Annually, the Department of Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention provides funding to local county governments for the purpose of funding early intervention programs/services for youth that are involved in, or may become involved in, the juvenile court system.

In consideration of the Department of Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention's (DJJDP) projected allocations the 2010.2011 fiscal year, the JCPC has examined the risk factors and programming needs to develop the annual county juvenile justice plan to provide effective programs and services for at-risk youth ages 6-17 years of age and those involved in the juvenile court system. During our June meeting held on Wednesday, June 2, 2010 regarding funding for the upcoming fiscal year, the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has completed their annual planning process. As part of that meeting, the JCPC voted unanimously to submit the council's funding recommendations and the 2010.2011 annual Comprehensive Planning document for Cumberland County and the DJJDP state program agreements for six local programs.

Cumberland County is projected to receive \$966,850 in state dollars for fiscal year 2010.2011. Local matching funds are required in order to be eligible to receive these state funds. The county will provide \$211,684 and the programs will provide \$615,475 in cash and in-kind contributions. The local Council gratefully acknowledges the ongoing support provided by the county.

This packet represents the funding recommendations the CCJCPC is making to the C.C. Board of Commissioners for their consideration. The projected 2010.2011 funding plan is attached for review. Please feel free to contact me should you have any questions or require further assistance.

REVISIONS TO THE HOMEBUYERS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM POLICY

BACKGROUND

Homeownership enhances personal wealth for low-income families through the appreciation of property value and the gradual accumulation of equity in the home. Our objective is to assist low- to moderate-income individuals and families in achieving this goal. The housing industry and economy as a whole appear to be on the rebound, therefore, it is still our desire to assist the targeted population we serve in obtaining homes and being in a better financial position to maintain those homes.

In an effort to ensure that we are providing adequate assistance to potential homebuyers but not over subsidyzing any applicant, we are proposing to revise our Homebuyer Assistance Policy as follows:

Downpayment Assistance

Current policy: Maximum assistance up to \$10,000 with a maximum of \$1,500 towards closing costs; 0% interest deferred for 15 years; loan forgiveness beginning after year 5 (61st month) in an equal prorated annual amount.

Proposed policy: Maximum assistance up to \$5,000 with no limit on closing costs; 4% interest for 10 years; payment deferred through the 5th year with monthly payments beginning in the 6th year (61st month). See the attached Homebuyer Assistance Policy page 5.

GAP Financing

Current policy: Maximum assistance up to \$20,000; 0% interest deferred for 30 years; loan forgiveness beginning after year 5 (61st month) in an equal prorated annual amount.

Proposed policy: Maximum assistance up to \$20,000; 0%-4% for 30 years (interest rate is based on level of assistance needed to support the applicant's loan to value ratio); immediate monthly payment. See the attached Homebuyer Assistance Policy page 5.

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Page 2-HRP Program Policy Revisions

Applicants may receive both downpayment and gap financing assistance up to a maximum of \$25,000. The loan terms would then be the same as under the gap financing criteria. The policy will remain the same in that in the event the promissory note is triggered for repayment, Community Development funds will be recaptured immediately.

RECOMMENDATION AND PROPOSED ACTION

CCCD recommends approval of the proposed changes to the Homebuyers Assistance Program policy with an effective date of July 1, 2010.

BENEFITS TO FAMILIES

Affordable home ownership benefits low-income families as well as the community. Home ownership gives families a measure of security and control over their living situation that one doesn't have as a renter. Home ownership enhances personal wealth for low-income families through the appreciation of property value and the gradual accumulation of equity in the home. Also, mortgage interest can result in significant tax write offs, thereby increasing the percentage of income that can be retained by a low-income family.

Homeowners find comfort in the stability and predictability of home ownership. In many instances, benefits of long-term amortization for many homeowners can be less than comparable housing expenses in rental units.

COMMUNITY BENEFITS

Community development objectives may be greatly enhanced by high levels of owner occupancy. Neighborhoods containing high numbers of owner-occupied single-family dwellings are more economically stable and more physically attractive than comparable neighborhoods with a high percentage of investor-owner dwellings. Pride of ownership is very evident among owner-occupied neighborhoods and can increase property values and thereby increase the local property tax base.

BARRIERS TO HOME OWNERSHIP

Many times home ownership is unattainable for many households, especially households with low incomes. Property values are too high, incomes too low and personal savings too small to allow low-income families to become homeowners.

To design and implement a successful and effective Homebuyer Program, an assessment was conducted of the factors preventing low-income households from obtaining a home. The following barriers to home ownership are noted:

- 1. High Cost of Property: Property values have risen; however, real income has not kept pace with this increase. Because of the gap in affordability, many low-income households have not been able to purchase a home.
- 2. Insufficient Funds for Downpayment: Most private lenders require 10% to 20% of a home's value for down payment. Even when Private Mortgage Insurance (PMI) or Federal Housing Administration (FHA) Insurance is used, a 5% down payment of the home's value may still be too high in high priced markets. Also, rent burdened households who pay 40% to 50% of their income for housing, preclude them from accumulating funds for downpayment.
- Insufficient Funds for Closing Costs: The typical fees for loan closing such as
 origination fee, title report, title insurance, appraisal and legal fees are often too high for
 low income households.
- 4. Long Term Affordability of a Home: Often the principal, interest, taxes and insurance payments required on a monthly basis are too high when compared with available income for a low-income household.

In the past, private lending institutions have not provided mortgage financing to home purchasers where the monthly housing costs (mortgage payments, taxes, and insurance)

would equal more than 28% of total gross monthly income. These lenders also required that housing and other long-term debt not exceed 36% of the gross monthly income.

In recent years the Federal National Mortgage Association (Fannie Mae) has liberalized these qualifying ratios. Ratios up to 33% for housing debt and 38% for long term debt are permitted. However, in areas where property value has out paced real income levels these low income households still cannot qualify because of long term affordability.

- 5. High Existing Debt of Prospective Purchasers: Typically, low income families have excessively high existing debt for items such as credit accounts, car payments and medical expenses that will preclude them from obtaining private lender financing.
- 6. Access to Mortgage Money: Because of a mind set of unworthiness, many low income households will not try to obtain mortgage financing because they already feel that mortgage lenders will be unwilling to help them. Whether this mind set is accurate or not, this type of self-prognosis exists. Many times these households have insufficient credit or blemished credit, which also hinders them from being able to work with private lenders.
- 7. Need for Property Repairs: Often times property that is affordable for low income households are in neighborhoods where the property has been poorly maintained and requires repairs. Also, many times affordable housing is in neighborhoods where money invested in property improvements does not mean an increase in the value of the property.
- 8. Lack of Credit: Private lenders are concerned with the credit record of the purchaser. Low-income households may not have a credit record because they pay cash for most of their expenses.
- 9. Poor Credit: A blemished credit record cannot be easily corrected. Unfavorable information is reported for seven (7) years and some bankruptcies for ten (10) years.

Prospective homebuyers will often experience multiple barriers to becoming homeowners. Cumberland County Community Development's (CCCD) first step in designing a Homebuyers Program was to identify the barriers in Cumberland County facing low-income households and establish procedures to overcome these barriers.

CCCD has determined that there are three (3) barriers most prevalent in Cumberland County and has designed a Homebuyers Program with **Home** Funding (HOME), Community Development Block Grant Funding (**CDBG**), and American Dream Downpayment Initiative (**ADDI**), to help overcome these barriers. The three (3) barriers are as follows:

- 1. Insufficient funds for downpayment and closing costs;
- 2. Long term affordability of a home; and
- 3. Credit Problems (lack of credit and poor credit).

PROGRAM DESIGN

In order to design a coherent and effective Homebuyers Program, CCCD analyzed the following areas for Cumberland County and have included this information in the Cumberland County Consolidated Plan:

- 1. Market conditions;
- 2. Neighborhood characteristics:
- Types of single-family housing; and
- 4. Availability of such housing.

