Action on Tax Collector's Preliminary Report and Proposed Annual Settlement

BACKGOUND: North Carolina General Statutes, Section 105-373 requires the Tax Collector of Cumberland County after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July of each year to render a preliminary report to the Board of County Commissioners concerning persons whose tax liabilities remain unpaid and to propose an annual settlement of taxes charged to him for collection for the past year. The Tax Collector has submitted such preliminary report and proposed settlement. The preliminary report consists of (i) a list of persons owning real property whose taxes for the tax year of 2014-2015 remain unpaid, (ii) a list of the persons not owning real property whose taxes for the year 2014-2015 remain unpaid (the proposed insolvent list), and (iii) a statement under oath by the Tax Collector that he has made diligent efforts to collect such taxes. The proposed settlement consists of the amounts of taxes with which the Tax Collector has been charged for the year and the amounts of credits against such charges, the real and personal property tax balance is charged to the forthcoming tax year. See Exhibits A, B and C in the County Clerk's Office.

**RECOMMENDATIONS:** The statute requires the Board to review the preliminary report, determine the insolvent list to be entered into the minutes, credit the Tax Collector with the insolvent list and make a settlement, i.e., approve or correct the proposed settlement. The Legal Department has reviewed for legal sufficiency.

**PROPOSED ACTION:** That the Board adopts the resolution attached as Exhibit D.

#### EXHIBIT D

Resolution accepting preliminary report of the Tax Collector, crediting the insolvent list, and approving proposed annual settlement.

Whereas, North Carolina General Statutes, Section 105-373, requires the Tax Collector of Cumberland County after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July of each year to render a preliminary report to the Board of County Commissioners concerning persons whose tax liabilities remain unpaid and to propose an annual settlement of taxes charged to the Tax Collector for collection for the past ten years; and

Whereas, the Tax Collector has submitted such preliminary report and proposed settlement.

Now therefore, the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County hereby resolves:

- 1. That the preliminary report of the Tax Collector of Cumberland County, consisting of (i) a list of persons owning real property whose taxes for the preceding fiscal year 2014- 2015 remain unpaid and the principal amount owned by each person; (ii) a list of the persons not owning or who have not listed real property whose taxes for the preceding fiscal tax year 2014 2015 remain unpaid and the principal amount owned by each person (the proposed insolvent list) and (iii) a statement under oath by the Tax Collector that he has made diligent efforts to collect such taxes, be and it hereby is, accepted;
- 2. That the Board hereby finds that the persons in the list of those that do not own or have not listed real property are insolvent as that term is used in G.S. 105-373, directs that the list of such person be entered into the minutes of the meeting of the Board as the insolvent list, and further directs that the amounts in such list be, and hereby are, credited to the Tax Collector in his annual settlement;
- 3. That the proposed settlement of the Tax Collector, appended hereto, for taxes in his hands for collection for the fiscal tax year 2014 2015, be and it hereby is, approved and that he be, and thereby is, charged with the amounts set forth in the settlement under the heading "Charges" and credited with the amounts set forth in the settlement under the heading "Credits".



WHEREAS, Duplin County is the controlling agency for the CAMET Grant Funds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C.G.S. §160A-274, Duplin County desires to donate to Cumberland County certain equipment, designated more fully in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, purchased with funds from Federal Fiscal Year 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program EMW-2014-SS-00069-S01; and

WHEREAS, Cumberland County agrees to accept the equipment purchased with CAMET funds in accordance with the terms indicated below.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to N.C.G.S. §160A-274, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

- 1. Duplin County received a grant for CAMET from the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management for the implementation of the State of North Carolina's goals and strategies of the State Homeland Security Strategy 2014 2016. 6. - I. PARTIES. The parties to this Memorandum of Understanding/Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "MOA" or "Agreement") are the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management and Duplin County.
- II. AUTHORITY. This Agreement is authorized under the provisions of: 1) Public Law 112-74, The Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2014 (Pub. L. No. 113-76); The 9/11 Commission Act of 2007; 3) Public Law 107-56, (6 U.S.C. § 101 et seq.), the USA Patriot Act of 2001; 4) Public Law 107-296, the Homeland Security Act of 2002; 5) Public Law 109-295, The Post-Katrina Emergency Management Reform Act of 2006, 6 U.S.C. 752(c); 6) the implementing recommendations or regulations of each Act or Law, if any; 7) the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) available at: <a href="http://www.fema.gov/media-library-data/1395161200285-">http://www.fema.gov/media-library-data/1395161200285-</a>

III. PURPOSE. The purpose of this Agreement is to establish responsibilities and procedures to implement the terms of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP). This Agreement is to set forth terms by which the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management (Grantee), shall provide FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Funding to Duplin County (Sub-grantee) to purchase CAMET Trailer and Equipment that will enable Sub-grantee to prevent, protect against, respond to, mitigate, and recover from potential acts of terrorism and other hazardous or catastrophic events.

IV. BACKGROUND. The Department of Homeland Security (DHS), through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Grants Program Directorate, in accordance with the authorities listed herein, created the FY2014 Homeland Security Grant Program, FOA Number DHS-14-GPD-067-000-01. This program was established to implement objectives addressed in a series of post-9/11 laws, strategy documents, plans, and presidential policy directives, including Presidential Policy Directive-8 (PPD-8) and the National Preparedness Goal (NPG), copies of which are available at: <a href="http://www.fema.gov/learn-about-presidential-policy-directive-8">http://www.fema.gov/learn-about-presidential-policy-directive-8</a>.

The Grantee and Sub-grantee enter into an arrangement by which the Grantee will provide Federal reimbursement funding to the Sub-grantee for the purchase of CAMET Trailer and Equipment.

#### V. RESPONSIBILITIES.

- a. The State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management shall:
  - (1) Provide reimbursement to the Sub-grantee for the cost of CAMET Trailer and Equipment as described in Attachment 1.
  - (2) Conduct periodic monitoring visits to the Sub-grantee to maintain grant compliance.
  - (3) The performance period for the award to the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management, ends on February 28, 2016. Funds allocated for the procurement of equipment must be encumbered and invoices dated on or prior to February 28, 2016.
  - (4) Reserves the right to de-obligate any remaining award funds after this agreement's expiration date, or before the expiration date of this agreement should the sub-grantee violate the terms of this agreement or should it become apparent that the sub-grantee will not be able to expend the funds prior to the expiration date of this agreement. Before taking action, the Grantee will provide the Sub-grantee reasonable notice of intent to impose corrective measures and will make every effort to resolve the problem informally.
- b. Duplin County shall:

