## BACKGROUND

The Workforce Development Program has undergone significant changes in the last few years. In FY2012, the Workforce Development Program was transitioned to Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC). With that transition, the WFD Board and its members have taken a more active role, providing guidance, direction and advocacy to the program. Last year, the program went through yet another major transition as Senate Bill 73 required that the Summer Youth and Dislocated Worker Programs be bid through an RFP process. The Summer Youth Program was transitioned to Cumberland County Schools and the Dislocated Worker Program was transitioned to ResCare, a private provider.

The latest development is the new Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) which is effective July 1, 2015. This new law includes a provision that allows direct contracts for class size training, instead of individualized training contracts.

Since FTCC still serves as the fiscal agent for the Workforce Development function, they would not be eligible to receive these class-sized training dollars. This new option under the WIOA perfectly matches the community college's core mission of providing workforce skills training. Therefore, it will be necessary for another entity to assume the responsibility for the Workforce Development Program.

FTCC has approached the county regarding the assumption of these administrative responsibilities, which will include contract and fiscal oversight, transition of five administrative personnel to the county, and coordination of WFD board activities. The staff will remain in the building with the Employment Security Commission and this transition should not provide any disruption to service delivery.

This item was presented to the Finance Committee on February 5, 2015. The committee unanimously approved the request to transfer the Workforce Development administrative and fiscal functions to the county.

## RECOMMENDATION

Direct the County Manager and County Attorney to work with the Community College in transferring the administrative and fiscal oversight to the county as well as the five employees which are directly responsible for these functions.

**Background:** A Budget Revision for FY 2014-15 for 17 new child welfare positions has been submitted to County Management. According to North Carolina state law and policy, local DSS agencies are required to maintain the following in the child welfare program: a caseload of 10 families per social worker and a staffing ratio of one supervisor to five social workers. With demand increasing for child protective services many county DSS agencies across the state including Cumberland County exceed the mandatory caseload and staffing ratios.

This budget revision is based on new state recurring revenues, some of which legislatively mandates us to create positions to reduce caseloads in child welfare services. See attached copy of the letter from North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services outlining this mandate. Cumberland County was one of thirty counties to receive additional funds based on the state's recognition of our staffing deficiency.

Our agency is experiencing steady increase in the need for child protective services in our community which has resulted in more children in foster care. We have, in fact, experienced an increase of 38% in number of children in foster care in the past two years. An increased number of juvenile delinquents placed in DSS custody by our court system have placed additional strain on our system and workforce. Any increase in social work positions will also require additional leadership and supervisory support to address the staffing ratio.

Please see the attached justification for 17 new child welfare positions:

 Nine new Social Worker III positions would enhance the capacity of foster care staff to expedite reunification, adoptions and guardianship efforts and increase our capacity to conduct state required internal quality assurance reviews of the federally mandated outcomes.

We stand united to strengthen individuals and families and to protect children and vulnerable adults...

 Four new Social Work Supervisors, three new Program Managers and one new Social Work Program Administrator position would distribute the workload of management and enhance program oversight of our Children's Services Section which will increase from 216 to 233 employees.

On February 5, 2015 this budget revision was submitted to the Finance Committee who voted to support this recommended budget revision.

<u>Proposed Action</u>: Considering the time sensitive nature of this state mandate, the need to improve critical child welfare services and our efforts to expedite some reductions in staff caseloads, we respectfully request your approval of this budget revision.

## **BACKGROUND**

In October 2008 Cumberland County established a Public Safety Task Force to conduct a comprehensive review of the public safety system. The focus of this task force was fire service, communications, and EMS. The task force presented its recommendations in February 2010. One of the recommendations made was the following – "For communications, immediately establish plans and standardized protocol for an all-encompassing combined communications center and a Consolidated Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), supporting all public safety agencies, to improve response times and increase responder safety".

Further studies were performed to determine the compatibility of PSAP staff positions and the ease with which positions could be consolidated. At that time, the personnel expense to the County was an obstacle to consolidation.

Recently, however, the City of Fayetteville invited the County to participate in a discussion regarding the feasibility of either co-locating or consolidating county and city emergency call centers. Mission Critical Partners, a public safety consultation firm, was also invited to participate in that discussion.

