Annually, the Department of Public Safety/Department Adult Corrections Juvenile Justice makes funding available to local county governments for the purpose of funding early intervention programs/services for youth that are involved in, or may become involved in, the juvenile court system.

The local Council reviewed all proposals submitted for consideration for the 2016.2017 DACJJ projected allocation. During the Council's April meeting on Wednesday, April 13, 2016, the full Council discussed the funding requests submitted for the upcoming fiscal year. As part of that meeting, the Council voted to submit funding recommendations, outlined in Attachment A, and the FY17 annual JCPC Certification for Cumberland County and the DAC/JJ state program agreements for six local programs. The annual comprehensive planning document will be forthcoming when received from DACJJ.

Cumberland County is projected to receive \$918,508 in state dollars for fiscal year 2016.2017. Local matching funds of 20% are required in order to be eligible to receive DACJJ state funds. The County of Cumberland has contributed a portion of the required match annually. The local council gratefully acknowledges the ongoing support provided by the county.

This packet represents the funding recommendations the JCPC is making to the C.C. Board of Commissioners for their consideration. Please feel free to contact me should you have any questions or require further assistance.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The County acquired the real property with PIN 0436-02-5629 from a tax foreclosure sale in 2007 for a purchase price of \$6,300.79. The parcel consists of 212 Dallas Street Maj Pt LT 19 Helena S. Perry Property with a tax value of \$7,000. Based on the County GIS Mapping system, there does appear to be a structure on the property. Mr. Carlomar Negron on behalf of Church of God Yashab has made an offer to purchase the property for \$6,300.79, and has submitted the required deposit to the Finance Department. If the Board proposes to accept this offer, the proposed sale must be advertised subject to the upset bid process of G. S. § 160A-269. The proposed advertisement is attached.

## 2. PRESENTATION BY MISSION CRITICAL PARTNERS ON A JOINT 911 CENTER WITH THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE

#### BACKGROUND:

On February 15, 2015, the Finance Committee approved funding for a Joint 911 Center Feasibility Study. This study was completed, and the results were presented to the Fayetteville-Cumberland Liaison Committee at its February 25, 2016 meeting. At that

time, representatives from Mission Critical Partners and the Schrader Group provided an overview of the study's findings and recommendations.

On April 7, 2016, the Facilities Committee agreed to have Mission Critical Partners appear at a future meeting and provide a presentation regarding the Joint 911 Center Study. A brief overview of the study will be presented at the May 5, 2016, Facilities Committee meeting along with information about the potential consolidation of City-County 911 Services.

#### RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

No action is being requested at this time. This is for information purposes only.

\*\*\*\*\*

Tracy Jackson, Assistant County Manager, reviewed the background information and recommendation recorded above. Mr. Jackson introduced Gary Loflin and Philip Penny from Mission Critical Partners.

Mr. Loflin reviewed the work accomplished by Mission Critical Partners Joint 911 Needs Assessment and Feasibility Study. Mr. Loflin stated the study analyzed the organizational structure, staffing and compensation practices of the two existing 911 centers (Cumberland County and the City of Fayetteville). Mr. Loflin further stated the study identified cooperative efforts that are currently in place and assessed the need for a joint 911 facility. Mr. Loflin stated the study provided recommendations for governance of a jointly operated center. Mr. Loflin stated the study suggested methods for cost-sharing and funding. Mr. Loflin stated the study described important programming and planning elements moving forward.

Mr. Loflin stated the study found the following reasons to have a joint 911 facility:

- The current facility is showing its age
- No room to expand current operations
- Current center does not promote optimum efficiency
- New technology requirements create challenges

Mr. Loflin stated there are similar principles with consolidation or co-location because:

- Both models (consolidation and co-location) improve operational efficiencies
- Technology and staffing resources are shared in both models
- Principles of the governance can be applied to either model
- Cost-sharing recommendation can be applied in either model

Mr. Loflin stated the study found two possible site locations for a joint 911 center:

Site Analysis #1 – Cedar Creek Business Park

- Available utilities now or in the future
- Good access
- Directly adjacent to Cedar Creek Road

- Don't know your future neighbors (vulnerability)
- Generally good buildable site

#### Site Analysis #2 – Fields Road

- Available utilities
- Possible permitting required for sewer
- All access is back to Cedar Creek Road only
- Good site for sharing with other agencies
- Generally good buildable site

Mr. Loflin stated the study recommended the following next steps:

- Establish Executive Committee
- Confirm site location
- Develop funding model
- Apply for NC-911 Board Grant

Mr. Loflin stated a 911 call today is processed the same way it was in 1968 when the first 911 call was made. Mr. Loflin further stated there are upcoming mandated technology requirements that Cumberland County needs to be ready for and will need to invest in the new technology. Mr. Loflin stated by consolidating 911 services resources would be shared so new technology would only have to be purchased one time and Cumberland County and the City of Fayetteville would share that cost.

