

BACKGROUND:

The City of Fayetteville has requested the County convey its interest in a lot (25x139) located on Old Wilmington Road to the Fayetteville Metropolitan Housing Authority (FMHA) so the FMHA can convey that interest to the Fayetteville Area Habitat for Humanity, Inc. which is using the lot in its participation in the Hope VI project.

The County along with the City acquired its interest in the property as the result of a tax foreclosure which occurred in 1972. The City deeded its interest in the property to someone in 1976 that then paid taxes on the property till their interest was conveyed back to the City in 2005. In 2009 the City donated the property to the Fayetteville Metropolitan Housing Authority which subsequently conveyed its interest to Habitat. The County has never conveyed its one-half undivided interest.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION:

Board approve the conveyance of the property to the FMHA for use in the Hope VI project and authorize the Chairman and Clerk to execute the necessary documents on behalf of the County subject the approval of the documentation by County legal.

Dear Mr. Barrett,

This is a request for action regarding the above parcel in order to clarify title. The City has just recorded a document in which 132 parcels of property were donated to the Fayetteville Housing Authority as part of the City of Fayetteville's contribution towards the development of the HOPE VI Project. This project will greatly enhance our downtown area for the citizens that live in this vicinity. HOPE VI will revitalize an older section of Fayetteville that:

- houses many senior & lower income citizens;
- has been hit hardest with flooding problems;

Back History:

1972 - 2347/115 Commissioner's Deed conveyed subject parcel to County & City 1976 - 2548/666 City sold said lot to Benjamin Wilkerson for \$200

2005 - 6972/370 Wilkerson's conveyed said lot to the City of Fayetteville

2009- 8099/660 City donated said lot to the Housing Authority

Bill # 2608871: Tax records were listed in the name of Wilkerson & Cumb C. with 100 per cent ownership. The Wilkerson's were billed & paid the entire tax bill for 29 years.

Tax Mapping brought the missing ½ interest to Real Estate's attention. Real Estate has been unable to find where the County conveyed their ½ interest during this time frame. Whether this was a lost deed or an administrative error, without records from that time period, we will never know.

A similar situation occurred with PIN 0437-50-9308. The County & City received joint title in said parcel. In 2006, the County conveyed the property to Gold Falcon Investments Inc. Due to an administrative error, the City's interest was never acquired. In 2007, the City declared the property surplus and quitclaimed the City's interest to Gold Falcon Investments, Inc. as intended by the good faith conveyance from the County.

Therefore, I respectfully request the County to join us in this endeavor. By quitclaiming the County's ½ interest in the above parcel to the Fayetteville Housing Authority, the Housing Authority can move forward with a clear title.



WITH MOSELEY ARCHITECTS FOR COUNTY DETENTION CENTER

EXPANSION PROJECT

BACKGROUND

The Board of Commissioners, at its April 18, 2011 meeting, approved the conceptual schematic design (Scheme 2) for the Detention Center Expansion Project consisting of four (4) - 64 bed Dormitory housing units and one (1) - 60 bed, single-cell, Maximum Security housing unit for a total bed capacity of 316. The Board also authorized Management and staff to negotiate, with Moseley Architects, the fees for the balance of the design work and construction administration services.

During the presentation by Dan Mace with Moseley Architects, he suggested that in addition to the base design as described above, the Board may wish to consider including an alternate design for the one (1) - 64 bed, 4-man cell, Medium Security housing unit that was removed from the initial conceptual design due to budget constraints. An add alternate bid could be taken for the Medium Security housing unit to provide the Board with an accurate cost for this housing unit and in the event the bids for the base design and alternate were within the construction budget, the Board may elect to construct the entire expansion project. The Board took no formal action on the architect's suggestion.

During the discussions with Moseley Architects, a fee of \$993,750 was negotiated for the base design and a fee of \$191,250 for the alternate design (through bidding phase) for a total fee of \$1,185,000. If the alternate was constructed, then construction administration for the expanded project would be increased by \$52,700. Reimbursable expenses would be capped at \$25,000. The fee for basic services for the base design represent 7.49% of the estimated construction cost and is reasonable based on past experience.

The question at hand is whether or not the County includes architectural services for the alternate design in the amendment to our agreement with Moseley Architects. Management and staff met to discuss this issue and believe that the added cost for the alternate design is not justified at this time for the following reasons:

Celebrating Our Past...Embracing Our Future

- It is unlikely that the alternate design could be constructed within the project budget of \$15 Million established by the Board. The actual construction cost for the base design would have to be about 25% less than the architect's preliminary estimate.
- The alternate design of the Medium Security housing unit may not be the type of housing unit needed particularly if the State of North Carolina mandates that misdemeanants serving 6 months or less be incarcerated in local detention facilities as currently being considered in the State Legislature. If enacted, the jail administrator believes a work release dormitory style housing unit is more appropriate than the 4-man cell housing unit.
- Given the fiscal challenge of funding the annual operating costs of the expanded detention center, a larger project (more beds) translates into a greater increase in annual operating costs. Should construction of the base design be under budget, the Board may wish to use the savings to help offset the initial operating costs as opposed to building more jail space.

Amendment #1 to our agreement with Moseley Architects reflects architectural and engineering services for the base design as recommended by Management and staff. This Amendment has been reviewed by the County Attorney for legal sufficiency.

This information will be presented to the County Facilities Committee at its June 2, 2011 meeting for review and consideration. The action of the Facilities Committee will be presented to the Board at its June 6, 2011 meeting.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

The recommendation of the County Engineer and Management is to:

- 1. Limit the continued architectural and engineering services for the County Detention Center Expansion Project to the base design identified as Scheme 2 in the conceptual schematic design phase.
- 2. Approve Amendment #1 to the agreement with Moseley Architects for architectural and engineering services for the County Detention Center Expansion Project in the amount of \$993,750 for Basic Services and Reimbursable Expenses not to exceed \$25,000 for a total amount of \$1,018,750.
- 3. Approve the attached budget revision.

The proposed action by the Board is to approve the recommendation of Management and staff pending action by the Facilities Committee.

AMENDMENT #1

The Agreement for architectural and engineering services for the Cumberland County Detention Center Expansion Project by and between County of Cumberland and Moseley Architects dated November 15, 2010 shall be amended as follows:

DATE: <u>JUNE 6, 2011</u>

Definition of Project: The Detention Center Expansion Project shall consist of a 62,700± SF facility containing four (4) - 64 bed dormitory housing units and one (1) - 60 bed single cell maximum security housing unit for a total bed capacity of 316. The design of the facility expansion shall be LEED equivalent (high performance). The Project shall also include minor modifications to areas in the existing facility such as the mechanical room, property storage room, and master control room as required to integrate the new systems into the existing infrastructure, and necessary site improvements to support the facility expansion.

