it is not a detriment to his neighbors. What we propose to do is not a detriment to this area and it is consistent with the area and we believe it should be approved. Mr. Neville read the definition of a manufactured home to the Board. Mr. Neville stated that the reason he was reading this is because if you go through the area you see the smaller homes with small roof pitches and the Class A manufactured homes that are out there today, most couldn't tell the difference between these older homes, what was built in the forties, versus what you see in Class A manufactured homes today. Mr. Neville presented a use matrix which tells the permitted uses in a certain zoning classification. The only distinction Mr. Neville found between R30 and R30A is the Class A manufactured home. Mr. Neville stated that the essential issue before the Board is the Class A manufactured distinction. Mr. Neville stated that his client does not intend to just throw up two additional manufactured homes; he intends to do landscaping. Mr. Neville pointed out that the property is very well maintained and has nice landscaping and it is the intention to do the same with the additional homes he plans to add. Mr. Neville restated that the intended use is not a detriment to the neighborhood and it also serves a use that is needed, not everyone can afford to live in a home that is a quarter million dollars or more. There is a need for housing for everyone and that has been brought to light in the current economy.

Vice-Chair Epler asked Mr. Neville how long his client owned the property.

Mr. Neville stated that he would have to ask his client.

Vice-Chair Epler stated that the subject property was rezoned from A1 to R30 in August of 2007. Vice-Chair Epler asked if the owner requested that rezoning.

Mr. Neville stated that his client did request the rezoning.

Vice-Chair Epler asked if the manufactured home was on the property then and if it was conforming when the home was put there.

Mr. Lloyd stated that if the property is subdivided sewer will have to be extended.

Mr. Joseph Christopher spoke in opposition. Mr. Christopher stated that he was opposed to the rezoning to R30A because it is not consistent with the surrounding areas. Mr. McArthur had the property rezoned in August of last year, he agreed to R30 zoning and said he would place three stick built homes on this property. By allowing Mr. McArthur to rezone this property, the Board will allow him to place three manufactured homes there. In accordance with the zoning ordinance, page 18, a manufactured home park is defined as a multi-family development on any site or track of land with two spaces intended to be occupied by manufactured home regardless of whether a charge is made for such services, so we will in fact have a mobile home park there. The district that surrounds Mr. McArthur's property is R40 across the street, R10 to the rear, and A1 to the

left and right. There are no manufactured homes in the immediate area, except for Mr. McArthur's. The manufactured home that the attorney referred to is bricked in and is not classified as a manufactured home according to public records. The pitch of the roof is normal, the eaves are approximately twelve inches, and the electrical connection is consistent with a stick built home. The public record search showed that Mr. McArthur owns approximately four parcels of land and eleven manufactured homes, of which two are located in the Hellandale Mobile Home Park in Hope Mills. Mr. Christopher stated that if the rezoning is approved, Mr. McArthur will put trailers on the property.

Ms. Gizelle Rodriguez spoke in opposition. Ms. Rodriguez stated that she is opposed to the rezoning because she feels it will decrease the value of her property.

Mr. Brian T. Schneider spoke in opposition. Mr. Schneider stated that he is opposed to the rezoning because he feels Mr. McArthur will place manufactured homes on the subject property which will decrease his property values.

Ms. Kathleen Palmer spoke in opposition. Ms. Palmer stated that she and her husband will have owned their house for three years, and will probably have to move if a manufactured home park is behind their property and visible from the property. Ms. Palmer stated that she is certain that this will decrease her property values.

Mr. Harry Whisnant spoke in opposition. Mr. Whisnant stated he was in the area when there was nothing out there. It was a shock to see the mobile home across the street. Since it is already zoned R30, it should stay that way. If Mr. McArthur is going to sell the property, he should sell it as it is.

Mr. Neville spoke in rebuttal. Mr. Neville stated that under the guidelines the home his client is going to place on the property is a Class A manufactured home; it's not a mobile home or a trailer. There are specific guidelines and facts that distinguish the two. Class A manufactured does not fit under the parameters of a mobile home. There are mobile homes and Jim Walter homes on the same road that predate his client's house. The bottom line is when you move to a rural area in the country you have to accept what's there. Mr. Neville stated that his client has a right to improve his property, if his improvements are not consistent with the neighborhood that's one thing, but what he is proposing is consistent with the neighborhood. The issue isn't density, we're already at R30 the issue here is solely Class A manufactured homes.

