1) Sheriff's Office - Budget Ordinance Amendment B170254 to recognize insurance settlement in the amount of \$3,801 from Travelers

The Stoney Point Fire Department Inc., (SPFD) Board of Directors in keeping with our Apparatus Replacement Plan approved the purchase of two (2) front line fire apparatus. The plan includes 1.4 million dollars for the purchase of one (1) Engine to replace a 1981 Pierce Fire Engine and one (1) Heavy Rescue Truck to accommodate the multitude of rescue equipment required for a certified Heavy Rescue Unit. The SPFD is currently one (1) of three (3) Heavy Rescue provider departments in Cumberland County, along with Eastover and Fayetteville; with Cotton, Godwin-Falcon and Vander providing Medium Rescue services.

This will be our first new apparatus purchase since purchasing two (2) front line Pierce Fire Engines in 2004, which are our newest front line apparatus. Our remaining Engine Companies are all over thirty years old. Our two (2) new fire apparatus are designed specifically for the diverse needs of our local county-wide demands, and will be part of our core fire defense and rescue systems.

In order to acquire financing the Board of Directors approved to secure a non-profit low interest tax-exempt loan with First Citizens Bank. Part of the process requires the advertisement of a public hearing, which has been set for Wednesday November 2, 2016 at 7:30 PM at Station 19, our corporate office. The loan process also requires approval from both the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners, and because we also have a contract for service with the City of Fayetteville, approval from the City and Mayor's Office is necessary. (Applicable approval forms provided by FCB are attached for your information).

Our department has obtained similar BOC approval documentations in the past for previous apparatus and facility construction loans. In the past these transactions were part of the consent agenda item, but please don't hesitate to contact me for additional questions or clarification concerning the purchase and financing of our replacement apparatuses.

On behalf of our Board of Directors and our membership thank you in advance for your much needed assistance.

Judge Stiehl's Proposal for Renovations to the Second Floor of the Courthouse

1) Create an additional Juvenile Court Hearing Room; this will help make the Juvenile Court process more efficient by utilizing Room 207-B as a new hearing room; will require the construction of a raised dais, installing a door from the waiting area into the hearing room, and furniture for a clerk, judge and security detail; need by January 1, 2017.

- a. Also, use the small hallway that exits near the Ladies Room next to Courtroom 206 as a holding area for juvenile detainees; *will require code-compliant egress*
- 2) Create a new office in order to get all District Court Judges on the second floor; utilize a portion of Conference Room 211-A for this purpose (the remainder of the conference room would remain; involves removing the bookshelves from a portion of conference room and creating a doorway to the existing office suite hallway; will need a smaller conference room table (might be able to utilize the table currently in Room 207-B); need in a reasonable amount of time (this fiscal year if possible)
- 3) Add cubicles on the wall of break room 208 for DSS staff to store personal belongings (DSS staff being displaced from Room 207-B; need in a reasonable amount of time (this fiscal year if possible)
- 4) Take the office vacated by the judge on the 3rd floor, and move to the 2nd floor conference room 211-A, and create a break room for District Court Staff; need in a reasonable amount of time (this fiscal year if possible)
- 5) Decrease the size of Judge Stiehl's office by moving a wall in order to create a large office storage/work area next to his office; create a mailbox pass-through from the lobby area to an adjacent hallway; add electrical & phone line for a fax machine adjacent to the receptionist area; need in a reasonable amount of time (this fiscal year if possible)

Tracy Jackson, Assistant County Manager, reviewed the background information, recommendation, Second Floor Renovation Estimates and Judge Stiehl's Proposal for Renovations to the Second Floor of the Courthouse as recorded above. Mr. Jackson stated the most immediate need at this time is a new juvenile court hearing room. Mr. Jackson stated the other requests could be completed depending on the budget. Questions and discussion followed.

Commissioner Edge stated the total cost of the renovations are estimated to be around \$35,000 and wanted to know if there is anything that can be done to reduce the total cost. Mr. Jackson stated if the sprinklers did not have to be moved that could help cut down on the total cost. Judge Stiehl asked if it would help the committee if he worked to prioritize the four specific areas and then broke them down with an individual cost and the Facilities Committee agreed this would be helpful.

The consensus of the Facilities Committee was for Judge Stiehl to work with County Management and the Engineering and Infrastructure Department to prioritize the four areas of renovations and list the cost of each individual renovation to help determine what

needs to be done and when and bring it back to the Facilities Committee at a later date. No action taken.

3. CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF CONTRACT TO REPLACE THE ROOF FOR THE COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS CENTER

BACKGROUND

The Engineering & Infrastructure Department worked with a consultant to complete roof assessments for all County facilities in the spring of 2015. It was determined that the Community Corrections Center facility located at 412 W. Russell Street needed to have the roofing membrane replaced for all sections of the roof, and this roofing need Center has been identified as a priority for completion. At the August 17, 2015 Board of Commissioners meeting, the Board approved a reimbursement resolution for capital projects in which the County would fund certain projects on the front end and then reimburse ourselves once an installment financing plan is approved. The Board of Commissioners also approved a budget revision at its December 3, 2015 meeting to coincide with the reimbursement resolution.

Informal bids were received on October 27, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. for the Community Corrections Center roofing project. The letter of recommendation from Atlas Engineering, Inc. is recorded below.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION

The Engineering and Infrastructure Director along with County Management recommend that the Facilities Committee approve the following recommendations and forward them to the Board of Commissioners for its consideration at their next scheduled meeting.

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – OCTOBER 6, 2016 FINANCE COMMITTEE REGULAR MEETING

2. UPDATE ON FY16 ANNUAL AUDIT STATUS

BACKGROUND:

The contracted due date for the annual audit is October 31 for June 30 year-end audits. The Local Government Commission does allow a "grace period" that typically ends around

December 1 but that date may be extended if circumstances warrant.

This year it is believed we may not meet the December 1 "grace period" deadline. Finance staff have been working diligently to complete assignments for the FY16 audit while continuing to remain on schedule with all aspects of the financial system conversion. The additional work involved in going live with the payroll system conversion in early October, additional reconciliations required as a result of within-year conversion, and (to a small extent) the impact of Hurricane Matthew have all played a part in causing us to fall behind in our audit schedule. Staff have been committed to ensuring data and reporting accuracy rather than on rushing through the audit process to meet a deadline. Throughout the audit process, communication has been open with Cherry Bekaert staff who have been flexible and completely understanding and have worked with us to accommodate our schedule as needed.

Based on current work load, a conservative estimate is that the audit will be completed and sent to the LGC no later than December 31. As a precaution, because it is believed we have circumstances that warrant an extension, the Finance Director recently spoke with staff of the LGC who advised that we take no action at this time because a potential automatic extension from the LGC is forthcoming. In the event that does not happen, please be aware a contract extension will have to be executed. No additional cost is anticipated.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

No action needed – for information purposes only.

Vicki Evans, Finance Director, reviewed the background information recorded above and stated the potential automatic extension forthcoming from the LGC will be statewide. Ms. Evans stated this update is to let the Finance Committee know the status of the FY16 audit because it is not where it has been for the past three years. Ms. Evans stated because this is for informational purposes, no action is needed.

3. HURRICANE MATTHEW REIMBURSEMENT AND RECOVERY CONSIDERATIONS

A. APPROVAL OF THIRD PARTY CONSULTANT FOR FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) REIMBURSEMENT

BACKGROUND:

A request for proposal (#17-14-ES) was issued on Monday, October 24, seeking qualified firms to provide FEMA public assistance program consulting in response to Hurricane Matthew. Responses are due back to the County on Friday, October 28 at 1 PM. A list of the primary tasks within the RFP included:

- Coordinate and develop all project work sheets as required documentation requirements of FEMA
- Assist to resolve Insurance and possible duplication of funding issues
- Assist in getting the necessary legal documents for proper filing