ARTICLE 2: SCOPE OF ARCHITECT'S BASIC SERVICES shall be amended to include:

2.1.1 The Architect's Basic Services consist of those described in Paragraphs 2.2 through 2.8 and shall include civil, structural, plumbing, mechanical, electrical, and security engineering services as required. During this phase of services, the Architect shall meet with the Owner, at a minimum, on a bi-weekly basis to communicate with the Owner's project team and report progress to the Owner.

2.4 SCHEMATIC DESIGN PHASE

2.4.3 The Architect shall finalize the schematic design based on the conceptual schematic design (Scheme 2) approved by the Owner on April 18, 2011 and submit the Schematic Design Package with the design narrative to the NC Division of Health Service Regulation (DHSR).

2.5 DESIGN DEVELOPMENT PHASE

- 2.5.1 Based on the approved Schematic Design Documents and any adjustments authorized by the Owner in the program, schedule, or construction budget, the Architect shall prepare, for approval by the Owner, Design Development Documents consisting of drawings and other documents to fix and describe the size and character of the Project as to architectural, structural, mechanical, electrical, and security systems, materials and such other elements as may be appropriate.
- 2.5.2 The Architect shall prepare a more detailed estimate of construction cost utilizing the Architect's standard format as previously agreed, and review with the Owner any adjustments to the design that may be required to maintain the Construction Budget. The Owner may elect to revise the Construction Budget in order to maintain the previously approved scope of the project and its related design features.
- **2.5.3** The Architect shall submit the Design Development Documents to DHSR for review and comments.

2.6 CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTS PHASE

- 2.6.1 Based on the approved Design Development Documents, incorporating the comments from DHSR, and any further adjustments in the scope or quality of the Project or in the construction budget authorized by the Owner, the Architect shall prepare, for approval by the Owner, Construction Documents consisting of Drawings and Specifications setting forth in detail the requirements for the construction of the Project.
- **2.6.2** The Architect shall assist the Owner in the preparation of the necessary bidding information, bidding forms, the Conditions of the Contract, and the form of Agreement between the Owner and Contractor. The Architect shall prepare bid packages for the following construction activities:
 - .1 Prime contracts for the site work and building(s) not to exceed two (2) packages.
- 2.6.3 In the event the Owner elects to use a Construction Manager (CM) to facilitate construction of the Project, the Architect shall assist the CM in developing bid packages that promote the Owner's desire to maximize local contractor and Minority Business Enterprise firms (MBE) participation on the Project, however, these packages shall be limited to no more than two (2) packages under basic services. It shall be the Construction Manager's responsibility to further subdivide the Work into smaller bid packages in consultation with the Owner and Architect.
- 2.6.4 The Architect shall prepare a detailed estimate of Construction Costs by Specification Section based on the Construction Documents and advise the Owner of any adjustments to previous preliminary estimates of Construction Costs indicated by changes in requirements or general market conditions. In addition, the Architect shall update the Project Budget consisting of Construction Costs, Design Fees, Materials Testing and Special Inspection Fees, Soils Remediation Contingency, FF&E, and Contingencies.
- 2.6.5 The Architect shall submit the Construction Documents to DHSR for review and approval and assist the Owner in connection with the Owner's responsibility for filing documents required for approval by other governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project.

2.7 BIDDING OR NEGOTIATION PHASE

- 2.7.1 The Architect, following the Owner's approval of Construction Documents and of the latest estimate of Construction Cost, shall assist the Owner in obtaining bids or negotiated proposals and assist in awarding and preparing contracts for construction. The Architect shall assist the Owner in soliciting participation of Minority Business Enterprise firms (MBE) through information meetings with local MBE firms. The Architect shall render interpretations and clarifications of the Drawings and Specifications in appropriate written form as may be required during the bidding phase.
- 2.7.2 In the event the Owner elects to use a Construction Manager (CM) to facilitate construction of the Project, the Architect and CM shall cooperate with each other in performing the tasks described in Paragraph 2.7.1.

2.8 CONSTRUCTION PHASE - ADMINISTRATION OF THE CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT

- 2.8.1 The Architect's responsibility to provide Basic Services for the Construction Phase under this Agreement commences with the award of the initial Contract for Construction and terminates at the earlier of the issuance to the Owner of the final Certificate for Payment or 120 days after the date of Substantial Completion of the Work, unless extended under the terms of Subparagraph 10.3.3. Prior to the end of the Correction of the Work period the Architect shall conduct a walk through inspection of the facilities with the Owner to identify and document deficiencies in the work that require corrective action under the contractor warranties. The Architect shall not be required to make an exhaustive inspection of all aspects of the facilities.
- **2.8.2** The Architect shall provide administration of the Contract for Construction as set forth below and in the latest edition of AIA Document (A201), General Conditions of the Contract for Construction, current as of the date of this Agreement, unless otherwise provided in this Agreement.
- 2.8.3 Duties, responsibilities and limitations of authority of the Architect shall not be restricted, modified or extended without written agreement of the Owner and Architect and with consent of the Contractor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 2.8.4 The Architect shall be a representative of and shall advise and consult with the Owner; (1) during construction until final payment to the Contractor is due, and (2) as an Additional Service at the Owner's direction from time to time during the correction period described in the Contract for Construction. The Architect shall have authority to act on behalf of the Owner only to the extent provided in this Agreement unless otherwise modified by written instrument.
- 2.8.5 The Architect shall visit the site a minimum of once per week at intervals appropriate to the stage of construction or as otherwise agreed by the Owner and Architect in writing to become generally familiar with the progress and quality of the Work completed and to determine in general if the Work is being performed in a manner indicating that the Work when completed will be in accordance with the Contract Documents. However, the Architect shall not be required to make exhaustive or continuous on-site inspections to check the quality or quantity of the Work. On the basis of on-site observations as an architect, the Architect shall keep the Owner informed of the progress and quality of the Work, and shall endeavor to guard the Owner against defects and deficiencies in the Work. More extensive site representation may be agreed to as an Additional Service, as described in Paragraph 3A.2.
- 2.8.6 The Architect shall not have control over or charge of and shall not be responsible for construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures, or for safety precautions and programs in connection with the Work, since these are solely the Contractor's responsibility under the Contract for Construction. The Architect shall not be responsible for the Contractor's schedules or failure to carry out the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents. The Architect shall not have control over or charge of acts or omissions of the CM, Contractor, Subcontractors, or their agents or employees, or of any other persons performing portions of the Work.

