

G. Budget Revisions: **(Pg. 50)**

(1) Health Department Budget Ordinance Amendment B170026 to request increase in salary appropriations in the amount of \$2,359

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170026 for an increase in position number PHD8014 in the amount of \$2,359. This position is 100% state funded and the funds will be reclassified from miscellaneous expense to salaries within the grant.

Please note that this amendment requires no additional County Funds.

(2) Sheriff's Office Budget Ordinance Amendment B170290 to recognize a contribution for the Sheriff's Office to purchase bullet proof vests in the amount of \$10,000

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170290 in the amount of \$10,000 from a contribution made to the Sheriff's Office. This is to purchase approximately 18 bullet proof vests at a cost of \$555 per vest.

Please note that this amendment requires no additional County Funds.

(3) Child Support Budget Ordinance Amendment B170247 to reallocate funds from departmental supplies to a part-time position in the amount of \$9,500

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B17047 in the amount of \$9,500 from departmental supplies and materials to a part-time position. This part-time position is for document imaging due to the Laserfiche software. Since the documentation must be scanned within a specific organizational structure, it is more efficient to utilize a retired staff member to work part-time for 6 months to scan older case files. This coincides with our technology initiative of reducing paper by utilizing electronic resources.

Please note that this amendment requires no additional County Funds.

(4) Sheriff's Office Budget Ordinance Amendment B170144 to recognize grant amount \$6,997 for the NC Public Safety Grant

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170144 in the amount of \$6,997 from a NC Public Safety Grant.

Please note that this amendment requires no additional County Funds.

(5) Solid Waste Budget Ordinance Amendment B170387 to appropriate solid waste fund balance in the amount of \$60,000

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170387 in the amount of \$60,000 to appropriate solid waste fund balance. A recent equipment fire resulted in the total loss of the equipment. Therefore, the department needs to rent equipment until insurance proceeds are available to purchase a replacement.

Please note that this amendment requires the use of solid waste fund balance.

(6) Overhills Park Water & Sewer District Budget Ordinance Amendment B170487 for the USDA Rural Development Grant

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170487 for \$560,000 for a subsequent Rural Utilities Services loan and an additional USDA Rural Development Grant of \$458,000. The budget has to be in place so that the contract can be signed after approval by the Local Government Commission.

Please note that this amendment requires no additional county funds.

REGARDING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS 7 – 12 PLEASE NOTE:

Each fiscal year County departments have projects that are incomplete by the fiscal year end (6/30/16) or items ordered that have not been received by fiscal year end. These projects or items were approved in the Fiscal Year 2016 budget but associated funds were not spent and therefore become part of fund balance. The following amendments seek to bring those funds forward into the current fiscal year, allowing departments to complete and pay for these projects.

(7) Planning Department Budget Ordinance Amendment B170116 to appropriate fund balance in the amount of \$5,900

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170116 in the amount of \$5,900 for two demolition projects that were not completed by the end of FY16.

Please note that this amendment requires the use of fund balance.

(8) Emergency Services Budget Ordinance Amendment B170043 to appropriate fund balance in the amount of \$125,131

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170043 in the amount of \$125,131 to appropriate fund balance. On June 20, 2016, the Cumberland County Commissioners approved the purchase of the Logger system. The Logger system is a recording system of all

incoming 911 calls. Funds are being requested in the current fiscal year due to being unable to complete the purchase before June 30, 2016.

Please note that this amendment requires the use of fund balance.

(9) Court Facilities Budget Ordinance Amendment B170477 to appropriate \$7,141

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170477 to appropriate \$7,141 from fund balance. Funds are needed to pay for various renovations in the Court system which began in FY16.

Please note that this amendment requires the use of fund balance.

(10) NORCRESS Budget Ordinance Amendment B170478 to appropriate \$200,000

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170478 in the amount of \$200,000 for the inflow and infiltration inspection. This project was started in FY16 and should be completed by the end of FY17.

Please note that this amendment requires the use of fund balance.

(11) Kelly Hills Budget Ordinance Amendment B170483 to appropriate \$93,107

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170483 in the amount of \$93,107. A bill was anticipated in FY16 for installing the mag meter in Kelly Hills Water and Sewer District; however, it has not been received. It is anticipated this bill will be received soon and funds are needed for payment.

Please note that this amendment requires the use of fund balance.