Also, CCCD must establish its priority for the Homebuyers Program. It has designed the following mission statement for the Program:

"First and foremost, the Homebuyer Program will provide a means of increasing the number of affordable housing units in Cumberland County for its low income citizens to improve their quality of life."

Our next issue to consider is whether or not the Homebuyer Program can provide enough flexibility and appropriate resources necessary to achieve the established goals. The goals for the Homebuyer Program are:

- 1. To significantly affect the level of homeownership among low income households within Cumberland County; and
- 2. Increase the supply of affordable housing which may be purchased.

The five (5) areas which need to be addressed in designing the Homebuyer Program are the location of the housing, eligible owners, eligible properties, forms of ownership and subsidy approaches and eligibility criteria.

- Location: CCCD operates within the geographical boundaries of the participating jurisdiction. This includes the towns of Stedman, Spring Lake, Wade, Falcon, Hope Mills, Linden, Eastover, and Godwin. CCCD does not operate within the city limits of Fayetteville.
- 2. Eligible Owners: The Homebuyer was designed to increase the level of affordable homeownership for low-income households. The program is limited to homebuyers who will occupy the property as the principal residence, and are considered low-income households. For the sake of consistency, we have selected the HUD 24 CFR Part 5 definition of annual income as the method of determination of annual income and asset eligibility be used for all programs. This will be useful when estimating borrowers' future ability to pay and producing quality loans. The Part 5 definition of Annual Income includes consideration of prospective income (over the next 12 months) and the current annual value of assets. Under these definitions all assets have an imputed income that must be included for purposes of determining eligibility. The Part 5 rules are efficient and fair and should be used, although the Part 5 definition of assets vary from the traditional underwriter's definitions. This is also beneficial in that the part 5 definitions are simpler, less arbitrary, and include only those items that are relatively easy to value and could actually be converted into cash.

Asset Limits: Applicants with assets above the thresholds below must apply those assets above the threshold toward the purchase of the property. Applicants may choose to use assets that fall below the established limits toward the purchase of the property, even though they are not required to do so.

- Non-elderly applicants must use non-retirement assets in excess of \$7,500 toward the purchase of the property.
- Elderly applicants must use non-retirement assets in excess of \$10,000 toward the purchase of the property.
- & All applicants must use retirement assets in excess of the applicable annual median income limit toward the purchase of the property.

In cases in which the family is experiencing un-reimbursed medical expenses in excess of 3 percent of annual income, the Loan Analyst may increase the applicable asset limit by the amount of the medical expenses in excess of 3 percent of annual income. The reasons for the waiver must be documented carefully.

Assets in excess of the above established limits must be used for down payment or other costs associated with the purchase of the property and may not be used to reduce the purchase price of a property below the HUD established 203(b) limit or pay prepaid taxes on the property.

The following are various qualifications of a homebuyer under the HOME definition in 24 CFR Part 92:

- a. A low income individual/family that has not owned a home within the past three (3) years;
- b. Displaced homemaker;
- c. Single parent;
- d. Low income individuals/families living in manufactured homes or mobile homes not permanently affixed to a foundation; or
- e. Owner occupants of homes not feasible for renovation.
- 3. Eligible Property: Cumberland County Community Development has broad discretion in the types of single-family dwellings (one to four units) properties that can be used. Property may be publicly or privately held prior to sale to the homebuyer. Any one to four unit property that serves as a principal residence of the purchaser qualifies in the Homebuyer program. Also, the property may not have been tenant occupied within the past six (6) months. This will include the following:
 - a. Single family home (one unit);
 - b. A two to four unit property;
 - c. Condominium units (in single or multi family units);
 - d. New manufactured house (mobile home); or
 - e. Cooperative unit (in single or multi family housing).
- 4. Forms of Ownership: The Homebuyer Program permits a variety of ownership approaches. Cumberland County Community Development has chosen to use fee simple title form of ownership.
- 5. Subsidy Approaches and Eligibility Criteria: Cumberland County Community Development will determine on an annual basis, which subsidy approach or combination of approaches is most advantageous. HOME regulations also permit discretion regarding the initial and future affordability of the property for the first time homebuyer.

There are three (3) suggested subsidy approaches. The following is a brief description of each type:

- 1. Development Subsidy: Investment of HOME funds in the acquisition, construction and/or rehabilitation of the project prior to initial sale to homebuyers. This approach should be used to underwrite the costs of producing units when they exceed market value.
- Prepaid Interest Subsidy: A grant of HOME funds to a private lender in order to buy down or write down the interest rate the lender would otherwise charge. This write down of interest rates creates a more affordable monthly mortgage cost to the borrower.
- 3. Homebuyer Subsidy: This subsidy may include all or a portion of the down payment, closing costs, or "gap" financing for the balance of the property purchase price and rehabilitation, making the long term affordability for the borrower attractive.

Cumberland County Community Development has elected to operate the Homebuyer Subsidy. It reserves the option to operate other subsidy programs as listed above in on-going years.

SUBSIDY APPROACH CHOSEN

CCCD will offer the Homebuyers Subsidy Approach by providing assistance with down payments and/or closing costs, and secondly, with "gap" financing to make up the difference between the market value of the property and a sales price that provides a more affordable monthly PITI (principal, interest, taxes, and insurance) payment for the purchaser.

For the subsidies providing downpayment and/or closing cost, CCCD will secure a first or second mortgage on the property with a deferred loan. The deferred payment loan is attractive because it does not add to the monthly carrying costs while permitting repayment at a future date. For subsidies providing "Gap" financing, CCCD will secure either a first or second mortgage on the property with a below market rate amortized loan. This approach offers the benefit of significant leverage of private lender money while providing program income for CCCD.

DOWNPAYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (DAP)

DAP loans will be financed over a 10 year term at 4% interest with a maximum loan amount of \$5,000.00. DAP funds may be used toward closing costs and/or required downpayment only. Payments and interest will be deterred for the first 5 years of the loan with payments beginning in the 61st month and amortized over the remaining 5 years at 4% interest. Below is an example of a DAP Loan with deferred payments.

If there is sufficient room in the participant's ability to pay, payments may be made in line with the first mortgage payment. However, the option of delaying the payback is available.

*Please note that any costs associated with the initiation of the first mortgage loan (i.e. appraisal fees, credit reports, etc.) will not be included as part of the down payment/closing cost assistance provided by CCCD.

GAP FINANCING (GAP)

"Gap" financing reduces private lender dollar amounts below the market value, which improves the loan to value ratio. Principal reduction or "gap" financing is one of the most convenient forms of assistance available. CCCD will offer a maximum \$20,000 second mortgage (or in some cases such as Rural Development partnerships, a first mortgage) in the form of "GAP" financing. The loan will be amortized at 0 - 4% interest with a maximum term similar to that of the participating lender's loan and a minimum term for the period of affordability. Interest rates will be based upon the level of subsidy necessary to produce a viable primary loan from participating lender. Below is an example of a GAP loan computed at various rates and terms.

Loan Closing

Loan closing will be accomplished in tandem with the participating lender's closing with the same attorney.

HOME FUNDED PROGRAM DIFFERENCES

Requirements that make the HOME funded programs unique include property value limitations, maintenance of homes as principal residences, use of properties with one or more rental units, and most notably, maintenance of homes as affordable housing.