Mr. Loflin stated an Executive Committee made up of City and County staff, Legal staff and 911 staff needs to be established to determine the site location and funding model. Mr. Loflin further stated he recommends the Executive Committee consider applying for the NC-911 Board grant. Mr. Loflin stated the NC-911 Board strongly encourages consolidation or co-location which has a significant impact on how the grant funds are distributed. Mr. Loflin further stated the criteria for grant funding is based on regionalization, consolidation or end of life equipment. Mr. Loflin stated based on size, Cumberland County and the City of Fayetteville merging together would be a significant project. Questions and discussion followed.

Commissioner Edge stated he feels the Board of Commissioners should move forward with appointing an Executive Committee and work towards consolidation with the City of Fayetteville because he feels it is the most effective and efficient way to go. Commissioner Adams stated he feels the Board of Commissioners should move forward with consolidation to avoid duplicating costs.

Ms. Cannon stated as this project moves forward some consideration should be given to reaching out to Fort Bragg because they have expressed possible interest in the project. Commissioner Adams stated he would also like to consider reaching out to Hoke County because of the hospital there and the fact that they utilize some of our ambulance services. Commissioner Keefe stated he agreed and feels we need to look at the possibility of a larger regional facility. Commissioner Keefe asked the County Manager to work towards establishing an Executive Committee to move forward with a

consolidated 911 plan. Commissioner Edge stated he requested this item be put back on the City-County Liaison agenda to be discussed further.

The consensus of the Facilities Committee was to move forward with establishing an Executive Committee with the hope to consolidate 911 services. No action taken.

Commissioner Lancaster called the meeting to order.

#### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – APRIL 7, 2016 REGULAR MEETING

MOTION: Commissioner Edge moved to approve the April 7, 2016 regular meeting minutes.

SECOND: Commissioner Keefe

VOTE: UNANIMOUS (3-0)

#### DISCUSSION REGARDING A YOUTH MISDEMEANOR DIVERSION PROGRAM 2.

#### BACKGROUND:

North Carolina is one of only two states that continue to prosecute all 16 and 17 year olds charged with criminal offenses in the adult criminal justice system. This includes minor, misdemeanor offenses such as littering, disorderly conduct, underage drinking, shoplifting, etc. These charges are considered in the same setting as more serious "adult" criminal charges such as robbery, home invasions and drugs. Many times, minor incidents involving our 16 and 17 year olds are the result of immaturity, peer pressure or acting on impulse. Simply stated, teenagers oftentimes make dumb mistakes, not attributable to criminal intent.

However, all arrests/allegations in the adult legal system can have a lifelong negative impact for a young person, even if the case is diverted or dismissed. All charges will appear indefinitely on the youth's (adult) criminal record, regardless of what the disposition in court was. This can have severe collateral consequences that can be immediate or far reaching to the youth and their family. Beyond the immediate costs associated with prosecution, there is the risk of an immediate loss of driving privileges, loss of college admission or scholarships, denial of public benefits (including financial aid for college), or loss of/inability to attain professional licensure and future employment opportunities.

Further, the prosecution of such offenses involves significant law enforcement and court resources in processing the citation/arrest.

In response to this issue, Durham County has implemented a Youth Misdemeanor Diversion Program (MDP) that offers an alternative to prosecution for 16 and 17 year old first-time non-violent offenders committing misdemeanors (with the exception of firearms offenses, sex offenses and traffic matters). Instead of formal court processing, Durham has an incident report process that, at the discretion of law enforcement, provides a 90-day diversion to avoid a first arrest for low-risk youth in Durham County, thereby keeping them out of the adult criminal justice system.

Durham's MDP has proven successful in educating and rehabilitating youth who are facing a first-time non-violent misdemeanor charge. The project provides youth a second chance at a successful life, while also preventing the unintended, long lasting and far reaching consequences of an adult criminal record. From the perspective of law enforcement and the Court system, it has significantly decreased the time and resources involved in prosecuting these cases. Cumberland County could potentially achieve similar outcomes by implementing a youth MDP comparable to the Durham model for our 16 and 17 year olds. Local law enforcement and court officials are aware of this model and are in support of implementing the program in Cumberland County.