There is a desire by the NC 911 Board that PSAPs move toward a regional approach as opposed to call center redundancy in a geographic area. This desire is evidenced by the grant opportunities available through the NC 911 Board. These grants are typically awarded on an annual basis and target consolidation and regional initiatives. One of the key unknown aspects of these grants is how long they will remain available to PSAPs.

Since it was believed grant funding was available for feasibility studies, Mission Critical Partners (MCP) was asked to present a proposal for conducting a feasibility study. MCP submitted that proposal to the City of Fayetteville in the fall. The total cost for the study is \$81,000. Subsequently, it was discovered that grant funds are not available for studies.

The feasibility study proposed appears to be extensive in scope including co-location / consolidation requirements for: technology /equipment, operations/staffing, governance/cost sharing, facility needs assessment, and potential site(s) for co-location or consolidation. The time needed to complete the study is dependent upon the availability of the city and county stakeholders as well as others. Since the timeline is dependent upon the participation of so many and since that participation cannot be controlled by a single person or entity, it would appear prudent to begin the study as soon as possible in order to be fully prepared for the next NC 911 Board grant cycle in the spring of 2016.

## RECOMMENDATION

Finance Committee recommends re-directing funds in the amount of \$45,000 in order to jointly participate in a co-location / consolidation feasibility study with the City of Fayetteville. The Finance Committee further recommends the Committee ask the City of Fayetteville to proceed with securing the appropriate consultant for the study and beginning the study in the current fiscal year.

In addition to the above information, the Planning and Inspections Staff also recommends the board approve Case No. P15-08 for R20 Residential district based on the following:

- The R20 Residential district will allow for land uses and lot sizes that exist in the general area; and
- Public water is available to serve this site.

There are no other districts considered suitable for this request.

There were people present to speak in favor and in opposition.

Mr. John Culbreth spoke in favor. Mr. Culbreth stated that the subject property will have lots larger than the Castlebrook Subdivision, the plan is to have this development tie into Linden water, so each lot will be on the community water system. Mr. George Rose designed the subdivision and he was able to get twenty five lots in there. Mr. Culbreth also said that the Department of Transportation (DOT) has approved the street design, and he met with the Town Board of Linden and they felt this would be an asset to the community.

Mr. Morris asked Mr. Culbreth if the dam is still drained.

Mr. Culbreth stated that the dam had been rebuilt and will be put back together in the spring and the pond will be built back up.

Mr. Morris asked Mr. Culbreth if anything occurred to the wetlands with the occurrence of the dam breaks.

Mr. Culbreth said that there were some soils that went downstream, Dam Safety came in and said that what kept it from completely failing was the fact that it was paved and the water went across and eroded the back part of the dam. Mr. Culbreth said they built the dam back to its original height but only half as wide.

Mr. Ernest Smith spoke in favor. Mr. Smith stated that he had no objections to the rezoning request; his main thing is that he would like to tap into water if it is available.

Jamie Bowden spoke in opposition. Mr. Bowden stated that he was speaking for about one hundred homeowners who signed a petition requesting the rezoning be to R40 instead of R20, and presented the petition to the Board. Mr. Bowden stated that some of the concerns are with soils, wetlands, and the size of the lots. They also have concerns with water.

Ms. Sandra K. Bowden-Johnson spoke in opposition. Ms. Johnson stated that her property backs up to the subject property, and didn't want anything back there. She stated that she also signed the petition and agrees that the rezoning should be to R40. She also has concerns with water and security.

Mr. Morris asked Mr. Culbreth if the subject property were rezoned to R40 would he still extend the water.

Mr. Culbreth said no, they would do individual wells; the layout is based on an R20 design, so he is requesting R20 because that's what they need.

Mr. McLaurin reminded the board that they could only be concerned with the rezoning, not the number of lots.




Mrs. Wheatley said that R40 has been discussed in the past and it has been palatable in this community.



Proposed Economic Development Incentives for Sanderson Farms, Inc.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Board of Commissioners conducted a joint public hearing with the Fayetteville City Council February 2, 2015, to receive public comment on proposed economic development incentives for Sanderson Farms, Inc. The joint public hearing was advertised in the *Fayetteville Observer* January 23, 2015. The publisher's affidavit for the advertisement is attached.