- 1. Property Value Limitations: HOME requires all properties used in a homeownership program to have a value not exceeding 95% of the median value for the area. HUD regulations governing the HOME Program use FHA 203(b) mortgage limits as the 95% of the median value for four (4) types of single family housing —single family and condominiums, duplex, triplex, and quadruplex. The property value must be supported by an appraisal completed by a certified appraiser. For existing properties receiving improvements, the appraisal must reflect the after-rehabilitation value of the property. For properties not requiring rehabilitation, a current tax assessment reflecting 100% of the value may be used in place of a certified appraisal.
- Principal Residence: Property must be retained as the principal residence by the owner for the period of affordability which is contingent upon the amount of per unit subsidy received and may be 5, 10, or 15 years (20 years if new construction). A Declaration of Deed Restriction Form outlining the term and period of affordability will be recorded at the Register of Deeds in conjunction with the Deed of Trust to ensure the property remains affordable for the required length of time. The property owner agrees to allow CCCD to verify principal residence status semi-annually and to provide CCCD with a written certification regarding same. Subletting or renting is not permitted without the consent of CCCD. CCCD must ensure that a deed restriction, covenant or comparable enforcement controls this occupancy requirement.
- 3. Recapture Provision: All units receiving HOME Program subsidies are required to comply with a designated affordability period as described above. CCCD can ensure continued affordability through the recapture of its initial investment (plus interest, if debt is structured to be repaid with interest). The proceeds will be recycled and used for another HOME eligible activity (i.e., assisting another eligible homebuyer in obtaining a home.) Once the HOME funds are repaid, the property is no longer subject to the HOME restrictions. Even though the first home may no longer be a part of the affordable housing stock, another home will take its place once the recycled funds are used to assist another homebuyer with his/her purchase.

Term. This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect until the expiration of the Period of Affordability or when the HOME investment is paid in full as specified in the promissory note, whichever comes first. In the event of foreclosure or transfer of title by deed in lieu of foreclosure, net proceeds from a foreclosure sale must be applied to the remaining balance on the loan and any repayment obligation under the recapture provision would be limited to said net proceeds. Also, in the case of foreclosure or transfer of title by deed in lieu of foreclosure, or similar event, such termination will cease to be in effect if, at any time during the remainder of the Period of Affordability, the OWNER of record immediately prior to the foreclosure or deed in lieu of foreclosure, or any newly formed entity that includes such former OWNER or those with whom the former OWNER has or had family or business ties, obtains an ownership interest in the Development or the Land.

REFINANCING CONSIDERATIONS

HOME funds may not be used to pay for the refinancing of existing mortgages (even if the sole purpose of the refinancing is to promote homeownership) or make the property rehabilitation feasible for an existing low-income homeowner; however, CDBG funds may be used to refinance in the event the property is in need of rehabilitation.

During the period of affordability, a homebuyer will not be permitted to refinance the property without the approval of the CCCD, nor will CCCD agree to a subordination of its lien interest unless it is deemed to be in the best interest of the borrower and only if the value of the collateral remains sufficient to secure the County's debt.

KEY PROGRAM DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS

Key # 1: Leverage Private-Lender Financing

Funds should be used to convert infeasible loan applications into sound underwriting risks for private lending institutions by reducing the loan amount or lessening monthly costs to the prospective borrower.

By leveraging instead of duplicating the role of private lending institutions, Funds will go further and more low-income families can be served. Funds to supplement private financing will also ensure that CCCD does not have to be concerned with exceeding the HOME maximum per unit subsidy limits.

Key # 2: Take Full Advantage of Other Resources

Several financing options are available in the public and private sector markets to low income families to create opportunities of purchasing a home with affordable terms and flexible underwriting. Some of the primary options are listed below:

- a. Secondary Market Purchasers: Most private lenders only originate loans which they can sell on the secondary market to purchasers such as Fannie Mae. Fannie Mae has greatly enhanced their opportunities for low-income families to qualify for a home. These guidelines include flexible underwriting ratios, acceptance of non-traditional methods of verifying credit worthiness (rent payments, utility bills, etc.), less cash at loan closing (waive 2 month cash reserve requirement) and acceptance of subsidized second mortgage for purchase assistance or rehabilitation costs.
- b. Private Mortgage Insurance (PMI): With private mortgage insurance, now the loan-to-value ratio is higher, 97% or 95% with only a 3% or 5% downpayment, respectively, instead of the normal 10% to 20%.
- c. FHA, VA, RD: Mortgages are guaranteed so downpayment requirements are reduced to 5% or less of the appraised value of the purchase price of the property.
- d. USDA Rural Development: RD's underwriting standards and procedures are similar in many respects to those used by private lenders. However, because the Agency's mission, in part, is to serve buyers who are unable to obtain private credit, their underwriting criteria is somewhat less stringent than those used by private lenders and Rural Development has the ability to offer subsidies that enhance the applicant's ability to repay.

Key # 3: Affordable Property:

Homeownership will be used to provide stability and security for the low income family. CCCD is responsible for assuring the housing debt-to-income ratio and overall debt to income ratios are reasonable, so we will not encourage the purchase of a home which we feel will over tax the family. Therefore, the prevailing debt income ratios established by the first mortgage lender will be maintained for the Homebuyers Program for all purchases financed by private lenders as long as they are deemed reasonable and in line with other affordable mortgage products. However, CCCD reserves the right to make the determination that the primary lender's product is indeed an affordable mortgage product.

Key # 4: Realistic Goals

Our program design and operation is as simple and straight forward as possible. We have analyzed our product against the private market to be sure all underwriting guidelines are acceptable.

Homebuyers transactions are tailored to the income and other needs of the family. The more structured the process is at loan origination and at resale, the less burden on CCCD and/or our subrecipients. This process will also help avoid any questions of fairness in determining subsidy approaches for individual homebuyers.

Key # 5: Preparing the Purchasers

Counseling prospective homebuyers before the purchase of a home and at the loan closing are responsibilities required by the HOME Regulations and it is extremely important to the success of the homeowner. CCCD partners with Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Fayetteville to provide education and explanation of how the program works; the first and second mortgage process, maintaining good credit, budget planning, qualifying for a mortgage, loan closing/loan documents, and post purchase counseling to include not going over maximum disposable income, home maintenance, and repairs. All of these issues must be discussed and understood by the purchasers. CCCD performs in house servicing of its loan portfolio and maintains a close working relationship with its borrowers to assure successful levels of homeownership.

Home and Community Care Block Grant for Older Adults

Agreement for the Provision of County-Based Aging Services

This Agreement, entered into as of this1st day of July, 2010, by and between the County of Cumberland (hereinafter referred to as the "County") and the Mid-Carolina Area Agency on Aging, (hereinafter referred to as the "Area Agency").

Witnesseth That:

WHEREAS, the Area Agency and the County agree to the terms and conditions for provision of aging services in connection with activities financed in part by Older Americans Act grant funds, provided to the Area Agency from the United States Department of Health and Human Services through the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services (DAAS) and state appropriations made available to the Area Agency through the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services, as set forth in a) this document, b) the County Funding Plan, as reviewed by the Area Agency and the Division of Aging and Adult Services, c) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, d) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Service Standards Manual, Volumes I through IV, and, e) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Community Service Providers Monitoring Guidelines.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises, and mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. As provided in the Area Plan, community service providers specified by the County to encourage maximum collocation and coordination of services for older persons are as follows:
 - Cumberland County Coordinating Council on Older Adults, Inc.
- 1.(a) The Community Service Provider(s), shall be those specified in the County Funding Plan on the <u>Provider Services Summary</u> format(s) (DOA-732) for the period ending June 30, 2011.
- 2. <u>Availability of Funds</u>. The terms set forth in this Agreement for payment are contingent upon the receipt of Home and Community Care Block Grant funding by the Area Agency.
- 3. <u>Grant Administration</u>. The grant administrator for the Area Agency shall be Glenda Dye, Aging Director. The grant administrator for the County shall be the County Manager.