- (1) Expend FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program funds in accordance with the applicable FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA), the Grant Application Package, and the Grant Award and Special Conditions documents, incorporated by reference herein, of this MOA for the purchase of CAMET Trailer and Equipment and the enhancement of all hazard preparedness.
- (2) Utilize State of North Carolina and/or local procurement policies and procedures for the procurement of the CAMET Trailer and Equipment and conform to applicable State and Federal law and the standards identified in the Procurement Standards Sections of 44 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 13 and 2 CFR Part 215. Sub-grantee must follow procurement procedures and policies as outlined in the applicable FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) and the USDHS Financial Management Guide. Sub-grantee shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations and program guidance. Sub-grantee must comply with the most recent version of the Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit requirements. Administrative and procurement practices must conform to applicable federal requirements. A non-exclusive list of regulations commonly applicable to DHS grants are listed below, codified in the following guidance: 44 CFR Part 13; 2 CFR 215; 2 CFR Parts 225, 220, and 230 (formerly OMB Circulars A-87, A21 and A-122); Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR), Part 31.2; and OMB Circular A-133 "Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations"; 28 CFR Part 23 "Criminal Intelligence Systems Operating Policies"; 49 CFR Part 1520 "Sensitive Security Information"; Public Law 107-296, The Critical Infrastructure Act of 2002; Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 2000 et. seq.; Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended, 20 U.S.C. 1681 et. seq; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, 29 U.S.C. 794; The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, 20 U.S.C. 6101 et. seq.; Certifications and Assurances regarding Lobbying 31 U.S.C. 1352, Drug-Free Workplace Act, as amended, 41 U.S.C. 701 et. seq. and Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements, Debarment and Suspension Executive Orders 12549 and 12689 and 44 CFR Part 17 and Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibility Matters; Assurances as listed in SF 424B and SF 424D; and Grant Award and Special Conditions documents.
- (3) Submit invoice(s) requesting reimbursement for item(s) received to the NCEM Homeland Security grants manager. Grantee will reimburse Subgrantee for eligible costs as outlined in the applicable USDHS Program Guidelines and Funding Opportunity Announcements. Sub-grantee must take possession of all purchased equipment and receive any grant-eligible service prior to seeking reimbursement from the grantee. Subgrantee must submit request for reimbursement within 60 days of payment of invoice.

- (4) Complete the procurement (s) process not later than February 28, 2016.
- (5) Provide quarterly progress reports to the NCEM Homeland Security grants manager as described in Attachment 2 by the following dates: 15 January, 15 April, 15 July, and 15 October.
- (6) Provide inventory list at project completion phase to the Homeland Security grants manager listing all equipment purchased through the grant.
- (7) Comply with the applicable federal statutes, regulations, policies, guidelines and requirements, reporting requirements and certifications as outlined in the applicable 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) and the USDHS Financial Management Guide and Special Conditions documents and FEMA Grant Programs Directorate Information Bulletins. As required in the FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) and FEMA Grant Programs Directorate Information Bulletin No. 388 dated July 18, 2012, subgrantee must report all grant-funded equipment that supports defined resource typed capabilities and all training that supports a defined resource typed team using the fields in the FY 2012 Grant-Funded Typed Resource Report. The link to this instrument and a completed example of this report as well as all options available in the drop-down boxes can be found on Attachment 3 of this document. This reporting will include both NIMS typed resources and State and local typed resources. The description and listing of NIMS typed resources can be found at: www.fema.gov/media-library/assets/documents/28973?id=6432 Sub-grantee will specify the number of resources, capability supported. whether it is a NIMS or State/local typed resource, the cost, and whether the resource sustains current capabilities or adds new capabilities. The resources should be reported only after equipment is delivered or after training has occurred and the corresponding grant funds have been expended. The Sub-grantee will include this Typed Resource Report with each cost report submitted for reimbursement.
- (8) Maintain grant management filing system as required in Attachment 4.
- (9) Retain all original records pertinent to this MOA for a period of five years following the date of the closure of the grant award, or audit if required, or longer where required by law. However, if litigation, claim or audit has been initiated prior to the expiration of the five-year period and extends beyond the five year period, the records shall be retained until all litigation, claims or audit findings involving the records have been resolved.
- (10) Comply with current federal suspension and debarment regulations pursuant to OMB Circular A-133 which states in pertinent part that "[e]ffective November 26, 2003, when a non-federal entity enters into a

covered transaction with an entity at a lower tier, the non-federal entity must verify that the entity is not suspended or debarred or otherwise excluded. Sub-grantee shall be responsible to ensure that it has checked the federal Excluded Parties List System (EPLS) to verify that contractors or sub-recipients have not been suspended or debarred from doing business with the federal government."

- (11) Ensure that FY 2014 HSGP funds are not used to support the hiring of any personnel for the purposes of fulfilling traditional public safety duties or to supplant traditional public safety positions and responsibilities.
- (12) Non-supplanting Requirement. Federal grant funds will be used to supplement existing funds, and will not replace (supplant) funds that have been appropriated for the same purpose.
- (13) All materials publicizing or resulting from award activities shall contain this acknowledgement: "This project was supported by a Federal award from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Office of Grants and Training and the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management." Use of the federal program logo must be approved by DHS. Printed as a legend, either below or beside the logo shall be the words "100 percent Funded by U.S. Department of Homeland Security."
- (14) Sub-grantee shall order, receive, inspect, and stage the equipment and supplies. The purchase or acquisition of any additional materials, equipment, accessories or supplies beyond those identified in this MOA shall be the sole responsibility of Sub-grantee and shall not be reimbursed under this MOA. Sub-grantee shall prominently mark any equipment purchased with grant funding as follows: "Purchased with funds provided by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security."
- (15) Sub-grantee shall maintain an effective property management system that complies with the following requirements. Equipment is defined as tangible, non-expendable property having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more per unit. Sub-grantee may have property management guidelines that are more restrictive, requiring a unit of equipment with a value of less than \$5,000 to be inventoried; if so, such equipment purchased under this award allocation shall be included in the reports submitted to Grantee.
  - a) Grantee and Sub-grantee shall take a physical inventory of the equipment. The EM Sub-grantee Equipment Inventory Report, Cost Reports with backup documentation, Certificate of Title, Site Visit Report and any other Sub-grantee reports or inventory reports that include information regarding the grant, vendor, invoice number, cost per item, number of items, description, location, condition and identification number may be used to meet this requirement Sub-grantee must provide Quarterly Progress Reports until all funds are expended.