The basic terms of the economic development incentives agreement proposed by the County and advertised for the public hearing are as follows:

# The Company's Obligations:

Sanderson Farms, Inc., (the Company) will spend at least \$95 million to construct and equip a modern poultry-processing plant in the County's Cedar Creek Industrial Park in the City of Fayetteville (the Project). The Project will employ at least 975 employees within three years of commencing operations. Not less than sixty percent (60%) of the Company's employees at this site will be residents of Cumberland County. The Company will not contract with any producer for the production of chickens on sites located within ten miles of the Project or within one mile of the Cape Fear River in Cumberland County. The Company will inform the county and city managers of any Notices of Violation it receives from DENR for any of its operations in Cumberland County.

### The County's Obligations:

As economic development incentives for the Company to undertake this Project, the County will sell to the Company the land in the Cedar Creek Industrial Park that the Company identifies for the Project at its fair market value subject to the upset bid process and grant the company a cash incentive equivalent to 50% of County general property taxes paid by the Company on the assessed value of the improvements constructed on the real property and the personal property and equipment used therein

for each of the first nine years that the Project complies with all the terms of the agreement. The estimated total value of these cash incentive payments is \$2.5 million.

Note that the County is proposing to sell the land in the Cedar Creek Industrial Park to the Company that the Company identifies it needs for this project. The proposal is to sell the land at fair market value subject to the upset bid process. The Company has not identified any specific property for the project; however; based on discussions with Russ Rogerson as to what he understood the Company's choice to be, the County obtained appraisals of three of the four parcels in the park in September, 2014. Of the two larger parcels, no value was placed on the portion of the property within the 100-year flood plains. That may significantly impact the value placed on those parcels. The zoning of the smallest parcel was incorrectly identified in the appraisal, resulting in its appraisal with residential use being the highest and best use. Under the zoning in place, that parcel cannot be used for residential development. That may significantly impact the value placed on that parcel.

There are also certain conditions or matters existing on or applicable to the real property which were not addressed in the appraisals and which may impact the value. These conditions and matters must also be addressed in the incentives agreement.

The City of Fayetteville has proposed different economic development incentives for the Project. The proposals of the County and City are consistent with the interlocal agreement for the annexation of the Cedar Creek Industrial Park in 2013.

#### RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

The county attorney makes the following recommendations:

#### § 58-84-30. Trustees appointed; organization.

For each county, town or city complying with and deriving benefits from the provisions of this Article, there shall be appointed a local board of trustees, known as the trustees of the local Firefighters' Relief Fund, to be composed of five members, two of whom shall be elected by the members of the local fire department who are qualified as beneficiaries of such fund, two of whom shall be elected by the mayor and board of aldermen or other local governing body, and one of whom shall be named by the Commissioner of Insurance. Their selection and term of office shall be as follows:

- (1) The members of the fire department shall hold an election each January to elect their representatives to above board. In January 1950, the firefighters shall elect one member to serve for two years and one member to serve for one year, then each year in January thereafter, they shall elect only one member and his term of office shall be for two years. Members elected pursuant to this section shall be either (i) residents of the fire district or (ii) active or retired members of the fire department.
- (2) The mayor and board of aldermen or other local governing body shall appoint, in January 1950, two representatives to above board, one to hold office for two years and one to hold office for one year, and each year in January thereafter they shall appoint only one representative and his term of office shall be for two years. Members appointed pursuant to this section shall be residents of the fire district.
- (3) The Commissioner of Insurance shall appoint one representative to serve as trustee and he shall serve at the pleasure of the Commissioner. The member appointed pursuant to this section shall be either (i) a resident of the fire district or (ii) an active or retired member of the fire department.

