On January 20, 2015, the Board resolved that the group home facility located at 800 Old Wilmington Road was not needed for governmental purposes and directed that it be advertised and sold pursuant to the upset bid process of G. BACKGROUND:

The City of Fayetteville, Cumberland County and the Fayetteville Regional Chamber formed a partnership that works collaboratively and strategically to engage with the federal government and pursue funding assistance for strategic focus areas identified in an annual, collectively established agenda. These efforts ensure protection and preservation of essential community assets and resources. The Partnership Federal Advocacy Report outlines specific initiatives undertaken through the consultant on behalf of the community during the first six months of FY 2015.

For many years, the Partnership's federal agenda focused on earmarks and legislation that could be amended to meet a specific need in our community. The processes by which we engaged with the federal government and the results of that engagement have continued to evolve. Cumberland County and Fayetteville now face a far different environment, a situation that the Partnership began to embrace in 2013 with the adoption of a revised Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). The MOU recognizes the importance of engagement with the federal government across a variety of strategic, tactical and policy junctures to successfully advocate for our community.

In January 2014, the Partnership contracted with FaegreBD, a federal services consulting firm, to perform a federal affairs assessment. Elected officials and subject-matter experts, representing the City, County and Chamber, met with the consultant during a series of strategic planning workshops to assist in assessing and developing a community federal agenda. That work yielded a set of community priories that match federal opportunities and provide a roadmap for future engagement in Washington, D.C. The community's federal agenda prioritizes needs and outlines a strategy to achieve the goals set forth in the Partnership's MOU and Federal Advocacy Program. David Gogol, Vice Chair of FaegreBD, presented the Federal Assessment and draft FY 2015 Federal Agenda to the Board of Commissioners on June 2, 2014. County Commissioners, City Council and the Fayetteville Regional Chamber Board adopted the FY 2015 Federal Agenda in June 2014.

The Partnership's initial work focused on identifying issues specific to garrison communities and specific agency and legislative requests to address systemic issues identified in the workshops. Mr. Gogol will update the board on initiatives undertaken through the consultant on behalf of the community during the first six months of FY 2015 and discuss moving forward as we continue to foster collaboration in the Partnership, develop action agendas, seek the support of our Congressional delegation, and report progress on a bi-annual basis.

Introduction

For the past year, FaegreBD Consulting (FBDC) has had the privilege of serving as the Partnership's federal affairs consultant. While we came to the community thinking that our work would be similar to our work with the multiple communities we have assisted with over the years, it became apparent that Fayetteville and Cumberland County are distinctly different than most American communities. As an Army garrison community, every aspect of this community is influenced by the presence of Fort Bragg and its population. The economy, the housing market, policing and virtually every city and county service reflects the military presence.

As we began our work, the community was at the end of a period in which it had benefited from the significant growth that had been experienced at Fort Bragg. This growth insulated the community, to a degree, from the housing downturn of 2008 and the recession. While the community had issues to address over the last decade, these issues were largely due to the activities of Fort Bragg and the deployment of service members stationed there.

The initial FBDC work focused upon the identification of issues that were garrison community-specific. How does Fort Bragg and the garrison impact city/county services and economic development uniquely? With the answers, FBDC began to identify specific agency and legislative requests to address these issues.

Six months into our work, the Army announced the drawdown and our work became highly focused on developing an understanding of the impact of the drawdown and then building responses, as possible. When the Army's estimate of the scale of the drawdown in Fayetteville and Cumberland County was made public, our work became more focused and urgent.

Just as the area economy and the housing market had largely been spared during the Fort Bragg growth, the area could now see impacts that may rival the hardest hit cities in the county during the depths of the recession. Given the scale of the drawdown, it appears that there will be significant dislocations in the housing market and the local economy, increases in homelessness and unemployment, pressure on the social service safety net and significant reductions in local government revenue.

Partnership/FBDC Process

In 2013, the Partnership issued a Request for Qualifications for federal advocacy firms to reply and indicate the services they could provide and the ways they could assist the community. FBDC responded and in February 2014, was hired to perform a landscape analysis to help the Partnership better understand the areas of nexus between the issues unfolding in the community and federal priorities.

Following that engagement, in the summer of 2014, FBDC was retained by the Partnership to explore, in-depth, the areas identified in the landscape analysis for opportunity and engagement. That work has yielded a set of community priories that match federal opportunities and provides a roadmap for future engagement in Washington, DC.

Federal Agency Engagement

As the magnitude of the drawdown became clearer, the Partnership recognized that direct and clear dialog with appropriate federal agencies was necessary. During the last quarter of 2014, Partnership leaders have met with senior federal officials with the United States Department of Labor (DOL), the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), the United States Department of Housing and Urban Affairs (HUD), the Economic Development Administration (EDA), the United States Department of Justice (DOJ) and representatives of the Fayetteville and Cumberland County congressional delegation.