A Youth MDP Coordinator would be needed in order to administer this program and to provide case management for our youth participants. This would be a part-time role at the program's inception, with the potential of evolving into a full-time role, depending on work demands. While some upfront funding might be needed to support this part-time role, there may be opportunities for grant funding on a limited basis to support this function.

#### RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

It is recommended that the Finance Committee:

- 1) Approve the concept of a Youth MDP for Cumberland County.
- 2) Direct staff to develop a strategy for implementing this program effective September 2016.

Commissioner Adams provided an overview of the background information recorded above and recognized Chief District Court Judge Robert Stiehl. Commissioner Adams stated he and Judge Stiehl attended a school board meeting and the Board of Education plans to approve a resolution in support of the diversion program. Commissioner Adams stated he has spoken with

municipalities, law enforcement and the Sheriff's Office and they are also on board.

Judge Stiehl stated on average he handles 25 expunctions per month which contain certain provisions under North Carolina law that allow charges to be dismissed or wiped clean. Judge Stiehl stated this theoretically allows for gainful/better employment down the road; however, in today's world of internet technology, nothing ever goes away. Judge Stiehl this means that 16 and 17 year olds now have records that they were charged and that the charges were dismissed. Judge Stiehl stated hiring or promoting authorities look at the fact these youth are charged and do not care about the end result. Judge Stiehl stated our country has seen fit to charge 16 and 17 year olds as juveniles with the exception of New York and North Carolina, with North Carolina taking the most hardened approach. Judge Stiehl stated Durham authorities are satisfied with the diversion program because the youth benefit from the lessons learned and there are financial benefits derived from not keeping the youth in the detention facility. Judge Stiehl stated the diversion program evens out across the board what is typical for most citizens which is they get in trouble, they pay a lawyer, the lawyer gets the charge dismissed and the citizen moves on in life. Judge Stiehl stated under the diversion program, there is no charge ahead of time, the individual must report in 48 hours, the individual is evaluated within seven days and put in one or more of the treatment tracks.

Judge Stiehl stated the program's coordinator/evaluator position is critical because that position assesses every individual for such things as former DSS involvement, home/life issues, educational issues, mental health issues or substance abuse issues. Judge Stiehl stated once youth are plugged into the various treatment tracks, they can then take responsibility for their actions. Judge Stiehl stated the electorate wants the community to be safe and law enforcement cannot divert some offenses such as domestic violence, fire arms and traffic. Judge Stiehl stated law enforcement officers have the discretion to make the call on the front line as to whether to keep youth out of the justice system and if youth are able to be taken out of the justice system, it will allow the courts to take their resources and better focus on their processes.

Sheriff Earl "Moose" Butler stated the Sheriff's Office favors and supports the diversion program. Commissioner Adams stated there will be a cost savings to the court system and to law enforcement, and the diversion program provides an opportunity for youth in this community to go forward without tarnish or a badge of dishonor on their record. Commissioner Adams stated law enforcement is working on offenses that will fit into the diversion program, Cumberland CommuniCare is determining programs into which youth can be steered, and Social Services is involved as is the District Attorney and even the Arts Council as a possible treatment program. Commissioner Adams stated the Durham program runs off of grants and the key to the program is the coordinator position. Commissioner Adams stated the committee that put together the concept of a youth misdemeanor diversion program for Cumberland County is looking at a September 2016 start date, although there is nothing magical about that date. Commissioner Adams stated there will likely be start up costs associated with the program and staff are working to come up with a figure and financing. Chairman Adams stated he believes it can fit within the County's budget and he urges the Board of Commissioners to support the program. Commissioner Adams also spoke to intangible cost savings.

Questions and discussion followed. Judge Stiehl stated it is important to recognize that the diversion program is a treatment model or upfront treatment approach. Judge Stiehl stated the long term benefit is that the program addresses issues and opens the first door toward rehabilitation. Commissioner Adams stated another the benefit is that youth do not come back

into the system.

Ronnie Mitchell, Cumberland County Sheriff Office Legal Counsel, stated there is a proposal to raise the juvenile age in North Carolina for court purposes, which will be a very expensive proposition for counties. Mr. Mitchell stated a youth diversion program may help delay the expense and save the taxpayers' money while they receive the protection they need. Judge Stiehl stated he felt this program will be in other jurisdictions as a common place tool within the judicial system when given the Chief Justices' appreciation for its use and benefit to citizens.