Mr. Lloyd stated that a manufactured home park is not allowed in R30 or R30A and a manufactured home park would be three or more spaces on the same lot. The applicant did rezone one year ago and was asked if he knew what that meant and he stated yes and still agreed.

Vice-Chair Epler asked Mr. Neville if his client understood a year ago and agreed to R30, and if he has changed his mind.

Mr. Neville stated that his client agreed to R30 and a year later he is before you again saying this is what he would like to do with his property and asking that the Board rule on it again. What is important is that his Class A manufactured home was there in 1992; three trailers aren't being added, at the most two are being added and it is consistent with the area.

Mrs. Piland asked Mr. Neville what has changed now that would warrant rezoning to R30A in that area.

Mr. Neville stated that he wasn't here a year ago, so he isn't aware of what has changed.

Mr. Barrett rephrased the question for Mr. Neville "Are you aware of any change in circumstances in the area since the rezoning in 2007 that would require rezoning now?"


Mr. Neville stated that someone else could answer that better than he could. The only thing that appears is what he refers to as the Jim Walters home.


Public Hearing closed.

Vice-Chair Epler stated that she understands the feelings of the people in the area, they have stick built homes, they're in a neighborhood, and they don't want a trailer park behind their house. But this isn't a trailer park that we are talking about, these are Class A manufactured homes, there was a Class A manufactured home on the subject property when they purchased their property and adding two more. We can't make the determination that it will lower their property values, they are in a different neighborhood and there is a different entrance to their homes, but I understand where they are coming from. They have an investment there and they want to protect it. The one thing that bothers me is that the applicant knew a year ago that he would not be allowed to keep a Class A manufactured home on that property if he agreed to R30, he could keep it but he couldn't add any additional homes. If anything happened to that Class A manufactured home he could not replace it with another manufactured home. He would have been better off at that time if he wanted to have his house conforming, to have left it A1. I can't speak for him, but in our experience, the different stance of our economy today has maybe precipitated him coming back and asking for rezoning. I certainly have sympathy for that, we have all felt it, but he made this decision a year and a half ago and I can't support rezoning to R30A.

Chair McLaurin stated that there was no case of "trailer hate" going on. Chair McLaurin stated that he himself had lived in trailers before. Where a person lives or the type of dwelling a person lives in has very little to do with the caliber of the person, as far as his experience goes. We have zoning and at the front of the ordinance it states that the ordinance is to provide for the public health, safety, and general welfare. Part of general welfare is financial welfare. Many years ago Mr. Al Prewitt went and started developing the Cypress Lakes area and looking at the things the way he did, he didn't worry about zoning, he was trying to have a golf and horse community, he was an avid horseman. He wanted everyone to have nice lots and he had a place out there where they could have horses. There are mobile homes and double wide trailers there now. But the general trend and the trend of the zoning in that area are stick built type houses. When everybody in this subdivision bought, this neighborhood was zoned R10 which led them to believe they would have a certain amount of protection from the general public. They relied on that as far as the type of construction that would be around them when they made their financial investment for part of their general welfare. People have moved into that area and they have moved in behind Mr. McArthur and as they moved in behind him, many of them military families, who made their investments, they looked over and saw R30 and they depended on this general public that designated this R30 for their financial protection while they are protecting us. As far as the Jim Walter type home that has been referred to, if somebody is going to live in it or keep living in it they had better be ready to spend a lot of money, because it's looking very dated out there. The general trend of this area is towards R10 and stick built homes. That's what people are depending on when they move out there, that the trend is stick built homes, they are looking for their investments to be protected. We keep hearing on the news that the value of homes is going down, and I don't think that we need to do anything that will disturb the general financial welfare of the people as it is now.

Mr. Clark made a motion, seconded by Vice-Chair Epler to deny the request for R30A rezoning. Unanimous approval



AMENDMENT TO THE COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE, CREATING STANDARDS FOR COUNTY-OPERATED CONVENIENCE CONTAINER AND RECYCLING FACILITIES BY AMENDING ARTICLE II INTERPRETATIONS, CALCULATIONS, AND DEFINITIONS, SECTION 203 DEFINITIONS OF SPECIFIC TERMS AND WORDS; ARTICLE IV PERMITTED, CONDITIONAL, AND SPECIAL USES, SECTION 403 USE MATRIX; ARTICLE IX INDIVIDUAL USES, CREATING SECTION 905.1, ENTITLED: CONVENIENCE CONTAINER AND RECYCLING FACILITY; AND UPDATING THE TABLE OF CONTENTS AS APPROPRIATE.