- Advise the County on document retention strategies
- Coordinate with the County staff to obtain all cost and necessary backup documentation to develop, revise and submit Project worksheets
- Coordinate with FEMA representatives to provide additional information needed to quickly process worksheets
- Track status of FEMA reimbursement and serve as a co-liaison between FEMA and the County
- Prepare the necessary reports to FEMA and assist the County with extension requests
- Advise the County on the management of the closeout process
- Assist the County in responding to Request for Information requests from FEMA
- Advise the County on handling disputed issues with FEMA/State Staff
- Provide detailed and periodic management reports on the status of Project Worksheets including developments, revisions, submissions/approvals, open issues, financial overview, etc.
- Provide Cash Management reports showing the projected schedule for reimbursement requests and the actual status of reimbursements received
- Provide the County accurate and current analysis on FEMA regulations and best strategies for maximizing reimbursements and to secure other funding sources when applicable, possibly grants
- Develop a process/system to efficiently submit Federal grant applications, identify eligible projects, capture costs, prepare cost reports, reconcile invoices, and closeout projects
- Attend meetings with relevant local, state, and federal officials to address eligibility and process issues, at the request of the client
- Proactively identify and resolve issues that may arise related to the funding of work completed or to be completed
- Obtain, analyze and gather field documentation, including gathering relevant records in order to extract pertinent information necessary for submittal including timekeeping and staff assignment records
- Review all data and supporting documentation to determine whether costs appear eligible and are adequately supported
- Evaluate and assist in the formulation of FEMA PA Emergency and Permanent Work Project Worksheets. This will involve expertise in Cost Estimating, developing Detailed Damage Descriptions and Dimensions (DDDs) and a project's Scope of Work (SOW)
- Prepare first and second appeals, and arbitration as required
- Monitor reconstruction efforts, actual versus Project Worksheet scope of repair, and progress payments
- Perform Project Worksheet closeouts
- Respond to audit findings, as required

After bid opening but before the Finance Committee meeting, the RFP responses will be reviewed. For the Finance Committee meeting, summary information regarding the responding top qualified firms will be presented along with a Management recommendation for a contract.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

Management will be requesting approval of the recommended vendor to provide FEMA public assistance consulting services and approval to move forward with contract approval during the November 7th Board of County Commissioners meeting.

In addition to the information recorded above, Ms. Evans reviewed the following background information handed out at the meeting to include responses to the RFP that was sent out for FEMA public assistance program consulting in response to Hurricane Matthew.

BACKGROUND:

A request for proposal (#17-14-ES) was issued on Monday, October 24, seeking qualified firms to provide FEMA public assistance program consulting in response to Hurricane Matthew. Responses were received on Friday, October 28. The county received responses from five separate companies. Hourly rate comparisons are shown below:

All costs proposed are to be inclusive of labor, materials, equipment, incidentals, etc. necessary to provide the scope of services outlined in the RFP. Rates proposed are also to include all expenses, including general overhead, equipment, field overhead, profit, travel per diem, all necessary food, water, restroom and lodging facilities needed to provide these services.

All bidders met the qualifications. However, in addition to having the most competitive overall hourly rates, IEM is also a woman-owned company and they provided the most comprehensive and specific project implementation plan and deliverables within their bid. Contingent on working out a satisfactory contract, management is recommending that a contract be awarded to IEM as a first choice and DMS Disaster Consultants as a

second choice in an amount not to exceed \$150,000 and approval of a corresponding budget revision.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

Management recommends that the Finance Committee approve moving forward to the November 7th Board of County Commissioners meeting and award the FEMA Consultant contract to IEM as a first choice (contingent upon working out a satisfactory contract) and DMS Disaster Consultants as a second choice.

General Government Other – Budget Ordinance Amendment B170033 to appropriate fund balance in the amount of \$150,000 for the FEMA Public Assistance Consulting Contract

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B170033 for FEMA contracted services in the amount of \$150,000.

Please note this amendment requires appropriation of General Fund fund balance.

Ms. Evans stated IEM had the lowest overall at \$976 compared to the second lowest submitted by DMS at \$1,007. Ms. Evans noted IEM is the only bid that lined out a date-specific time line of the entire process from start to finish. Ms. Evans stated based on that contingent on working out a satisfactory contract, Management is recommending that a contract be awarded to IEM as a first choice and DMS as a second choice not to exceed an amount of \$150,000 which will require a budget revision.

Commissioner Keefe asked how this would be paid. Ms. Cannon stated as she understands it, FEMA will reimburse 75% of the cost of the consultant and it is believed that a consultant will be valuable as it relates to some of the unique challenges created by Hurricane Matthew and the fact that FEMA guidelines have changed significantly over the past two years. Ms. Cannon stated the consultant can also help the County wade through the guidelines so it can get reimbursed.

Additional questions followed. Ms. Evans stated IEM had the best proposal submitted as far as detail and the listing of deliverables and were the only respondents who did so. Ms. Evans stated she contacted their references which were all very good. Ms. Cannon stated County Attorney Moorefield is in the process of reviewing the contract and the request of the Finance Committee is to place the contract on the November 7 agenda. Rick Moorefield, County Attorney, stated there are no significant issues with either of the low bids and he did not see any issues with IEM although there was one issue with DMS and Adjusters that could perhaps be negotiated. Ms. Cannon stated the earliest IEM can start is November 14.