- b) Sub-grantee must ensure adequate safeguards to prevent loss, damage or theft. Sub-grantee shall be responsible for replacing or repairing equipment which is willfully or negligently lost, stolen, damaged, or destroyed. Any loss, damage or theft of the property must be investigated and fully documented, and made part of the official project records.
- c) Sub-grantee must ensure adequate maintenance procedures exist to keep the equipment in good condition.
- d) Disposition Procedures. Sub-grantee may dispose of the equipment when the original or replacement equipment acquired under the grant award is no longer needed for the original project or program. Items with a fair market value of less than \$5,000 may be retained, transferred or otherwise disposed of with prior approval of Grantee and in accordance with applicable program requirements. Items with a current per unit standard federal or fair market value in excess of \$5,000 may be retained, transferred or otherwise disposed of with prior Grantee approval in accordance with disposition requirements in 44 C.F.R. Part 13. Sub-grantee must provide documentation that includes the method used to determine current fair market value.
- (16) The purchase or acquisition of any additional materials, equipment, accessories or supplies, or the provision of any training or exercise beyond that identified in this MOA shall be the sole responsibility of Sub-grantee and shall not be reimbursed under this MOA.
- (17) No indirect or administrative costs will be charged to this allocation award.
- (18) Sub-grantees must utilize equipment as intended in the project proposal form /project detail workbook submitted to NCEM- HLS. Any variation from this intended use must be requested in writing and approved by NCEM- HLS office.
- (19) Each Sub-grantee must have a DUNS Number, prior to any funds being released. DUNS Numbers may be obtained from either of the following web links: www.dnb.com or http://fedgov.dnb.com/webform.
- (20) System for Award Management (SAM) registration is required for all applicants. Each Sub-grantee shall ensure that your organization's name, address, DUNS number and EIN are up to date in SAM and that the DUNS number used in SAM is the same one used to apply for all FEMA awards. SAM information can be found at <a href="http://www.sam.gov">http://www.sam.gov</a>. Future payments will be contingent on the information provided in SAM; therefore it is imperative that the information is correct.
- VI. FUNDING AND COMPENSATION. Grantee will reimburse Sub-grantee for the actual eligible costs incurred for the subject of this grant, not to exceed Forty-six Thousand, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$46800). Funds will be provided by the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, and North Carolina Emergency

Management. The allocation of funds will be from the USDHS FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program.

All terms and conditions of this MOA are dependent upon and subject to the allocation of funds from DHS, FEMA and Grantee for the purposes set forth and the MOA shall automatically terminate if funds cease to be available. Allowable costs shall be determined in accordance with the applicable U.S. Department of Homeland Security

Program Guidelines, which include, but may not be limited to, the FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA), available at: http://www.fema.gov/media-library-data/1395161200285-5b07ed0456056217175fbdee28d2b06e/FY\_2014\_HSGP\_FOA\_Final.pdf, 44 C.F.R. Part 13, 2 CFR Parts 215, 220, and 230, Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR) Part 31.2, OMB Circulars A-21, A-87, A-122 and A-133 and the U.S. DHS Financial Management Guide available at:

http://www.dhs.gov/xlibrary/assets/Grants\_FinancialManagementGuide.pdf.
Allowable costs are also subject to the approval of the State Administrative Agent for the State of North Carolina, the Secretary of the Department of Public Safety.

- VII. WARRANTY. Sub-grantee shall hold Grantee harmless for any liability and personal injury that may occur from or in connection with the performance of this MOA to the extent permitted by the North Carolina Tort Claims Act. The parties agree that this Limitation of Liability shall not be construed as a waiver of sovereign immunity by either party. This Agreement does not give any person or entity other than the parties hereto any legal or equitable claim, right or remedy. This Agreement is intended for the sole and exclusive benefit of the parties hereto. This Agreement is not made for the benefit of any third person or persons. No third party may enforce any part of this Agreement or shall have any rights hereunder. This Agreement does not create, and shall not be construed as creating, any rights enforceable by any person not a party to this Agreement.
- VIII. PROPERTY. All property furnished under this agreement shall become the property of the Sub-grantee. The Sub-grantee shall be responsible for the custody and care of any property furnished for use in connection with the performance of this agreement. Grantee will not be held responsible for any equipment purchased by Sub-grantee.

#### IX. COMMUNICATIONS AND POINTS OF CONTACT

To provide consistent and effective communication between the Sub-grantee and the Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management, each party shall appoint a Principal Representative(s) to serve as its central point of contact responsible for coordinating and implementing this MOA. Grantee contacts shall be Michael A. Sprayberry, Director; Michael Daniska, Deputy Chief, Planning and Homeland Security Section and Callion Maddox, Grant Manager. The sub-grantee signatory shall be Mike Aldridge, County Manager, Duplin County and the point of contact shall be Reid Southerland, EM Coordinator, Duplin County.

All confidential information of either party disclosed to the other party in connection with the services provided hereunder will be treated by the receiving party as confidential and restricted in its use to only those uses contemplated by the terms of

this MOA. Any information to be treated as confidential must be clearly marked as confidential prior to transmittal to the other party. Neither party shall disclose to third parties, the other party's confidential information without written authorization to do so from the other party. Specifically excluded from such confidential treatment shall be information that: (i) as of the date of disclosure and/or delivery, is already known to the party receiving such information; (ii) is or becomes part of the public domain through no fault of the receiving party; (iii) is lawfully disclosed to the receiving party by a third party who is not obligated to retain such information in confidence; or (iv) is independently developed at the receiving party by someone not privy to the confidential information. In accordance with the FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA), "FEMA recognizes that much of the information submitted in the course of applying for funding under this program, or provided in the course of its grant management activities, may be considered law enforcement sensitive or otherwise important to national security interests. While this information under Federal control is subject to requests made pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. §552 et. seq., all determinations concerning the release of information of this nature are made on a case-by-case basis by the FEMA FOIA Office. The Grantee and NCOI should be familiar with the regulations governing Sensitive Security Information (49 CFR Part. 1520), as it may provide additional protection to certain classes of homeland security information."

- X. SUBCONTRACTING. If the Sub-grantee subcontracts any or all purchases required under this Agreement, Sub-grantee agrees to include in the subcontract that the subcontractor is bound by the terms and conditions of this MOA. Sub-grantee agrees to include in the subcontract that the subcontractor shall hold Grantee harmless against all claims of whatever nature arising out of the subcontractor's performance of work under this MOA. If Sub-grantee subcontracts, a copy of the executed subcontract agreement must be forwarded to the North Carolina Emergency Management. Contractual arrangement shall in no way relieve Sub-grantee of its responsibilities to ensure that all funds issued pursuant to this grant be administered in accordance with all state and federal requirements. Sub-grantee is bound by the terms, conditions and restrictions of the applicable USDHS Program Guidelines and Funding Opportunity Announcement referenced herein.
- XI. SITUS. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of North Carolina, and venue for any disputed matters or claims shall be in the Superior Court of Wake County, North Carolina.
- XII. ANTITRUST LAWS. This Agreement is entered into in compliance with all State and Federal antitrust laws.
- XIII. COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAW. Sub-grantee shall be wholly responsible for the purchases to be made under this MOA and for the supervision of its employees and assistants. Sub-grantee shall be responsible for compliance with all laws, ordinances, codes, rules, regulations, licensing requirements and other regulatory matters that are applicable to the conduct of its business and purchase requirements performed under this MOA, including those of federal requirements and State and local agencies having appropriate jurisdiction and found in the FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA).

