Wendell Scott Weathington 2010

Scott lives in the Beaver Dam community, where he has lived his entire life, with the exception of his time in Raleigh while attending North Carolina State University.

While attending Cape Fear High school he was active in the Future Farmers of America. He grew corn, soybeans, beef cows, and other agriculture related items as his FFA projects. During his agriculture training while attending high school he was awarded the *Chapter Star Farmer*. At the National Convention of Future Farmers, he was awarded the American Farmer Degree. Later he was awarded the North Carolina Star Farmer of the Year. During his final year at Cape Fear High School, his agriculture teacher asked each student what their future plans were. Scott said he was going to be an agriculture consultant. He has followed his life's long plan.

After finishing at North Carolina State University, Scott worked for American Agri., managed by Dr. Fay Thompson. After a short time he started his own company, Agri-Technologies of Eastern North Carolina. Not only has his work led him to Cumberland and Sampson Counties, but to other states and countries including Georgia, South Carolina, Virginia, Florida, and Central America.

The goal of his work has been to develop better ways to apply both fertilizer, chemicals, drip irrigation for better use of water, to help lower levels of fertilizer and chemicals and lastly to save money for farmers as well as to help protect the environment.

In addition, Scott is associated with a company, Super Soils. The goal is to purify the liquids from the lagoons and process the solids to be used as dry fertilizer. This has been a success.

Scott's work helps him to share information with a lot of farmers to bring new ways to better their farming. This includes a lot of test plots on the home farm.

2010 Young Farmer of the Year

Adam Carter

Adam has been interested in and involved with farming all his life. From a very young age he followed his father, grandfather, and uncles around the farm as they went about their work. By the time he began school he was driving a tractor and doing chores around the farm. While he was in school he was involved in raising cows and hogs and participating in area livestock shows.

Although he never really wanted to do anything other than farming, he did attend Fayetteville Technical Community College for two years. However, due to a family illness, he left school and returned to the family farm. The plan was for him to return to school as soon as possible; however, Adam was so vital to the managing and operation of the farm that he remained on the farm and farming became his vocation at an early age.

Adam was taught the value of hard work and doing a good job as he grew up in a family of farmers. He was taught the importance of conservation and to leave the land in better condition than when it was found.

Today Adam is involved in a poultry operation with Tyson Foods. He also grows corn, soybeans, grain and hay on the on the family farm land. Planning to continue the family tradition of farming, Adam has begun to purchase land and equipment for future production.

Adam attends Lebanon Baptist Church with his family.

When time allows, he enjoys hunting and fishing.



BACKGROUND

Bids were received on March 23, 2011 for the Law Enforcement Center Second Floor Renovation Project for CSI Offices. This project involves demolition of the old Work Release area (approximately 5200 sf) on the second floor and renovation of this space for offices and labs for the Crime Scene Investigation unit of the Sheriff's Office.

Attached is a copy of the certified bid tabulation. The low bid was submitted by Hayes, Inc., in the amount of \$179,000. This equates to a unit renovation cost of \$34.42 per sf. In addition to the base bid, a 10% contingency in the amount of \$17,900 is recommended. Funding for this project is from the Sheriff's Office Federal Forfeiture Fund.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

The recommendation of the County Engineer, Sheriff's Office and Management is to:

- 1. Accept the bids for the Law Enforcement Center Second Floor Renovation Project for CSI Offices.
- 2. Award a contract to Hayes, Inc., in the amount of \$179,000.
- Approve a project contingency of \$17,900 for additional work recommended by the County 3. Engineer and approved by the County Manager.
- Approve the attached budget revision. 4.

BACKGROUND: On or about September 10, 2007, the County acquired by tax foreclosure the above property. The amount currently owed on the foreclosure judgment including interest and costs for the property is \$4,793.12.

Nicholas Amuna has offered to purchase the County's interest in the property for \$4,793.12 and has deposited \$489.00 in the Finance Office. The tax value of the property is \$38,900.00.

This property is surplus to the needs of the County and, according to N.C.G.S. §153A-176 and N.C.G.S. §105-376, the County has the authority to sell such property. BACKGROUND:

Cumberland County Mental Health Auxiliary, Inc., has had a franchise to locate vending machines in the buildings occupied by the Mental Health Authority since before 1990. The Auxiliary provides the machines through a contract with a third-party vendor. The Auxiliary uses the commissions it receives from the contact to support the activities of the Mental Health Authority. The successive franchise agreements have been granted for five-year terms. Current term expired June 30, 2010. The request is approved by the Director of the Mental Health Authority. Because this is a franchise agreement, it will have to be approved at two meetings of the Board.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

Approve the franchise agreement on first reading and direct Clerk to place it on next agenda for second reading.