In these meetings, the Partnership leadership helped federal officials understand the unique issues faced by garrison communities, alerted these agencies to the drawdown and the impacts that could be expected, discussed potential responses and asked for assistance and continued engagement. The agencies have been highly responsive and agency-specific projects have been initiated.

Reporting and Contact Management

Since our initial engagement with the Partnership, FBDC has maintained a consistent level of interaction with key points of contact in the form of biweekly calls and regular email communications. We have also provided logistical and policy support to Partnership members as they have traveled to Washington, DC, either for activities speared headed by us, or when attending events put on by others.

FBDC also provides regular written communications around trending policy issues, emerging opportunities and in-depth analysis of key issues. FBDC has provided written text and talking

points regarding local issues with federal impacts, including an analysis of the National Defense Authorization Act (drafts and final approved versions), the TIGER grant program, funding history analysis of the Economic Development Administration and the Office of Economic Assistance, and funding impacts of the FY 2015 appropriations bill, to name a few.

As the engagement between the Partnership and FBDC unfolded, a number of areas have been explored in detail to determine if federal opportunities align with local interests, capabilities, responsibilities and goals.

Areas explored include:

A. Economic Development

The drawdown is estimated to have a significant negative impact on the local economy. The military winding down that has occurred in both Iraq and Afghanistan has reduced the number of individuals receiving deployment pay, a loss of income that has rippled through the local economy. In anticipation of the worsening situation, Partnership officials met with the leadership of the EDA to discuss the drawdown. EDA was highly responsive and indicated that the base population losses would be considered job losses under EDA's programs and qualifying the community to receive priority in EDA grant decisions. For example, the Chamber is currently considering potential ways in which its collaborative ICAR program could leverage federal EDA funds to support expansion.

B. Employment

With a local unemployment rate that already exceeds the State and the national employment rates, the community faces a potential disaster if the drawdown results in the loss of 25,000 local jobs as the Army has estimated. In addition, with 8,000+ soldiers discharged in the community each year, there is a growing concern that veteran unemployment may also become a significant issue.

In response to the emerging unemployment issues, the Partnership met with the leadership of the VA and DOL to discuss national and regional efforts to address veteran unemployment.

C. Grants

With the earmark ban, communities that want to secure federal funding must track and respond to competitive grant programs. Neither Fayetteville nor Cumberland County has a centralized grant department. Both governments currently have departments track and respond to grant opportunities in their subject area. FaegreBD Consulting has been supporting the Partnership's efforts regarding federal grants. FBDC has provided grant notifications and has provided advice on the use of grants to meet local needs. FBDC has also provided guidance on best practices for communities seeking federal grants, including a recommendation to support a centralized resource to improve the tracking, evaluating and competing for grant funding for community priorities.

D. Human Services/Homelessness

The cost of providing human services to Cumberland County residents is partially borne by the federal government through a variety of programs. The preservation of the funding for the programs is essential to the ability to provide services at the local level.

Homelessness in the community has been and continues to be a serious local issue. And, as the drawdown accelerates, there is concern that homelessness will increase (as unemployment rises) and veteran homelessness will rise as well. The Partnership met with VA officials to discuss these issues and the VA has been responsive. The local VA leadership has been meeting with the Partnership and the Continuum of Care leadership on a regular basis to discuss needs and opportunities.

E. Housing

As the drawdown accelerates, the impact on the housing economy will likely be significant. After years of housing growth, the housing market in Fayetteville has begun to soften. In 2013, the rental vacancy rate was twice the national average and home sales slowed. In 2014, the rental vacancy rate continued to grow; home sales dropped 71% and housing prices slid slightly. Foreclosures have been rising over the past two years and the VA has become the largest home owner in Cumberland County due to foreclosures.

The Partnership met with housing officials with the VA and HUD to discuss the worsening situation. The VA shares the Partnership's concern and has offered to work with the Partnership on strategies to respond to foreclosures.

2015-2016 Work Plan

The 2015-2016 Work Plan agenda for the Partnership builds on the body of work done to date, and focuses the activity of the Partnership into two main areas.