- **2.8.7** The Architect shall at all times have access to the Work wherever it is in preparation or progress.
- 2.8.8 Except as may otherwise be provided in the Contract Documents or when direct communications have been specially authorized, the Owner and Contractor or CM as may be applicable shall communicate through the Architect. Communications by and with the Architect's consultants shall be through the Architect.
- **2.8.9** Based on the Architect's observations and evaluations of the Contractor's Applications for Payment, the Architect shall review and certify the amounts due the Contractor.
- **2.8.10** The Architect's certification for payment shall constitute a representation to the Owner. based on the Architect's observations at the site as provided in Subparagraph 2.8.5 and 3A.2.2 and on the data comprising the Contractor's Application for Payment, that the Work has progressed to the point indicated and that, to the best of the Architect's knowledge, information and belief, quality of the Work is in accordance with the Contract Documents. The foregoing representations are subject to an evaluation of the Work for conformance with the Contract Documents upon Substantial Completion, to results of subsequent tests and inspections, to minor deviations from the Contract Documents correctable prior to completion, and to specific qualifications expressed by the Architect. The issuance of a Certificate for Payment shall further constitute a representation that the Contractor is entitled to payment in the amount certified. However, the issuance of a Certificate for Payment shall not be a representation that the Architect has (1) made exhaustive or continuous on-site inspections to check the quality or quantity of the Work, (2) reviewed constructions means, methods, techniques, sequence or procedures, (3) reviewed copies of requisitions received from Subcontractors and material suppliers and other data requested by the Owner to substantiate the Contractor's right to payment or (4) ascertained how or for what purpose the Contractor has used money previously paid on account of the Contract Sum.
- 2.8.11 The Architect shall have authority to reject Work which does not conform to the Contract Documents. Whenever the Architect considers it necessary or advisable for implementation of the intent of the Contract Documents, the Architect will have authority to require additional inspection or testing of the Work in accordance with the provisions of the Contract Documents, whether or not such Work is fabricated, installed or completed. However, neither this authority of the Architect nor a decision made in good faith either to exercise or not to exercise such authority shall give rise to a duty or responsibility of the Architect to the CM, Contractor, Subcontractors, material and equipment suppliers, their agents or employees or other persons performing portions of the Work.
- 2.8.12 The Architect shall review and approve or take other appropriate action upon Contractor's submittals such as Shop Drawings, Product Data and Samples, but only for the limited purpose of checking for general conformance with information given and the design concept expressed in the Contract Documents. The Architect's action shall be taken with such reasonable promptness as to cause no delay in the Work or in the construction of the Owner or of separate contractors, while allowing sufficient time in the Architect's professional judgment to permit adequate review. Review of such submittals is not conducted for the purpose of determining the accuracy and completeness of other

information such as dimensions and quantities or for substantiating instructions for installation or performance of equipment or systems furnished by the Contractor, all of which remain the responsibility of the Contractor. The Architect's review shall not constitute approval of safety precautions or, unless otherwise specifically stated by the Architect, of construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedure. The Architect's approval of a specific item shall not indicate approval of an assembly of which the item is a component. When Contractor's design professional certification of design and performance characteristics of materials, systems or equipment is required by the Contract Documents, the Architect shall be entitled to rely upon such certification to establish that the materials, systems or equipment will meet the design and performance criteria required by the Contract Documents.

- **2.8.13** The Architect shall prepare Change Orders and Construction Change Directives, with supporting documentation and data for the Owner's approval and execution in accordance with the Contract Documents, and may authorize minor changes in the Work not involving an adjustment in the Contract Sum or an extension of the Contract Time which are not inconsistent with the intent of the Contract Documents.
- 2.8.14 The Architect shall conduct inspections to determine the date or dates of Substantial Completion and the date of final completion, shall receive and forward to the Owner for the Owner's review and records written warranties and related documents required by the Contract Documents and assembled by the Contractor, and shall issue final Certificate for Payment upon Contractor's certificate of compliance with the requirements of the Contract Documents.
- **2.8.15** The Architect shall interpret and decide matters concerning performance of the Owner and Contractor under the requirements of the Contract Documents on written request of either the Owner or Contractor. The Architect's response to such requests shall be made with reasonable promptness and within any time limits agreed upon.
- **2.8.16** Interpretations and decisions of the Architect shall be consistent with the intent of and reasonably inferable from the Contract Documents and shall be in writing or in the form of drawings. When making such interpretations and initial decisions, the Architect shall endeavor to secure faithful performance by both Owner and Contractor, shall not show partiality to either, and shall not be liable for results of interpretations or decisions so rendered in good faith.
- **2.8.17** The Architect's decision on matters relating to aesthetic effect shall be final if consistent with the intent expressed in the Contract Documents.
- **2.8.18** The Architect shall render written decisions within a reasonable time on all claims, disputes or other matters in question between the Owner and Contractor relating to the execution or progress of the Work as provided in the Contract Documents.
- **2.8.19** The Architect's decisions on claims, disputes or other matters, including those in question between the Owner and Contractor, except for those relating to aesthetic effect as provided in Subparagraph 2.8.17, shall be subject to negotiation and legal action as provided in this Agreement and in the Contract Documents.

2.8.20 The Architect shall receive and forward to the Owner a project manual containing written warranties, equipment manufacturer's operation and maintenance information, list of Subcontractors utilized on the project and related documents assembled by the Contractor as required prior to submission of final payment requests.

ARTICLE 3A: ADDITIONAL SERVICES

3A.1 GENERAL

3A.1.1 The services described in this Article 3A are not included in Basic Services unless so identified in Article 12, and they shall be paid for by the Owner as provided in this Agreement, in addition to the compensation for Basic Services. The services described under Paragraphs 3A.2 and 3A.4 shall only be provided if authorized or confirmed in writing by the Owner. If services described under Contingent Additional Services in Paragraph 3A.3 are required due to circumstances beyond the Architect's control, the Architect shall notify the Owner prior to commencing such services. If the Owner deems that such services described under Paragraph 3A.3 are not required, the Owner shall give prompt written notice to the Architect. If the Owner indicates in writing that all or part of such Contingent Additional Services are not required, the Architect shall have no obligations to provide those services.

3A.2 PROJECT REPRESENTATION BEYOND BASIC SERVICES

- **3A.2.1** If more extensive representation at the site than is described in Paragraph 2.8.5 is required, the Architect shall provide one or more Project Representatives to assist in carrying out such additional on-site responsibilities.
- **3A.2.2** If requested by the Owner, the Architect shall provide a full time on-site construction representative who shall be qualified by training and experience to accomplish the duties and responsibilities as defined in AIA Document B352 as amended. The Architect's representative shall be replaced promptly and without protest at the request of the Owner, if in the opinion of the Owner, such representative is either negligent or unqualified to perform his duties. Compensation for full time on-site construction representative shall be as defined in Paragraph 9.2.1a.
- **3A.2.3** Through the observations by such Project Representatives, the Architect shall endeavor to provide further protection for the Owner against defects and deficiencies in the Work, but the furnishing of such project representation shall not modify the rights, responsibilities or obligations of the Architect as described elsewhere in this Agreement.