(12) Facilities Maintenance Budget Ordinance Amendment B170460 to appropriate \$985,378

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment number B170460 to appropriate \$985,378 for various projects that were started during FY16 and should be finished in FY17.

Please note that this amendment requires the use of fund balance.

(13) Contingency Funds Report

The county manager approved an increase in contingency funds of \$21,570. This increase was due to a decrease by North Carolina Forestry Services budget approved at the state level. County of Cumberland has a 40% share of their total budget.

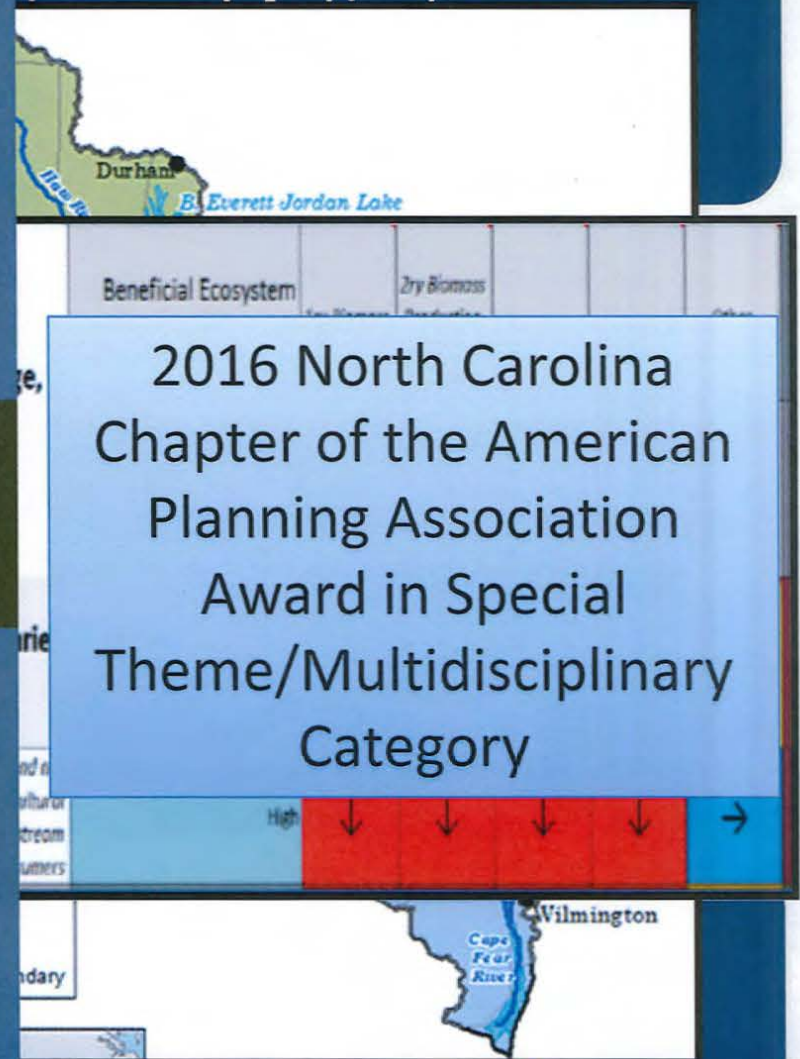

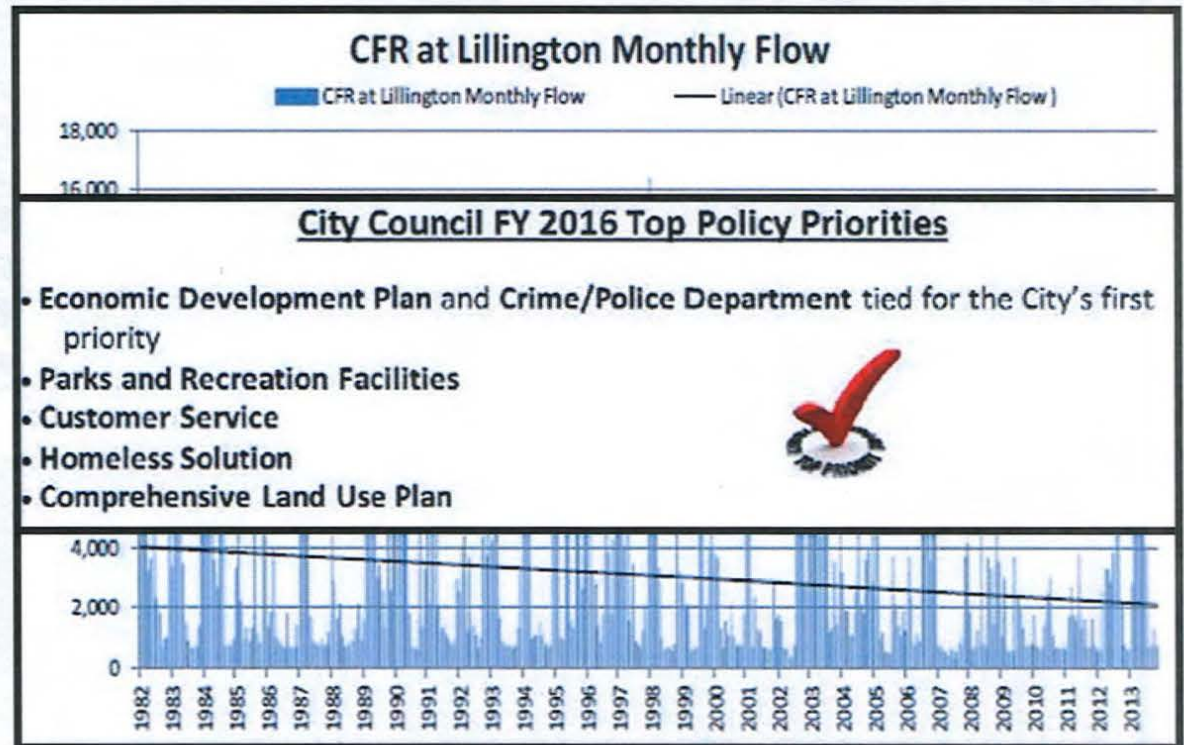

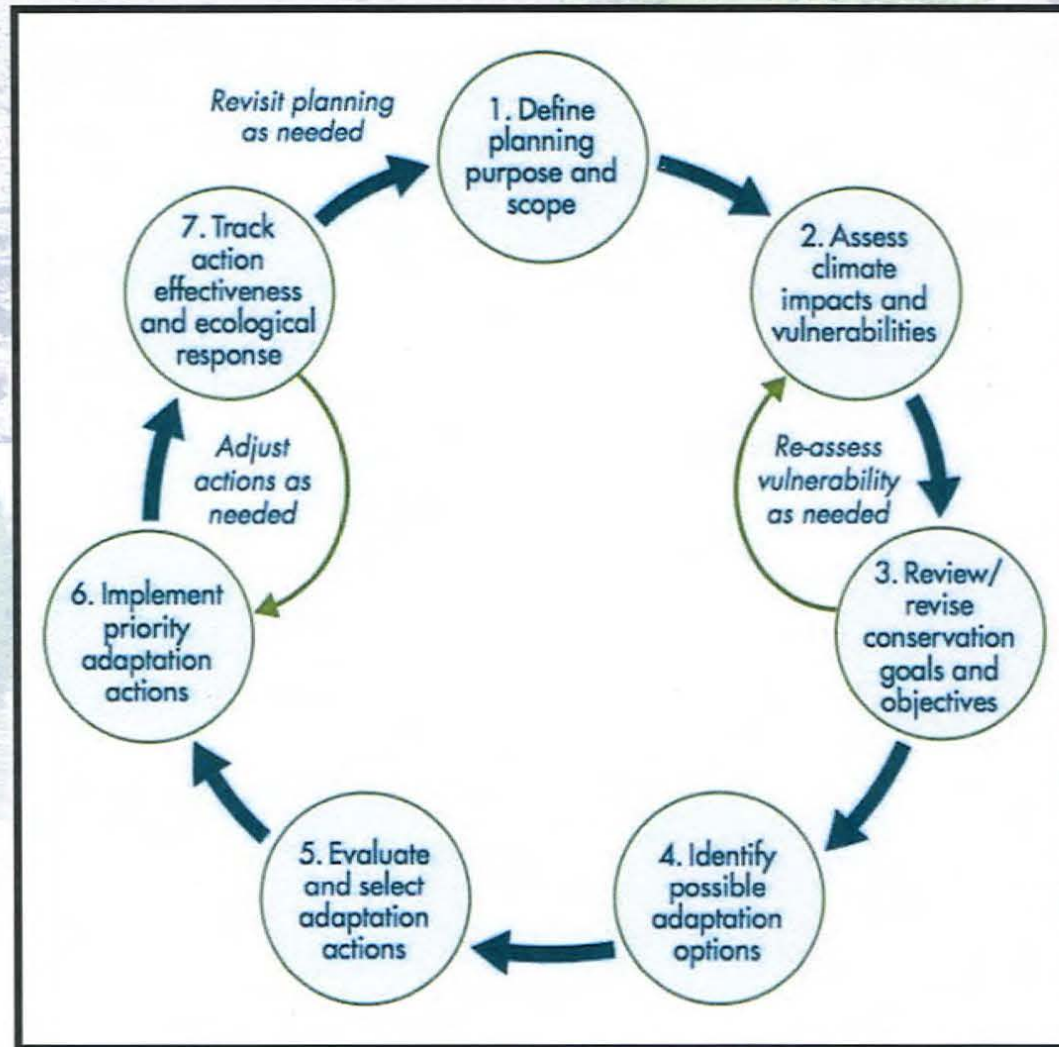

RE: Action on Tax Collector's Preliminary Report and Proposed Annual Settlement

BACKGROUND: North Carolina General Statutes, Section 105-373 requires the Tax Collector of Cumberland County after the 1st day of July of each year to render a preliminary report to the Board of County Commissioners concerning persons whose tax liabilities remain unpaid and to propose an annual settlement of taxes charged to him for collection for the past year. The Tax Collector has submitted such preliminary report and proposed settlement. The preliminary report consists of (i) a list of persons owning real property whose taxes for the tax year of 2015-2016 remain unpaid, (ii) a list of the persons not owning real property whose taxes for the year 2015-2016 