AMEND the County Zoning Ordinance, Article II Interpretations, Calculations, and Definitions, Section 203 Definitions of Specific Terms and Words by CREATING the following definition for "Convenience Container and Recycling Facility" and INSERTING the definition in alphabetical order:

Convenience Container and Recycling Facility: A County-owned, -leased or - operated site, generally two acres or less in size, serving the surrounding community for the temporary collection, storage and transference of solid waste, yard waste and recyclables. (Section 905.1)

AMEND the County Zoning Ordinance, Article II Interpretations, Calculations, and Definitions, Section 203 Definitions of Specific Terms and Words, specifically the definition for "Solid Waste Disposal Facility" as indicated:

Solid Waste Disposal Facility: Any depository of solid waste, excluding earth for fill and septage. This definition includes, but is not limited to, sanitary landfills, sewage treatment facilities and waste incinerators. This definition does not include "Convenience Container and Recycling Facilities" as defined herein. (Section 925)

AMEND the County Zoning Ordinance, Article IV Permitted, Conditional, and Special Uses, Section 403 Use Matrix by INSERTING a row under the Land Uses column entitled: Convenience Container and Recycling Facility (Sec. 905.1), in alphabetical order, with the Convenience Container and Recycling Facility being allowed in the individual zoning districts as indicated below:

DRAFT

Special Use Permit – "S" in the Zoning Classifications columns – (requiring Board of Adjustment approval) for the A1, A1A, R40, R40A, R30, R30A, RR, R20, R20A, R15, R7.5, R6, R6A, R5, R5A and O&I(P) zoning districts; and

Permitted Use – "P" in the Zoning classifications columns - (requiring staff site plan approval) for the C1(P), C2(P), C(P), M1(P) and M(P) zoning districts.

AMEND the County Zoning Ordinance, Article IX, Individual Uses, by CREATING Section 905.1, entitled: Convenience Container and Recycling Facility, along with the following sub-sections:

SECTION 905.1 CONVENIENCE CONTAINER AND RECYCLING FACILITY

- A. Material shall not be stored outside of appropriate waste containers, and all such containers shall be located on a solid impervious surface such as concrete pads.
- B. All structures on the site shall comply with the dimensional requirements for the zoning district in which the facility is to be located.
- C. The site shall be maintained to prevent odors, rodents and any other nuisances.
- D. The site shall have direct access to a paved public street.
- E. Access roads leading to any part of the operation shall be constructed in such a manner as to not impede traffic on any public or private street and shall be paved or constructed with gravel or crushed stone surface and maintained in a dust-free manner.
- F. All environmental health rules and regulations, including Federal and State laws, shall be complied with.
- G. One identification sign, as defined in Section 1302, shall be permitted in accordance with Article XIII.
- H. Site obscuring buffers shall be provided in accordance with the provisions of Section 1102.G, and are not included in the exemptions under Section 1102.G.2

BACKGROUND

The Board of County Commissioners, at its February 17, 2009 meeting, considered revising the Special Assessment Resolution for the Lake Upchurch Dam Restoration Project to reduce the interest rate from eight percent (8%) to seven percent (7%) and established the time and date for the required public hearing for 6:45 pm, March 16, 2009. Notice of the Public Hearing was duly published in the Fayetteville Observer and mailed first class to all property owners in the project area. A copy of the Revised Special Assessment Resolution for the Lake Upchurch Dam Restoration Project is attached for reference.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

At the conclusion of the Public Hearing, the Board may adopt the Revised Special Assessment Resolution for the Lake Upchurch Dam Restoration Project.

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND

REVISED SPECIAL ASSESSMENT RESOLUTION LAKE UPCHURCH DAM RESTORATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the emergency spillway of the Lake Upchurch Dam was breached by heavy rainfall during May, 2003, resulting in the loss of impounded water in the lake; and

WHEREAS, the permanent loss of Lake Upchurch will adversely affected property values along said lake resulting in a corresponding loss of property tax revenue for Cumberland County; and

WHEREAS, Lake Upchurch Power Company operates a hydroelectric generation facility on said lake that provides an environmentally clean source of electrical energy consistent with Cumberland County's goal to improve air quality in the County; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) has jurisdiction over the operations of Lake Upchurch Power Company and all improvements to restore said dam must comply with FERC requirements; and

WHEREAS, Lake Upchurch Power Company has retained a qualified engineering firm to conduct a hydrological and hydraulic study to analyze Lake Upchurch Dam for the proper design storm in order to determine the improvements necessary to comply with FERC requirements; and

WHEREAS, a majority of the homeowners in the immediate vicinity of Lake Upchurch have petitioned the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners to undertake a special assessment project to make the necessary repairs to the dam in accordance with FERC requirements; and

WHEREAS, Lake Upchurch provides a public benefit through flood control, stormwater quality improvements; and recreation opportunities.