3A.3 CONTINGENT ADDITIONAL SERVICES

- **3A.3.1** Making revisions in Drawings, Specifications or other documents when such revisions are:
 - .1 inconsistent with approvals or instructions previously given by the Owner, including revisions made necessary by adjustments in the Owner's program or Project budget;

- .2 required by the enactment or revision of codes, laws or regulations subsequent to the preparation of such documents; or
- .3 due to changes required as a result of the Owner's failure to render decisions in a timely manner.
- 3A.3.2 Providing services required because of significant changes in the Project including, but not limited to, size, quality, complexity, the Owner's schedule, or the method of bidding or negotiating and contracting for construction, except for services required under Section 5A.2.5.
- 3A.3.3 Providing services including preparing Drawings, Specifications and other documentation and supporting data in connection with Change Orders and Construction Change Directives shall be an Additional Service unless:
 - .1 the Change Orders or Construction Change Directives are due to errors, omissions or lack of coordination of the Architect's documents.
 - .2 the cumulative value of the Change Orders or Construction Change Directives is less than or equal to five percent (5%) of the total construction bids or Guaranteed Maximum Price in the event construction is through a Construction Manager.
- **3A.3.4** Revisions to Drawings, Specifications and other documentation due to more than two substitution requests by the Contractor(s) for any one submittal shall be an Additional Service.
- **3A.3.5** Providing consultation concerning replacement of Work damaged by fire or other cause during construction, and furnishing services required in connection with the replacement of such Work.
- **3A.3.6** Providing services made necessary by the default of the Contractor, by major defects or deficiencies in the Work of the Contractor, or by failure of performance of either the Owner or Contractor under the Contract for Construction.
- **3A.3.7** Providing services in evaluating an extensive number of claims, requests for information, submittals or Change Orders submitted by the CM or Contractor or others in connection with the Work.
- **3A.3.8** Providing services in connection with a public hearing or legal proceeding except where the Architect is party thereto.
- **3A.3.9** Preparing documents for alternate separate or sequential bids or providing services in connection with bidding, negotiation or construction prior to the completion of the Construction Documents Phase, not provided in the Basic Services.

3A.4 OPTIONAL ADDITIONAL SERVICES

- **3A.4.1** Providing analyses of the Owner's needs and programming the requirements of the Project, except as otherwise provided in Paragraph 2.2.
- **3A.4.2** Providing financial feasibility or other special studies.
- **3A.4.3** Providing planning surveys, site evaluations or comparative studies of prospective sites.
- **3A.4.4** Providing special surveys, environmental studies and submissions required for approvals of governmental authorities or others having jurisdiction over the Project.
- **3A.4.5** Providing services relative to future facilities, systems, and equipment.
- **3A.4.6** Providing services to investigate existing conditions or facilities or to make measured drawings thereof, except as otherwise provided in Paragraph 2.3.
- **3A.4.7** Providing services to verify the accuracy of drawings or other information furnished by the Owner.
- **3A.4.8** Providing coordination of construction performed by separate contractors, by the Owner's own forces and coordination of services required in connection with construction performed and equipment supplied by the Owner.
- **3A.4.9** Providing detailed quantity surveys or inventories of material, equipment and labor.
- **3A.4.10** Providing analysis of owning and operating costs.
- **3A.4.11** Providing services for planning tenant or rental spaces.
- **3A.4.12** Making investigations, inventories of materials or equipment, or valuations and detailed appraisals of existing facilities.
- 3A.4.13 The Architect shall witness start-up tests with the Owner and Contractors for major building equipment as part of Basic Services. Additional assistance in the utilization of equipment or systems including testing, adjusting and balancing, commissioning, preparation of operation and maintenance manuals, except to the extent provided for in Article 2.8.20, training personnel for operation and maintenance, and consultation during operation shall be an Additional Service.
- **3A.4.14** Providing services after issuance to the Owner of the final Certificate for Payment, or in the absence of a final Certificate for Payment, more than 120 days after the date of Substantial Completion of the Work unless provided for otherwise in this agreement.
- 3A.4.15. Providing services of consultants not otherwise provided for as a part of Basic Services.
- **3A.4.16** Providing any other services not otherwise included in this Agreement or not customarily furnished in accordance with generally accepted architectural practice.

3A.4.17 Providing design services for LEED certification.

ARTICLE 3: OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES shall be amended to include:

- 3.6 The Owner, in conjunction with the Architect, shall establish and update an overall budget for the Project, including the Construction Cost, the Owner's other costs and reasonable contingencies related to all of these costs.
- 3.7 The Owner shall furnish the services of geotechnical engineers when such services are necessary to assist the Architect in the performance of his design services. Such services may include test borings, test pits, determinations of soil bearing values, percolation tests, evaluations of hazardous materials, ground corrosion and resistivity tests, including necessary operations for anticipating subsoil conditions, with reports and appropriate professional recommendations.
- 3.8 The Owner shall furnish structural, mechanical, chemical, air and water pollution tests, tests for hazardous materials, and other laboratory and environmental tests, inspections and reports required by law or the Contract Documents.
- 3.9 The Owner shall furnish all legal, accounting and insurance counseling services as may be necessary at any time for the Project, including auditing services the Owner may require to verify the Contractor's Applications for Payment or to ascertain how or for what purposes the Contractor has used the money paid by or on behalf of the Owner.
- 3.10 The services, information, surveys and reports required by Paragraphs 3.4 and 3.7 through 3.9 shall be furnished at the Owner's expense, and the Architect shall be entitled to rely upon the accuracy and completeness thereof.
- 3.11 The proposed language of certificates or certifications requested of the Architect or Architect's consultants shall be submitted to the Architect for review and approval at least 14 days prior to execution. The Owner shall not request certifications that would require knowledge or services beyond the scope of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 5A: CONSTRUCTION COST

5A.1 DEFINITION

- **5A.1.1** The Construction Cost shall be the total cost or estimated cost to the Owner of all elements of the Project designed or specified by the Architect.
- 5A.1.2 The Construction Cost shall include the cost at current market rates of labor and materials furnished by the Owner and equipment designed, specified, selected, or specially provided for the Architect, plus a reasonable allowance for the Contractor's overhead and profit. In addition, a reasonable allowance for contingencies shall be included for market conditions at the time of bidding and for changes in the Work during construction.

5A.1.3 Construction Cost does not include the compensation of the Architect and Architect's consultants, the costs of the land, rights-of-way, financing, contingencies for changes in the Work or other costs which are the responsibility of the Owner as provided in Article 3.