#### 3. UPDATE ON CRIME LAB

#### BACKGROUND:

Ronnie Mitchell, Cumberland County Sheriff Office Legal Counsel, will be presenting an update on the crime lab and associated statistics.

#### RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

No action required, for informational purposes only.

\*\*\*\*\*

Ronnie Mitchell, Sheriff's Office Legal Counsel, reported over the fifteen months during which the crime lab has been operational, the results have been good. Mr. Mitchell stated there was initially a backlog of 546 cases that had been pending for more than two years and once it was announced there was going to be a switch to a private lab, the state lab began to speed up their delivery services. Mr. Mitchell stated 115 cases were able to be adjudicated between the announcement and the time the cases were picked up from the state lab. Mr. Mitchell stated so essentially 246 lab specimens were initially delivered to the crime lab that worked through that backlog is less than 90 days. Mr. Mitchell stated everything was current as of 2016. Mr. Mitchell stated things have remained current, particularly with blood alcohol and blood drug identification, most of which are returned within one week instead of two years. Mr. Mitchell stated of particular importance is that within the last 15 months, 641 drug identification and quantification cases have been able to be resolved which impacts the Detention Center. Mr. Mitchell stated a cost savings has occurred in that evidence custodians no longer have to travel to Wake County to deliver substances for analysis.

Mr. Mitchell stated a drawback to the lab is cost and to date, the lab cannot be used for DNA analysis. Mr. Mitchell stated negotiations and discussions have taken place with the lab about the costs involved. Mr. Mitchell stated one of the recommendations of the lab that has not been placed in the budget is an additional \$1,100 per month to do DNA database; the lab believes this will expedite crime resolution. Mr. Mitchell stated although a specific number has not been

agreed upon, there has been talk about the lab meeting the budget proposal to include at least 30 complex cases per year for DNA analysis as part of the increased funding requested of \$30,000.

4. CONSIDERATION OF ADOPTION OF THE PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT ROLL FOR THE BULLARD CIRCLE WATERLINE EXTENSION AND SCHEDULING OF A PUBLIC HEARING

#### BACKGROUND:

The Board of Commissioners, at their August 18, 2014 meeting, adopted a Final Assessment Resolution for the Bullard Circle Waterline Extension Project. The resolution defined the term of the assessment as 15 years at 6% interest. The construction of the waterline extension throughout the Bullard Circle area is now complete, Fayetteville Public Works Commission (FPWC) has accepted the lines, and FPWC will own and operate the waterline as an extension of their existing water system. Letters were mailed to the property owners on April 12, 2016 informing them that they may now connect to the waterline and of the steps necessary to connect to the system through FPWC. The final project costs have been determined and the preliminary assessment roll prepared. A copy of the assessment roll is recorded below.

The next step is for the Board of Commissioners to adopt the preliminary assessment roll and set a date for a public hearing. It is suggested that a public hearing be scheduled for June 20, 2016 at 6:45 pm. Following the public hearing the Board of Commissioners will need to confirm the assessments for each parcel. The cost per parcel will be \$2,701.22.

5. CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF USE OF OUTSIDE COUNSEL FOR PERSONNEL POLICIES

### **BACKGROUND:**

More than 18 months ago the County Finance and IS departments began the process of financial software implementation and conversion. While the transition to the new financial software will be complete in May, the transition to the payroll / human resources software has just begun.

In preparation of the payroll / human resources software implementation, a review of personnel policies was undertaken within the past year. Certain aspects of the software rely on policy to insure that payroll will be processed correctly for all employees. Therefore, it is imperative the appropriate policies are in place and in compliance with employment law as well as the local ordinance.

Employment law encompasses a myriad of ever-changing issues including, but not limited to, health care reform, same-sex marriage, anti-discrimination practices, as well as the Federal Labor Standards Act (FLSA). Engaging outside counsel in the area of employment law will facilitate this review and the related software implementation.

The law firm of Teague Campbell has successfully worked with Cumberland County in the specialized area of workers compensation. This relationship has been very positive for the County as the firm has steered us through numerous facilitations and mediations while minimizing the financial impact of workers compensation claims. It is because of the proven track record with Teague Campbell that we once again seek to engage the firm.

The attached representation agreement represents an extremely conservative 'not to exceed' amount of \$10,000. This fee is based upon completely rewriting the County's policies, which is not anticipated at this time.

### RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

Staff recommends engaging the law firm of Teague Campbell to review proposed updates to the personnel policies for employment law compliance thus insuring software conversion is both timely and accurate. Staff further recommends a 'not to exceed' amount of \$10,000 for the engagement.

\*\*\*\*\*

Ms. Cannon stated she would like this item removed from the agenda. Ms. Cannon stated as background, in 2012 as the County worked through its classification study and plan, the recommendation was made and approved by the Board of Commissioners to remove the personnel ordinance from the County Code and make it a stand-alone ordinance. Ms. Cannon stated it was also agreed that the stand-alone ordinance needed to be updated which was a project that was going to be completed through the county attorney's office. Ms. Cannon stated as a part of that, a suggestion was made that the county manager's office create personnel policies to carry out the Board's approved ordinance.

Ms. Cannon stated late on April 29, the county attorney sent county management a draft of the personnel ordinance and indicated to her that he would now be in a position, after putting so much time into the draft ordinance, to review the personnel policies that would go with and enforce the draft ordinance. Ms. Cannon stated she is withdrawing the request to seek outside counsel for this review.

Commissioner Edge asked if this could come back in 60 days. Rick Moorefield, County Attorney, stated he felt the Board needed to adopt the ordinance before creating policies. Commissioner Adams asked that there be a review of the policies before the ordinance is adopted and stated he concurred with Commissioner Edge that the county attorney could have the policies for review within 60 days. Commissioner Adams stated the policies do not necessarily have to be approved at that time, but at least they would have been reviewed alongside the ordinance.

Ms. Cannon pointed out 60 days takes the matter into July during which there are no monthly meetings which would put the matter off until the August committee meeting and the end of August for adoption. Ms. Cannon explained the personnel policies will be a part of the next software phase with implementation of human resource policies and payroll policies. Ms. Cannon asked whether it might be possible to get Board approval of the ordinance at the second meeting in June which means the policies would have been reviewed. Mr. Moorefield stated there are no policy changes relative to the accruals of time, benefits or pay so the review can easily be completed.

MOTION: Commissioner Edge moved to have the personnel ordinance approved at the

second meeting in June with the personnel policies having been reviewed in

conjunction with the ordinance by county legal.

SECOND: Commissioner Council VOTE: UNANIMOUS (4-0)

### 6. MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

Vicki Evans, Finance Director, stated there has been a delay in reporting because the monthly finance reports are manually compiled and staff have experienced time constraints due to their involvement in the financial system conversion and the FY2017 budget process. Ms. Evans asked if an April/Year-to-Date report could be provided at the June Finance Committee meeting. Consensus followed. An update was provided on the conversion to the Munis Financials which

### BACKGROUND

The Board of Commissioners, at their August 18, 2014 meeting, adopted a Final Assessment Resolution for the Bullard Circle Waterline Extension Project. The resolution defined the term of the assessment as 15 years at 6% interest. The construction of the waterline extension throughout the Bullard Circle area is now complete, Fayetteville Public Works Commission (FPWC) has accepted the lines, and FPWC will own and operate the waterline as an extension of their existing water system. Letters were mailed to the property owners on April 12, 2016 informing them that they may now connect to the waterline and of the steps necessary to connect to the system through FPWC. The final project costs have been determined and the preliminary assessment roll prepared. A copy of the assessment roll is attached for your review.

The next step is for the Board of Commissioners to adopt the preliminary assessment roll and set a date for a public hearing. It is suggested that a public hearing be scheduled for June 20, 2016 at 6:45 pm. Following the public hearing the Board of Commissioners will need to confirm the assessments for each parcel. The cost per parcel will be \$2,701.22.

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – APRIL 7, 2016 POLICY COMMITTEE

MOTION: Commissioner Council moved to approve the minutes.

SECOND: Commissioner Adams VOTE: UNANIMOUS (4-0)

 CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF A JOINT PARTNERSHIP WITH THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE FOR FEDERAL ADVOCACY SERVICES

### BACKGROUND

Cumberland County and the City of Fayetteville would like to partner in the development of a joint federal action plan and hire consultants Leslie C. Mozingo and Ronald K. Hamm to assist with developing the strategy and providing advocacy services.

This will be a year of change on the federal front. Congressional redistricting has placed Cumberland County within two redrawn districts and a new president will be elected in November 2016. With the full board's approval, the consultants would start June 1, 2016.