WHEREAS, the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners has determined that a public benefit exists in repairing Lake Upchurch Dam.

NOW THEREFORE, the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners, pursuant to Article 9 of Chapter 153A of North Carolina General Statutes, hereby adopts the following preliminary special assessment resolution:

- 1. <u>Need for Project</u>: The Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County hereby undertakes a project which will restore the dam and allow the safe impoundment of water in Lake Upchurch and provide flood control and stormwater quality benefits as well as restore the ability to generate an environmentally clean source of electrical energy.
- II. <u>General Description of the Project</u>: This project will include improvements to the emergency spillway and primary spillway as required by FERC.
- III. Ownership: The improvements will be owned by the property owners of record of the land upon which the improvements are made.
- IV. <u>Proposed Basis of Assessment</u>: The proposed basis of assessment will be at an equal rate per One Hundred Dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation. The valuation of land benefitted by the project (being the project area as shown on the map attached as Exhibit "A") being the value of the land without improvements as shown on the tax records of the County.
- V. <u>Percentage of Cost to be Assessed</u>: The total engineering, construction and administrative costs shall be assessed against the benefitted properties in this special assessment project.
- VI. Abeyance: No assessment will be held in abeyance.
- VII. <u>Terms of Payment</u>: The assessment will be payable in ten (10) annual installments and the first installment with interest will be due sixty (60) days after the date that the assessment roll is confirmed. One installment with interest is due on the anniversary date in each successive year until the assessment is paid in full. The interest rate shall be set at seven percent (7%) per annum. The assessment may be paid in full without interest anytime up to thirty (30) days after the confirmation of the assessment roll is published.

Now through April 5, Cumberland County Public Library & Information Center and its many community partners are conducting The Big Read, a celebration of *The Maltese Falcon* by Dashiell Hammett.

Cumberland County is one of 208 communities nationwide participating in The Big Read, an initiative of the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) designed to restore reading to the center of American culture. The NEA presents The Big Read in partnership with the Institute of Museum and Library Services and in cooperation with Arts Midwest.

The Big Read, which started February 19 and runs through April 5, features programming at various locations, including all public libraries, Fayetteville State University, Methodist University, Fort Bragg, Pope Air Force Base, and the Museum of the Cape Fear.

This is the third year in a row the NEA has awarded a grant to Cumberland County. In 2007 the community read *Their Eyes Were Watching God* by Zora Neale Hurston, followed by Ray Bradbury's *Fahrenheit 451* in 2008.

The Book

Dashiell Hammett's **The Maltese Falcon**, published in 1930, set the standard for all subsequent hardboiled detective stories. It follows private investigator Sam Spade, who is tough enough to bluff the toughest thugs and hold off the police. Spade's partner is murdered on a stakeout; the cops blame him for the killing; a beautiful redhead with a heartbreaking story appears and disappears; grotesque villains demand a payoff he can't provide; and everyone wants a fabulously valuable gold statuette of a falcon, created as a tribute for the Holy Roman Emperor Charles IV. Who has it? And what will it take to get it back? Spade's solution is as complicated as the motives of those seeking it.

Programming

Book discussions and film screenings are scheduled throughout the project at various libraries. There are also programs for teens and children. The community is even helping write a mystery short story based here in Fayetteville. Each week a new chapter is published on the library's web site and in *The Fayetteville Observer* as part of the Collaborative Mystery Writing Project.

The Museum of the Cape Fear is hosting **The Maltese Falcon** exhibit through April 5. This exhibit showcases Hammett memorabilia and artifacts related to **The Maltese Falcon**. On display are issues of the *Black Mask*, the pulp fiction magazine which first published serially **The Maltese Falcon**; first edition copies of the book; movie cards from the 1931, 1936 and 1941 movie versions of the novel; and a replica of the falcon statue from the 1941 movie.