5A.2 RESPONSIBILITY FOR CONSTRUCTION

- 5A.2.1 The Architect, as a design professional familiar with the construction industry shall evaluate the Owner's Project budget and shall prepare estimates of Construction Cost at the appropriate stages of Schematic Design, Design Development and Construction Document preparation as specified in the Agreement. Such estimates of Construction Cost represent the Architect's best judgment and it is recognized, however, that neither the Architect nor the Owner has control over the cost of labor, materials or equipment, over the Contractor's methods of determining bid prices, or over competitive bidding, market or negotiating conditions. Accordingly, the Architect cannot and does not warrant or represent that bids or negotiated prices will not vary from the Owner's Project budget or from any estimate of Construction Cost or evaluation prepared or agreed to by the Architect.
- 5A.2.2 The Architect shall take all necessary measures during the design phases to reasonably evaluate that the Project can be constructed within the Construction Cost. The Architect shall be permitted to include contingencies for design, bidding and price escalation, to determine what materials, equipment, component systems and types of construction are to be included in the Contract Documents, to make reasonable adjustments in the scope of the Project and to include in the Contract Documents alternative bids to adjust the Construction Cost.
- 5A.2.3 If the Bidding or Negotiation Phase has not commenced within 90 days after the Architect submits the Construction Documents to the Owner, any Project budget or Construction Cost shall be adjusted to reflect changes in the general level of prices in the construction industry between the date of submission of the Construction Documents to the Owner and the date on which proposals are sought.
- **5A.2.4** If the Construction Cost (adjusted as provided in Subparagraph 5A.2.3) is exceeded by the lowest bonafide bid(s) or negotiated proposal, the Owner shall:
 - .1 give written approval of an increase in such Construction Cost;
 - .2 authorize rebidding or renegotiating of the Project within a reasonable time;
 - .3 if the Project is abandoned, terminate in accordance with Paragraph 6.3; or
 - .4 cooperate in revising the Project scope and quality as required to reduce the Construction Cost.
- **5A.2.5** If the Owner chooses to proceed under Clause 5A.2.4.4, the Architect, without additional charge, shall modify the Contract Documents as necessary to comply with the Construction Cost.

ARTICLE 8: PAYMENTS TO THE ARCHITECT shall be amended to include:

8.2 REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES

8.2.7 Expense of reproductions, postage and handling of Drawings, Specifications and other documents.

8.5 PAYMENTS ON ACCOUNT OF ADDITIONAL SERVICES

8.5.1 Payments on account of the Architect's Additional Services and for Reimbursable Expenses shall be made monthly upon presentation of the Architect's statement of services rendered or expenses incurred.

8.6 PAYMENTS WITHHELD

8.6.1 No deductions shall be made from the Architect's compensation on account of penalty, liquidated damages or other sums withheld from payments to CM or Contractors, or on account of the cost of changes in the Work other than those for which the Architect has been found to be legally liable.

ARTICLE 9: BASIS OF COMPENSATION shall be amended as follows:

9.1 BASIC COMPENSATION

- **9.1.1a** FOR BASIC SERVICES, as described in Article 2 of this AMENDMENT, compensation shall be a stipulated sum of \$993,750.00. The fee for basic services shall be equitably adjusted in the event the scope of the project is increased by more than 5 percent (5%) by the Owner.
- 9.1.2a Where compensation is based on a stipulated sum, progress payments for Basic Services in each phase shall total the following amounts of the total Basic Compensation payable:

Schematic Design Phase:

fifteen percent (15%)

Design Development Phase:

twenty percent (20%)

Construction Documents Phase:

thirty-five percent (35%)

Bidding or Negotiation Phase:

five percent (5%)

Construction Phase:

twenty-five percent (25%)

Total Basic Compensation:

one hundred percent (100%)

9.2 COMPENSATION FOR ADDITIONAL SERVICES

9.2.1a FOR PROJECT REPRESENTATION BEYOND BASIC SERVICES, as described in Paragraph 3A.2, compensation shall be computed as follows:

For a stipulated sum to be agreed upon at a later time.

9.2.2 FOR ADDITIONAL SERVICES OF THE ARCHITECT, not described in Article 2 and requested by the OWNER, but excluding services of consultants, compensation shall be computed as follows:

Per Hourly Rate Schedule in Attachment "C" or stipulated sum to be agreed upon prior to performing said Additional Services.

9.2.3 FOR ADDITIONAL SERVICES OF CONSULTANTS, a multiple of one and two-tenths (1.2) times the amounts billed to the Architect for such services.

9.3 REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES

9.3.1 REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES, as described in Paragraph 8.2, in connection with the BASIC SERVICES provided under this AMENDMENT, shall not exceed \$25,000.00 without prior written authorization by the Owner and shall be billed at direct cost incurred by the Architect, the Architect's employees and consultants in the interest of the Project.

9.4 ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

9.4.1a IF THE BASIC SERVICES covered by this AMENDMENT have not been completed within twenty-seven (27) months of the date hereof, through no fault of the Architect, extension of the Architect's services beyond that time shall be compensated as provided in Article 9.2.2.

ARTICLE 10: OTHER CONDITIONS OR SERVICES shall be amended to include:

- Architect shall prepare Construction Documents that will be adequate and sufficient to accomplish the construction of the project by competent and responsible Contractors; and, further, that any review or approval of those Construction Documents by the Owner shall not be deemed to diminish the Architect's responsibilities.
- 10.6 The preparation of Specifications for furniture, fixtures and equipment (FF&E) to the extent that are desired by the Owner may be included as an Additional Service at a later date.
- 10.7 The following special consultants shall be retained by the Architect as a part of Basic Services:
 - .1 Cost Consultant
 - .2 Food Design Consultant
- Professional services provided by the Architect and the Architect's Consultants under this Agreement necessarily require the active participation of the Owner. It is the Owner's responsibility to establish goals and objectives for the Project, to identify budgetary constraints, to identify key objectives of the Project, to identify budgetary constraints, and to make key decisions involving trade-offs between time or cost and quality and, in some cases, between time or cost and economic risk. To facilitate such

decision making, the Architect shall make investigations, conduct evaluations, and present alternatives to the Owner within a standard of usual and customary professional care consistent with sound architectural practice and the scope of services provided for hereunder. Should the Owner desire more detailed investigations of alternatives, the Architect shall conduct such investigations, subject to the constraints of time and cost budgeted by the Owner for that purpose, as an Additional Service requiring prior Owner approval.

Where such decisions are made by the Owner and savings in time or cost realized as a result, the savings accrue to the benefit of the Owner. At the same time, responsibility for the trade-offs involved must be assumed by the Owner. In recognition thereof and notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, it is understood and agreed that the Owner shall be solely responsible for the consequences of any adverse impact on quality and any and all economic risk attributable to any such decision.