Commissioner Adams inquired regarding enforcement of IEM's deliverables. Mr. Moorefield stated that can be made a condition of the contract and IEM's bid document

can be incorporated into the contract. Ms. Moorefield stated a penalty clause can also be included in the contract. Melissa Cardinali, Assistant County Manager, stated in a meeting with FEMA, they specifically said the County needs to go with the low bid, preferably MWBE, and IEM met both. Ms. Cardinali states it will likely be more problematic to present to FEMA why the County did not go with IEM.

MOTION: Commissioner Council moved to follow staff recommendation and to

include a penalty clause in the contract.

B. UPDATE ON DISASTER DEBRIS REMOVAL AND MONITORING SERVICE CONTRACTS

BACKGROUND:

As a direct result of Hurricane Matthew (DR-4285), there is an urgent need to implement the management, clearing and removal of storm-related debris throughout the unincorporated areas of Cumberland County. In a coordinated effort between the Engineering and Infrastructure Director/Interim Director of Solid Waste and the Emergency Services Director and staff, Purchasing staff recently issued two requests for proposals (RFP) seeking separate contracts for:

- 1. Disaster Management, Recovery and Consulting Services which was advertised beginning October 14 with a scheduled bid opening of October 24th at 10:00 a.m. Scope: Disaster management, recovery, and consulting services to support the oversight and management of debris recovery contractors. Contractor shall be capable of providing a range of related services including damage assessment, training, emergency planning, infrastructure restoration, and other services as needed and ordered by the County; and,
- Disaster Debris Clearance and Removal Services which was advertised beginning October 18th with a scheduled bid opening of October 26th at 10:00 a.m. Scope: Work shall consist of clearing and removing any and all "eligible" debris as defined by Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") Publication 325, all applicable State and Federal Disaster Specific Guidance ("DSG") and policies, and as directed by the debris manager. Work will include 1) examining debris to determine whether or not debris is eligible, burnable or non-burnable, 2) loading the debris, 3) hauling the debris to an approved temporary debris storage and reduction site (TDSRS) or landfill, 4) reducing the debris, 5) hauling the debris to an approved disposal facility, and 6) dumping the debris at the dumpsite or landfill. Debris not defined as eligible by FEMA Publication 325 or State or Federal DSGs or policies will not be loaded, hauled, or dumped under this contract unless written instructions are given to the contractor by the debris manager.

As of the date of this memo, Purchasing is in the process of reviewing, summarizing and tabulating all RFP results. There are still several steps remaining to reach a point where debris removal can be undertaken by the County.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

For information only. No action is requested at this time.

Tracy Jackson, Assistant County Manager, reviewed the background information recorded above and stated debris removal is heavily regulated and FEMA has a convoluted and complex process for securing reimbursement. Mr. Jackson stated as a result, the County put out RFPs for two separate contracts; overall management for debris removal and the actual hands-on removal of debris from the community as a direct result of Hurricane Matthew in accordance with FEMA rules to get the maximum reimbursement. Mr. Jackson stated staff was able to review the results from companies and consultant weigh in helped guide the County through the process.

Questions and discussion followed regarding C&D and vegetative debris pick up in the unincorporated areas. Mr. Jackson stated it will be difficult to project a schedule until a contractor is in place and the County will be put at risk with FEMA if it pays out of pocket for debris pick up, and if it partners with any municipalities who may not get FEMA reimbursed. Mr. Jackson stated the regulatory side slows the process down and makes it challenging. Ms. Cannon stated a public assistance FEMA agent, who assists local government reimbursement for expenditures, said local government contracts have to be kept separate which means FEMA will not reimburse Cumberland County and the City of Fayetteville together because it could affect FEMA reimbursement. Ms. Cannon also explained if all landfill fees are suspended, the County will not receive FEMA reimbursement because it did not incur the cost.

C. UPDATE ON OTHER RECOVERY EFFORTS

Ms. Cannon stated as an update on other recovery efforts, the County is working on mosquito spraying through the end of November to remediate issues in areas that have been hit the hardest. Ms. Cannon stated this will not be reimbursed by FEMA because of the extensive procurement process that has to be undertaken. Ms. Cannon stated the issue is now and money will be redirected internally.

