Approval of Report on Delinquent Real Property Taxes for the Year 2014

BACKGROUND: North Carolina General Statute 105-369 requires the Tax Collector to report unpaid taxes for the current fiscal year that are liens on real property by the first Monday in February. The purpose of the reporting is to allow you to order the Tax Collector to advertise the tax liens. Upon receipt of your order, I will advertise the tax liens by posting notice at the County Courthouse and by publishing each lien at least one time in one or more of the newspapers having general circulation in Cumberland County.

The statute requires that advertisement period to occur during the period of March 1<sup>st</sup> through June 30<sup>th</sup>. It is my intention to deliver an updated list of delinquent taxes to the newspaper in the latter part of April for advertisement in early to mid-May. The current delinquent report will be on display in the Clerk's office through February 2, 2015 in CD or printout format. After this date, the report will be available in the Tax Administrator's office.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The County acquired both of the following real properties below at tax foreclosure sale in in 2012 for a total purchase price of \$5,075.78:

**PIN 0454-43-6052**; located at 4110 River Point Dr., Fayetteville, NC; being Lot 19, River Point, Plat Book 88, Page 4. Based on the County GIS Mapping system it appears to be a vacant residential lot with a tax value of \$17,500.

**PIN 0454-42-6788**; located at 4118 River Point Dr., Fayetteville, NC; being Lot 20, River Point, Plat Book 88, Page 47. The tax records list a 1998 14x80 mobile home with a value of \$11,493 located on the lot as personal property of the previous owner of the parcel. The residential lot has a tax value of \$7,549.

Cole, Jr., as recorded in Deed Book 2832, Page 133 Cumberland County Registry; and running thence North 72 degrees 48 minutes East 100.00 feet to a point; thence South 17 degrees 12 minutes East 200.00 feet to a point; thence South 72 degrees 48 minutes West 100.00 feet to a point in the eastern margin of said State Road No. 1002; thence with the eastern margin of said State Road No. 1002 North 17 degrees 12 minutes West 200.00 feet to the point and place of BEGINNING and containing 0.46 acres more or less.

To have and to hold said lands for the term and upon the conditions as follows:

I.

The term of this lease shall be for a period of five (5) years beginning on March 25, 2015 unless sooner terminated by mutual agreement of the parties herein or if continued performance by either or both parties will result in a violation of any county, state or federal law. The COUNTY is granted the option to renew this lease for an additional period of five (5) years upon the same terms and conditions as herein contained by its payment of the same rental rate provided for in paragraph III thirty (30) days prior to expiration of the original term.

The COUNTY will use this property for the purpose of maintaining a solid waste container site on said property with the necessary solid waste containers, ramps, pads, driveways, and fences for public use.

III.

The rental to be paid by the COUNTY to OWNER for said property shall be THREE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$3,750.00) which shall be paid promptly after the execution of this lease agreement.

IV.

The COUNTY agrees to accept the said property in its present condition and make all improvements required to place said solid waste containers on property.

V.

The COUNTY will maintain said property in an orderly manner.

VI.

At the expiration of this lease or any renewal term, the COUNTY shall remove any pads, ramps, fences, fill, or other materials placed on said property by the COUNTY if so required by the OWNER.

VII.

The OWNER warrants that he is the owner of the above described property, and has the authority to enter into this Lease.

VIII.

The County agrees that it shall indemnify and hold harmless the OWNER from any claims for damages, to either persons or property, made by the employees, agents or contractors of the County arising out of or in connection with the County's operation in maintaining the Solid Waste Container Site on said property.

IX.

This Agreement shall be governed by the internal laws of the State of North Carolina without regard to the conflict of interest provisions thereof.

This Agreement may be modified only by an instrument duly executed by the parties or their respective successors in interest.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The North Carolina Department of Transportation is making improvements to Tom Starling Road for a distance of 3.4 miles from U.S. 301 to N.C. 87 (TIP Project W-5512). The improvements include grading, drainage, paving, signing, traffic control and pavement marking. NCDOT has requested that the county donate a right-of-way and a temporary construction easement for this project.

The right-of-way, designated as TIP Parcel Number W-5512.013, consists of an irregularly shaped parcel approximately 333 feet in length with a width varying from 99 to 76 feet and consisting of approximately 0.6 acres. It is located on a vacant 50.86 acre parcel that is part of the Cumberland Industrial Center, directly across Tom Starling Road from its intersection with Grandford Road. The requested right-of-way will become part of Tom Starling Road.

The temporary construction easement, designated as TIP Parcel Number W-5512.016, consists of a strip approximately 375 feet in length with a width varying from 26 to 34 feet located adjacent to the existing right-of-way of Tom Starling Road on vacant Lot 6B in the Cumberland Industrial Center. This lot lies between Tom Starling Road and the property of Le Bleu Corporation and is adjacent to the property of McCune Technology, Inc. The temporary easement will be extinguished when the project is completed.