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this first day of July 2010, by and between the CUMBERLAND COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH AUXILIARY, INC., a North Carolina non-profit corporation, with a place of business located at 109 Bradford Avenue, Fayetteville, North, 28301, (hereinafter referred to as "AUXILIARY") and the COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, a body politic and corporate of North Carolina, (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY".) (AUXILIARY AND COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, collectively "PARTIES").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the COUNTY desires to grant a franchise for the purpose of providing food and drink vending machines to the clients, employees, and visitors of the Cumberland County Mental Health Center's various premises and facilities throughout the county; and

WHEREAS, the AUXILIARY, a 501 (c) (3) non-profit corporation whose function is to provide charitable support to the Cumberland County Mental Health Center and its clients, has expressed an interest in providing said vending machine services at the location listed in paragraph 1.and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County, North Carolina has granted the AUXILIARY a franchise to use the premises and facilities of the Cumberland County Mental Health Center to provide food and drink vending machines to the clients, employees, and visitors of the Mental Health Center;

AND, WHEREAS, said franchise requires that the terms and conditions of such services be set forth in an agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the promises and agreements hereafter set forth and the mutual benefits to be derived by the Parties therefrom, the AUXILIARY and the COUNTY agree as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the PARTIES hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>PURPOSE.</u> During the term of this Agreement, the COUNTY agrees that the AULIXIARY shall have exclusive right to provide all food and drink vending machine services at the following Cumberland County Mental Health locations: Adult Services located at 109 Bradford Avenue; Child and Family Services /Administration located at 711 Executive Place and the Roxie Avenue Center located at 1724 Roxie Avenue, Fayetteville, North Carolina.
- 2. <u>TERM OF AGREEMENT</u>. The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of five (5) years beginning July 1, 2010 and shall terminate on June 30, 2015, unless sooner terminated as hereinafter provided.
- 3. AGENCY AND AUTHORITY. The COUNTY hereby designates the Area Director of the Cumberland County Mental Health Center as its exclusive agent with respect to this Agreement. The Area Director is authorized, on behalf of the COUNTY, to negotiate directly with the AUXILIARY on all matters pertaining to this Agreement. The AUXILIARY agrees that all of its dealings with COUNTY regarding this Agreement shall be exclusively with the Area Director. Further, the AUXILIARY specially agrees that is shall not modify any of the

services subject to this Agreement except as described in the paragraph entitled MODIFICATION.

4. SERVICES.

- a. Equipment Provided. The AUXILIARY will provide, by lease or purchase, the food and drink vending equipment described in Appendix A attached hereto during the term of this Agreement at the locations indicated. Equipment may be replaced or substituted as provided herein or may be changed to any type equipment which is acceptable to both the AUXILIARY and the Director of the Cumberland County Mental Health Center as agent for the COUNTY for such purpose.
- b. Revenue Collection and Utilization. COUNTY agrees that the AUXILIARY or its designed agent (the lessor in the case of leased equipment) shall collect all revenues directly from the vending units. The AUXILIARY shall keep an account of such collections and such account shall be available to the COUNTY or the Director of the Cumberland County Mental Health Center for inspection, upon request. The AUXILIARY agrees that all net revenues received from the operation of the vending machines in the Mental Health Center shall be expended as provided in its Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws for charitable purposes in support of the Mental Health Center shall be conducted unless approved by the Director.
- c. <u>Supplies</u>. All inventory and other supplies necessary for the operation of the vending machines shall be provided by the AUXILIARY or its designed agent (the lessor in the case of leased equipment) and the COUNTY shall have no responsibility in that regard.
- d. <u>Service and Repairs.</u> The AUXILIARY or its designed agent (the lessor in the case of leased equipment), during the time of the Agreement and without charge to the COUNTY, shall keep the vending equipment in good working order, make required inspections, adjustments, and repair and replace machine parts as necessary.
- e. <u>Usual Hours of Service</u>. The AUXILIARY shall provide vending machine services at the Mental Health Center twenty-four (24) hours per day.
- f. <u>Electrical Requirements</u>. COUNTY shall permit the use of suitable existing electrical outlets for the operation of the vending equipment and shall not be liable to the AUXILIARY or its designated agents (the lessor in the case of leased equipment) or the public for any harm resulting from such use or any cessation of electrical service to the Mental Health Center. The AUXILIARY shall hold the COUNTY harmless from any such liability.
- 5. NOTIFICATION OF SERVICES NEEDS. The COUNTY, through the Mental Health Center, agrees to notify the AUXILIARY or its designated agent immediately of any equipment malfunction or any repairs needed on any vending equipment to the telephone number and to the individuals as may be designated by the AUXILIARY.
- 6. INSURANCE AND HOLD HARLMESS PROVISIONS. In the event the AUXILIARY leases vending equipment from commercial vendors, the AUXILIARY shall require the lessor to have or obtain a contract of insurance, and provide for the same in the lease agreement for the equipment, under which the lessor, the AUXILIARY, and the COUNTY shall be indemnified for any liability to the public proximately caused by the malfunction of the leased vending machines and resulting in personal injury or property damage to Mental