It is understood and agreed that the grant administrator for the County shall represent the County in the performance of this Agreement. The County shall notify the Area Agency in writing if the administrator changes during the grant period. Specific responsibilities of the grant administrator for the County are provided in paragraph seven (7) of this Agreement.

- 4. Services authorized through the County Funding Plan, as specified on the <u>Provider Services Summary</u> format(s) (DOA-732) are to commence no later than July 1, 2010 and shall be undertaken and pursued in such sequence as to assure their expeditious completion. All services required hereunder shall be completed on or before the end of the Agreement period, June 30, 2011.
- 5. Assignability and Contracting. The County shall not assign all or any portion of its interest in this Agreement. Any purchase of services with Home and Community Care Block Grant for Older Adults funding shall be carried out in accordance with the procurement and contracting policy of the community services provider or, where applicable, the Area Agency, which does not conflict with procurement and contracting requirements contained in 45 CFR 92.36. Federal funds shall not be awarded to any subreceipients who have been suspended or debarred by the Federal government. In addition, Federal funds may not be used to purchase goods or services costing over \$100,000 from a vendor that has been suspended or debarred from Federal grant programs. The County designates the Area Agency to procure services of the Home and Community Care Block Grant which are provided by Private For Profit Agencies.
- 6. <u>Compensation and Payments to the County</u>. The County shall be compensated for the work and services actually performed under this Agreement by payments to be made monthly by the Area Agency. Total reimbursement to the community service providers under this Agreement may not exceed the grand total of Block Grant funding, as specified on the <u>Provider Services Summary</u> format (DOA-732).

(a) Interim Payments to the County

Upon receipt of a written request from the County, the Division of Aging and Adult Services, through the Area Agency, will provide the County Finance Officer with an interim payment equivalent to seventy percent (70%) of one-twelfth (1/12) of the County's Home and Community Care Block Grant allocation by the 22nd of each month.

(b) Reimbursement of Service Costs

Reimbursement of service costs are carried out as provided in Section 3 of the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

c) Role of the Area Agency

The Area Agency shall be responsible for disbursing Home and Community Care Block Grant Funding to Community Service Providers in accordance with procedures specified in the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

- (d) The Area Agency will invoice County for all required match and any overmatch budgeted. This match will be disbursed to the proper agencies by the Area Agency.
- (e) Payment of Administration on Aging Nutrition Services Incentive Program (NSIP)
 Subsidy

NSIP subsidy for congregate and home delivered meals will be disbursed by the Division of Aging through the Area Agency to the County on a monthly basis, subject to the availability of funds as specified in Section 3 of the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Services Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

If through the US Department of Agriculture Area Agency on Aging Elections Project, the County elects to receive a portion of its USDA entitlement in the form of surplus commodity foods in lieu of cash, the Area Agency will notify the County in writing of its community valuation upon notification from the Division of Aging and Adult Services. The delivery of commodity and bonus foods is subject to availability. The County will not receive cash entitlement in lieu of commodities that are unavailable or undelivered during the Agreement period.

7. Reallocation of Funds and Budget Revisions. Any reallocation of Block Grant funding between counties shall be voluntary on the part of the County and shall be effective only for the period of the Agreement. The reallocation of Block Grant funds between counties will not affect the allocation of future funding to the County. If during the performance period of the Agreement, the Area Agency determines that a portion of the Block Grant will not be expended, the grant administrator for the County shall be notified in writing by the Area Agency and given the opportunity to make funds available for reallocation to other counties in the Planning and Service Area or elsewhere in the state.

The Area Agency may authorize community service providers to implement budget revisions which do not cause the County to fall below minimum budgeting requirements for access, inhome, congregate, and home delivered meals services, as specified in Division of Aging and Adult Services budget instructions issued to the County. If a budget revision will cause the County to fall below minimum budgeting requirements for any of the aforementioned services, as specified in Division of Aging and Adult Services budgeting instructions issued to the County, approval for the revision from the Area Agency prior to implementation by the community service provider is required, so as to assure that regional minimum budgeting requirements for the aforementioned services will be met.

In the event the Service Provider's rate of progress on the contract is leading to under spending at the end of the contract period the Area Agency may reallocate Home and Community Care Block Grant funds within the county as necessary to most effectively utilize funds.

Unless community services providers have been given the capacity to enter data into the Aging Resources Management System (ARMS), Area Agencies on Aging are responsible for entering amended service data into the Division of Aging Management Information System, as specified in the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

8. Monitoring. This Agreement will be monitored to assure that services are being provided in compliance with the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Service Standards Manual, dated July 1, 1992, and the N.C. Division of Aging Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997. Further, compliance with updated monitoring requirements, as specified in Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-133 and NC General Statute 143C-6-22 and 23 shall be carried out. Monitoring shall also include compliance with conflict of interest requirements. Monitoring requirements are discussed in Section 308 of the AAA Policies and Procedures Manual (7/1/03 and revised 10/1/09). Private non-profit service providers will be monitored to ensure compliance with conflict of interest policies, as stated in DoA Administrative Letter No. 03-14.

The monitoring of services provided under this Agreement shall be carried out by the Area Agency on Aging in accordance with its Assessment Plan and/or by the DAAS Program Compliance Representative (PCR). Local Departments of Social Services providing Adult Day Care, Adult Day Health Care, Housing and Home Improvement, and/or In-Home Aide (all levels) through the Home and Community Care Block Grant will receive monitoring by the State PCR. All other services and grantees are monitored by the Area Agency on Aging serving the counties' PSA.

Counties and community service providers will receive a written report of monitoring findings in accordance with procedures established in Section 308 of the AAA Policies and Procedures Manual (7/1/03 and revised 10/1/09). Any areas of non-compliance will be addressed in a written corrective action plan with the community service provider.

9. <u>Disputes and Appeals</u>. Any dispute concerning a question of fact arising under this Agreement shall be identified to the designated grants administrator for the Area Agency. In accordance with Lead Regional Organization (LRO) policy, a written decision shall be promptly furnished to the designated grants administrator for the County.

The decision of the LRO is final unless within twenty (20) days of receipt of such decision the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners furnishes a written request for appeal to the Director of the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services, with a copy sent to the Area Agency. The request for appeal shall state the exact nature of the complaint. The Division of Aging and Adult Services will inform the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of its appeal procedures and will inform the Area Agency that an appeal has been filed. Procedures thereafter will be determined by the appeals process of the Division of Aging and Adult Services. The state agency address is as follows:

- 10. Termination for Cause. If through any cause, the County shall fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this Agreement, or the County has or shall violate any of the covenants, agreements, representations or stipulations of this Agreement, the Area Agency shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners written notice of such termination no fewer than fifteen (15) days prior to the effective date of termination. In such event, all finished documents and other materials collected or produced under this Agreement shall at the option of the Area Agency, become its property. The County shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any work satisfactorily performed under this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Audit.</u> The County agrees to have an annual independent audit in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes, North Carolina Local Government Commission requirements, Division of Aging and Adult Services Program Audit Guide for Aging Services and Federal Office of Budget and Management (OMB) Circular A-133.

Community service providers, as specified in paragraph one (1), who are not units of local government or otherwise subject to the audit and other reporting requirements of the Local Government Commission are subject to audit and fiscal reporting requirements, as stated in NC General Statute 143C-6-22 and 23 and OMB Circular A-133, where applicable. Applicable community service providers must send a copy of their year-end financial statements, and any required audit, to the Area Agency on Aging. Home and Community Care Block Grant providers are not required to submit Activities and Accomplishments Reports. For-profit

corporations are not subject to the requirements of OMB Circular A-133, but are subject to NC General Statute 143C-6-22 and 23 and Yellow Book audit requirements, where applicable. **Federal funds** may not be used to pay for a **Single or Yellow Book audit** unless it a federal requirement. **State funds** will not be used to pay for a **Single or Yellow Book** audit if the provider receives less than \$500,000 in state funds. The Department of Health and Human Services will provide confirmation of federal and state expenditures at the close of the state fiscal year. Information on audit and fiscal reporting requirements can be found at https://www.ncgrants.gov/NCGrants/PublicReportsRegulations.jsp.