All of the above trustees shall hold office for their elected or appointed time, or until their successors are elected or appointed, and shall serve without pay for their services. They shall immediately after election and appointment organize by electing from their members a chairman and a secretary and treasurer, which two last positions may be held by the same person. The treasurer of said board of trustees shall give a good and sufficient surety bond in a sum equal to the amount of moneys in his hand, to be approved by the Commissioner of Insurance. The cost of this bond may be deducted by the Insurance Commissioner from the receipts collected pursuant to G.S. 58-84-10 before distribution is made to local relief funds. If the chief or chiefs of the local fire departments are not named on the board of trustees as above provided, then they shall serve as ex officio members without privilege of voting on matters before the board. #### BACKGROUND

In the fall of 2014, staff from the Engineering and Infrastructure Department was contacted by a representative from the Kansas City Sausage Company, LLC about the possibility of connecting to the NORCRES sewer system. This is the former Martin's Abattoir and Wholesale Meats located in Sampson County just across the Cumberland County line off of Highway 13 (see attached map). This meat processing plant had been in operation for over 50 years up until it closed in 2014. Kansas City Sausage Company would like to reopen this plant by December of 2015. Upon receiving this request, a meeting was held with the NORCRESS Advisory Board to inform them of the request that had been made and to seek their thoughts on the possible connection. After much discussion, it was determined that Kansas City Sausage Company should be directed to complete a feasibility study of this proposed connection and how it would impact the NORCRESS sewer system.

Kansas City Sausage Company, LLC acquired the services of Hobbs Upchurch Associates out of Southern Pines, NC to complete a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) to determine the impact that their proposed connection would have on the NORCRESS system. This PER document has been completed and submitted to the County staff for review. A copy of this report has been attached for your review with the exceptions of appendixes C-E which were County documents that the engineer included within the report. The PER document has been sent to PWC for review and approval as well. PWC will set the wastewater concentrations that Kansas City Sausage Company is allowed to discharge into the system and permit the facility as an industrial user if they are authorized to connect to the NORCRESS sewer system by the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners.

This request was presented to the Facilities Committee on February 5<sup>th</sup> and the Committee unanimously directed staff to continue working to formalize an agreement between Kansas City Sausage Company and Cumberland County that would allow a sewer connection to the NORCRESS System.

#### RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

The Engineering and Infrastructure Director, County Management and the Facilities Committee recommend that the NORCRESS Governing Board direct County staff to move forward with attempting to formalize an agreement between Cumberland County and Kansas City Sausage Company that would allow a sewer connection to the NORCRESS System. If an agreement can be reached, then this item will be brought back to the Facilities Committee and the NORCRESS Governing Board at a later date for approval.

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#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to evaluate the feasibility of providing sanitary sewer service to the old Martin's Abattoir and Wholesale Meats facility. The facility is located on approximately 75.5 acres at the intersection of NC Highway 13 (Fayetteville Highway) and Martin Road in Sampson County, near the Cumberland County border at South River. A map of the property is shown as Figure 1 in Appendix A.

The facility was engaged in the slaughter of bovine cattle to provide meat to other processing facilities to be ground into hamburger for fast food restaurant usage. A reliable, consistent supply of cattle within a reasonable distance to the facility became increasingly more difficult to secure, and the facility closed its slaughtering operations resulting in the loss of approximately 150 jobs to the local community. Processing and rendering of animal by-products from dead stock and other processing facilities has continued with a minimal reduced staff of approximately 22 employees.

An agreement was reached for the sale of the facility to Kansas City Sausage Company, LLC in partnership with Smithfield Foods. The new ownership has continued the rendering operations and desires to resume slaughtering operations, using swine in lieu of bovine cattle. The resumption of slaughtering operations would mean that 100 to 125 of the jobs lost to the closing of the previous slaughtering operation would be reclaimed, resulting in an economic stimulus to the immediate area. As part of the process of resuming slaughtering operations, Kansas City Sausage Company wishes to discontinue land application of their wastewater effluent and construct the necessary infrastructure to convey discharge to the public sewer system. The closest available publicly owned sewer system is owned by Cumberland County, NC and operated and maintained by the Fayetteville Public Works Commission (PWC). This system is the North Cumberland Regional Sewer System (NORCRESS), which incorporates facilities in the towns of Falcon, Godwin and Wade.