The City and County would split the \$6,000 per month fees from June 2016 through February 2017. The total cost would be \$54,000 and the County's share would be \$27,000, which is available in the Governmental Affairs budget. From March 2017 through December 2017, the professional fees would be determined by the number of priority projects the partnership chooses to pursue as identified in the Federal Action Plan. Mozingo and Hamm estimate that to be \$2,000 per priority project each month.

### The scope of services includes:

- Collaborate with the Partnership's management and elected officials to develop a Federal Action Plan (FAP), including federal resources and policies to advance priorities.
- Arrange and participate in regularly scheduled conference calls to develop and discuss strategies.
- Notify the Partnership of legislation impacting local governments, federal agency announcements, White House initiatives, and other potential opportunities/threats, as well as anticipated timelines.
- Provide regular notices of federal competitive grant opportunities.
- Review and recommend improvements to competitive grant applications and develop strategies to make them more competitive and increase success rates.
- Recommend key federal contacts to make, the timing and method of communication to use, and strategies for action, in order to advance priorities.
- Develop briefing materials and talking points for meetings and phone calls with federal officials.
- Provide federal advocacy advice both proactively and in reaction to all requests from the Partnership's leadership.
- Engage with other federal advocacy associations (i.e. National League of Cities, National Association of Counties, etc.)
- Report frequently on progress and results.
- Serve as a resource to local elected officials.

Partnering with the City of Fayetteville on a Federal Action plan will assist the County with two strategic objectives: improving communications and collaboration between the County and other governmental entities and developing a flexible, proactive approach to the expansion and contraction of the military.

### RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

Approve partnering with the City of Fayetteville in establishing a federal action plan and jointly hiring Strategics Consulting and Hamm Consulting Group to perform federal advocacy services.

\*\*\*\*\*

Sally Shutt, Governmental Affairs and Public Information Officer, reviewed the background information and recommendation as recorded above. Ms. Shutt introduced Rebecca Rogers-Carter, Strategic Performance Analytics Director from the City of Fayetteville, who works with Ms. Shutt on the federal legislative agenda and the federal advocacy plan.

Ms. Shutt stated for over a decade Cumberland County, the City of Fayetteville and the Chamber of Commerce formed a partnership for a federal legislative program and annually established a federal agenda focusing on earmarks and funding sources to meet specific needs within our community. Ms. Shutt further stated over the years the process has changed and the results have continued to evolve with those changes. Ms. Shutt stated over the years there has been increased focus on competitive grants and working directly with the federal agencies. Ms. Shutt stated the past contracts were for twelve (12) months and were very broad. Ms. Shutt further stated the new proposal will provide greater flexibility.

Ms. Shutt stated this year with the Congressional redistricting and local changes with economic development, the Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Fayetteville and the Chamber of Commerce that was approved in 2013 needs to be revised. Ms. Shutt stated in the recommended proposal with Leslie Mozingo and Ronald Hamm once a federal action plan is established they will work to prevent reduction or elimination of programs that meet the needs of Cumberland County and the City of Fayetteville.

Commissioner Adams stated he does not believe we have received many tangible results from the federal lobbying efforts and he does not want to spend money and not receive anything in return. Commissioner Adams stated he would rather see payment made based on outcome. Commissioner Adams further stated he is not ready to move forward with the recommended proposal and stated it has nothing to do with the partnership with the City of Fayetteville and has more to do with the uncertainty in Washington, D.C., right now. Commissioner Keefe agreed with Commissioner Adams and stated he also believes we have not received much return from the federal lobbyist in the past. Ms. Cannon stated staff is looking for guidance on how to move forward with developing a federal agenda.

Commissioner Evans stated he does not believe this is a good time to work for federal funding. Commissioner Edge stated he would like to partner with the City of Fayetteville but he prefers that we delay any kind of federal advocacy at this point and time because there is no money available.

Ms. Cannon stated staff would withdraw this request today and let Ms. Shutt monitor the situation and work internally with the Policy Committee as we move forward closer to the election this fall 2016. Ms. Cannon further stated if staff sees a need this item will be brought back to the Policy Committee. The consensus of the Policy Committee was to delay this item until staff recommends that it be reconsidered. No action taken was taken.

Mr. Lloyd presented the case information and photos.

### 1st MOTION

The Planning and Inspections Staff recommends the board find that approval of the request for rezoning in Case No. P16-02 is consistent with the adopted comprehensive plan designated as the 2030 Growth Vision Plan, which calls for "rural" at this location because the district requested

will allow for single family dwelling units on relatively large lots in a rural area. Although the request is not entirely consistent with the South Central Land Use Plan which calls for "farmland", the requested district would restrict development to approximately one acre lots where soil conditions are suitable for septic systems.