- Audit/Assessment Resolutions and Disallowed Cost. It is further understood that the 12. community service providers are responsible to the Area Agency for clarifying any audit exceptions that may arise from any Area Agency assessment, county or community service provider single or financial audit, or audits conducted by the State or Federal Governments. In the event that the Area Agency or the Department of Health and Human Services disallows any expenditure made by the community service provider for any reason, the County shall promptly repay such funds to the Area Agency once any final appeal is exhausted in accordance with paragraph nine (9). The only exceptions are if the Area Agency on Aging is designated as a community service provider through the County Funding Plan or, if as a part of a procurement process, the Area Agency on Aging enters into a contractual agreement for service provision with a provider which is in addition to the required County Funding Plan formats. In these exceptions, the Area Agency is responsible for any disallowed costs. The County or Area Agency on Aging can recoup any required payback from the community service provider in the event that payback is due to a community service provider's failure to meet OMB Circular A-122 requirements, requirements of A-110, requirements of 45CFR, Part 1321, and 45CFR, Part 92, or state eligibility requirements as specified in policy.
- 13. Indemnity. The County agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Area Agency, its agents, and employees from and against and all loss, cost, damages, expenses, and liability arising out of performance under this Agreement to the extent of errors or omissions of the County.
- Equal Employment Opportunity and Americans With Disabilities Act Compliance. Both the 14. County and community service providers, as identified in paragraph one (1), shall comply with all federal and state laws relating to equal employment opportunity and accommodation for disability.
- 15. Data to be Furnished to the County. All information which is existing, readily available to the Area Agency without cost and reasonably necessary, as determined by the Area Agency's staff, for the performance of this Agreement by the County shall be furnished to the County and community service providers without charge by the Area Agency. The Area Agency, its agents and employees, shall fully cooperate, with the County in the performance of the County's duties under this Agreement.
- Rights in Documents, Materials and Data Produced. The County and community service 16. providers agree that at the discretion of the Area Agency, all reports and other data prepared by or for it under the terms of this Agreement shall be delivered to, become and remain, the property of the Area Agency upon termination or completion of the work. Both the Area Agency and the County shall have the right to use same without restriction or limitation and without compensation to the other. For the purposes of this Agreement, "data" includes

- writings, sound recordings, or other graphic representations, and works of similar nature. No reports or other documents produced in whole or in part under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright by or on behalf of the County.
- 17. <u>Interest of the Board of Commissioners</u>. The Board of Commissioners covenants that neither the Board of Commissioners nor its agents or employees presently has an interest, nor shall acquire an interest, direct or indirect, which conflicts in any manner or degree with the performance of its service hereunder, or which would prevent, or tend to prevent, the satisfactory performance of the service hereunder in an impartial and unbiased manner.
- 18. <u>Interest of Members of the Area Agency, Lead Regional Organization, and Others</u>. No officer, member or employee of the Area Agency or Lead Regional Organization, and no public official of any local government which is affected in any way by the Project, who exercises any function or responsibilities in the review or approval of the Project or any component part thereof, shall participate in any decisions relating to this Agreement which affects his personal interest or the interest of any corporation, partnership or association in which he is, directly or indirectly, interested; nor shall any such persons have any interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds arising therefrom.
- 19. Officials not to Benefit. No member of or delegate to the Congress of the United States of America, resident Commissioner or employee of the United States Government, shall be entitled to any share or part of this Agreement or any benefits to arise herefrom.
- 20. <u>Prohibition Against Use of Funds to Influence Legislation</u>. No part of any funds under this Agreement shall be used to pay the salary or expenses of any employee or agent acting on behalf of the County to engage in any activity designed to influence legislation or appropriations pending before Congress.

This page will be utilized when the Area Agency is designated by County to write checks to community service providers.

22. Payment to Community Service Providers by the Area Agency on Aging. The County authorizes the Area Agency on Aging, in lieu of the County Finance Officer, to provide interium and reimbursement payments to community service providers as prescribed in paragraphs 6(a) and (c) of this Agreement. PARKING DECK AND RURAL WATER

BACKGROUND

The attached agreement is the latest proposal for an agreement among the three parties with respect to the parking deck and rural water. The language in Sections 1 and 3 was prepared by someone on behalf of the city or PWC. I prepared the language in Section 2. No agreement has been reached. I have also included an email I sent to the email list on May 28, 2010, to clarify the characterization of the draft as the county's version.

DISCUSSION

With respect to the parking deck, the agreement requires the county to contribute 100% of the increase in the current year's tax collections in the Municipal Service District into the debt service fund until the debt is paid. This will require a modification to the school funding agreement to be re-negotiated for the FY commencing July 1, 2011.

With respect to the provision of rural water, the agreement is a commitment to provide the water under the terms and conditions established in the agreement.

RECOMMENDATION

I suggest that the county be removed from the preamble statement that "development and commercial activity in the downtown area of Fayetteville has been hampered due to an insufficient inventory of public parking" because the agreement does not address the number of public parking spaces to be created. It only indicates that approximately 150 spaces will be reserved for the RCW building.

Interlocal Agreement Between The City of Fayetteville, Cumberland County, and Fayetteville Public Works Commission Related to The Funding And Development of The Franklin Street Parking Garage

This interlocal Agreement is entered into between the CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, Cumberland County, North Carolina, (the "City"), CUMBERLAND COUNTY, North Carolina, (the "County") and the PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, ("PWC") for the propose of developing and financing a Franklin Street Parking Garage adjacent to the Robert C. Williams Building and to provide for future partnerships in providing rural water service to unincorporated portions of Cumberland County.

Whereas; development and commercial activity in the downtown area of Fayetteville has been hampered due to an insufficient inventory of public parking;

Whereas; both Fayetteville and Cumberland County benefit from economic activity and increased property values in the downtown area;

Whereas; PWC owns the Robert C. Williams ("RCW") Building on Hay street in the core of downtown that does not have sufficient parking for its customers and tenants;

Whereas; the construction of a parking deck on Franklin Street with a capacity of about 300 spaces will increase the value of the RCW Building and promote economic activity, development and redevelopment in the downtown, and thereby enhance property value growth in the Municipal Service District of downtown and will benefit all parties;

Whereas; the County has an interest in making rural water service available throughout the County; and

Whereas; PWC currently has the capacity to treat and provide potable water and the expertise to serve utility operations.

Now Therefore;

- Franklin Street Parking Deck The Parties agree to the following regarding the construction of a parking deck on the City's lot adjacent to the Robert C. Williams Building.
 - 1.1. Project Funding

- 1.1.1. Cash Contribution: PWC will provide an equity investment of \$1,500,000 contributed as follows:
 - Reimbursement to the Fayetteville Cumberland County Chamber of Commerce of costs incurred in initial and schematic design of the project,
 - Reimbursement to the City for all design and construction management related costs, and
 - Reimbursement to the City for construction cost payments upon receipt of construction progress billing documentation and reimbursement requests from the City up to the unexpended Cash Contribution amount.
- 1.1.2. **Debt Financing:** The City will take the lead in securing financing sufficient to support construction of the project utilizing either ARRA Economic Development Bond program financing or tax exempt debt financing.
- 1.1.3. Debt Repayment: PWC will contribute \$500,000 to reimburse the City for initial debt payments when they become due. The City will contribute \$25,000 annually from Municipal Service District ("MSD") revenue beginning in FY 2012 to the Debt Repayment Fund, established by the City. Beginning in FY 2012, the City's MSD contribution will also include the cumulative amount of growth in the MSD revenue collections over the FY 2011 base year. The remaining debt will be repaid through a Synthetic Tax Increment Financing ("TIF") as follows:
 - 1.1.3.1. The City and the County agree to pay into the Debt Repayment Fund tax revenue from the cumulative amount of growth in current year ad valorem tax collections from properties within the MSD beginning in FY 2012 over the FY 2011 base year until such time as the Debt Repayment Fund is sufficient to fully repay the debt incurred to construct the garage.
 - 1.1.3.2. <u>Basis</u> the current year ad valorem tax revenue collected from properties within the increment area (the MSD) for the FY 2011 fiscal year shall be the Basis of the tax increment calculation.
 - 1.1.3.3. <u>TIF Contribution</u> beginning in FY 2012, the City and County shall contribute to the Debt Repayment Fund quarterly any increase in ad valorem tax revenue collected between the Basis and collections during that quarter.