#### 2.0 EXISTING FACILITIES

#### 2.1 Martin Facility

The current Martin facility is served by a system of wastewater lagoons and a holding pond prior to land discharge by spray irrigation. The first lagoon has a volume of 586,000 gallons. The second lagoon has a volume of 1,675,000 gallons. Each lagoon is approximately 10-feet deep. The second lagoon discharges to a storage lagoon with a volume of approximately 2.9 million gallons. Effluent from this lagoon is land applied to an adjacent spray field. The current discharge from the facility is approximately 20,000 gallons per day. The first two lagoons are clay lined and are equipped with mechanical aerators. Basin No. 1 is equipped with four mechanical floating aerators and Basin No. 2 has two floating aerators. Wastewater is land applied within the requirements of the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources (NCDENR) under a Non-Discharge Permit number WQ0007240. The current permit allows for the land application of 110,000 gallons per day on roughly 76.4 acres. Permitted discharge rates vary, as there are 14 discharge zones for spray irrigation. The rate varies from 1/3 inch per week to 1-inch per week.

#### 2.2 NORCRESS System

As previously mentioned, the NORCRESS system consists of infrastructure to serve the Towns of Falcon, Godwin and Wade, N. C., and is permitted for a discharge of up to 400,000 gallons per day to the PWC wastewater facility for treatment. The system was constructed and put into operation in 2005. The capacities of the existing system downstream of the proposed tie-in must be evaluated in order to determine that there is adequate capacity to accept the additional flow proposed by the Kansas City Sausage operations. The NORCRESS system is permitted to discharge a maximum of 400,000 gallons per day to PWC for treatment. Flows are primarily domestic in nature and are a combination of residential and commercial flows. Flow meter readings for the Wade #2 Pump Station are shown on the following table:

There are a total of 614 taps installed. Of the installed taps, 369 are connected to the system, while the remaining 245 taps are not connected, but capacity must be reserved.

Of the 369 taps that are connected, 18 taps generate a higher flow than typical residential or commercial taps. The largest of these is for Martin's Meats.. Based on billing records for 2014, it was determined that the Average Daily Flow from Martin's Meats is 40,552 gallons per day.

The next largest user is the Falcon Children's Home, which discharges wastewater through 15 separate taps. Billing records were provided from Cumberland County, documenting an average daily flow from Falcon Children's Home of 7,181 gallons per day for the calendar year 2014.

The remaining "bulk" users are two schools with one tap each. Again, billing records were provided by Cumberland County for calendar year 2014. Eastover Central School discharged an average of 1,107 gallons per day and District 7 School discharged 1,159 gallons per day.

Based on flow meter readings at the Wade #2 Pump Station, the highest recorded flow to PWC was 146,226 gallons per day on average, occurring in May, 2014. The Average Daily Flow for 2014 was 132,820 gallons per day. The "bulk users" documented above contribute a total of 49,999 gallons per day through 18 taps. The remaining 82,821 gallons per day can be considered the Average Daily Flow generated from a "standard" or "typical" tap. Based on this information, the Average Daily Flow from a typical tap in the NORCRESS system is 236 gallons per day.

It is necessary to calculate the total flow that has been committed to in the NORCRESS system. On average, 132,820 gallons per day are being discharged, including high flow users from 369 taps. Falcon Children's Home has requested connection of their final tap and it is projected that this tap will generate 3,640 gallons per day. The flow has been committed to the remaining 244 taps can be projected to be 57,584 gallons per day, based on the 236 gallons per day per tap calculated above. From this information, the NORCRESS system needs 194,044 gallons per day to honor flow commitments already made.

The total design flow to the Falcon pump station is 70,000 gallons per day. The Falcon pump station is rated for a discharge of 350 gallons per minute. Actual pumping tests have documented the pumps capable of delivering up to 376 gallons per minute. The Falcon pump station, known as Lift Station #92 in the PWC system is discharging approximately 68,000 gallons per day. This information comes from an analysis of the Falcon Pump Station by Marziano and McGougan, P.A. dated 9/19/2012. The flows were documented during a five week period prior to June 1, 2012. The complete report of the Falcon Pump Station Investigation is included as Appendix E. Based on existing commitments, combined with existing flows, the projected flow to the Falcon Pump Station would be 87,924 gallons per day.