SUBJECT: New EPA ground-level Ozone Standards in 2015, Implications for Cumberland County & Future emissions reduction priorities

#### BACKGROUND

Cumberland County voluntarily entered into the Early Action Compact in 2002. The Early Action Plan (EAP) was developed for Cumberland County and the Air Quality Stakeholders Committee was formed. This committee is supported by the Combined Air Team (CombAT) with membership from the Cumberland County Air Team, the Fort Bragg Air Team, and the Sustainable Sandhills Air Team. Based on the EAP, subsequent EPA milestones on ozone emission level reductions were achieved until Ozone Attainment standards were met in April 2008. To maintain attainment status, the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners approved participation in the Ozone Advance program in 2012. Every municipality within Cumberland County has signed a resolution in support of participation in the Ozone Advance program as of June 2013.

The EPA is issuing new Ozone Advance standards beginning 2015. The new proposed standards will set attainment between 0.065 parts per million (ppm) to 0.070 ppms. Cumberland County's design value for the past three years (2011-2013) was 0.069 ppm. If the new National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) is set at 0.070 ppm we will be in compliance, but if the EPA decides to take our values from 2013-2015 and sets the National standard at 0.065 ppm Cumberland County will not be in compliance. If 2015 is a low ground level ozone year like 2014 and the community continues working together to lower emissions as we have since 2002, then we look likely to meet the EPA proposed standards for this year. Emissions standards for ground level ozone will continue to decline over the next decade. Cumberland County must work together to be prepared.

IN INTERBASIN TRANSER CERTIFICATE

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: Apex, Cary, Morrisville and Wake County have requested a change in their current interbasin transfer (IBT) certificate, which enables the movement of surface water from one river basin to another. The Triangle communities are seeking permission from the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources to take more water from the Haw River basin, which feeds into the Cape Fear River, and return it through wastewater to the Neuse River and Cape Fear River basins.

The communities are seeking more water to better accommodate projected growth and greater demands for water in the decades to come and prefer the option of returning the wastewater to the Neuse River (Alternative 2A).

Mick Noland, the chief operations officer of the City of Fayetteville Public Works Commission's Water Resources Department, will discuss why this IBT is unnecessary and poses increased risks to the water supply of Cumberland County and other counties downstream. The attached resolution opposes the change in the IBT certificate under alternative 2A and recommends using alternative 3A, as described in the Environmental Assessment for the proposed IBT. This option avoids interbasin transfer by sending additional untreated wastewater to the Western Wake Regional Water Reclamation Facility. The Western Wake Partnership has the infrastructure in place to allow the return of treated wastewater to the Cape Fear River. If wastewater is returned, an additional IBT would not be needed and existing conditions in the Cape Fear River would be preserved.

DENR held two public hearings; the first in Apex on January 7, followed by one in Fayetteville on January 22. DENR is accepting comments through February 6. The N.C. Environmental Management Commission is set make a decision on the transfer request later this spring.

# RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE PROPOSED INTERBASIN TRANSFER ("IBT") CERTIFICATE MODIFICATION FOR THE TOWNS OF APEX, CARY AND MORRISVILLE, AND WAKE COUNTY (FOR RTP SOUTH) ALTERNATIVE 2A - INCREASE IBT TO MEET 2045 DEMANDS

WHEREAS, the County of Cumberland, North Carolina, believes the Interbasin Transfer ("IBT") Certificate request submitted by the towns of Apex, Cary and Morrisville, and Wake County (for RTP South) is unnecessary and poses increased risks to the water supply of Cumberland County and other counties downstream; and

WHEREAS, the Cape Fear River is a tremendous resource to our community, providing our major source of water supply as well as affording many recreational opportunities for our citizens, and it is our responsibility to maintain the highest level of certainty for our future water supply; and

WHEREAS, based on modeling results, it has been determined that the minimum flows from the Cape Fear River at Lillington and Fayetteville will be reduced significantly in the future, even with no increase in IBT, making it critical that treated wastewater be returned to the Cape Fear River Basin; and

WHEREAS, the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission has indicated concern that increased withdrawals from Jordan Lake could negatively impact fish populations in the Cape Fear River and therefore negatively impact the river's ecosystem; and

WHEREAS, current requests for water supply from Jordan Lake do not allow for any water to be held in reserve; which could limit the ability of the lake to meet all of its intended uses, including water supply and flow downstream; and

WHEREAS, the additional transfer will cause more than 50 percent of the water supply to be diverted away from the Jordan Lake drainage basin; which is not in compliance with N.C. Department of Environmental Resources (DENR) rules and could jeopardize replenishment of the lake; and

WHEREAS, a water use decision of this magnitude seems premature given that the Cape Fear River Water Supply Plan, being prepared by DENR to determine whether or not all water supply needs can be met throughout the entire Cape Fear River Basin, has not been finalized; and

WHEREAS, this transfer request is based on a 30-year planning period, which is excessive and would compromise our ability to meet changes due to regulations, statutes, customer demands, climate changes, and regional needs; and a shorter planning period of 15 years would be more prudent; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The County of Cumberland recommends utilization of alternative 3A, as described in the Environmental Assessment for the proposed IBT. This option avoids interbasin transfer by sending additional untreated wastewater to the Western Wake Regional Water Reclamation Facility. The Western Wake Partnership has the infrastructure in place to allow the return of treated wastewater to the Cape Fear River. If wastewater is returned, an additional IBT would not be needed and existing conditions in the Cape Fear River would be preserved.
