BACKGROUND

The purpose of this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is to establish procedures surrounding the Work First/Child Protective Services/Substance Abuse (WF/CPS/SA) assessment services and facilitate appropriate Mental Health/Substance Abuse (MH/SA) services to parents and caretakers of children in order to better assure the safety, permanence and well-being of children where there has been substantiated child abuse, neglect and/or dependency or when the need for Child Protective Services has been identified and substance abuse or mental illness has been a factor in the maltreatment.

There is no monetary value attached to this MOA. However, CCDSS and Alliance Behavioral Healthcare currently have a contractual agreement whereas Alliance Behavioral Healthcare agrees to reimburse CCDSS a total of \$83,600.00 for the cost of two (2) Substance Abuse workers and one (1) on-site supervisor.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the Memorandum of Agreement between CCDSS and Alliance Behavioral Healthcare.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (hereinafter "MOA"), is made and entered into this the <u>1st</u> day of <u>July</u>, 2015 by and between the County of Cumberland, a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina by and through its department of Cumberland County Department of Social Services (hereinafter "CCDSS") and Alliance Behavioral Healthcare, a multi-county Local Management Entity/Managed Care Organization ("LME/MCO") existing under the provisions of N.C.G.S. Chapter 122C (hereinafter "Alliance").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, substance abuse and mental health issues are significant barriers to employment for a number of adult Work First participants; and

WHEREAS, the Work First/Child Protective Services/Substance Abuse (WF/CPS/SA) Initiative provides early identification of a substance abuse disorder(s) or a mental illness that will affect the WF/CPS consumer's ability to secure and maintain employment through screening (AUDIT, DAST-10), assessment, and referral and case management services to the eligible populations to be served; and

WHEREAS, the WF/CPS/SA Initiative also facilitates substance abuse services and mental health services to parents and caretakers of children, where there has been substantiated child abuse, neglect and/or dependency, or an identified need for services related to the caretaker's substance abuse, in order to better ensure the safety, permanence and well-being of children; and

WHEREAS, the services for WF/CPS/SA-involved families provided under this Agreement include assessment, referral, collaboration to ensure that barriers to receiving treatment are addressed and that the requirements of G.S. 108A-25.2 and G.S. 108A-29.1 (Appendix A) are adhered to, case consultation, follow-up, training, and other activities approved by the Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services (DMH/DD/SAS); and

WHEREAS, CCDSS is to conduct WF/CPS/SA Assessments, refer consumers for medically necessary treatment when applicable and provide care coordination and other Services as outlined herein; and

WHEREAS, to assist Work First participants in becoming employed and maintaining employment, CCDSS will screen all Cumberland County eligible Work First adult applicants/recipients for possible substance abuse, and such individuals may also be voluntarily screened for mental health issues; and

WHEREAS, if the screening indicates the adult is at risk for substance abuse, he/she will be assigned a WF/CPS/SA Assessment professional to conduct a comprehensive substance abuse assessment and facilitate arrangements for medically necessary treatment where appropriate; and

WHEREAS, Work First Participants who do not comply with their treatment plan are not eligible for Work First cash assistance.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the Parties to this MOA agree as follows:

I. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is to establish procedures surrounding the WF/CPS/SA Assessment services and facilitate appropriate MH/SA services to parents and caretakers of children in order to better assure the safety, permanence and well-being of children, where there has been substantiated child abuse, neglect and/or dependency or when the need for Child Protective Services has been identified and substance abuse or mental illness has been a factor in the maltreatment.

II. TERM:

The term of this MOA shall be **July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016** unless sooner terminated as provided herein.

III. TERMINATION:

- A. Termination of this MOA under the terms set forth below shall not form the basis of any claim for loss of anticipated profits by either Party.
- B. Termination for Convenience. This MOA may be terminated, without cause, by any Party upon sixty (60) days' written notice to the other Party.
- C. Termination for Default. Alliance may, by written notice to CCDSS, terminate the whole or any part of this MOA immediately, if:
 - (i) CCDSS has breached any provision of this Agreement; or
 - (ii) CCDSS is in violation of any law, rule or regulation; or
 - (iii) CCDSS fails to timely provide and/or satisfactorily perform any task, deliverable, service, or other work required under this MOA, including but not limited to timely submission of required reports, records or documentation; or
 - (iv) CCDSS is no longer eligible to provide the Services required under this MOA.
- D. Opportunity to Cure. Upon a determination that Contractor meets a condition of Default, Alliance will offer CCDSS the opportunity to cure by providing CCDSS with written notice of the material breach, specifying the breach and requiring it to be remedied within, in the absence of greater or lesser specification of time, seven (7) calendar days from the date of the notice; and if the breach is not timely cured, terminate the MOA, effective immediately upon written Notice of Termination. CCDSS shall not be entitled to any form of injunctive relief if this MOA is terminated by Alliance.