- XIV. OTHER PROVISIONS/SEVERABILITY. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to conflict with current laws or regulations of the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety or Duplin County. If any term of this Agreement is found by any court or other legal authority, or is agreed by the parties to be in conflict with any law or regulation governing its subject, the conflicting term shall be considered null and void. The remaining terms and conditions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- XV. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement and any exhibits and amendments annexed hereto and any documents incorporated specifically by reference represent the entire agreement between the parties and supersede all prior oral and written statements or agreements.
- XVI. MODIFICATION. Modifications of this agreement must be in writing and upon approval of both parties except as modified by official USDHS Federal Grant Adjustment Notice (GAN).
- XVII. TERMINATION. The terms of this agreement, as modified with the consent of all parties, will remain in effect until February 28, 2016. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other party.

Upon approval by USDHS, FEMA and the issuance of the Grant Adjustment Notice, if this MOA is extended, the termination date for the extension will be the date listed in the applicable USDHS Grant Adjustment Notice, incorporated by reference herein, or as established by the State Administrative Agency, whichever is sooner.

If Sub-grantee materially fails to comply with the terms of the award and DHS or Grantee suspends or terminates the grant award in accordance with 44 C.F.R., the applicable FY 2014 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) and other applicable authorities, incorporated by reference herein, Sub-grantee shall reimburse the North Carolina Emergency Management for said property.

- XVIII. EXECUTION AND EFFECTIVE DATE. This Agreement will become binding upon execution of all parties to the Agreement. The terms of this Agreement became effective on September 1, 2014. The last signature shall be that of Gregory Baker, Commissioner—Law Enforcement, North Carolina Department of Public Safety.
- XIX. TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall be in effect from September 1, 2014 to February 28, 2016.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have each executed this Agreement and the parties agree that this Agreement will be effective as of September 1, 2014.

- 1. - I. PARTIES. The parties to this Memorandum of Understanding/Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "MOA" or "Agreement") are the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management and Morehead City Police Department.
- II. AUTHORITY. This Agreement is authorized under the provisions of: 1) Public Law 112-74, The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2013, Division D; 2) Public Law 110-53, The 9/11 Commission Act of 2007; 3) Public Law 107-56, (6 U.S.C. § 101 et seq.), the USA Patriot Act of 2001; 4) Public Law 107-296, the Homeland Security Act of 2002; 5) Public Law 109-295, The Post-Katrina Emergency Management Reform Act of 2006, 6 U.S.C. 752(c); 6) the implementing recommendations or regulations of each Act or Law, if any; 7) the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) available at: http://www.fema.gov/media-library-data/20130726-1916-25045-6176/fy\_2013\_hsgp\_foa.pdf 8) FOA Number DHS-13-GPD-067-000-01; 9) applicable Grants Programs Directorate (GPD) Information Bulletins available at http://www.fema.gov/grants/grant-programs-directorate-information-bulletins; and 10) the N.C. Emergency Management Act, Chapter 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes.
- III. PURPOSE. The purpose of this Agreement is to establish responsibilities and procedures to implement the terms of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP). A copy of the complete federal grant instructions is available at: http://www.fema.gov/media-library-data/20130726-1916-25045-6176/fy 2013 hsgp\_foa.pdf.

This Agreement is to set forth terms by which the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management (Grantee), shall provide FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Funding to Morehead City Police Department (Subgrantee) to purchase Message Boards that will enable Sub-grantee to prevent, protect against, respond to, mitigate, and recover from potential acts of terrorism and other hazardous or catastrophic events.

IV. BACKGROUND. The Department of Homeland Security (DHS), through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Grants Program Directorate, in accordance with the authorities listed herein, created the FY2013 Homeland Security Grant Program, FOA Number DHS-13-GPD-067-000-01. This program was established to implement objectives addressed in a series of post-9/11 laws, strategy documents, plans, and presidential policy directives, including Presidential Policy Directive-8 (PPD-8) and the National Preparedness Goal (NPG), copies of which are available at: http://www.fema.gov/prepared/ppd8.shtm.

The Grantee and Sub-grantee enter into an arrangement by which the Grantee will provide Federal reimbursement funding to the Sub-grantee for the purchase of Message Boards.

#### V. RESPONSIBILITIES.

- a. The State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management shall:
  - (1) Provide reimbursement to the Sub-grantee for the cost of Message Boards, as described in Attachment 1.
  - (2) Conduct periodic monitoring visits to the Sub-grantee to maintain grant compliance.
  - (3) The performance period for the award to the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management, ends on February 28, 2015. Funds allocated for the procurement of equipment must be encumbered and invoices dated on or prior to February 28, 2015.
- b. Morehead City Police Department shall:
  - (1) Expend FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program funds in accordance with the applicable FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA), the Grant Application Package, and the Grant Award and Special Conditions documents, incorporated by reference herein, of this MOA for the purchase of Message Boards and the enhancement of all hazard preparedness.
  - (2) Utilize State of North Carolina and/or local procurement policies and procedures for the procurement of the Message Boards, and conform to applicable State and Federal law and the standards identified in the Procurement Standards Sections of 44 Code of Federal Regulations

(CFR) Part 13 and 2 CFR Part 215. Sub-grantee must follow procurement procedures and policies as outlined in the applicable FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) and the USDHS Financial Management Guide. Sub-grantee shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations and program guidance. Sub-grantee must comply with the most recent version of the Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit requirements. Administrative and procurement practices must conform to applicable federal requirements. A non-exclusive list of regulations commonly applicable to DHS grants are listed below, codified in the following guidance: 44 CFR Part 13; 2 CFR 215; 2 CFR Parts 225, 220, and 230 (formerly OMB Circulars A-87, A21 and A-122); Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR), Part 31.2; and OMB Circular A-133 "Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations"; 28 CFR Part 23 "Criminal Intelligence Systems Operating Policies"; 49 CFR Part 1520 "Sensitive Security Information"; Public Law 107-296, The Critical Infrastructure Act of 2002; Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 2000 et. seq.; Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended, 20 U.S.C. 1681 et. seg; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, 29 U.S.C. 794; The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, 20 U.S.C. 6101 et. seq.; Certifications and Assurances regarding Lobbying 31 U.S.C. 1352, Drug-Free Workplace Act, as amended, 41 U.S.C. 701 et. seg. and Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements, Debarment and Suspension Executive Orders 12549 and 12689 and 44 CFR Part 17 and Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibility Matters; Assurances as listed in SF 424B and SF 424D; and Grant Award and Special Conditions documents.

- (3) Submit invoice(s) requesting reimbursement for item(s) received to the NCEM Homeland Security grants manager. Grantee will reimburse Subgrantee for eligible costs as outlined in the applicable USDHS Program Guidelines and Funding Opportunity Announcements. Sub-grantee must take possession of all purchased equipment and receive any grant-eligible service prior to seeking reimbursement from the grantee. Subgrantee must submit request for reimbursement within 60 days of payment of invoice.
- (4) Complete the procurement (s) process not later than February 28, 2015.
- (5) Provide quarterly progress reports to the NCEM Homeland Security grants manager as described in Attachment 2 by the following dates: 15 January, 15 April, 15 July, and 15 October.
- (6) Provide inventory list at project completion phase to the Homeland Security grants manager listing all equipment purchased through the grant.