COUNTY DETENTION CENTER EXPANSION PROJECT

BACKGROUND

Now that the Board has approved a schematic design that defines the size and scope of the Detention Center Expansion Project, it is appropriate to begin discussions regarding the construction delivery methods available to the County for this project. Over the years, changes in North Carolina legislation have provided local governments with more options for construction of public facilities. The traditional Multi-Prime (general, plumbing, mechanical & electrical) competitive bidding requirement has been expanded to allow local governments to use Single-Prime bids and most recently Construction Manager-at-Risk (CM-at-Risk) to construct public facilities. Based on my involvement with the construction of County facilities and having used each of these methods, I am convinced that for the construction of large public facilities, Construction Manager-at-Risk is the best construction delivery method for the following reasons:

- CM-at-Risk is qualifications based as opposed to accepting the low bid from any contractor that can get bonded for the job regardless of past performance.
- CM-at-Risk promotes a partnership arrangement with the owner. It is less adversarial than the other construction delivery methods because the fees (profit margin) are negotiated upfront which tends to mitigate the contractor looking for money through the change order process.
- CM-at-Risk can be incentive driven which can lead to a shortened project timeline. Any reduction in the construction timeline should result in reduced construction costs due to inflationary factors.
- CM-at-Risk is open book meaning that all costs are disclosed to the architect and owner.

Celebrating Our Past...Embracing Our Future

- CM-at-Risk can have more impact on keeping the construction dollars local through subdividing the work into packages for which local subcontractors can reasonable submit bids. This can also be an effective tool for recruiting MBE participation on the project.
- The owner has more control over the selection process for subcontractors, hence more control over quality of construction.
- CM-at-Risk provides a higher level of construction oversight which helps mitigate problems in the field and expedite solutions to keep the project on schedule.
- CM-at-Risk can be brought on during the design process to provide pre-construction services such as constructability reviews as the design of the facility evolves and value engineering for cost control purposes.

Construction Manager-at-Risk was successfully used on the new Public Health Center and should be given serious consideration for the Detention Center Expansion Project.

This information was presented to the County Facilities Committee at its June 2, 2011 meeting for review and consideration. The recommendation of the Facilities Committee will be presented to the Board at its June 6, 2011 meeting.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

The recommendation of the County Engineer and Management is to use Construction Manager-at-Risk as the construction delivery method for the Detention Center Expansion Project.

The proposed action is to approve the recommendation of Management and staff pending the action of the Facilities Committee.

B. Approval of Bulk Water Purchase Contract with PWC for Gray's Creek Water & Sewer District.

BACKGROUND: PWC has offered a bulk water purchase agreement with the District that is satisfactory to the consulting engineer. The standard wholesale rate is declared to be the same price as bulk water is sold to the Town of Stedman, Hoke County, and Aqua, NC. The estimated rate for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2011 is \$2.20 per 1000 gallons. PWC has agreed that it will take commercially reasonable measures to deliver the water at the current average operating pressure. This language is specifically acceptable to the consulting engineer. The agreement was sent to USDA-RD on Monday, November 29, 2010 for review and approval. As of December 1, 2010 the County has not received a response from USDA-RD. It is anticipated that a copy of the agreement will be provided to the governing board members at the start of the meeting on December 6.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the bulk water purchase agreement subject to review and concurrence or approval by USDA-RD.

County Manager Martin advised this meeting has been called to review the proposed bulk water purchase contract with the Public Works Commission for the Gray's Creek Water & Sewer District and called on Mr. Moorefield for details.

County Attorney Moorefield informed the Board that the contract has been in the works for some time, but it was not returned in a timely manner. He sent the last draft to the USDARD for their concurrence last month, but a response was just received this morning. The contract has been forwarded to Raleigh, but the USDA's form was unable to be used because PWC did not want to do so which is delaying the process somewhat. The USDA does have some issues with the contract as they see some of the same issues that Eastover is experiencing with the PWC currently. The only certain item with regard to the contract is water will be sold to the county for this district with the same rate provided to other wholesale customers (Stedman, Hoke County and AQUANC) which is their best wholesale rate. Ft. Bragg has a lower rate, but they are in a different category. Mr. Moorefield had hoped to take this to the Local Government Commission tomorrow for the financing piece, but the County will only be able to report to them the anticipated rate. More work is needed on the contract. As reported earlier to the Board, Mr. Moorefield expects the referendum date will likely have to be changed. Mr. Moorefield advised the issues USDA brought up had already been discussed with the PWC at the beginning, but no changes were made by the PWC when suggestions were made by the County. Mr. Moorefield suggests continuing with the rate structure discussion with the Local Government Commission, but would suggest putting the above recommendation on hold until the next meeting. Mr. Moorefield stated if this is not worked out by the December 20th meeting, the referendum will have to be delayed. County Manager Martin concurred. Commissioner King questioned whether anything else could be done to move the process along. Mr. Moorefield advised he just discovered that under the PWC rules, the meters placed on PWC lines and their installation would have to be paid by the County, as USDA will not fund that part, and he does not know

the cost. Part of the issue is the PWC will not agree to the County purchasing water from any other source and USDA does not like this inclusion in the contract. Mr. Moorefield stated he has removed the language, but when the contract was returned to him from PWC, the language was still part of the contract. This and some other issues still need to be worked out. Commissioner Keefe stated due to the size of this financial expenditure, it would be prudent to wait until all the facts are in before taking action. Chairman Edge stated he hoped issues could be worked out by the December 20th meeting.

BACKGROUND

A current evaluation of the municipal market indicates that we have two prior General Obligation Bond Issues in the amount of \$13.345M that are eligible for refunding. The most current analysis indicates potential savings of \$1.5M or 8.70% in net present value savings or approximately \$140,000 in annual savings through 2023. This refunding will replace the original General Obligation Bond Issues for school facilities in 2002 or 2004.

Management recommends moving forward with this refunding opportunity if market conditions remain favorable. We have contacted the Local Government Commission (LGC) regarding this opportunity and have received a tentative sale date of June 22, pending your approval. Attached you will find a bond order authorizing issuance of the General Obligation Refunding Bonds.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the attached bond order authorizing the issuance of General Obligation Bonds in the amount up to \$15M to refund all or certain maturities of the Series 2002 and Series 2004 General Obligation School Bonds, and authorize the Chairman, County Attorney, County Manager, and Finance Director to execute the necessary documents to finalize this transaction.