Commissioner King opened the meeting with a prayer.

1. Approval of Minutes: January 8, 2009

MOTION: Commissioner Faircloth moved to approve.

SECOND: Commissioner Edge

VOTE: UNANIMOUS

2. Update on the Southpoint Project:

Tom Cooney, Public Utilities Director, advised that Mr. Martin, County Manager, held a meeting with Robeson County Commissioners and several other individuals regarding extending a line from their water system to the Southpoint subdivision in Cumberland County. A lease agreement was discussed where Cumberland would install the lines and Robeson County would lease the assets, which would allow Cumberland to maintain ownership of the lines. Mr. Martin discussed the possibility of a short term lease, but Robeson wanted a renewable 20-year agreement and terms were not agreed upon during the meeting. After the meeting, the individuals attending from Robeson County further discussed the issue and a letter was sent to Mr. Martin advising that they were not interested in any type lease plan. No further discussions have been held with Robeson and dialogue was opened with Bladen County. Mr. Martin advised that the bottom line is that Robeson wants Cumberland to install the lines and they would operate them as Robeson County lines, but Mr. Martin does not feel that would be in Cumberland's long-term best interest. After making an initial contact with Bladen County, Mr. Martin feels that a meeting with Bladen is in order to discuss the possibility of extending lines from that county. Mr. Cooney asked Koontz Noble, Cumberland's engineering firm, to contact Hobbs Upchurch, the engineering firm for Bladen County's system, to make calculations about the availability of water from Bladen County and to report back to Cumberland. Water from Bladen County is not immediately practical at this time due to a high iron content, but is hoping to have availability by June.

Responding to a question from Commissioner Edge regarding the water supply for the Dupont Plant on Highway 87 and the proximity of PWC lines to the Southpoint subdivision, Mr. Cooney advised that he has been asked by PWC to look at providing water to the two schools in Grays Creek, which would create some participation that would bring the water lines close to Southpoint. However, the cost would be higher to go this route compared to bringing water from Bladen County. Mr. Cooney advised that he has applied for federal stimulus dollars, but it would be a couple of months before that may come available and he would like to have this project bid within the next two months.

3. Update and Consideration of participation for the Cedar Creek Road Project:

Mr. Cooney advised that citizens from the Cedar Creek Road area petitioned for a special assessment for a water line. Mr. Cooney referred members to the map included in their packet. Easements from a couple of the parcel owners were needed in order to save some expenses due to the railroad track location, but one owner refused to grant an easement. That has resulted in the need for a longer line down Cedar Creek Road and the necessity for an expensive bore under the railroad track. PWC was requested to participate in the project and it has agreed to match whatever the County contributes. Therefore, Mr. Cooney is asking that the County contribute between \$40,000 and \$50,000 as its share towards the project, which would reduce the citizens' share to around \$5,000 to \$6,000 per lot (27 lots in all). Commissioner Edge confirmed with Mr. Martin that funds for this project were available in the water fund.

MOTION: Commissioner Edge moved to recommend to the full Board the approval of the request to equally share the additional cost with PWC and to allow a special assessment be applied to the citizens' share.

SECOND: Commissioner Faircloth

VOTE: UNANIMOUS

4. Discussion/Review of the Status of the Storm Water Program:

Mr. Stanger introduced Mr. Caison and Mr. Fersner and provided background information on the formation of the storm water utility. In the mid-1990s the City of Fayetteville and the County partnered to fund and administer the requirements of a NPDES permit under Phase I. Due to the lower population of Cumberland's urban population after the City's annexations, the County asked to the NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources to remove the County from the Phase I program. DENR has provided verbal approval, but written approval has not been received to date. Based on the verbal approval and the fact that the NPDES permit renewal process, which the City is now going through, does not include Cumberland County, it appears that the County has been removed from Phase I. Mr. Barrett added that the State's Phase II actions agree with the verbal approval of our removal from Phase I. The City of Fayetteville's NPDES permit has been renewed. It seeks guidance from the County as to our continued participation in the joint storm water utility. The County also needs to decide whether to continue collecting the storm water fee which has been collected under the Phase I program. Discussion ensued as to the potential issues and as to how the fee, which generate \$600,000 per year, could be used should the County continue to collect it. It was agreed that only limited storm water improvement projects could be afforded and if the fee is discontinued, educating the public as to why this was decided would be very important. The County Attorney noted his legal concern about the

difference between a tax and a fee, with a fee being imposed in return for providing a service. After consulting with other staff members present, Mr. Martin recommended removing the \$12.00 per year fee. Mr. Martin added that even if the full Board votes in favor of the fee's removal, this action could still be revisited before adoption of the budget ordinance for the upcoming year.