- (7) Comply with the applicable federal statutes, regulations, policies, guidelines and requirements, reporting requirements and certifications as outlined in the applicable 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) and the USDHS Financial Management Guide and Special Conditions documents and FEMA Grant Programs Directorate Information Bulletins. As required in the FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) and FEMA Grant Programs Directorate Information Bulletin No. 388 dated July 18, 2012, subgrantee must report all grant-funded equipment that supports defined resource typed capabilities and all training that supports a defined resource typed team using the fields in the FY 2012 Grant-Funded Typed Resource Report. The link to this instrument and a completed example of this report as well as all options available in the drop-down boxes can be found on Attachment 3 of this document. This reporting will include both NIMS typed resources and State and local typed resources. The description and listing of NIMS typed resources can be found at: www.fema.gov/media-library/assets/documents/28973?id=6432 Sub-grantee will specify the number of resources, capability supported, whether it is a NIMS or State/local typed resource, the cost, and whether the resource sustains current capabilities or adds new capabilities. The resources should be reported only after equipment is delivered or after training has occurred and the corresponding grant funds have been expended. The Sub-grantee will include this Typed Resource Report with each cost report submitted for reimbursement.
- (8) Maintain grant management filing system as required in Attachment 4.
- (9) Retain all original records pertinent to this MOA for a period of five years following the date of the closure of the grant award, or audit if required, or longer where required by law. However, if litigation, claim or audit has been initiated prior to the expiration of the five-year period and extends beyond the five year period, the records shall be retained until all litigation, claims or audit findings involving the records have been resolved.
- (10) Comply with current federal suspension and debarment regulations pursuant to OMB Circular A-133 which states in pertinent part that "[e]ffective November 26, 2003, when a non-federal entity enters into a covered transaction with an entity at a lower tier, the non-federal entity must verify that the entity is not suspended or debarred or otherwise excluded. Sub-grantee shall be responsible to ensure that it has checked the federal Excluded Parties List System (EPLS) to verify that contractors or sub-recipients have not been suspended or debarred from doing business with the federal government."
- (11) Ensure that FY 2013 HSGP funds are not used to support the hiring of any personnel for the purposes of fulfilling traditional public safety duties or to supplant traditional public safety positions and responsibilities.

- (12) Non-supplanting Requirement. Federal grant funds will be used to supplement existing funds, and will not replace (supplant) funds that have been appropriated for the same purpose.
- (13) All materials publicizing or resulting from award activities shall contain this acknowledgement: "This project was supported by a Federal award from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Office of Grants and Training and the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management." Use of the federal program logo must be approved by DHS. Printed as a legend, either below or beside the logo shall be the words "100 percent Funded by U.S. Department of Homeland Security."
- (14) Sub-grantee shall order, receive, inspect, and stage the equipment and supplies. The purchase or acquisition of any additional materials, equipment, accessories or supplies beyond those identified in this MOA shall be the sole responsibility of Sub-grantee and shall not be reimbursed under this MOA. Sub-grantee shall prominently mark any equipment purchased with grant funding as follows: "Purchased with funds provided by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security."
- (15) Sub-grantee shall maintain an effective property management system that complies with the following requirements. Equipment is defined as tangible, non-expendable property having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more per unit. Sub-grantee may have property management guidelines that are more restrictive, requiring a unit of equipment with a value of less than \$5,000 to be inventoried; if so, such equipment purchased under this award allocation shall be included in the reports submitted to Grantee.
  - a) Grantee and Sub-grantee shall take a physical inventory of the equipment. The EM Sub-grantee Equipment Inventory Report, Cost Reports with backup documentation, Certificate of Title, Site Visit Report and any other Sub-grantee reports or inventory reports that include information regarding the grant, vendor, invoice number, cost per item, number of items, description, location, condition and identification number may be used to meet this requirement Sub-grantee must provide Quarterly Progress Reports until all funds are expended.
  - b) Sub-grantee must ensure adequate safeguards to prevent loss, damage or theft. Sub-grantee shall be responsible for replacing or repairing equipment which is willfully or negligently lost, stolen, damaged, or destroyed. Any loss, damage or theft of the property must be investigated and fully documented, and made part of the official project records.
  - c) Sub-grantee must ensure adequate maintenance procedures exist to keep the equipment in good condition.

- d) Disposition Procedures. Sub-grantee may dispose of the equipment when the original or replacement equipment acquired under the grant award is no longer needed for the original project or program. Items with a fair market value of less than \$5,000 may be retained, transferred or otherwise disposed of with prior approval of Grantee and in accordance with applicable program requirements. Items with a current per unit standard federal or fair market value in excess of \$5,000 may be retained, transferred or otherwise disposed of with prior Grantee approval in accordance with disposition requirements in 44 C.F.R. Part 13. Sub-grantee must provide documentation that includes the method used to determine current fair market value.
- (16) The purchase or acquisition of any additional materials, equipment, accessories or supplies, or the provision of any training or exercise beyond that identified in this MOA shall be the sole responsibility of Sub-grantee and shall not be reimbursed under this MOA.
- (17) No indirect or administrative costs will be charged to this allocation award.
- (18) Sub-grantees must utilize equipment as intended in the project proposal form /project detail workbook submitted to NCEM- HLS. Any variation from this intended use must be requested in writing and approved by NCEM- HLS office.
- VI. FUNDING AND COMPENSATION. Grantee will reimburse Sub-grantee for the actual eligible costs incurred for the subject of this grant, not to exceed One Hundred Ninety-nine Thousand, Two Hundred Twelve Dollars and Fifty-four cents, (\$199, 212.54). Funds will be provided by the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, and North Carolina Emergency Management. The allocation of funds will be from the USDHS FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program.

All terms and conditions of this MOA are dependent upon and subject to the allocation of funds from DHS, FEMA and Grantee for the purposes set forth and the MOA shall automatically terminate if funds cease to be available. Allowable costs shall be determined in accordance with the applicable U.S. Department of Homeland Security Program Guidelines, which include, but may not be limited to, the FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA), available at: http://www.fema.gov/pdf/government/grant/2013/fy13\_hsgp\_foa.pdf, 44 C.F.R. Part 13, 2 CFR Parts 215, 220, and 230, Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR) Part 31.2, OMB Circulars A-21, A-87, A-122 and A-133 and the U.S. DHS Financial Management Guide available at

http://www.dhs.gov/xlibrary/assets/Grants FinancialManagementGuide.pdf.

Allowable costs are also subject to the approval of the State Administrative Agent for the State of North Carolina, the Secretary of the Department of Public Safety.