remain unpaid (the proposed insolvent list), and (iii) a statement under oath by the Tax Collector that he has made diligent efforts to collect such taxes. The proposed settlement consists of the amounts of taxes with which the Tax Collector has been charged for the year and the amounts of credits against such charges, the real and personal property tax balance is charged to the forthcoming tax year. See Exhibits A, B and C in the County Clerk's Office.

RECOMMENDATIONS: The statute requires the Board to review the preliminary report, determine the insolvent list to be entered into the minutes, credit the Tax Collector with the insolvent list and make a settlement, i.e., approve or correct the proposed settlement. The Legal Department has reviewed for legal sufficiency.

PROPOSED ACTION: That the Board adopts the resolution attached as Exhibit D.

EXHIBIT D

Resolution accepting preliminary report of the Tax Collector, crediting the insolvent list, and approving proposed annual settlement.

Whereas, North Carolina General Statutes, Section 105-373, requires the Tax Collector of Cumberland County after the 1st day of July of each year to render a preliminary report to the Board of County Commissioners concerning persons whose tax liabilities remain unpaid and to propose an annual settlement of taxes charged to the Tax Collector for collection for the past ten years; and

Whereas, the Tax Collector has submitted such preliminary report and proposed settlement.

Now therefore, the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County hereby resolves:

1. That the preliminary report of the Tax Collector of Cumberland County, consisting of (i) a list of persons owning real property whose taxes for the preceding fiscal year 2015-2016 remain unpaid and the principal amount owned by each person; (ii) a list of the persons not owning or who have not listed real property whose taxes for the preceding fiscal tax year 2015 – 2016 remain unpaid and the principal amount owned by each person (the proposed insolvent list) and (iii) a statement under oath by the Tax Collector that he has made diligent efforts to collect such taxes, be and it hereby is, accepted;
2. That the Board hereby finds that the persons in the list of those that do not own or have not listed real property are insolvent as that term is used in G.S. 105-373, directs that the list of such person be entered into the minutes of the meeting of the Board as the insolvent list, and further directs that the amounts in such list be, and hereby are, credited to the Tax Collector in his annual settlement;
3. That the proposed settlement of the Tax Collector, appended hereto, for taxes in his hands for collection for the fiscal tax year 2015 - 2016, be and it hereby is, approved and that he be, and thereby is, charged with the amounts set forth in the settlement under the heading "Charges" and credited with the amounts set forth in the settlement under the heading "Credits".