WHEREAS, the Bond Order hereinafter described was introduced, authorized and adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Cumberland (the "Board") on June 6, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to provide for the issuance of its General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2011 to refund all or a portion of certain maturities of the County's General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2002 and its General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Board has agreed to sell the bonds through the North Carolina Local Government Commission by negotiated sale to Stephens Inc. after circulation of an official statement with respect to such bonds which describes the terms thereof and the security therefor, including information concerning the County and its financial resources, and the Board has been provided a draft of such official statement;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County, meeting in regular session at Fayetteville, North Carolina, on June 6, 2011, does the following:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR CUMBERLAND COUNTY:

1. The County shall issue its general obligation refunding bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$15,000,000, pursuant to and in accordance with the Bond Order adopted June 6, 2011, entitled:

BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2011 OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY IN A MAXIMUM AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$15,000,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF REFUNDING ALL OR CERTAIN MATURITIES OF THE COUNTY'S GENERAL OBLIGATION SCHOOL BONDS, SERIES 2002 AND ITS GENERAL OBLIGATION SCHOOL BONDS, SERIES 2004

2. Such Bonds shall be referred to as the "Bonds" and shall be dated as of the date set forth in the Bonds.

3. The Bonds shall mature in annual installments on August 1 in the years and amounts as set forth on Exhibit A, subject to change as hereinafter described. Each Bond shall bear interest at such rate as shall be determined by the County Manager and the LGC, as hereafter defined, at the time of sale, provided no interest rate on any Bond shall exceed six percent (6%) per annum, payable on February 1, 2012, and semiannually thereafter on each February 1 and August 1.

Initially, one bond certificate for each maturity of the Bonds will be issued to The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), and immobilized in its custody. So long as DTC is securities depository for the Bonds, a book-entry system will be employed, evidencing ownership of the Bonds in principal amounts of \$5,000 or multiples thereof, with transfers of ownership effected on the records of DTC and its participants pursuant to rules and procedures established by DTC and its participants. Interest on the Bonds will be payable to DTC or its nominee as registered owner of the Bonds. Transfer of principal and interest payments to participants of DTC will be the responsibility of DTC; transfer of principal and interest payments to beneficial owners by participants of DTC will be the responsibility of such participants and other nominees of beneficial owners. The County will not be responsible or liable for maintaining, supervising or reviewing the records maintained by DTC, its participants or persons acting through such participants.

In the event that (a) DTC determines not to continue to act as securities depository for the Bonds or (b) the County Manager determines that continuation of the book-entry system of evidence and transfer of ownership of the Bonds would adversely affect the interests of the beneficial owners of the Bonds, the County will discontinue the book-entry system with DTC. If the County fails to identify another qualified securities depository to replace DTC, the County will authenticate and deliver replacement Bonds in the form of fully registered certificates, and registration of transfer of the Bonds will be permitted as described in paragraph 7.

- 4. The Bonds shall be signed by the manual or facsimile signature of the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of the County, shall be countersigned by the manual or facsimile signature of the Clerk to the Board and a manual or facsimile of the County's seal shall be printed or affixed thereon. No Bond shall be valid until it has been endorsed by the manual or facsimile signature of an authorized representative of the North Carolina Local Government Commission (the "LGC").
- 5. The Bonds shall be in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, the terms and requirements of which are incorporated herein by reference.
- 6. The full faith and credit and taxing power of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds. Unless other funds are lawfully available and appropriated for timely payment of the Bonds, the Board shall levy and collect taxes and raise other revenues for payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, as the same become due and payable.
- 7. The County shall maintain registration books for the registration of Bonds. If no qualified securities depository is the registered owner of the Bonds, upon surrender of any Bonds at the office of the County, together with an assignment duly executed by the registered owner or

his duly authorized attorney or legal representative in such form as shall be satisfactory to the County, the County shall execute and shall authenticate and deliver in exchange, a new Bond or Bonds having an equal aggregate principal amount, in authorized denominations, of the same form and maturity, bearing interest at the same rate, and registered in names as requested by the then registered owner or his duly authorized attorney or legal representative. Any such exchange shall be at the expense of the County, except that the County may charge the person requesting such exchange the amount of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect thereto.

The County shall treat the registered owner as the person exclusively entitled to payment of principal and interest and the exercise of all other rights and powers of the owner, except that interest payments shall be made to the person shown as owner on the registration books on the fifteenth day of the month preceding each interest payment date.

- 8. Pursuant to G.S. § 159-123(b)(5), the County hereby requests the LGC to sell the General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2011 by private sale to Stephens Inc. (the "Underwriter") pursuant to a Bond Purchase Agreement between the Underwriter, the County and the LGC (the "Bond Purchase Agreement"), a form of which has been presented to the Board and is hereby approved by the Board.
- 9. There has been presented to the Board the form of a draft dated May 26, 2011, of the Preliminary Official Statement relating to the Bonds, which contains certain information about the County and the plan of finance (the "Preliminary Official Statement") to be used to market and sell the Bonds, which is hereby approved by the Board.
- 10. The Board covenants on behalf of the County that so long as any of the installments of principal and interest on the Bonds are outstanding and unpaid, the County shall not take or omit to take any action the taking or omission of which will cause the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), or otherwise cause interest on the Bonds to be includable in the gross income of the holders thereof.
- 11. The Board hereby covenants that it will not permit the gross proceeds of the Bonds to be used in any manner that would result in either (a) 5% or more of such proceeds being considered as having been used directly or indirectly in any trade or business carried on by any person other than a governmental unit as provided in Section 141(b) of the Code, (b) 5% of such proceeds being used with respect to any "output facility" (other than a facility for the furnishing of water), within the meaning of Section 141(b)(4) of the Code, or (c) 5% or more of such proceeds being considered as having been used directly or indirectly to make or finance loans to any person other than a governmental unit as provided in Section 141(c) of the Code; provided, however, that if the Board receives an opinion of bond counsel acceptable to the LGC that any such restriction is not required to prevent the interest on the Bonds from being includable in the gross income of the registered owners thereof under existing statutes, the Board need not comply with such restriction.

- 12. The County hereby undertakes, for the benefit of the beneficial owners of the Bonds, to provide to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB"):
- (a) by not later than seven months from the end of each fiscal year of the County, beginning with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the audited financial statements of the County for such fiscal year, if available, prepared in accordance with Section 159-34 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, as it may be amended from time to time, or any successor statute, or, if such audited financial statements of the County are not available by seven months from the end of such fiscal year, unaudited financial statements of the County for such fiscal year to be replaced subsequently by audited financial statements of the County to be delivered within 15 days after such audited financial statements become available for distribution;
- (b) by not later than seven months from the end of each fiscal year of the County, beginning with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 (i) the financial and statistical data as of a date not earlier than the end of the preceding fiscal year for the type of information included under heading "Debt Information" and "Tax Information" in Appendix A to the Official Statement relating to the Bonds (excluding any information on overlapping or underlying units) and (ii) the combined budget of the County for the current fiscal year, to the extent such items are not included in the audited financial statements referred to in (a) above;
- (c) within ten (10) Business Days following the occurrence of an event, notice of any of the following events with respect to the Bonds:
 - (i) principal and interest payment delinquencies;
 - (ii) unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;
 - (iii) unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties;
 - (iv) substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
 - (v) adverse tax opinions, the issuance by the Internal Revenue Service of proposed or final determinations of taxability, Notices of Proposed Issue (IRS Form 5701-TEB) or other material notices or determinations with respect to the tax status of the Bonds or other events affecting the tax status of the Bonds;
 - (vi) defeasances;
 - (vii) rating changes;
 - (viii) tender offers; and
 - (ix) bankruptcy, insolvency, receivership or similar proceedings by the County.