- VII. WARRANTY. Sub-grantee shall hold Grantee harmless for any liability and personal injury that may occur from or in connection with the performance of this MOA to the extent permitted by the North Carolina Tort Claims Act. The parties agree that this Limitation of Liability shall not be construed as a waiver of sovereign immunity by either party. This Agreement does not give any person or entity other than the parties hereto any legal or equitable claim, right or remedy. This Agreement is intended for the sole and exclusive benefit of the parties hereto. This Agreement is not made for the benefit of any third person or persons. No third party may enforce any part of this Agreement or shall have any rights hereunder. This Agreement does not create, and shall not be construed as creating, any rights enforceable by any person not a party to this Agreement.
- VIII. PROPERTY. All property furnished under this agreement shall become the property of the Sub-grantee. The Sub-grantee shall be responsible for the custody and care of any property furnished for use in connection with the performance of this agreement. Grantee will not be held responsible for any equipment purchased by Sub-grantee.

#### IX. COMMUNICATIONS AND POINTS OF CONTACT

To provide consistent and effective communication between the Sub-grantee and the Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management, each party shall appoint a Principal Representative(s) to serve as its central point of contact responsible for coordinating and implementing this MOA. Grantee contacts shall be Michael A. Sprayberry, Director; Michael Daniska, Deputy Chief, Planning and Homeland Security Section and Patty Moyer, Grant Manager. The sub-grantee signatory shall be Gerald A. Jones, Jr., Mayor, Town of Morehead City and the point of contact shall be Wrenn Johnson, Chief, for Morehead City Police Department.

All confidential information of either party disclosed to the other party in connection

with the services provided hereunder will be treated by the receiving party as confidential and restricted in its use to only those uses contemplated by the terms of this MOA. Any information to be treated as confidential must be clearly marked as confidential prior to transmittal to the other party. Neither party shall disclose to third parties, the other party's confidential information without written authorization to do so from the other party. Specifically excluded from such confidential treatment shall be information that: (i) as of the date of disclosure and/or delivery, is already known to the party receiving such information; (ii) is or becomes part of the public domain through no fault of the receiving party; (iii) is lawfully disclosed to the receiving party by a third party who is not obligated to retain such information in confidence; or (iv) is independently developed at the receiving party by someone not privy to the confidential information. In accordance with the FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA), "FEMA recognizes that much of the information submitted in the course of applying for funding under this program, or provided in the course of its grant management activities, may be considered law enforcement sensitive or otherwise important to national security interests. While this information under Federal control is subject to requests made pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. §552 et. seq., all determinations concerning the release of information of this nature are made on a case-by-case basis by the FEMA FOIA Office. The Grantee and NCOI should be familiar with the regulations governing Sensitive Security Information (49 CFR Part 1520), as it may provide additional protection to certain classes of homeland security information."

- X. SUBCONTRACTING. If the Sub-grantee subcontracts any or all purchases required under this Agreement, Sub-grantee agrees to include in the subcontract that the subcontractor is bound by the terms and conditions of this MOA. Sub-grantee agrees to include in the subcontract that the subcontractor shall hold Grantee harmless against all claims of whatever nature arising out of the subcontractor's performance of work under this MOA. If Sub-grantee subcontracts, a copy of the executed subcontract agreement must be forwarded to the North Carolina Emergency Management. Contractual arrangement shall in no way relieve Sub-grantee of its responsibilities to ensure that all funds issued pursuant to this grant be administered in accordance with all state and federal requirements. Sub-grantee is bound by the terms, conditions and restrictions of the applicable USDHS Program Guidelines and Funding Opportunity Announcement referenced herein.
- XI. SITUS. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of North Carolina, and venue for any disputed matters or claims shall be in the Superior Court of Wake County, North Carolina.
- XII. ANTITRUST LAWS. This Agreement is entered into in compliance with all State and Federal antitrust laws.
- XIII. COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAW. Sub-grantee shall be wholly responsible for the purchases to be made under this MOA and for the supervision of its employees and assistants. Sub-grantee shall be responsible for compliance with all laws, ordinances, codes, rules, regulations, licensing requirements and other regulatory matters that are applicable to the conduct of its business and purchase requirements performed under this MOA, including those of federal requirements and State and local agencies having appropriate jurisdiction and found in the FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA).
- XIV. OTHER PROVISIONS/SEVERABILITY. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to conflict with current laws or regulations of the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety or Morehead City Police Department. If any term of this Agreement is found by any court or other legal authority, or is agreed by the parties to be in conflict with any law or regulation governing its subject, the conflicting term shall be considered null and void. The remaining terms and conditions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- XV. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement and any exhibits and amendments annexed hereto and any documents incorporated specifically by reference represent the entire agreement between the parties and supersede all prior oral and written statements or agreements.
- XVI. MODIFICATION. Modifications of this agreement must be in writing and upon approval of both parties except as modified by official USDHS Federal Grant Adjustment Notice (GAN).

XVII. TERMINATION. The terms of this agreement, as modified with the consent of all parties, will remain in effect until February 28, 2015. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other party.

Upon approval by USDHS, FEMA and the issuance of the Grant Adjustment Notice, if this MOA is extended, the termination date for the extension will be the date listed in the applicable USDHS Grant Adjustment Notice, incorporated by reference herein, or as established by the State Administrative Agency, whichever is sooner.

If Sub-grantee materially fails to comply with the terms of the award and DHS or Grantee suspends or terminates the grant award in accordance with 44 C.F.R., the applicable FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) and other applicable authorities, incorporated by reference herein, Sub-grantee shall reimburse the North Carolina Emergency Management for said property.

- XVIII. EXECUTION AND EFFECTIVE DATE. This Agreement will become binding upon execution of all parties to the Agreement. The terms of this Agreement became effective on September 1, 2013. The last signature shall be that of Frank L. Perry, Secretary, and North Carolina Department of Public Safety.
- XIX. TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall be in effect from September 1, 2013 to February 28, 2015.

#### LEASE RENEWAL

THIS LEASE RENEWAL is made and entered into this 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2015 by and between the COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND (hereinafter referred to as "Landlord") and ALLIANCE BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE (hereinafter referred to as "Tenant").

#### WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, the Landlord and Tenant entered into a Lease Agreement dated July 1, 2014, for the lease of space at 711 Executive Place, Fayetteville, North Carolina, (hereinafter the "Original Lease Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Landlord and Tenant desire to amend the Original Lease Agreement, while keeping in effect all terms and conditions of the Original Lease Agreement not inconsistent with the terms and conditions set forth below.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration for the mutual covenants and agreements made herein, the parties agree to renew and amend the Original Lease Agreement as follows:

#### BACKGROUND

Effective July 1, 2015 the county assumed the administrative and fiscal oversight of the Workforce Development Program due to the changes in the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). As such, three employees were transferred from Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC) to the county on July 1.