George has never run a farming operation; however, his agricultural work (in a volunteer capacity) is second to none. Some of his most notable agricultural work contributions have been centered with Cumberland County Cooperative Extension. George is a graduate of the 1996 inaugural Extension Master Gardener class. After graduating from the class, George became a permanent fixture in the Extension office. Twenty years later, George continues to be one of our state's strongest advocates for Cooperative Extension. On most days, he can be found teaching horticulture classes, answering the Extension Master Gardener telephone hotline, serving on committees, hosting farm tours, and other various activities, all with a mission to assist Cooperative Extension and promote agriculture. GREEN thumb

For George Quigley, gardening is a hobby and a passion

George Quigley doesn't talk with his hands, so you never see them. During conversation, they are rested at his side, or in his lap, out of view. But his thumbs are green, surely. He is a "master gardener," after all.

To be a "master" anything is an accomplishment, but it's particularly impressive to master something as fickle as nature. But before you go further, Quigley corrects you. First, he points out, killing a plant is a result of your worst effort; having a garden flourish takes work, not luck. Second, a "master gardener" isn't a self-appointed title of grandeur, it's a designation handed out by the North Carolina Cooperative Extension.

"The master gardener volunteer program is an extension of the horticulture agents' ability to get to the public," Quigley said. "With only a few agents and over 100 counties, plus the Cherokee reservation, to cover, the master gardener program fills a necessary role of being trained to answer any consumer horticulture questions and responding to the public, either in a live venue or by telephone or in classes."

To become a master gardener, you must complete 55 hours of training and become certified after performing volunteer service. One gets a sense after spending time with Quigley that neither requirement took a toll — training is old hat for the retired Army officer, and volunteer work is what he does best and most often in his new post-military life.

"I've always enjoyed gardening," Quigley said. "After I retired finally, I decided to make that one of the things that I was paying back with — my talent to for being able to talk about horticulture subjects."

Quigley retired from service in 1989, then spent five years in Saudi Arabia as an advisor to the Saudi Arabian National Guard. He retired for good when he got back stateside. His calendar now is full of classes and hours in the sun. In addition

to his work with the North Carolina Cooperative Extension, Quigley teaches a class at Fayetteville Tech, volunteers at the Cape Fear Botanical Garden, and with the United Way, the Catholic Social Ministries and the local Second Harvest Food Bank.

"My wife says I need to go back to work so I can take some time off," he said with a laugh.

One can tell from Quigley's tan skin and his svelte physique that hard work and toiling in the sun aren't tasks to which he's adverse. Still, his life now is devoted to others. He admits his own garden isn't that special. It's just property. But his green thumb prints can be seen throughout Cumberland County.

"There's a lot of things I work on," he said. "My own landscape at home is just an average urban lot. It's nothing spectacular, just a few plants that are low maintenance and turf grass. But at the Agro-Expo Center we have a Master Gardener Inspiration Garden that we've been working on for six years. We're developing a little more of that each year, so we've done a lot of work there. And of course the Cape Fear Botanical Garden, we've got about 15 acres of some sort of rigorous cultivation. ... So I've got quite a few gardens I work on."

He also does consulting work for friends, although he doesn't charge. If you ask, he'll come out, look at your property, make suggestions. Actually, you don't

even have to ask. If he has a few minutes, he'll walk around, look at your yard, and offer advice. Although he has done his share of vegetable gardens, landscaping is his specialty.

"Wherever I was (stationed), I tried to do something," Quigley said. "I'd put a little garden in window boxes or containers, I did a lot of containers over the years. So I was always working a little bit in the garden."

Quigley even had a small garden in Saudi Arabia. Window boxes, of course, because the sand isn't the best place for vegetation. Still, it was a slice of nature. In fact, his handiwork is spread throughout the United States. Like a modern-day Johnny Appleseed, Quigley spread vegetation from post to post.

"The problem with the military is when you plant it you can't take it with you, you leave it there," he said. "I've always enjoyed doing that: Making it a little better, then leaving."

Quigley and his family have lived in Fayetteville for 21 years. He was raised in Upstate New York. He's always had an interest in nature, he said. Even as a kid

THREE TIPS FROM A MASTER GARDENER

1. Find what you like. "I like landscape plantings. I'm not big on vegetable gardening, although I've done a lot of it. My pleasure has always come from doing landscape ornamentals, choosing plants and making it all come together."
2. Make sure you don't over-fertilize, you don't over-water, you don't over-prune. "Those are major sins that people usually do wrong."
3. Select the right plant. "What is the planting site going to be: is it shady, is it sunny, is it dry, is it wet. Make sure you put the right plant material in."