The Marziano and McGougan investigation documents several issues surrounding the operation

of the pump station, mainly resulting from low influent flow with respect to pump station capacity. Problems that have been documented in the system include solids being deposited in the force main due to insufficient velocity, excessive detention times, which result in anaerobic conditions which lead to odor problems and corrosion, and uncharacteristic pressure and pump rate variations, thought to be associated with inadequate flows, which could possibly lead to premature wear and/or failure of pumps due to operation outside of their designed range. A chemical feed system has been installed to diminish problems with odor. Additional air release and vacuum breaker valves have been installed to address abnormal pressure readings and pumping rates. The pumps were reconfigured to run in series, hoping to increase the pumping rate to a point closer to the intended design. This reconfiguration eliminates the redundancy required in the design of pump stations that insure the ability to continue operation in the event of a pump failure. The addition of the air/vacuum valves and reconfiguration of the pumps has given mixed results with respect to solving problems associated with the station.

#### 3.0 PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

#### 3.1 Proposed Wastewater Flows and Loadings

It is anticipated that once slaughter operations have resumed, the facility will process between 700 and 1,000 head of swine per day. The wastewater flows from the resumed operations are projected to total 200,000 gallons per day once the facility is operating on a steady schedule. Characteristics of the proposed wastewater are expected to be as follows:

#### 3.2 Proposed Infrastructure Improvements

It is proposed that a new pump station and force main be constructed to convey effluent to the North Cumberland Regional Sewer System (NORCRESS). Final approval for this connection will need to be obtained from the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners. The proposed pump station would be constructed at the base of the dike of the secondary aeration basin. This pump station would be capable of a discharge of 320 gallons per minute. The station would

consist of duplex submersible pumps in a 8-foot diameter wetwell, which should be approximately 15 to 18 feet deep. Each pump would be driven by electric motors in the 25 to 30 horsepower range. Three phase 230 or 460 volt power would be required. The pump station would be equipped with a standby emergency generator of sufficient capacity to operate the station during periods of electrical power outage. The estimated generator size is 50KW.

The proposed forcemain is 8-inch diameter. It is proposed that the force main be routed through the facilities property to Old Park Road. The main would cross South River by means of directional bore, and proceed to Highway 82. The forcemain would continue along Highway 82 until it terminates with a tie-in to an existing manhole at the end of a 10-inch gravity sewer that is part of the NORCRESS system in the Town of Falcon. See Figure 2 in Appendix A for a map of the proposed routing.

Wastewater would be conveyed by the existing 10-inch gravity sewer and flow to the Town of Falcon pump station. From this pump station, flow would continue through an 8-inch forcemain to the Town of Wade, NC pump station in Cumberland County. Wastewater is transported from the Wade pump station to the Fayetteville Public Works Commission Sewer System via an existing 10-inch diameter forcemain.

The existing 10-inch gravity should have a minimum slope of 0.0028 ft./ft., which would provide for a capacity of nearly 1.0 MGD, which is adequate for both existing flow and the proposed flow from the Old Martin facility.

The Falcon pump station, as previously noted was designed for a flow of 350 gallons per minute. As previously noted, the design flow to the Falcon pump station was 70,000 gallons per day or 49 gallons per minute. The pump station will need to have a capacity for up to 87,924 gallons per day plus the additional flow from the proposed Kansas City Sausage expansion. A standard peaking factor of 2.5 applied to the Average Daily Flow of 87,294 gallons per day, then converted to gallons per minute results in a design flow to the existing Falcon Station of 151 gallons per minute. The combination of the existing flow and the proposed flow of 320 gallons

per minute from the Old Martin facility would require a capacity of 471 gallons per minute for the Falcon Station. Based on this, the Falcon Pump Station would require an upgrade to 475 gallons per minute, including replacement of pumps and electrical components.

The Wade #2 station has a capacity of 700 gallons per minute. Assuming a worst case scenario, whereby peak flows reached the station at the same time, the allocated system flow of 194,044 gallons per day would equate to a peak hourly flow of 337 gallons per minute based on a peak factor of 2.5. Adding the proposed flow of 320 gallons per minute from Kansas City Sausage would elevate peak flow in the Wade Pump Station to 657 gallons per minute, which is comfortably below the design rate of 700 gallons per minute. The Wade Pump Station would, therefore, not require upgrades to accommodate this project.

It should be noted that there is a wide range of flexibility that can be incorporated into the design of the proposed pump station and force main. This flexibility may be beneficial in reducing impact and excess strain on the existing NORCRESS system. For instance, flexibility is available as far as the times that wastewater could be discharged from the proposed pump station. Discharges could be timed such that impacts to existing peak flow rates would be minimal.