Under the provisions of the Cumberland County Personnel Ordinance these employees would be considered new employees since they have not worked for the county within the last three years. In the prior transfer to FTCC, a Memorandum of Agreement was developed to address unique provisions related to the transfer of personnel. Specifically, the county asked FTCC to accept the transfer of up to 40 hours of annual leave. The assumption in this current transfer has been that the county would respond in a like manner and accept up to 40 hours of annual leave upon the transfer back to the county, which I believe is appropriate and fair under the circumstances in this situation. This will not be an expense to the county since federal funds are available to fund the leave.

Since our Personnel Ordinance does not provide approval for transfer of annual leave for new employees, I am respectfully requesting the Board to ratify my decision to honor the same annual leave transfer provision we requested of FTCC. This is a very unique situation and I think it is reasonable to expect that generally, the same provisions in the former transfer would be applicable in this current transfer.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Ratify approval of the transfer of up to 40 hours of annual leave for three employees that transferred to the County effective July 1, 2015, based upon a similar provision in the previous transfer.





Achievements in his/her field: At age 85, Gilbert "Gip" Smith continues to farm along River Road where his family moved in 1937. The 10<sup>th</sup> of 11 children, Mr. Smith was born in Sampson County and recalls one of his first farm duties was pumping water for the mules at age 6. Mr. Smith was 20 years old when his father, S.O. Smith Sr., died, leaving his youngest son to run the farm operation and bring in his first crop without his father's guidance. After serving two years in the U.S. Army, he returned to the family farm along River Road in 1955 and never left. "I decided then I was going to be a farmer and be a good one," he said. Over six decades, he has grown tobacco, soybeans, corn, wheat and other row crops on his properties in Cumberland, Duplin and Sampson counties and raised hogs and cows. He partnered with his brother Woodrow on farms in Duplin and Sampson counties and with his brother John on row crops in Cumberland County. John Smith was inducted into the Cumberland County Agriculture Hall of Fame in 2002. Gilbert Smith started in the cattle business by feeding 40 to 50 head at his barn and then expanded the "M.G. Smith Farms" operation in 1970 when he built a feedlot on River Road that would hold up to 400 beef cattle. The feedlot business thrived and "M.G. Smith Farms" cows were shipped to packing companies in North Carolina, Alabama, Georgia, Florida and beyond. During this time, he was also farming approximately 1,200 acres. Over the years, Mr. Smith has downsized, but he continues to have a few cows and grows soybeans, wheat, hay and corn. He still owns the 1966 Chevrolet truck he first used to ship cattle and haul grain, and you will find the vehicle parked under the barn built by his father in 1937. Today, Mr. Smith is not slowing down and he embodies the strong work ethic modeled by his father, brothers and others, including Mr. Oscar McLean, a River Road neighbor who lived to be 103 and taught a young Gip Smith much about farming and life. Mr. Smith still enjoys driving his tractors in the fields he has farmed for 60 years and working on his backhoe, especially on his most recent project -- the clearing of a farm he purchased in 2013 along Beard Road.

The obligations of the End User, including its obligation to pay H-GAC's contractor for all costs incurred under this Contract prior to such notice shall survive such cancellation, as well as any other obligation incurred under this Contract, until performed or discharged by the End User.

#### ARTICLE 9: SEVERABILITY

All parties agree that should any provision of this Contract be determined to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect any other term of this Contract, which shall continue in full force and effect.

#### ARTICLE 10: FORCE MAJEURE

To the extent that either party to this Contract shall be wholly or partially prevented from the performance within the term specified of any obligation or duty placed on such party by reason of or through strikes, stoppage of labor, riot, fire, flood, acts of war, insurrection, accident, order of any court, act of God, or specific cause reasonably beyond the party's control and not attributable to its neglect or nonfeasance, in such event, the time for the performance of such obligation or duty shall be suspended until such disability to perform is removed; provided, however, force majeure shall not excuse an obligation solely to pay funds. Determination of force majeure shall rest solely with H-GAC.

I shall be responsible for the full cost of the investigation, however, and will pay such costs as billed by my Attorneys whether the case is accepted or not.

I agree to pay all necessary costs of processing the claim, including, without limitation, filing fees, discovery costs, service of process, court costs and travel, telephone and postage. From time to time I understand that Attorneys may advance costs on my behalf. Any such costs not previously paid by me are to be deducted from my share of any recovery; however, I understand that costs and expenses must be paid in full whether or not there is any recovery. I will pay these costs as taxed by the court and/or billed by Attorneys.

I understand that I will receive itemized billing statements approximately for (1) all costs advanced on my behalf and/or (2) Attorneys' services rendered on an hourly rate basis under (E) and (F) above and/or (3) Attorneys' services rendered on a flat fee basis under (G) above. In the event that I have paid a retainer described in (A) above which is to be credited to the bill for services rendered in this matter, I understand that the billing statement will reflect the deduction from the retainer. I agree to pay said balance shown on the billing statement within twenty (20) days of invoice date. If any billing statements are not paid promptly, I shall allow my Attorneys to discontinue their services on my behalf. Additionally, if any billing statements remain unpaid for a period of sixty (60) days or more, my Attorneys shall be authorized to formally withdraw from representing me and may collect any unpaid balance on such statements as provided by law. I further agree that my Attorneys have the right to charge an annual interest rate of eighteen percent (18%) or one and one-half percent (1 1222) per month on all balances owed by over ninety (90)

days.

I further understand that I will be billed a <u>minimum</u> of twelve (12) minutes for all conversations with my Attorneys, whether personal or by telephone, regardless of who initiates the call or conversation. Any telephone conversation initiated by me after normal business hours, on weekends or during legal holidays shall be billed at a <u>minimum</u> for thirty (30) minutes. I further understand that I will be billed a <u>minimum</u> of twelve (12) minutes for all correspondence from my Attorney in connection with my case.

I further authorize and direct my Attorneys to pay any outstanding medical bills, charges, claims and liens, including claims of health care plans and insurers, as required by law, and incurred as a result of the above incident out of any recovery obtained on my behalf

I further understand that I may terminate the services of my Attorneys at any time, but that such termination will not relieve me of my obligation to pay them outstanding balance owed upon their hourly services computed to the date of such termination. Additionally, if this agreement provides for a contingency fee agreement pursuant to paragraphs (B), (C) or (D) above, and I terminate the services of my Attorneys at any time prior to settlement, then I agree to pay said Attorneys \$300.00 per hour for all attorney services rendered in this matter and \$135.00 per hour for all paralegal services rendered in this matter.

I further understand that in the event another person agrees or is ordered by the court to pay all or a portion of the fees due my Attorneys in this mater, I must nevertheless pay the fees due, but my account shall be credited in the amount which is in fact paid by such other personnel when actually received by my Attorneys.

I further understand that unless specified above, my Attorneys shall not be required to pursue any appeal in the representation without specific further agreement as to the fee nor shall they be required to provide further services at the conclusion of the case without further agreement as to fees whether such services relate to the enforcement or modification of the order or judgment obtained in my case.

I hereby grant my Attorneys all power and authority to represent me in any court pursuant to G.S. §84-11.