March 19 – June 20, 2004: *Thinking With Blood: Conflict and Culture in the New South*

This exhibition includes three decades of contemporary work by twelve Southern artists and examines the nature of postmodern existence in the Southeastern United States. Works range through many media including some ordinarily thought the province of craft, such as ceramics and beading. The exhibition examines the resonant themes of what it is to be considered Southern in today's world and brings a new eye to bear on the New South.

May 28 – August 29: W.P.A. Puppetry

This exhibition, presented in conjunction with the Asheville Puppetry Alliance, is a fascinating look at a little known project of the WPA in the 1930s. Puppets and puppet programs were developed and presented through the Federal Theater Program during the '30s and '40s as part of FDR's New Deal, thus helping many crafters weather the Depression.

Up For Discussion Artist Talks

This informal series of artists' talks includes a slide presentation by the artist(s), a question and answer session, and a light reception. Some of the most noted artists and crafts people in WNC continue to present their work on Friday evenings at the Asheville Art Museum. Free with Museum admission, all programs begin at 6:00 pm and last approximately one and a half hours.

John C. Campbell Folk School

Week long and weekend classes year-round in traditional and contemporary arts and crafts, music, dance, cooking, gardening, writing and photography. Visitors are always welcome to stop by our 300-acre campus and visit the studios, tour the History Center where 20th century Appalachia is on display and browse through the Craft Shop, featuring the juried work of over 300 artists. He'd look at his lawn, and try and figure out how he could make it look better. His mother had a garden; though he admits it wasn't much.

"She was a terrible gardener, but she loved to garden," he said. "She did the best she could. Upstate New York is not the best sort of terrain for gardening. ... That's probably where it came from. It's in the genes."

Now Quigley devotes his life to helping people like his mother. He volunteers his time to teach people on how to make their garden grow. He offers advice, answers questions, instructs in proper technique – still, he knows that it comes down to the individual. Quigley may be a master gardener, but he, too, has had his share of failed plants.

"I certainly have had failures," he said. "You learn at a certain plant doesn't like in the sunlight, or one doesn't like it in the shade. Most plant material, if you put it right, will survive. Your worst effort will kill it."

And each Labor Day weekend, the volunteers bring their favorites to the three-day North Carolina Apple Festival to have thousands of participants evaluate them.

The festival results, along with the volunteers' findings in the orchard, influence growers' decisions about which varieties they grow, Owings explained. For example, he expects growers to begin showing more interest in Senshu, whose taste 2014 festival-goers preferred by a 10-to-1 margin over Honey Crisp, the perennial favorite that also happens to be one of the most difficult varieties to grow.

While helping the industry is a primary goal for the Master Pomology program, the volunteers have varied motivations for participating. Some simply enjoy spending time outside, learning and serving others. Others participate because they want to better enjoy fruit trees they have on their property. Bill Metts started with that intention but became so hooked that he has continued volunteering for 15 years, even though he no longer has fruit trees. He also has spread what he's

learned to others by establishing a small orchard of apples, peaches, plums and cherries for children at a local orphanage.

Still others, such as Saltz and Trey Enloe, have changed careers to farming and want to learn state-of-the-art production methods. Like Saltz, Enloe had grown up in a family that had long been involved in the apple industry. But he decided to try something new when he went to NC State University for college, majoring in engineering. He worked in that field for seven years, until his grandfather passed away in 2013.

"I was on the fence about what I wanted to do. I didn't really enjoy a cubicle and all that stuff, so I figured I'd give farming a shot," Enloe says.

When he told people that he planned to take the pomology course, some discouraged him. "A lot of people said, 'You are wasting your time. You know all that stuff,'" he says. "But that hasn't been the case at all."

Enloe, who serves as president of the Blue Ridge Apple Growers Association and on the

board of the state apple association, says his family farm has been "kind of traditional": "We didn't use a lot of plant growth regulators and things like that — not near to the extent you could use some. But here, I'm learning about the science behind what they affect and have been able to see the advantages of some and would stay away from others. And I've been successful at grafting."

"So, yes, I've definitely taken things away from the class that are important to our farm. It's all about efficiency, and if I can learn ways to save a dollar here or there," he adds, "then it's worth it." Saltz agrees. "It's been a good experience all around. It has been nice coming out here and seeing how they recommend doing things today versus how my granddaddy did it," she says. "The most important thing I learned is to respect the tree, how to take care of the tree, and that it's OK to prune to get new growth coming in. I grow fruit, not wood."