- E. Consequence of Termination. In the event that Alliance terminates this MOA in whole or in part as provided in Section III (B) or III (C) above, the State contract, for Work First services, between Alliance and CCDSS shall terminate as well. Alliance may also: (1) deduct any and all expenses incurred by Alliance for damages caused by the breach; and/or (2) pursue any of its remedies at law or in equity, or both, including damages and specific performance; and/or (3) procure, upon such terms and in such manner as Alliance may deem appropriate, Services similar to those so terminated. CCDSS shall be liable to Alliance for any and all excess costs incurred by Alliance, as determined by Alliance, for such similar Services. CCDSS shall continue the performance of this Contract to the extent not terminated under the provisions of III (B) or III (C).
- F. Contingent upon Funds Appropriation. It is agreed by the parties that all obligations under this MOA shall terminate if funds for continuation are not appropriated.

IV. NOTICE:

All notices which are required or permitted to be given to the Parties under the terms of this agreement shall be sufficient in all respects if given in writing and delivered in person, by overnight courier, or by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, to the receiving party at the following address:

V. CCDSS AGREES TO:

- A. Provide up to 1.46 Licensed Clinical Addictions Specialists, clinicians licensed in other regulated professions who provide substance abuse services in the normal course of the practice of their profession, or other qualified staff, who are working toward licensure and whose professional development plan have been approved by NCDMHDDSAS' Project Manager for WF/CPS/SA Initiative Qualified Professional to conduct WF/CPS/SA Assessments.
 - Provide Comprehensive Clinical Assessment (CCA) and/or SUDDS 5 for Work First (WF) and/or Food and Nutrition Services applicants and recipients who have been referred according to established Work First and/or Food and Nutrition Services state policies.
 - Provide Comprehensive Clinical Assessment (CCA) and/or SUDDS 5* for Child
 Protection Services (CPS) referrals as applicable.
- B. Screen all eligible Cumberland County Work First applicants for possible substance abuse or dependence and mental illness using the designated screening tools (AUDIT, DAST-10).
- C. Explain to the individual the nature of the WF/CPS/SA assessment and the services provided.
- D. Schedule assessment appointment if deemed appropriate.
- E. Refer consumer for substance abuse treatment or mental illness treatment when the assessment indicates medical necessity criteria for services.
 - Provide information about SUD, treatment and referral to treatment for individuals referred as a result of DAST-10 and/or criminal conviction involving controlled substances in the past 3 years.

- F. Provide care coordination for the consumer while receiving substance abuse or mental health services.
- G. Offer available child care and transportation resources for consumers with children receiving substance abuse services.
- H. Include substance abuse treatment recommendations in the Family Services Case Plan.
- I. Provide ongoing collaboration and consultation regarding decisions affecting substance abuse treatment outcomes or mental illness outcomes and/or child safety, including participation on an Adult Wellness and Recovery Team, if one exists, or a Child and Family Team.
- J. Inform the consumer about the method of payment for substance abuse treatment or mental health treatment in the event the consumer must bear any of the cost.
- K. Provide the assigned Alliance Provider Network Development Specialist with a monthly report that lists name of recipient, referral source, all direct contacts with the WF/CPS/SA Assessor, and the outcome of the assessments and treatment progress.
- L. Designate a staff person to serve as liaison under this Memorandum of Agreement. The Work First Program Manager serves in this capacity.

VI. ALLIANCE BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE AGREES TO:

- A. Provide oversight and monitoring of CCDSS to ensure compliance with WF/CPS/SA Initiative requirements through ongoing reporting and monitoring.
- B. Authorize medically necessary treatment for consumers referred by CCDSS in accordance with Medicaid Clinical Coverage Policies, State Service Definitions, the State Plan for Medical Assistance, the NC Medicaid 1915 (b)/(c) Waiver and Clinical Practice Guidelines, and within County and State-funded service fiscal limitations as applicable.