#### 4.0 PROJECTED COST FOR NEW INFRASTRUCTURE

The Preliminary Engineers Opinion of Probable Cost for constructing the new system is shown as Figure 3 at the end of this report. The projected costs for construction are approximately \$876,500.00. Modifications to the existing Falcon Pump Station are estimated at \$85,000.00. The estimate is broken down item by item, with anticipated quantities and unit costs.

Design fees are estimated to be \$82,400.00. Resident Project Representative fees, or fees for construction observation are estimated to be \$50,500.00. The design fee includes surveying and mapping services, including preparation of any required easement maps. Services for wetlands delineation or archaeological investigations are excluded.

It is possible that Kansas City Sausage Company may be able to offset a significant portion of the total project cost by means of available grant funds. Grants are available, in particular, for economic development that increases employment for the area. Considerations are made on a case by case basis. Preliminary findings indicate that as much as \$12,500.00 per each new job created may be available, provided certain criteria are met, up to a maximum grant of \$500,000.00.

#### 5.0 PROJECTED START-UP AND MONTHLY OPERATING COSTS

Based on the NORCRESS Commercial Sanitary Sewer Rate Schedule, the Usage Charge is \$7.00 per 1000 gallons. Additionally, there is a Debt Charge of \$1.00 per 1000 gallons and a Lift Station Maintenance Fee of \$2.00 per 1000 gallons. Sewer flow would be measured by the installation of an 8-inch meter on the force main. The monthly NORCRESS meter fee is \$46.70 per month. The fee to the Town of Falcon would be \$7.50 per month. The Fayetteville Public Works Commission imposes a surcharge on industrial wastewater with specific pollutants that are above maximum thresholds. The surcharges are detailed in the Appendix, and the anticipated charges are as follows (based on anticipated flows of 200,000gpd):

The resulting total wastewater bill for the total permitted flow at the anticipated wastewater characteristics would be \$81,337.58 per month. It is anticipated that the cost of operating the pump station on a monthly basis would be \$685.71, for a total monthly wastewater cost of \$82,023.29. A tap fee, estimated to be \$60,310.00 would be required up front to tie into the NORCRESS system

It may be possible to reduce the surcharges to PWC substantially or in their entirety by utilizing the existing aerated lagoons for pre-treatment. By oxygenating the raw wastewater, BOD and TKN can be reduced. It is beyond the scope of this PER to analyze the existing lagoons and to

what extent that they can treat effluent, however in a worst case scenario, an upgrade of aerators and the addition of baffles to the first lagoon may be warranted in this regard. Assuming that the total horsepower requirements of the aerators was 60hp, for example, and assuming electrical charges of 12 cents per kilowatt hour, it might be possible to eliminate surcharges to PWC for the substitution of \$3,888.00 per month in electrical charges. This would reduce the monthly wastewater disposal cost to \$64,627.91, provided the wastewater characteristics could be reduced to less than 300mg/l for BOD and 50mg/l of TKN.


#### 6.0 SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

In conclusion, it is recommended that Kansas City Sausage Company proceed with plans to implement the proposed 320 gallon per minute pump station and 14,700 lf of 8-inch force main to discharge to the NORCRESS sewer system. It is recommended that the existing lagoons be evaluated to determine to what extent that they can be used to reduce contaminant loading of effluent being discharged, thereby reducing, possibly substantially, the surcharges to the monthly wastewater fees. It is estimated that the design phase of the proposed pump station and force main will require 120 days to complete. Design of modifications to the existing lagoons would require additional time. Construction of the proposed pump station and force main would require approximately 180 days to complete.

It is emphasized that the implementation of this project should have a positive impact on the NORCRESS system, by increasing flows in the Falcon portion of the system, which has consistently displayed operational problems due to low flows. Chemical costs at the Falcon Pump Station would likely be reduced. Problems due to sedimentation in the Falcon force main would likely be eliminated, and problems with odor and cycling at the Falcon station would likely be eliminated or reduced substantially.

It also bears emphasis that a great deal of flexibility can be incorporated into design of the proposed pump station and force main to minimize any possible negative effects to existing infrastructure that would arise from discharges during traditional peak hours.