The staff also recommends the board further find that approval of this rezoning is reasonable and in the public interest because the district requested for the subject property meets or exceeds the location criteria of the adopted Land Use Policies Plan, in that: *individual well and septic systems* are allowed, public water and sewer is not available; *could be located in any defined critical area* as defined by the Fort Bragg Small Study Area; and may be outside the Sewer Service Area.

There are no other districts suitable for this request at this location.

There were people signed up to speak in favor and in opposition of the request.

Public Hearing opened.

Mr. Tim Evans spoke in favor. Mr. Evans stated that this zoning is a little unique to him, what he would like to present to the Board is unique with this piece of property. The tract of land beside the school was given to the County for a drain fill that was part of the property. Mr. Devore inherited the property; he was retired and has gone back to work. With him not farming he felt it was in his best interest at his age to sell the land and develop it. He should be commended on the quality of houses he built across the street. This development will have smaller houses but built with the same quality.

Mr. Will Walters spoke in opposition. Mr. Walters stated that he was a property owner near the subject property. Mr. Walters is opposed to the request because A1 zoning is being changed to R30 or R40 zoning, he understands that development is coming and some areas do adhere to the R30 and R40 zoning. He understands the need for diversity zoning in a rural area, but it needs to accommodate for all with adequate infrastructure while preserving the character of the area and protect environmentally sensitive areas. Gray's Creek does not have public water, they have wells. Mr. Walters has concerns about water quality; fears there might be an increase in risk of contaminated water with the increase of septic systems and private wells. Mr. Walters presented aerial photos of the general area to the Planning Board.

Mr. Phil Edge spoke in opposition. Mr. Edge presented data sheets to the Board of the Cape Fear River, which shows the aquifer in the 1990's being drained from March 1993 to November of 1998. Higher density development will strip resources and there will be a lot of mad people, if their wells go dry. If we continue to build at such a high density we might as well let Fayetteville annex and run the water lines.

Mr. Bill Melvin spoke in opposition. Mr. Melvin said that we do need to have green spaces left in the County, and someday we are going to need this farmland that we are getting rid of. We could do better than what we are doing.

Mr. Joe Curle spoke in opposition. Mr. Curle stated that he wants to preserve agricultural quality of life in Gray's Creek. Mr. Curle's biggest concerns are environmental; there is already a huge demand on the available septic and water resources. Mr. Curle is also concerned about the

possibility of contaminated water and the increase in traffic that this new development would create.


Ms. Rebecca Horn spoke in opposition. Ms. Horn stated that she had concerns with property value. Rezoning will put smaller houses around her property and would affect the impact of the value of her property. Ms. Horn also had concerns about the increase in traffic that this would create. Ms. Horn asked that the request be denied.


Mr. Evans spoke in rebuttal. Mr. Evans stated that he agreed with a lot of what was said. This request wasn't what he recommended, it was what the applicant wanted. But it was probably because when you bring a road into A1 the cost is high. The water and sewer problem is the County's problem, they elected not to bring it out there, fight that with them. The growth is coming and the fight is going to continue.

#### Public hearing closed.

Vice-Chair Morris said that this has been a discussion that the Board has had for a while; you have a farmer that owns his farm and gets between \$65 and \$85 an acre and a developer due to the expansion of Fayetteville and the expansion of urban areas comes along, and offers \$12,000 - \$20,000 an acre, economically he's placed in a position where he's not going to make that kind of money farming it, ever. It's a conflict between the rural and urban environments. Mr. Morris looks at the uses, what uses are occurring in A1 or could occur that are not going to be suitable for the community. In A1 that could be outdoor recreation, a paintball course. Mr. Morris asked how many Class A or Class B trailers could go out there. Mr. Lloyd responded 12 or 13. In R40 those are stick built homes on 1 acre lots and typically, they hold their values and it's a heavy step up in the restrictions going from A1, where you can actually put a convenience store, to single family, stick built residential. This is what's happening as our urban forces move out into the rural areas and retiring farmers or folks who inherited land, it's part of the economics of what we're dealing with. When those economic constraints hit the Planning Board Mr. Morris has a tendency to look at the most appropriate uses within the ordinance and for this to go from A1, an unrestricted use, to R40, a restrictive use, it's not what all communities want to see, but it is a reality that we've been seeing for 15 years up here.