- 1.2. **Project Development:** The parking garage shall be developed with specific characteristics and conditions as follows:
 - 1.2.1. **Design** The parking deck will be designed and constructed to tie into the RCW Building on an upper level as determined most feasible by the architect. The parking deck, including access control, will be designed to allow clear identification of a number of parking spaces reserved to the RCW Building consistent with the equity payment made by PWC and debt issuance restrictions. The parking deck will be designed to minimize its impact on the function of the drive through at the RCW Building and the existing capacity of that facility will be maintained. PWC's approval of the final design of tie in connections must be obtained prior to bidding the project. All costs of completing designed connections will be included in the project.
 - 1.2.2. Construction The City will manage the construction of the parking deck including any service contracts necessary to accomplish that work. Existing parking resources available to the RCW Building will be maintained during construction through the dedication of temporary off-site parking facilities provided under the same terms as displaced parking. Every reasonable effort will be made to minimize the extent and duration of any impact of construction on the functioning of the drive through that serves the RCW Building. The drive through will not be closed during the business hours of the tenant operating the drive through window without prior consent thereof.
- 1.3. Project Operation: The City shall operate the parking deck exercising complete control and responsibility for establishing operational policies, rates, hours of operation, etc... and establishing maintenance practices, budgets, contracts, etc... with the following restrictions and contributions:
 - 1.3.1. Capacity Reservation A portion of the parking deck's capacity will be reserved for use by tenants of the RCW Building as follows:
 - 1.3.1.1. Number of Spaces the capacity to be reserved will be calculated based upon the equity payment provided by PWC; that is the percentage of parking capacity equal to the percentage of the equity payment to the total cost of constructing the parking deck including all design costs. Further, an additional

reservation from the remaining, debt financed capacity up to 10% will be reserved with the purpose of getting as close to 100 spaces reserved as permissible under debt issuance restrictions and as practicable based upon the design of the structure including circulation and access control points.

Additionally, the City will continue to make available the 50 permitted spaces in the parking lot across Franklin Street for the employees of the tenants of the RCW Building, such arrangement consistent with the current use of said parking lot.

- 1.3.1.2. <u>Location</u> the spaces reserved will be located at the top of the structure in a manner designed to allow their use to be separately controlled through the use of automated access equipment, or as otherwise agreed to by PWC and the City.
- 1.3.1.3. <u>Timing</u> the spaces reserved will be open to the public for general use on the same terms and conditions as the other spaces in the deck between 6 pm and 7 am Monday through Friday and at all times on Saturday, and Sunday.
- 1.3.1.4. Operations and Maintenance Cost Contribution in order to maintain this reservation, PWC or subsequent owner of the RCW Building must reimburse the City quarterly for a proportion of the operation and maintenance costs of the parking deck, including any identified capital reserve amount for reconditioning or major repairs, in proportion to the total percentage of the capacity of the deck reserved for use by the RCW Building.
- 1.3.1.5. <u>Term</u> this reservation shall extend for a period of twenty five (25) years from the date a certificate of occupancy is provided for the parking structure unless earlier terminated by the failure to comply with Section 1.3.1.4., another material term of this agreement, or by agreement of the parties.
- 1.3.2. Operational Revenue All revenue from fees charged for parking or other use of the parking deck or other facilities owned by the City will accrue solely to the City.
- 2. County Rural Water Service Development The County desires to provide rural water service to certain unincorporated areas of the County currently without service. PWC agrees to sell water to the County for this rural water service and to provide other services pertaining

to the operation and maintenance of the County's rural water system pursuant to the service delivery options and other terms set forth in this agreement.

- 2.1. Rural Water Districts. The rural water systems to be served by PWC water have been or may be established by the County as water districts, water and sewer districts, County-owned systems, or by any other method authorized by the North Carolina General Statutes and shall be referred to collectively as the "County Water System." in this agreement.
- 2.2. Rural Water Standards. All distribution systems to be developed in the County Water System shall be developed to USDA-RD rural water system standards, whether or not such standards comply with the standards established by PWC from time to time.
- 2.3. Cost of Development. PWC shall not incur any obligation to share in any portion of the costs of developing the County Water System. All costs, including the cost of any distribution lines to deliver the water to any established water districts shall be the responsibility of the County.
- 2.4. Ownership of Assets. The County shall own all the assets of the County Water System.
- 2.5. Service Delivery Options. PWC shall provide the water and services in accordance with the service delivery options identified as Options 1, 1A, 2 and 3 in Attachment A to this agreement. At the time any such water service is developed, the County shall elect either option as the service delivery method it chooses to provide service in any component system in the County Water System. The County may choose different options for different component systems.
- 2.6. Capacity Limitation. PWC shall have no obligation to provide service to any component system of the County Water System when the cumulative addition of the demand in the component system of the County Water System with all other customer demand exceeds 80% of its treatment capacity at the time such request for County service is made.
- 2.7. Contaminated Water. PWC will extend service into areas identified by the County as suffering from contaminated water as long as the capital investment to be paid by PWC as part of the extension can be recovered within twelve (12) years of project completion. "Contaminated" as use herein shall mean found to be unfit for human consumption by a governmental agency applying published regulatory standards. The service extended

under this paragraph will be standard PWC water service under the terms and conditions generally applicable to existing customers outside the City of Fayetteville. Any such extensions under this provision shall become part of PWC's distribution system and owned by it.

- 2.8. Consideration. PWC enters into this agreement with County as part of the consideration to County for County's agreement to partially fund construction of the Franklin Street Parking Deck described in Section 1 of this agreement.
- 2.9. Term. PWC's obligation to provide the water and services requested by the County as described in this agreement shall remain in place through June 30, 2030, regardless of the term of county's payment of any debt service on the Franklin Street Parking Deck as described in Section 1 of this agreement.

3. General Terms

- 3.1. Term This agreement will persist until all debt incurred by the City for the initial construction of the Franklin Street Parking Deck has been retired.
- 3.2. Timing of Payments Any payment required under this agreement will be made within thirty (30) days of becoming due as established by the terms hereof. Where reimbursement is called for, the payment will become due upon the request of the party eligible for reimbursement.

Attached you will find a resolution approved by the Board of Education on May 11, 2010, which includes the necessary information for the application process and a pledge of sales tax and education lottery proceeds for repayment of the debt.

BACKGROUND

As a result of the discussions at the February Planning Workshop conducted by the Board of Commissioners county management sought to re-establish the county's formal economic development policy with a points-based system modeled after the system developed by Chatham County with assistance from the Kenan-Flagler School of Business at UNC-CH. The City of Fayetteville joined in that effort with the goal of creating, with the county, a cooperative program still under the direction of the Fayetteville-Cumberland Chamber of Commerce.

The attached draft is reported to be the joint economic development policy as adopted by the Fayetteville City Council. The email delivering that report is attached and also states that the city established a revitalization zone. That zone is contemplated by the city's scoring system for location. We have not asked for details as to the location of the zone.