Commissioner Faircloth inquired regarding eroded river banks. Ms. Cannon stated this is one of the mitigation pieces in which the County is looking to the consultant for assistance. Cecil Combs, Assistant Planning Director, spoke to erosion and sinkholes that will be difficult for the County to deal with because the lands are owned by individuals who will need geo-technical or soil engineering. Mr. Combs stated the County is taking the various situations on a case-by-case basis. A brief discussion followed. Ms. Cannon stated Mr. Jackson has reached out to NCRS and FEMA consultants may also be able to help with the mitigation piece.

4. PRESENTATION ON IMPACT OF NEW FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT (FLSA) REQUIREMENTS EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 1, 2016

BACKGROUND:

During the budget planning process for FY17, staff made the Board of Commissioners aware of pending federal requirements that could affect the overtime status of certain classes of employees. Subsequently, President Obama and the Secretary of the Department of Labor (DOL) announced the publication of the DOL's final rule updating its overtime regulations which automatically extend overtime pay protections to millions of workers within the first year of implementation. The presentation included with this memorandum will attempt to highlight the most important impacts upon Cumberland County as a result of DOL's changes to the FLSA.

The effective date of the final rule is December 1, 2016. Future automatic updates to those thresholds will occur every three years, beginning on January 1, 2020. Based upon analysis by staff, the anticipated cost to the County in FY17 will be approximately \$39,208. This amount is well below the \$100,000 budgeted prior to the release of the final rule concerning changes to the FLSA.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

No action is required. This is for information only.

Mr. Jackson reviewed the background information recorded above and stated the impact on the County has been less than initially anticipated. Dan Domico, Human Resources Analyst, who performed the hands-on analysis, provided the following presentation on the Department of Labor's new overtime rules, which falls under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) and stated Cumberland County is on track to meet the December 1 date.

Overview

New DOL Changes

- Salary threshold changing from \$455/week (\$23,660/year) to \$913/week (\$47,476/year).
- ▶ The effective date for the final rule is December 1, 2016.

Important Considerations

- Positions that make less than \$47,476 CANNOT be exempt, regardless of duties.
- ▶ Non-Exempt employees must be compensated for working overtime
 - Must be paid at time and a half for hours worked over 40 in a work week; or
 - Given time off based on OT accrued at time and a half.

 Total annual compensation for highly compensated employees (HCE) is subject to a "duties test" to the annual equivalent of the 90th percentile of full-time salaried workers nationally (\$134,004)

Questions followed. In response to a question posed by Commissioner Keefe, Mr. Domico stated a new U.S. President/Administration could change the new overtime rules instituted under President Obama.

Mr. Domico explained in order to be considered exempt, all three tests have to be met: 1) the salary basis in which one receives a fixed salary with no thinking about the quantity or quality of work, 2) the salary level of \$47,476 and 3) the duties test which is the most difficult. Mr. Domico further explained all positions had to be looked at individually and job titles were not an indication of exempt status. Mr. Domico stated options included increasing salaries to the \$47,476 threshold to maintain exempt status or make employees non-exempt to earn leave at a higher rate of time and a half.

Mr. Domico stated elected officials are not covered under the FLSA so recommendation in order to clean up the books is to take those positions away because it has no impact on elected officials who do not earn leave. Mr. Domico stated recommendation is that salaries for sixteen employees who are currently exempt be adjusted up to \$47,476 in order to maintain their exempt status and that the others go to non-exempt status because everyone could not be taken to \$47,476 as it would create system wide inequities. Mr. Domico stated the majority of employees who did change from exempt to non-exempt were in the Department of Social Services, Public Health Department and the Library.

Next Steps

- Implement the changes as a result of the updated FLSA requirements.
- ▶ Hold individual meetings with Department Heads who have staff that will be affected.
- Employees will be notified of changes in person by their department heads or supervisors.

Ms. Cannon responded to questions. Mr. Domico stated the salary threshold under the current Administration is scheduled to change every three years.

5. CONSIDERATION OF REQUEST FOR NEW POSITION IN THE COUNTY'S PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICE

BACKGROUND:

The Public Information Office, which is a section of the County Manager's Office, consists of three positions: the Governmental Affairs Officer, Public Information Specialist and Graphic Design Information Specialist II.

The three-member team is responsible for coordinating external and internal communication with the public, media and employees. The office serves as a central point for receiving and disseminating public information through various outlets, including media releases, employee newsletters, a monthly TV show, weekly newspaper column, bi-weekly newspaper section, brochures, website and social media content and other outreach materials and programs.