Hundreds turn out to celebrate Ag Awareness Day

March 18 was a historic day, as an estimated 1,600 people turned out at the state capital in downtown Raleigh to celebrate and raise awareness of agriculture in North Carolina, a \$78 billion business.

Ag Awareness Day was organized by the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, NC State's College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, N.C. Farm Bureau, N.C. State Grange and N.C. A&T State University's School of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences. Growers and agribusiness leaders from all over the state were encouraged to come to Raleigh and share the good news about the economic value of North Carolina agriculture and new efforts to grow agriculture to a \$100 billion industry for the state.

Elected officials from Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler to Gov. Pat McCrory addressed the crowd.

"We have the best entrepreneurs in the world right here in this audience, the people who understand the markets, the people who understand hard work, the people who understand strong work values, the people who have

business ethics," McCrory told the crowd. "These are the people right here of North Carolina, the people of agriculture. The agriculture community is leading the Carolina comeback, and I want to thank you for your hard work."

McCrory shared his "strategy to lead the agriculture comeback of North Carolina," including "filling the skills gap" by training new farmers, developing tax strategies that work for agriculture and developing environmental regulations that make sense.

"Who is the next generation of agriculture in North Carolina, when the average age of N.C. farmers is 57?" he asked. "We need young people to get into agriculture, through

our high schools, our community colleges and our universities."

"Agriculture is leading the way — it is the No. 1 most important industry in North Carolina," McCrory said. "You are the most important people in North Carolina."

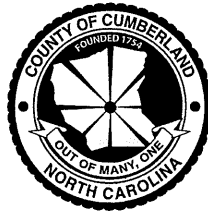

BACKGROUND:

The Public Utilities Division received and opened bids on June 17, 2016 for the construction of the Overhills Park sewer line extension. Attached is a copy of the bid tabulation prepared by the consulting engineer; McGill Associates of Pinehurst, North Carolina. The lowest responsive, responsible bid submitted was from Park Construction of NC, Inc. of Morrisville, North Carolina in the amount of \$4,308,506. The bid received was over the project budget amount and therefore negotiations began with the contractor to arrive at a mutually acceptable amount for both parties. The contractor was able to modify the unit prices due to favorable soil conditions discovered after completion of exploratory digging activities within the project area. The negotiated bid price is now \$3,600,000.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

The Engineering and Infrastructure Director and County Management recommend that the Board of Commissioners vote to approve the following recommendations contingent upon Local Government Commission and USDA approval.

1. Accept the bids for the construction of the Overhills Park Sewer Line Extension.
2. Approve the attached Memorandum of Negotiation.
3. Award a contract to the lowest responsive bidder, Park Construction of NC, Inc., in the amount of \$3,600,000.

On June 17th, 2016, two (2) bids were received and opened in the second floor courtroom at 130 Gillespie Street in Fayetteville for the above referenced project. The two (2) bids were allowed to be opened in accordance with North Carolina bidding laws because the project was re-advertised for bids after unsuccessfully receiving three (3) bids on June 7th.

The project includes the construction of a new wastewater collection system to serve the Overhills Subdivision, including approximately 17,500 LF of 8" gravity sewer lines, two (2) lift stations and related appurtenances. The low base bid was submitted by Park Construction of NC, Inc. from Morrisville, North Carolina in the amount of \$4,308,506.00. The submitted bids are summarized in the attached Certified Bid Tabulation.

On July 19, 2016, Park Construction staff met with Cumberland County and McGill staff to discuss potential reductions to their bid amount. After digging several test pits in the project area to observe both soil and groundwater conditions, Park Construction offered to reduce their total bid amount to \$3,600,000.00 without reducing the scope of the project. A Memorandum of Negotiation in USDA format documenting this change is attached for your reference.

Park Construction of NC, Inc. is appropriately licensed with the North Carolina General Contractor Board, and appears to be capable of performing the work associated with this project. Therefore, McGill Associates recommends that the Overhills Park Water and Sewer District award the Overhills Subdivision Wastewater Service project to Park Construction of NC, Inc. in the total revised bid amount of \$3,600,000.00 subject to approval by USDA-Rural Development, the Local Government Commission and other applicable agencies.