VII. CONFIDENTIALITY, SECURITY AND PRIVACY OF HEALTH INFORMATION.

All Parties are required to comply with any and all laws relating to privacy and/or security of protected health information ("PHI") or other healthcare, public assistance or social services information, including but not limited to the Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and its implementing regulations, 45 CFR Parts 160, 162 & 164, as further expanded by the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act (HITECH Act), which was adopted as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, commonly known as "ARRA" (Public Law 111-5) and any subsequent modifications thereof, the Substance Abuse Confidentiality regulations set forth in 42 CFR Part 2, N.C.G.S. § 122C-51, et seq., N.C.G.S. § 108A-80,10A NCAC Subchapter 26B, and DMH/DD/SAS Confidentiality Rules published as APSM 45-1 (effective January 2005).

RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES:

All Parties shall be independent contractors of each other Party, and nothing herein shall be construed as creating a partnership or joint venture; nor shall any employee of any party be construed as employees, agents, or principals of any other party hereto.

VIII. ENTIRE AGREEMENT:

This MOA shall constitute the entire Agreement between the County and Alliance for the services, activities and functions addressed herein, and may only be amended by a separate writing mutually agreed upon and signed by both parties.

IX. CONTROLLING LAW:

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of North Carolina and any applicable federal confidentiality or clients' rights laws. The venue for initiation of any action arising under this MOA shall be in the Superior Court of Cumberland County, North Carolina.

X. SEVERABILITY:

Memorandum of Agreement

If any provision of this MOA shall be declared invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of the MOA shall continue in full force and effect, and such invalid or unenforceable provision(s) shall be limited or curtailed only to the extent necessary to make such provision valid and enforceable.

XI. E-VERIFY REQUIREMENTS

To ensure compliance with the E-Verify requirements of the General Statutes of North Carolina, all contractors, including any subcontractors employed by the contract(s), by submitting a bid, proposal or any other response, or by providing any material, equipment, supplies, services, etc., attest and affirm that they are aware and in full compliance with Article 2 of Chapter 64, (NCGS 64-26(a)) relating to the E-Verify requirements.

XII. CONSTRUCTION

The Parties have participated jointly in the negotiation and drafting of this MOA. If any ambiguity or question of intent or interpretation arises, this MOA shall be construed as if drafted jointly by the Parties, and no presumption or burden of proof shall arise favoring or disfavoring any party by virtue of the authorship of any of the provisions of this MOA.

XIII. ADDITIONAL ASSURANCES.

Each Party agrees to perform all further acts, and execute, acknowledge and deliver any and all documents, which is reasonably necessary to confirm, complete or effectuate the provisions of the MOA.

XIV. ASSIGNMENT.

This MOA is non-assignable and non-transferrable. Any attempt by either Party to assign or sub-contract its obligations hereunder to other entities shall be void.

XV. NO THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY CONTRACT RIGHTS CONFERRED.

Memorandum of Agreement

Nothing in this MOA shall be construed as creating or justifying any liability, claim or cause of action, however alleged or arising, by any third party against Alliance or the County.

APPENDIX A

§ 108A-29.1. Drug screening and testing for Work First Program applicants and recipients.

(a) The Department shall require a drug test to screen each applicant for or recipient of Work First Program assistance whom the Department reasonably suspects is engaged in the illegal use of controlled substances. The Department shall provide notice of drug testing to each applicant or recipient. The notice shall advise the applicant or recipient that drug screening, and testing if there is reasonable suspicion that an individual is engaged in the illegal use of controlled substances, will be conducted as a condition of receiving Work First Program assistance, and that the results of the drug tests will remain confidential and will not be released to law enforcement. Dependent children under the age of 18 are exempt from the requirements of this section. The Department shall require the following:

(1) That for two-parent households, both parents comply with the requirements of this section.

(2) That any teen parent who is emancipated pursuant to Article 35 of Chapter 7B of the General Statutes complies with the requirements of this section.

(3) That each applicant or recipient be advised before drug testing that he or she may inform the agent administering the test of any prescription or over-the-counter medication he or she is taking.

(4) That each applicant or recipient being tested signs a written acknowledgement that he or she has received and understood the notice and advice provided under this subsection.