Health Center employees or visitors, and to otherwise hold the COUNTY harmless for such injury or damage.

- 7. RENEWAL. This Agreement shall be renewed at the end of said Term for a period of five (5) years unless the COUNTY gives the AUXILIARY written notice of termination at least sixty (60) days, but no more than one hundred eighty (180) days before the end of the term. The AUXILIARY may terminate this Agreement by giving the COUNTY at least sixty (60) days written notice of termination before the expiration of said term. All provisions of the Agreement shall remain in effect for any renewal periods.
- 8. <u>NOTICES</u>. All notices, requests, and approvals required or permitted to be given, shall be in writing and shall be deposited in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed as follows:

- ASSIGNMENT. The AUXILIARY shall not assign all or part of its contract rights under this
 Agreement; or delegate any performance; or subcontract; without first obtaining the COUNTY'S
 written approval.
- 10. TERMINATION. This Agreement may be terminated immediately by the COUNTY or the COUNTY may pursue any other remedy recognized in law or equity upon the violation of any of the terms of this Agreement. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days notice in writing to the other party. Upon the entering of a judgment of bankruptcy or insolvency by or against the AUXILIARY shall immediately terminate any lease agreement it any have with a lessor for vending machines at the Mental Health Center locations.
- 11. MISCELLANOUS. The Parties hereto, for themselves, their agents, officials, employees, and servants shall not discriminate in any manner on the basis of race, sex, color, creed, handicap, disability, gender, or national origin in the course of fulfilling any obligation, duty, or service that arises under this Agreement. More specifically, the AUXILIARY shall comply with Title VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), as amended; and all requirements imposed by Federal regulations, rules, and guidelines issued pursuant to these Titles for both personnel employed and customers served.

- 12. <u>MODIFICATION</u>. This Franchise Agreement may be modified only by an instrument duly executed by the Parties or their respective successors.

WHEREAS, North Street Negro School opened with Margaret Brewer Walker as the first principal of the North Street Negro School, where she established a safe and caring school to educate the children of the neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, upon the death of Margaret Brewer Walker in November 1958, Teresa Callendar Berrien became the principal and served until 1972. North Street Negro School continued to provide a safe, caring, and nurturing environment for students, where teachers were held to a high professional and personal standard that included home visits, dresses and hose for the women and suits and ties for the men; and

WHEREAS, high academic standards were established and maintained by Teresa Berrien and The Fayetteville City Board of Education renamed the North Street Negro School in her honor on June 4, 1972, from then until this day to be known as Teresa C. Berrien Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, Teresa C. Berrien administrators, faculty, and support staff continue to maintain high expectations for academics; and

WHEREAS, Teresa C. Berrien administrators, faculty, and support staff continue to be committed to providing a safe, caring environment that allows social, emotional, physical, and academic growth.

BACKGROUND

As you will recall, the County received a letter from Mr. Roger Shackleford, Executive Director of the North Carolina Division of Workforce Development on February 17, 2011 citing issues with the WIA program design, budgeting of grant funds, staff morale, case management, internal staff communications, and lack of coordination between program and financial staff. Mr. Shackleford requested that the county prepare a Corrective Action Plan which would address these concerns.

Recently, Management has had discussions with Dr Larry Keen, President for Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC), regarding potential partnering opportunities between the college and our Workforce Development Department (WFD). FTCC has been a major service provider for many of our WFD programs for many years and is an integral part of our training program. A model of this partnership exists between Central Carolina Community College and WFD programs in Harnett and Sampson counties. Dr. Keen is aware of this model and has expressed his interest in consolidating our WFD programs into the community college system. Management believes this model may present an opportunity to provide services to this community in a more efficient and economical manner.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

Approve the transfer of the Workforce Development program to Fayetteville Technical community college effective May 1, 2011, or as soon as possible thereafter, subject to approval of the college's Board of Trustees.

Appoint Deputy County Manager Amy Cannon as the Interim Workforce Development Director effective April 11, 2011, until the transfer to FTCC has been finalized.