I further agree that associate counsel may be employed at the discretion and expense of my Attorneys and that any attorney so employed may be designated to appear on my behalf or undertake me representation in this matter.

I further understand that my Attorneys will return all telephone calls as soon as practicable and that I will leave a full and explicit message for my Attorneys with their office which I agree may be responded to by a secretary without any charge, as such time has been factored into the hourly rate charged in my case.

No settlement of the matter shall be made without my consent. Following their investigation, if my Attorneys conclude that no action should be brought, they will have no further responsibility to me in this matter and will be discharged from further representation.

I understand that it is imperative that I keep Attorneys informed as to any change in address during the period of this contract. Should I fail to do so, Attorneys may at their option with twenty-one (21) days prior written notice to me, withdraw from any responsibility from the handling of my case by giving me notice by certified mail to my address as listed below or the last known address that I may have in writing provided to Attorneys.

I acknowledge that NO GUARANTEE of any results, recovery or outcome has been made to me by my Attorneys. Attorneys do agree to use their best professional judgment in handling my case and advising me in regard to what actions I am to take.

CODE REGARDING WEAPONS POSTING (SECOND READING)

### **BACKGROUND:**

A man has entered the Historic Courthouse carrying an open carry firearm. Someone also emailed library personnel stating that the posting on its website prohibiting "carrying weapons of any kind" is unlawful and enforceable as North Carolina law preempts county rules over the carrying of handguns.

The ordinance Cumberland County has on this issue is section (a) of 9.5-101 which states,

Concealed weapon posting. (a) *Posting of signs required*. The county manager is hereby ordered to post appropriate signage on each park, building or portion of a building now or hereafter owned, leased as lessee, operated, occupied, managed or controlled by Cumberland County, as well as the appurtenant premises to such buildings, indicating that concealed handguns are prohibited therein.

(Sections (b) through (c) of this ordinance provide exceptions for law enforcement officers and others, but these subsections are not specifically relevant to this issue)

### **Open Carry**

N.C.G.S. § 153A-129 allows a county, by ordinance, to regulate the display of firearms on public property. N.C.G.S. §14-409.40(f) allows a county to prohibit the possession of firearms in public-owned buildings, their grounds, and parking areas with the exception that firearms may be stored in vehicles while on the above-described property. These are the relevant statutes to apply to "open carry" of firearms.

Cumberland County's ordinance cited above prohibiting weapons specifically references "concealed handguns", so it does not apply to open carry. The ordinance must be revised or a new ordinance passed to prohibit the open carry of firearms on county property under the statutory authority.

### **Concealed Carry**

It is unlawful for a person to willfully or intentionally carry a concealed pistol or gun, unless the weapon is a handgun and the person has a concealed handgun permit (there are other exceptions not relevant to this discussion). N.C.G.S. ¶ 14-269. Any person with a concealed handgun permit may carry a concealed handgun unless otherwise specifically prohibited by law. N.C.G.S. ¶ 14-415.11 (N.C.G.S. ¶ 14-415.11(c) lists specific exceptions where handguns are not allowed even with a permit to include, schools, courthouses, law enforcement facilities, and venues where alcohol is sold or admission is charged).

N.C.G.S 14-415.23 states that "A unit of local government may adopt an ordinance to permit the posting of a prohibition against carrying a concealed handgun, in accordance with G.S. 14-415.11(c), on local government buildings and their appurtenant premises. Further, N.C.G.S. 14-415.23(b) provides that a county may adopt an ordinance to prohibit, by posting, the carrying of a concealed handgun on county recreational facilities. N.C.G.S. 14-415.23(c) provides that the term "recreational facilities" includes athletic fields, swimming pools, athletic event facilities, and the appurtenant facilities of these examples. The statute states that "recreational facilities" does not include any greenway or biking/walking path or any other area not specifically described therein. Therefore, it seems that a county may not ban concealed carry handguns in county owned parks. This is further supported because concealed handguns are specifically permitted in state parks in N.C.G.S. 14-415.11(c1).)

Based on these "concealed carry" statutes, a county may prohibit the concealed carry of firearms in county buildings and their appurtenant premises as well as recreational facilities. The current Cumberland County ordinance on concealed weapon posting appears consistent with the statutory authority other than it allowing the posting to prohibit handguns in parks.

The ordinance may be revised with language as follows to be consistent with the statutory authority to prohibit handguns (both concealed and open carry) on county property:

#### Sec. 9.5-101. – Concealed Weapon posting.

(a) Posting of signs required. The county manager is hereby ordered to post appropriate signage on each park, recreational facility, building or portion of a building now or hereafter owned, leased as lessee, operated, occupied, managed or controlled by Cumberland County, as well as the appurtenant premises to such buildings, indicating that weapons, including concealed handguns and open carry handguns are prohibited therein.

### **RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:**

The revisions were approved by the Policy Committee at its June 4, 2015, meeting and at the June 15, 2015 meeting of the Board of Commissioners (not unanimous - second reading required).

# STEPPING UP INITIATIVE TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE WITH MENTAL ILLNESSES IN JAILS

WHEREAS, counties routinely provide treatment services to the estimated 2 million people with serious mental illnesses booked into jails each year; and

WHEREAS, prevalence rates of serious mental illnesses in confinement facilities are three to six times higher than for the general population, with statistics showing that almost 13% of North Carolina's prison population requires some type of intervention due to mental health issues; and

WHEREAS, almost three-quarters of adults with serious mental illnesses in jails have co-occurring substance use disorders; and

WHEREAS, adults with mental illnesses tend to stay longer in jail and upon release are at a higher risk of recidivism than people without these disorders; and

WHEREAS, county jails spend two to three times more on adults with mental illnesses that require interventions compared to those without these treatment needs; and

WHEREAS, without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental illnesses can continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these individuals, their families, and their communities; and

WHEREAS, county jails are generally an unsafe environment for those with mental health treatment needs; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners has undertaken a serious effort to address the local service needs of those with mental illnesses through the appointment of a special Task Force; and

WHEREAS, Cumberland County, like all counties, takes pride in our responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare and safety of our residents in efficient, safe, and socially just ways; and

WHEREAS, through the Stepping Up Initiative, the National Association of Counties, the Council of State Governments Justice Center and the American Psychiatric Foundation are encouraging counties to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in county jails.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, by the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners.

 That the Board of Commissioners does hereby sign on to the Call to Action to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in our county jail and commits to sharing lessons learned with other counties in North Carolina and across the country to support the Stepping Up Initiative; and


- 2. That the Board of Commissioners will utilize resources available through the Stepping Up Initiative and other resources provided by the Council of State Governments Justice Center to convene a diverse team of leaders and decision makers from multiple agencies who are committed to safely reducing the number of people with mental illnesses in jails, and
- 3. That this team will utilize the comprehensive resources available through the Stepping Up Initiative to develop a plan to reduce the number of people with mental illness in the county jail for 2016-2020, consistent with the Council of State Governments Justice Center report and recommendations.