(5) That each applicant or recipient who fails a drug test understands that he or she has the right to take one or more additional tests at his or her own expense.

(6) That each applicant or recipient who fails a drug test be provided with information regarding substance abuse, substance abuse counseling, and substance abuse treatment options, including a list of substance abuse treatment programs that may be available to the individual.

(b) An applicant or recipient who tests positive for controlled substances as a result of a drug test required under this section is ineligible to receive Work First Program assistance for one year from the date of the positive drug test except as provided in subsections (b1) and (b2) of this section. The individual may reapply after one year. However, if the individual has any subsequent positive drug tests, the individual shall be ineligible for benefits for three years from the date of the subsequent positive drug test unless the individual reapplies pursuant to subsection (b1) or (b2) of this section.

(b1) An applicant or recipient deemed ineligible under subsection (b) of this section may reapply for Work First Program assistance after the expiration of 30 days from the date of the positive drug test if the individual can document either the successful completion of or the current satisfactory participation in a substance abuse treatment program offered by a provider under subsection (e) of this section and licensed by the Department. The applicant or recipient who reapplies for Work First Program assistance after successful completion of a substance abuse program shall pass a drug test. The cost of any drug testing and substance abuse program provided under this subsection shall be the responsibility of the individual being tested and receiving treatment. An applicant or recipient who reapplies for Work First Program assistance pursuant to this subsection may reapply one time only. (b2) An applicant or recipient deemed ineligible under subsection (b) of this section may reapply for Work First Program assistance after the expiration of 30 days from the date of the positive drug test if a qualified professional in substance abuse or a physician certified by the American Society of Addiction Medicine determines a substance abuse program is not appropriate for the individual and that individual has passed a subsequent drug test. The cost of any drug testing provided under this subsection shall be the responsibility of the individual being tested. An applicant or recipient who reapplies for Work First Program assistance pursuant to this subsection may reapply one time only.

(c) The children of any applicant or current recipient shall remain eligible for benefits, and these benefits shall be paid to a protective payee pursuant to G.S. 108A-38.

(d) The Social Services Commission shall adopt rules pertaining to the testing of applicants and recipients under this section. The Social Services Commission shall adopt rules pertaining to the successful completion of, or the satisfactory participation in, a substance abuse treatment program under subsection (b1) of this section, including rules regarding timely reporting of completion of or participation in the substance abuse treatment programs.

(e) Area mental health authorities organized pursuant to Article 4 of Chapter 122C of the General Statutes shall be responsible for administering the provisions of this section.

(f) Repealed by Session Laws 2013-417, s. 4, as amended by Session Laws 2014-115, s. 66 (c), effective March 1, 2015.

(g) For the purposes of this section, reasonable suspicion that an applicant for, or recipient of, Work First Program assistance is engaged in the illegal use of controlled substances may be established only by utilizing the following methods:

(1) A criminal record check conducted under G.S. 114-19.34 that discloses a conviction, arrest, or outstanding warrant relating to illegal controlled G.S. 108A-29.1 Page 3 substances within the three years prior to the date the criminal record check is conducted. (2) A determination by a qualified professional in substance abuse or a physician certified by the American Society of Addiction Medicine that an individual is addicted to illegal controlled substances.

(3) A screening tool relating to the abuse of illegal controlled substances that yields a result indicating that the applicant or recipient may be engaged in the illegal use of controlled substances.

(4) Other screening methods, as determined by the Social Services Commission under subsection (d) of this section. (h) Child only cases shall be exempt from the requirements of this section. (1997-443, s. 12.8; 2009-489, s. 13; 2013-417, s. 4; 2014-115, s. 66(c).)

G.S. 108A-25.2 Exemption from limitations for individuals convicted of certain drug-related felonies.

Individuals convicted of Class H or I controlled substance felony offenses in this State shall be eligible to participate in the Work First Program and food stamp program:

(1) Six months after release from custody if no additional controlled substance felony offense is committed during that period and successful completion of or continuous active participation in a required substance abuse treatment program determined appropriate by the area mental health authority; or

(2) If not committed to custody, six months after the date of conviction if no additional

controlled substance felony offense is committed during that period and successful completion of or continuous active participation in a required substance abuse treatment program determined appropriate by the area mental health authority.