MOTION: Commissioner Faircloth moved to recommend to the full Board that

the County no longer impose the \$1.00 per month residential unit

storm water fee.

SECOND: Commissioner Edge

VOTE: Commissioner Faircloth and Edge voted for the motion.

Commissioner King voted against the motion.

5. Update on Fire Protection Services:

County Attorney Barrett stated that since discussions with the Board about legal issues with regard to fire protection services that he and Mr. Currie have met twice with Freddie Johnson, Chief of the Fire Chief's Association, regarding issues with the standard fire protection services contract. It appears that an agreement can be reached on the vast majority of issues. Once the document is finalized, it will go to the Fire Chief's Association and fire department chiefs and officers for their review.

Other Matters of Concern – Discussion Regarding Enforcement of Minimum Housing Ordinance:

Mr. Lloyd introduced Mr. Combs stating that he will be providing information on a proposed procedural change which will save money for fuel, inspector's time and postage. Mr. Combs provided a handout stating that he is trying to find a better way for the staff in the code enforcement department to deal with issues related to the removal of trash and debris from properties. The proposed change in the current ordinance would be to eliminate costly certified mail and to use first class mail rates and posting of properties instead. The notification process would use the tax records last known address for the owner of the property and would include placing a notice on the property. The members agreed to bring the proposed ordinance directly to the full Board.

CONSIDERATION OF PARTICIPATING IN THE COST OF EXTENDING A WATER

LINE EAST ON CEDAR CREEK ROAD TO SERVE RESIDENTS WHO HAVE

PETITIONED FOR A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT PROJECT.

BACKGROUND

On September 15, 2008 the Board of Commissioners approved a special assessment project to extend public water to approximately 25 residents along Cedar Creek Road east of the former Monsanto facility. The estimates for this project were based on the County being able to obtain easements from two property owners adjacent to the railroad tracks along the route. This would negate the need to obtain an easement from the railroad as well as the cost of boring the line under the railroad. Unfortunately one of the property owners is unwilling to grant the easement under any circumstances. This requires relocating the route to continue east along Cedar Creek Road, under the railroad tracks. This is estimated to increase the cost of the project by as much as \$75,000 to \$90,000 depending on the cost of getting the easement.

The residents requesting this service cannot bear the increase in the project costs and unless they receive some additional aid then the project will be abandoned. I am requesting that the Board of Commissioners through the Policy Committee consider recommending to the full Board that the County participate in the project to the extent that we in a partnership with the PWC extend the line across the tracks and the property owners pick up the costs from there. The Policy Committee met on March 5, 2009 to consider this request and unanimously approved recommending to the Board of Commissioners participation in this project.


The PWC staff has verbally agreed to participate in an amount equal to that which the County is willing to participate. This would also need the approval of the PWC Board as well. The cost is estimated to be less than \$50,000 to the County.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Commissioners follow the recommendation of the Policy Committee and approve County participation in this project for an amount equal to that of the PWC to extend the water line from its present location at the intersection of Cedar Creek Rd and Hwy 210 to a point on Cedar Creek Road just clearing the railroad right of way. TO DISCONTINUE THE STORMWATER FEE

BACKGROUND

The County Policy Committee at its March 5, 2009 meeting discussed the County's continued involvement in the joint Stormwater Utility. Refer to the attached memorandum to the Policy Committee dated February 23, 2009. Discussions were prompted by the NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources (NCDENR) favourable response to the County's request to no longer be considered a Phase I NPDES community. Although the County has not received a written response to our request, the conduct and verbal approval by NCDENR and the fact that only the City of Fayetteville has been named as the applicant in the Phase I NPDES Permit renewal process is assurance that the County is no longer a Phase I community. In addition, NCDENR has accepted the County's Certification of Non-Ownership/Non-Operation of a Municipal Separate Stormwater System (MS4) with respect to the Phase II NPDES Permit requirements giving further evidence that the County is no longer a Phase I community.