Although described as a joint program between the city and county, there is a portion that is specific only to the city and it was contemplated that there may also be a portion specific to the county.

DISCUSSION

The proposed policy establishes three joint programs. One is for direct property tax grantbacks which have been in use for a number of years. Another is for the direct funding of public infrastructure necessary to support a privately financed project through what the policy refers to as synthetic TIFs. The third is for the direct grant or grantback of the cost of real property.

Since a synthetic TIF cannot be used to establish a project development financing district, it must be used in conjunction with an economic development agreement with the project owner and amounts to a tax grantback that is restricted to use for debt service. The synthetic TIF program does not really enhance the incentives being offered. It does, however, establish a conceptual framework for financing infrastructure needed for a project. The 50% limitation on the dedication of future tax revenue was inserted to accommodate the county's funding agreement with the school system. It is applied to both the county and city even though the city has no obligation for school funding.

The city specific programs are rather limited in scope and scale of incentives offered. The Board of Commissioners may add such county specific programs as it deems

prudent. The city's point rating system set out on Attachment A establishes objective criteria for rating projects seeking property tax grantbacks. The county's point rating system should be modified to accommodate the county's funding agreement with the school system. A direct tax grantback is a form of synthetic TIF and the limitation on the synthetic TIF used to finance public infrastructure should carry forward into the direct tax grantback.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Policy Committee modify the county's Tax Grantback criteria to address specific areas of county concern including the county's school funding agreement and provide staff direction on any further specific county programs to be included.

Specific modifications should be considered as follows:

- Add a section for (Support Programs County): One program to be considered
 would be coordination of workforce development efforts with local and state
 agencies including community college, ESC and Workforce Development
- The county's tax grantback should be reduced to the percentage available after the school funding obligation is met
- The property cost grantback might be focused on county-owned property in the industrial park accomplished through specific program language or by weighting an industrial park site instead of a revitalization zone site in the points system

Cumberland County and the City of Fayetteville have determined that it is in the best interests of their residents and constituents to implement an economic development program to attract and support private investment to:

- Expand the tax base;
- Redevelop economically challenged areas of the community;
- Increase employment opportunities, wages, and personal incomes;
- Improve the quality of life available to their residents; and
- Increase wealth in the community.

The ultimate objective of this work is to develop a healthy and diverse tax base able to provide the resources necessary for Cumberland County and Fayetteville to provide high quality public services consistent with their missions at a reasonable cost to their residents.

This effort will be coordinated and led by the Fayetteville-Cumberland County Chamber of Commerce (FCCCC). The purpose of this document is to establish the composition and boundaries of that program.

Organization:

FCCCC will serve as the primary point of contact for economic development projects under consideration for this program throughout the process of Application, Review, and Evaluation (except as otherwise noted below). The FCCCC will manage and coordinate the receipt of application materials and when appropriate make a written recommendations and/or oral presentations to the City Council and Cumberland County Commission as to the eligibility and suitability of each proposal. The FCCCC will not only serve as the initial point of contact for those interested in accessing this incentive program, but will also promote the program.

The FCCCC will pre-screen applicants for preliminary eligibility and provide early notification to the offices of the City and County Managers at the point it appears a potentially qualifying project has begun its due diligence process for sites in Fayetteville and Cumberland County. All proprietary information is to be retained by the FCCCC until such point as the developer authorizes public dissemination of the subject information.

The final decision as to eligibility and suitability leading to a decision to apply any of the development incentives herein to any particular project rests with the City Council of the City of Fayetteville and the Cumberland County Commission.

While the FCCCC will have primary responsibility for project review and incentive plan development, they will do so in coordination with the City and County managers' offices and

with technical support from relevant City and County subject matter experts.

Projects eligible for assistance may receive a combination of the incentives described herein dependent on the project's documented need for assistance, and the projected benefit to the community's economy and quality of life.

The FCCCC may also provide development assistance for eligible projects, including, but not limited to:

- Providing meeting space during planning, negotiation and construction process; and
- Providing project management personnel for local resource guidance, workforce development, facility assistance and government/community interface

The FCCCC is also expected to seek support for economic development projects through federal, state, and other local agencies

Public Purpose:

All projects supported by economic development incentives recommended by FCCCC must serve a Public Purpose. The Public Purposes to be served through the application of this program will include:

- Expanding the tax base by increasing the value of taxable property;
- Increasing employment opportunities, wages, and personal incomes;
- Diversifying the economic base of the community improving economic stability;
- Redeveloping economically challenged areas of the community and removing blight in key corridors identified by one of the jurisdictions;
- Supporting the development of facilities necessary to fill the needs identified by the BRAC RTF Comprehensive Regional Growth Plan for the Fort Bragg Region (September 2008);
- Improving the quality of life available to Fayetteville and Cumberland County residents.

Economic Justification

The FCCCC will review all requests for incentives to evaluate eligibility of the type and amount of assistance requested. This will include identification of the public purpose(s) to be served by the project and must be supported by evidence that without the assistance requested the project could not be developed with the attributes and benefits necessary to serve the identified Public Purpose.

This will include scrutiny of the gap analysis provided by the applicant's independent financial analysis. The economic impact analysis will forecast the projected outcomes from a particular project, including, but not limited to, job generation, and direct and indirect economic impacts in the community for ongoing operation of the facility. The analysis will be used in consideration of approval of the project as well as in drafting potential terms of the Economic Development Incentive Agreement if approved for the program. The FCCCC will provide a written

recommendation to the City and County regarding project eligibility and level and type of assistance.

General Eligibility Criteria:

Projects must be:

- located within the City limits of Fayetteville (for City incentive programs) and/or Cumberland County (for all programs);
- permitted under existing zoning and land-use regulations applicable to the subject property without subsequent action by the City Council or County Commission; and
- subject to property tax.

Programs:

Without precluding exploration of unique or evolving economic development projects, economic development activities will focus on meeting the needs of potential projects through the following programs:

Property Tax Grantback Program (City & County)

The Property Tax Grantback program provides a successful applicant a series of grants based upon ad valorem taxes actually paid and is subject to the following:

Property Tax Grantback benefits will only be paid for completed, operational projects meeting the terms of the Economic Development Incentive Agreement ("EDIA") and that remain in compliance with all applicable codes, regulations, and requirements including but not limited to those associated with environmental, building, zoning, property maintenance, and specific terms or standards established in the EDIA.

The Property Tax Grantback benefits will be determined based on the documentation of financial need and the Property Tax Grantback Incentive Program Table (Attachment A). The Grantback benefit will be a function of the increased property value over the initial land value as determined by the County Tax Administrator for each year of eligibility. In order for projects to remain eligible, all property taxes must be paid on time in accordance with standard City and County requirements. Eligible projects will receive a Property Tax Grantback payment in accordance with the terms set out in the EDIA.

Tax Increment Funded Public Infrastructure Program (City & County)

Public infrastructure required to support a privately financed project may be funded through the dedication of future ad valorem tax revenue (Synthetic "TIF"). The funding provided shall not exceed the amount that can be retired by a dedication of fifty percent (50%) of the projected increase in ad valorem revenue of the property supported by the public infrastructure project over a period of twenty (20) years. Any funding for the public infrastructure project not covered by this program must be secured to the satisfaction of the City and/or the County prior to commitment of public resources.

Examples of eligible public infrastructure projects include transportation, stormwater, recreation, and parking improvements. In all cases, the resulting improvement must be dedicated to the City or County for public benefit, use and operation upon completion. The design of the public improvement project must be approved in advance and estimated cost

must exceed \$3 million. Any ongoing operational or maintenance requirement for developed improvements must be addressed in the EDIA. Required conditions precedent and other guarantees that may be required to ensure the anticipated tax revenue is generated will also be set out in the EDIA. The project applicant must not seek any other incentive that could result in reducing the tax revenue available to support repayment of the debt incurred to support the construction of the public infrastructure project.