- Issue areas that impact the operations or interests of the Partnership members, but where
 the members either take a supportive role or, due to a variety of factors, are not uniquely
 suited to lead the initiative through direct engagement. These are areas where FBDC will
 continue to monitor, inform, advocate and educate the Partnership and the congressional
 delegation. Areas include:
 - Municipal finance
 - o Preservation of City federal funding
 - Preservation of County federal funding
 - o 440th
 - Veterans issues
 - Employment
 - o Federal grants
 - Transportation/Transit
 - Federal tax policy

• Issue areas that, following detailed exploration, demonstrate unique federal opportunities that intersect local capabilities, including:

1. Law Enforcement/Criminal Justice

Crime continues to be a significant issue in the community and the Army presence creates special problems for Fayetteville and Cumberland County. The Partnership has met with the DOJ to discuss the needs of garrison communities and the need for additional funding and technical assistance. The DOJ has responded positively to the Partnership's requests.

In 2015, the DOJ will undertake an initiative to identify the special policing needs of garrison communities, begin the development of best practices for base-city police issues and consider a grant request to assist the City. Fayetteville has suggested to DOJ it could host a national policy meeting in 2015 on the subject of policing and criminal justice in military communities. Additionally, the Partnership will track developments and engage with congressional delegation members regarding legislative approval of a federal program to assist communities with funding body cameras for law enforcement.

2. Census

Partnership leaders presented FBDC with concerns around past decennial census processes and their possible negative effects for Fayetteville and Cumberland County. Due to an old policy, and the 2010 census coinciding with high deployment rates, service members from Fort Bragg, who would be returning to Fort Bragg following their deployment, were not included in the county count.

North Carolina state government is also engaged on this issue, and is taking the lead on engagement with the US Census Bureau to suggest a review of the decade's-old policy to prevent further undercounting in garrison communities. The Partnership will work with the State, as well as engage independently as needed, to communicate to the US Census Bureau its belief that a new methodology of counting deployed service members is required.

3. Data

As the drawdown accelerates and creates negative impacts on the housing market, retail sales, hotel occupancy and other elements of the local economy, local government revenues will be impacted. The Partnership has seen early indications of the impact of the drawdown on tax revenue and is concerned.

Recognizing the need to be able to track the performance of the local economy and accurately estimate tax revenue, the Partnership met with economic forecasting officials at the VA to discuss the development of an economic tracking mechanism for the community. The VA recognized the need for this tool and has been working with the Partnership to develop a responsive dashboard for the Partnership. The data provided to the Partnership will assist in informing local decisions regarding issues around housing and the broad economy.

4. Legislation

The Partnership has met with the Fayetteville and Cumberland County Congressional delegation to discuss the drawdown, its potential impacts on the community and possible legislative responses to the identified problems. The Partnership has also discussed other non-drawdown legislative needs with the delegation. The Partnership is considering focusing legislative efforts for 2015-2016 around:

- Legislation that would authorize the Office of Economic Adjustment at DOD to provide assistance to communities impacted by the drawdown.
- Legislation that would authorize a temporary payment to partially reimburse garrison communities from revenue losses that result from the drawdown.
- Legislation that would require the payment of property taxes by private developers for facilities built on bases under the Enhanced Use Lease authority.

Moving forward

As noted previously, since our initial engagement with the Partnership, we have sought to identify areas of intersection with the federal government, conduct in-depth research in those areas to determine where opportunity existed, and, then compare those areas to the goals, staffing and capabilities of the Partnership. Now that the focus areas for 2015-2016 have been identified, FBDC will create a customized federal engagement plan for each area, working directly with subject experts at the City, County and Chamber to meet agreed upon deadlines and deliverables. While the action plans will be different based on the specific issues (for example, supporting a state effort around the census will look different than spearheading Fayetteville hosting a national DOJ conference), they will all be tailored to both the opportunity at hand and the ability of the Partnership to engage.

An important part of the development of the action plans will be participation by FBDC in a Partnership-initiated strategic workshop. Unlike previous meetings which have included a wide swath of community members attending and discussing a variety of federal activities, this gathering will be limited to the 2015-2016 goals. The plans that come out of this process can then be considered for adoption as the Partnership's 2015-2016 federal agenda.

It is expected that the strategic workshop would occur in April, with the plans delivered to the Partnership in May, with possible adoption in June.

Introduction

- ▶ Fort Bragg creates a greater intersection with the federal government than the vast majority of communities enjoy.
- ► The insulation from the Great Recession that Fayetteville and Cumberland County experienced is being replaced with a downward trend.
- ► The community has already rallied together on the related issue of the 440th Airlift Wing.
- ► The community engagement has allowed FBDC's work to date to focus less on the engagement with the Department of Defense but rather with federal agencies that can assist Fayetteville and Cumberland County in dealing with the effects of DOD decisions.









Process

- ► FBDC responded to an RFP from the Partnership in 2013 and began working in February 2014.
- ► Following a six month landscape analysis, FBDC and the Partnership entered into a year engagement to begin working on the Community's federal priorities.