Recognizing that the City of Fayetteville must take appropriate action for continued compliance with their Phase I NPDES Permit requirements, including budgetary considerations, the Stormwater Utility Director requested guidance from the County regarding any continued involvement in the Stormwater Utility. The County Engineer advised the Policy Committee that withdrawing completely from the joint Stormwater Utility might send a message that the County is no longer committed to storm water quality issues and that perhaps some limited involvement in the utility is warranted. Also the County may want to consider redirecting its emphasis on storm water quantity issues, i.e. flooding problems, and look to the Stormwater Utility as the vehicle to accomplish these efforts with some continued storm water fee to fund drainage improvements. The County Attorney cautioned the Policy Committee that the stormwater fee was enacted to fund Federally mandated storm water quality activities for a county-wide benefit and that there are legal implications of continuing to collect a fee to be used to make site specific drainage improvements.

Chairman King asked the County Manager if there was a consensus among staff regarding a recommendation on this matter. After further discussion, the manager recommended that the County no longer collect the storm water fee. The Policy Committee concurred with the manager's recommendation.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

The recommendation of the County Policy Committee and management is to discontinue collecting the storm water fee. County staff will work with the Stormwater Utility Director in transitioning out of the joint Stormwater Utility.

The proposed action by the Board is to consider approval of the Policy Committee recommendation.

CONSIDERATION OF WITHDRAWING FROM JOINT STORMWATER UTILITY

BACKGROUND

In June 1995, the Board of Commissioners adopted a Stormwater Management Ordinance which established the Stormwater Utility for the primary purpose of administering the stormwater quality management program (SWOMP) required by the Phase I NPDES Permit issued by NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources (NCDENR). Through interlocal agreement, the City Of Fayetteville partnered with the County to submit a joint Phase I NPDES Permit Application and implement a joint Stormwater Utility. The City is responsible for the day to day operation of the Stormwater Utility.

Within the past year, the County submitted a written request to NCDENR that it no longer be considered a Phase I NPDES community due to the annexation by the City of Fayetteville of the urbanized area in western Cumberland County. This annexation resulted in the urbanized population of the unincorporated area of Cumberland County now being less than 100,000 which is the threshold for a Phase I NPDES community. Verbal approval from NCDENR has been received. however, we have not yet received written confirmation that explicitly states the County is no longer required to comply with Phase I NPDES Permit requirements. Given the verbal approval by NCDENR and concurrence from EPA Region 4, I believe it is appropriate for the County to now consider the future direction of our Stormwater Management Program including what level of participation, if any, in the joint Stormwater Utility and collection of the stormwater fee that supports the utility.

The Stormwater Management Ordinance adopted by the Board was developed only to comply with Federally mandated stormwater quality program elements dictated in the Phase I NPDES Permit. If the County is no longer a Phase I community, then we are no longer required to implement the SWQMP, however, we may choose to do so voluntarily. Given the current emphasis on being "environmentally friendly", there is some justification for continued involvement in a stormwater quality program.

There are a number of alternatives to consider with respect to the County SWQMP of which the two extremes are:

 Rescind the Stormwater Management Ordinance. This action would abolish the joint Stormwater Utility and the County's portion of the fee necessary to operate the utility. The Interlocal Agreement with the City of Fayetteville to operate the joint storm water utility would need to be modified or terminated. The City would need to take any necessary action for continued compliance with their Phase I NPDES Permit requirements.

• Continue to implement the SWQMP as is on a voluntary basis and continue to collect the storm water fee of \$12 per year per household plus non-residential fees. This action would demonstrate a continued commitment by the County to stormwater quality issues which are environmentally friendly. This would also keep intact a revenue stream to pay for small storm water system improvements (address storm water quantity needs) on a limited basis.

The County may consider some limited involvement in the Stormwater Utility recognizing that future changes in the NPDES regulations may again put the County in the stormwater quality business. Also, we may want to redirect the County emphasis on storm water issues from quality based to quantity based, i.e. address flooding concerns, and continue to look to the Stormwater Utility as the vehicle to accomplish these efforts. Obviously some level of storm water fee would be necessary to fund these activities.

This memorandum is intended to open a dialogue with the Policy Committee so that we may ultimately provide recommendations to the Board on the future of County participation in the joint Stormwater Utility. Mr.Greg Caison, Director of the Stormwater Utility, has requested guidance from County management concerning this matter. As the City plans for their stormwater program needs for the upcoming fiscal year, they need to know what the County's position will be regarding any continued involvement in the stormwater utility.

In the near future staff will review current Committee policies and explore the possibility of developing Bylaws that will more carefully address membership and term limits, as well as ex-officio possibilities.