Property Price Grantback (City & County)

City and/or County owned property acquired and prepared for development or redevelopment may be made available for a price established by market appraisal or as authorized by N.C.G.S. 158-7.1. The purchase price may, however, be granted back to the developing entity or purchase payments forgiven based upon job creation and other Public Purposes as defined and consistent with terms established in the EDIA.

Support Programs: (City)

The FCCCC will promote the following programs, but will refer applications to the Community Development Department of the City of Fayetteville for processing.

Downtown Loan Program

This program is designed to recruit small businesses to the downtown Fayetteville Renaissance Plan area. Loans are available for existing or expanding small businesses to purchase, renovate or construct a downtown commercial property. The minimum loan is \$50,000 and the maximum is \$300,000. The City partners with six banks to fund this loan pool. The City puts in 40% of each loan and offers an attractive fixed interest rate of 4% and the banks share the other 60% at variable prime.

Business Assistance Loan Program

This program is available to small businesses investing anywhere within the City limits. It offers assistance with gap financing or down payment assistance. The business owner would first make application to a bank for a primary loan and after being approved and identifying a gap in financing, can then make application to this program. The City's loan can be up to \$125,000 or up to 25% of the total loan funds needed. The City offers a low fixed interest rate of 5% and an even lower rate of 3% if the business is located within one of the City's redevelopment plan areas.

Facade Improvement Grant Program

This program encourages downtown businesses as well as those located within any of the City's redevelopment plan areas to improve the exteriors of their commercial property. The City will provide a 50% matching reimbursement grant up to a maximum of \$5,000 for each project.

Urban Progress Zones

This incentive program provides economic incentives to stimulate new investment and job creation in economically distressed areas. The designation of these zones offers an enhancement to the Article 3J state tax credits that are available to eligible taxpayers. The

City of Fayetteville has two Urban Progress Zones that are effective beginning January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2011.

Development Eligibility & Review/Evaluation Criteria

To be eligible for this program, the proposed project must identify:

- the financial and technical capacity of the development team as demonstrated by past participation/responsibility for projects of the type proposed;
- the location, site characteristics and preliminary sketch site design;
- the proposed LEED elements to be incorporated into the development, construction and operation of the facility;
- number and type of FTE jobs to be created;
- the preliminary project budget;
- the physical and operational/service elements that will result in the project being eligible for this program;
- the type(s) and fiscal impact estimates of the proposed incentives;
- unique benefits or public contributions to be provided by the project in excess of regulatory requirements;
- a professional independent financial analysis that will determine whether financial gaps exist justifying participation in the incentive program. The entity chosen for the financial analysis must be pre-approved by the City or County Manager; and
- any other information that may be requested by the City or County.

Economic Development Incentive Agreement

In the event that preliminary approval of a project for this program is provided, an Economic Development Incentive Agreement ("EDIA") will be drafted providing further detail of the physical and operational attributes of the entire scope of development. In addition, the responsibilities of the Developer and City and/or County will be clearly defined along with appropriate timelines for performance and remedies for breach of contract. Public funds will not be expended for any project specific improvements until a current and favorable market feasibility analysis is completed by an independent, nationally recognized third party expert demonstrating the viability of the proposed project and the developer demonstrates the irrevocable financial commitments necessary to carry out the project as agreed upon.

Additionally, once an incentive package has been approved, construction on a project must commence and be completed in accordance with the terms of the EDIA..

The EDIA will also include specific provisions to recapture the value of incentives provided should the project fail to provide the negotiated public benefit as defined in the EDIA and as demonstrated by specific performance objectives established in the EDIA.

Other qualitative criteria identified elsewhere in this document will be used in the process of considering, approving, rejecting, and/or modifying the incentive amount.

This route extension would bring the trail across the County's landfill property which abuts the river. County management and legal has been negotiating with the City the terms and conditions for an easement across County property since 2007, and the attached easement reflects those negotiations. The City says it needs to acquire this easement by the end of June to comply with the terms and conditions of its grant. The attached easement is drafted to accommodate the City's project needs while providing terms which protect the County's landfill operations and minimizes the County's loss of control of its land.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION:

Board approve the granting of the easement to the City of Fayetteville and authorize the Chairman and Clerk to execute the necessary documents on behalf of the County subject the approval of the documentation by County legal.

THIS INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT made and entered into this day of April, 2010, by and between the CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, a municipal corporation located in Cumberland County, North Carolina (hereinafter the "CITY"), and CUMBERLAND COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter the "COUNTY").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, CITY desires to purchase through foreclosure proceedings the abandoned property formerly owned by TEXFI Industries located at Pin Numbers 0438-95-1325, 0438-74-9413, and 0438-96-4009 (hereinafter the "TEXFI Site").

WHEREAS, CITY has submitted an application for a Brownfields Agreement with the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

WHEREAS, award of a Brownfields designation will benefit CITY and COUNTY residents in that environmental contaminants on the TEXFI Site will be abated.

WHEREAS, cleanup of the TEXFI Site is beneficial to both the CITY and COUNTY as it will make the land suitable for reuse and protection of the PWC Hoffer Water Treatment Facility and the Cape Fear River.

WHEREAS, the foreclosure will allow the CITY to take advantage of funding opportunities with EPA grants and the CITY's Capital Improvement Plan to make the site environmentally safe and expand the Clark Park Recreation Area and complete Phase II of the River Trail for the benefit of all CITY and COUNTY residents.

WHEREAS, CITY will bear all costs associated with the acquisition of TEXFI Site.

WHEREAS, CITY and COUNTY taxes, interest, and fees in the amount of \$411,043.41 are due on the said property (hereinafter "Taxes").

WHEREAS, COUNTY is in need of a vehicle and trailer for transport of animals by Animal Services.

WHEREAS, the CITY, pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 160A-280, has a vehicle and a three-horse trailer in its surplus inventory.

WHEREAS, the abatement of the environmental dangers, future reuse and expansion of the Clark Park Recreation Area, completion of Phase II of the River Trail, and protection of the Cape Fear River, is of a great value to the COUNTY as well as the CITY.

NOW. THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual obligations set forth below, the sufficiency and receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 160A-461, the parties do hereby enter into this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as follows:

- The outstanding Taxes and fees as of March 31, 2010, are \$411,043.41. Of the Taxes and fees, \$175,913.81 is owed to the CITY and \$235,129.60 is owed to the COUNTY.
- If the CITY is the highest bidder at the foreclosure sale, the CITY shall transfer title and ownership to the COUNTY the following surplus property: F350 Pickup 1992 Ford. Vehicle Identification Number 1FTJF35M8NNB18629, and a Three-Horse Trailer, Serial Number 1D9CS1826BP363719, free and clear, "AS IS".
- The COUNTY shall grant back all COUNTY taxes received as a result of the CITY's successful acquisition of the property and within 30 days of receipt of the taxes or the confirmation of the sale, whichever occurs last.
- In the event the CITY is not the highest bidder, the CITY will have no obligation to transfer the aforementioned property to the COUNTY and the COUNTY will be under no obligation to the CITY.
- Neither party shall transfer nor assign its rights under this Agreement, nor grant any interest, privilege, or rights whatsoever under this Agreement.
- The parties covenant and agree that this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement contains the entire agreement between them and that the terms hereof are contractual and not a mere recital. The parties acknowledge that the consideration recited herein constitutes the sole consideration for this Agreement, and that no other promises, statements, or representations except as appear herein have been made by any party (or any agent, attorney, or representative thereof) to induce either party enter into this Agreement.