- (d) within ten (10) Business Days following the occurrence of an event, notice of any of the following events with respect to the Bonds, if material:
 - (i) non-payment related defaults;
 - (ii) modification to the rights of the beneficial owners of the Bonds;
 - (iii) bond calls, other than bond calls relating to mandatory sinking fund redemption;
 - (iv) release, substitution or sale of any property securing repayment of the Bonds;
 - (v) mergers, consolidations, acquisition and sales of assets (other than in the ordinary course of business); and
 - (vi) appointment of a successor or additional trustee or a change in the name of the trustee.
- (e) within ten (10) Business Days following the occurrence of a failure, notice of a failure of the County to provide required annual financial information described in (a), (b), (c) or (d) above on or before the date specified.

The County shall provide the documents referred to above to the MSRB in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB and accompanied by identifying information as prescribed by the MSRB.

The County may discharge its undertaking described above by transmitting the documents referred to above to any entity and by any method authorized by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.

If the County fails to comply with the undertaking described above, any beneficial owner of the Bonds may take action to protect and enforce the rights of all beneficial owners with respect to such undertaking, including an action for specific performance; provided, however, that failure to comply with such undertaking shall not be an event of default and shall not result in any acceleration of the Bonds. All actions shall be instituted, had and maintained in the manner provided in this paragraph for the benefit of all beneficial owners of the Bonds.

The County reserves the right to modify from time to time the information to be provided to the extent necessary or appropriate in the judgment of the County, provided that any such modification will be done in a manner consistent with Rule 15c2-12 issued under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as it may be amended from time to time ("Rule 15c2-12"), and provided further that:

(a) any such modification may only be made in connection with a change in circumstances that arises from a change in legal requirements, change in law or change in the identity, nature or status of the County;

- (b) the information to be provided, as modified, would have complied with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 as of the date of the Official Statement, after taking into account any amendments or interpretations of Rule 15c2-12, as well as any changes in circumstances; and
- (c) any such modification does not materially impair the interests of the beneficial owners of the Bonds, as determined by Bond Counsel, or by the approving vote of the registered owners of a majority in principal amount of the Bonds pursuant to the terms of this resolution, as it may be amended from time to time, at the time of the amendment.

In the event that the County makes such a modification, the annual financial information containing modified operating data or financial information shall explain, in narrative form, the reasons for the modification and the impact of the change in the type of operating data or financial information being provided.

The provisions of this Section shall terminate upon payment, or provision having been made for payment in full of the principal of and interest on all of the Bonds.

- 13. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and the Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to take all proper steps to have the Bonds prepared and, when they shall have been duly sold by the LGC, to execute the Bonds and to deliver the Bonds to the State Treasurer of North Carolina for delivery to the purchasers thereof.
- 14. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and the Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver an Escrow Deposit Agreement dated as of June 1, 2011 (the "Escrow Agreement") between the County and Regions Bank, as escrow agent (the "Escrow Agent") pursuant to which the Escrow Agent will hold the proceeds of the Bonds until such proceeds are used to redeem the refunded bonds. The Escrow Agreement shall be in substantially the form previously submitted, which is hereby approved, with such completions, omissions, insertions, and changes as may be approved by the Chairman, Vice Chairman or the County Manager, their execution to constitute conclusive evidence of their approval of any such completions, omissions, insertions and changes.
- 15. The Chairman and the Clerk, after consultation with the County Finance Officer and the LGC, are authorized (i) to add optional redemption provisions in the Bonds, (ii) to change the dated date of the Bonds to a date later than the dated date herein authorized in order to facilitate the sale and delivery of the bonds, (iii) to change the principal and interest payment dates for the Bonds (so long as such interest payment dates are semiannual), (iv) to make changes in the principal amounts of each maturity provided the aggregate total of Bonds issued shall not exceed \$15,000,000, (v) to approve an Underwriter's spread under the Bond Purchase Agreement not in excess of .6%, and (vi) to make such other adjustments as they shall deem necessary to market the Bonds. In approving such changes and adjustments, the Chairman and the County Manager shall take into account that the intent of the Board is to achieve present value debt service savings of at least 3% of the principal amount of the refunded bonds.

- 16. The Chairman or Vice Chairman of the Board and the County Manager, or any of them, are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Preliminary Official Statement and a form thereof updated with pricing information and other details of the Bonds (the "Final Official Statement" and, together with the Preliminary Official Statement, the "Official Statement"), which shall be in substantially the forms previously submitted, which are hereby approved, with such completions, omissions, insertions, and changes as may be approved by the Chairman, Vice Chairman or the County Manager, including such changes as may be required by the LGC, their execution to constitute conclusive evidence of their approval of any such completions, omissions, insertions and changes.
- 17. All other actions of officers of the County in conformity with the purposes and intent of this resolution and in furtherance of the issuance of the Bonds are hereby approved and confirmed.
- 18. Such officers of the County as may be requested are hereby authorized and directed to execute appropriate closing papers including a certificate setting forth the expected use and investment of the proceeds of the Bonds in order to show that such expected use and investment will not violate the provisions of Section 148 of the Code and regulations issued pursuant thereto, applicable to "arbitrage bonds." Such papers and certificates shall be in such form as may be requested by bond counsel for the County.
- 19. This resolution, in particular paragraphs 2, 3, 5 and 7 hereof, constitutes a system of registration for the Bonds pursuant to NCGS § 159E-4.
 - 20. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
 - 21. This resolution shall take effect immediately.



According to our records, the term of Edward Melvin, who was appointed to the county board of social services by the county commissioners, expires on June 30, 2011. In making either a new appointment or reappointment, the board should adhere to the following guidelines:

G.S. 108A-4: "Each member of a county board of social services shall serve for a term of three years. No member may serve more than two consecutive terms. Notwithstanding the previous sentence, the limitation on consecutive terms does not apply if the member of the social services board was a member of the board of county commissioners at any time during the first two consecutive terms, and is a member of the board of county commissioners at the time of reappointment."

> In summary, if a social services board member has served two consecutive terms and is a county commissioner on June 30, 2011, that person may be reappointed.

G.S. 108A-6: All appointments made to fill vacancies "... shall be for the remainder of the former member's term of office and shall not constitute a term for the purposes of G. S. 108A-4."

I encourage your board to consider men and women who are representative of all ethnic groups and reflective of the citizens of the county.