After further discussion Mr. Morris made both of the motions referenced above, seconded by Mr. Cain, to follow the staff recommendations and approve the rezoning request. The motions passed with Mrs. Wheatley, Mr. Clark, and Chair Hall voting in opposition.

### 1<sup>st</sup> MOTION

The Planning and Inspections Staff recommends the board find that approval of the request for rezoning in Case No. P16-18 is consistent with the adopted comprehensive plan designated as the 2030 Growth Vision Plan, which calls for "urban fringe" at this location because the districts requested will allow for single family dwelling units on relatively large lots in a suburban area as well as a limited list of convenient commercial uses to ensure essential services for the area residents. The request is consistent with the Southwest Cumberland Land Use Plan, which calls for "suburban density residential" uses at this location.

The staff also recommends the board further find that approval of this rezoning is reasonable and in the public interest because the district requested for the subject property meets or exceeds the location criteria of the adopted Land Use Policies Plan, in that: septic system allowed, public sewer is not available; must have direct access to a public street, Roslin Farm Road is a public street; must not be located in any defined critical area as defined by the Fort Bragg Small Area Study.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> MOTION

In addition to the above information, the Planning and Inspections Staff recommends the board approve Case No. P16-18 for the A1 Agricultural and R30 Residential districts based on the following:

 The A1 Agricultural and R30 Residential districts will allow for land uses and lot sizes that exist in the general area.

The R40 Residential district could also be found suitable at this location.

There were people signed up to speak in favor and in opposition.

Public hearing opened.

Dr. Charles Gardner spoke in favor. Dr. Gardner stated that the subject property was farmland at one time until he couldn't get anyone to farm it and let it grow into pine trees. Dr. Gardner presented a map of the property to the Board. Dr. Gardner said the reason he was requesting the zoning is because he can't build on the lot. There are some wetlands in the area, and no sewer system. He is requesting the rezoning so that he can go back for agricultural purposes.

Mr. Walter Allen spoke in opposition. Mr. Allen stated that the subject property was never farmland and has concerns about drugs and traffic. He is also concerned about water.

Dr. Gardner spoke in rebuttal. Dr. Gardner stated he understands the concerns; he is reducing the number of lots and will leave more trees.




Mr. Lloyd stated that Mr. Gardner is proposing fewer lots than are currently allowed under the present zoning.





At your last meeting, a resolution was approved which authorized the filing of an application to the LGC for this financing. The resolution also documented certain findings that are required for the transaction under G.S. 159-151. Additionally, you authorized publication of a notice of the public hearing on the proposed installment financing contract.

## RECOMMENDATION

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS SUPPORTING THE NOMINATION OF PATRICIA TIMMONS-GOODSON FOR FEDERAL COURT JUDGE

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson graduated from Pine Forest Senior High in Fayetteville, North Carolina, is married and resides in Fayetteville, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson received an undergraduate degree from UNC Chapel Hill in 1976, a Juris Doctor in 1979 from the UNC School of Law and a Master of Laws degree in Judicial Studies in 2014 from Duke University School of Law; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson served as the District Manager of the U.S. Census Bureau, served as Staff Attorney for Lumbee River Legal Services, and served as Assistant District Attorney for the Twelfth Judicial District in Fayetteville, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson was named a District Court Judge in 1984 and was subsequently elected to three four-year terms as a District Court Judge; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson was appointed by Governor Jim Hunt to the North Carolina Court of Appeals in 1997, an appointment from which she retired in late 2005; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson was appointed by North Carolina Governor Mike Easley to the North Carolina Supreme Court in 2006 and upon taking her seat, was the first African American woman to serve on the Court; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson was elected by voters to remain on the North Carolina Supreme Court in November 2006, an elected seat from which she resigned in 2012; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson was appointed by President Barack Obama to the United States Commission on Civil Rights in 2014 and served as Vice Chair of that Commission since 2015; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson was nominated by President Barack Obama on April 28, 2016, to serve as a United States District Judge of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Timmons-Goodson's nomination is currently pending before the U. S. Senate Judiciary Committee; and

WHEREAS, Cumberland County has one of the largest Federal Courthouses in the Eastern District of North Carolina, has one of the largest Federal installations and desires that a Federal Court Judge resides in Fayetteville, North Carolina.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners, offer this visible show and resolution of support for the nomination of Patricia Timmons-Goodson to become the U. 