- ▶ Partnership representatives join FBDC on a bimonthly hour-long call to review developments in the community, discuss completed activities and plan new initiatives.

 Washington, D.C., of interest to the Partnership.









Federal Agency Engagement

- ► The drawdown has focused the Partnership's efforts toward federal agencies that impact several issues important to the community.
- ► Ted Voorhees, Amy Cannon and Doug Peters traveled to Washington, D.C., to begin engagement with federal officials in November 2014.









Focus Areas

- ► The presence of Fort Bragg and the drawdown of military and civilian personnel provided a number of areas in which work could be undertaken.
- ► FBDC and the Partnership conducted a thorough examination of the wide range of issues impacting the community.











Focus Area Factors

- Not all areas provide equal opportunities for success.
- ▶ Partnership members do not have primary community responsibility for all areas nor unlimited capacity to pursue all opportunities.
- Some areas are not uniquely important to the Partnership members, but necessitate attention and effort due to their impact on cities and counties generally.
- ► The 2015-2016 Work Plan will be divided into two categories: *Areas* of Support and Advocacy and Focus Areas

Law Enforcement/Criminal Justice

- Army presence creates special problems for Fayetteville and Cumberland County.
- Partnership will work with the DOJ on:
 - Issues unique to garrison communities
 - Funding for body cameras
 - Soldier-connected domestic abuse & suicide initiatives
 - Building relationship with Killeen, TX

Census

- Census policy established decades ago has hurt the community during times of high deployment.
- ▶ Partnership members engaged with the Governor's office will work on:

- The drawdown could provide an opportunity to create another such program.

Enhanced Use Lease

- Enhanced Use Leases (EULs) have become popular on government properties, however they deprive local units of government needed revenues.
- Legislation could provide for the payment of property taxes by private developers using EULs.

Office of Economic Adjustment

- Fort Bragg Regional
 Alliance has received planning grants from the Office of Economic Adjustment (OEA).
- OEA is not allowed to assist communities directly as they deal with the drawdown, but a legislative change could allow for it.

§ 58-84-30. Trustees appointed; organization.

For each county, town or city complying with and deriving benefits from the provisions of this Article, there shall be appointed a local board of trustees, known as the trustees of the local Firefighters' Relief Fund, to be composed of five members, two of whom shall be elected by the members of the local fire department who are qualified as beneficiaries of such fund, two of whom shall be elected by the mayor and board of aldermen or other local governing body, and one of whom shall be named by the Commissioner of Insurance. Their selection and term of office shall be as follows:

- (1) The members of the fire department shall hold an election each January to elect their representatives to above board. In January 1950, the firefighters shall elect one member to serve for two years and one member to serve for one year, then each year in January thereafter, they shall elect only one member and his term of office shall be for two years. Members elected pursuant to this section shall be either (i) residents of the fire district or (ii) active or retired members of the fire department.
- (2) The mayor and board of aldermen or other local governing body shall appoint, in January 1950, two representatives to above board, one to hold office for two years and one to hold office for one year, and each year in January thereafter they shall appoint only one representative and his term of office shall be for two years. Members appointed pursuant to this section shall be residents of the fire district.
- (3) The Commissioner of Insurance shall appoint one representative to serve as trustee and he shall serve at the pleasure of the Commissioner. The member appointed pursuant to this section shall be either (i) a resident of the fire district or (ii) an active or retired member of the fire department.

All of the above trustees shall hold office for their elected or appointed time, or until their successors are elected or appointed, and shall serve without pay for their services. They shall immediately after election and appointment organize by electing from their members a chairman and a secretary and treasurer, which two last positions may be held by the same person. The treasurer of said board of trustees shall give a good and sufficient surety bond in a sum equal to the amount of moneys in his hand, to be approved by the Commissioner of Insurance. The cost of this bond may be deducted by the Insurance Commissioner from the receipts collected pursuant to G.S. 58-84-10 before distribution is made to local relief funds. If the chief or chiefs of the local fire departments are not named on the board of trustees as above provided, then they shall serve as ex officio members without privilege of voting on matters before the board. FARM ADVISORY BOARD

The Farm Advisory Committee was created by Resolution approved by the Board of Commissioners on April 5, 2004. Committee members were appointed by the Commissioners on June 7, 2004. Bylaws were adopted by the Commissioners on November 30, 2006 and the Farm Advisory Committee became the Farm Advisory Board. Initial terms for the Farm Advisory Board began on December 31, 2006. The initial term was for 3 years with an expiration date of December 31, 2009. (All second terms were staggered as outlined in the bylaws with 1/3 of the members appointed for a 1-year term; 1/3 of the members appointed for a 2-year term; and 1/3 of the members appointed to a 3-year term.)