The Sheriff's Office has a Public Information Officer and the library system has a five-member Community Relations Department that manages its communications and outreach efforts. The Public Information Office serves all other County departments.

The Chief Public Information Director's position expanded in 2014 with a reclassification to Governmental Affairs Officer. The position became part of the County's management team. The position has operational responsibility for managing public information and governmental communications, including legislative agendas and strategic initiatives.

One of the County's strategic goals is to educate, inform and engage employees, citizens, elected and appointed officials through effective and efficient communications. In order to fulfill the objectives under this goal and better serve all County departments in sharing their message and telling the County's story, the Public Information Office needs additional capacity in the form of a Communications and Outreach Coordinator.

The new position would coordinate media relations and collaborate with the departments for press releases, videos, events and communications initiatives to ensure consistent and favorable messaging.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

Management recommends the Finance Committee approve and forward to the Board of Commissioners the following actions:

- 1. Approve the establishment of a new Communications & Outreach Coordinator position at Cumberland County salary grade 72 and
- 2. Approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B171027 in the amount of \$47,186 to fund a new position in the Public Information Office. Federal Labor Standards Act funds were budgeted at \$100,000; however, the impact of FLSA changes is expected to be just under

\$40,000 for FY17 resulting in excess funds of \$60,000. This revision will transfer excess FLSA funds of \$47,186 to the Administration personnel accounts for salary and fringe benefits.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

Sally Shutt, Public Information and Governmental Affairs, reviewed the background information recorded above. Ms. Shutt stated the goal is to be proactive in order to tell the County's story to citizens. Ms. Shutt reviewed Management's recommendations recorded above.

6. MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

BACKGROUND:

The financial report is included as of September 30, 2016. Highlights include:

- Revenues
 - O The first three months of the fiscal year show revenues as expected. Collections are generally slow in the first part of the year. However, this is consistent with rates of prior fiscal years.
- Expenditures
 - o General fund expenditures remain in line with budget and prior year trends.
- Crown center expense summary/prepared food and beverage and motel tax
 - O Spectra is reporting slightly higher income and slightly lower expenses compared with the same timeframe last fiscal year.
 - Revenues of prepared food and beverage and motel tax are consistent with prior fiscal years.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

No action needed – for information purposes only.

Ms. Evans provided highlights of the financial report for the first quarter of FY17 as recorded above and stated revenues and expenditures are consistent with prior fiscal years.

7. OTHER ITEMS OF BUSINESS

Ms. Cannon stated the new Solid Waste Director Jerod Roberts will start work on November 14 and will be introduced at the Board of Commissioners' regular meeting on November 21. Ms. Cannon provided a brief bio on Mr. Roberts.

Ms. Cannon responded to questions regarding waiver of HUD guidelines as it relates to Hurricane Matthew. Ms. Cannon stated if the County does not go through the appropriate processes, it will have an audit exception and have to pay the money back as a penalty.

INFORMATION OFFICE

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> The Public Information Office, which is a section of the County Manager's Office, consists of three positions: the Governmental Affairs Officer, Public Information Specialist and Graphic Design Information Specialist II.

The three-member team is responsible for coordinating external and internal communication with the public, media and employees. The office serves as a central point for receiving and disseminating public information through various outlets, including media releases, employee newsletters, a monthly TV show, weekly newspaper column, bi-weekly newspaper section, brochures, website and social media content and other outreach materials and programs.

The Sheriff's Office has a Public Information Officer and the library system has a five-member Community Relations Department that manages its communications and outreach efforts. The Public Information Office serves all other County departments.

The Chief Public Information Director's position expanded in 2014 with a reclassification to Governmental Affairs Officer. The position became part of the County's management team. The position has operational responsibility for managing public information and governmental communications, including legislative agendas and strategic initiatives.

One of the County's strategic goals is to educate, inform and engage employees, citizens, elected and appointed officials through effective and efficient communications. In order to fulfill the objectives under this goal and better serve all County departments in sharing their message and telling the County's story, the Public Information Office needs additional capacity in the form of a Communications and Outreach Coordinator.

The new position would coordinate media relations and collaborate with the departments for press releases, videos, events and communications initiatives to ensure consistent and favorable messaging.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

At its November 3, 2016, meeting, the Finance Committee approved forwarding the recommendations outlined below to the full Board of Commissioners:

- 1. Approve the establishment of a new Communications & Outreach Coordinator position at Cumberland County salary grade 72; and,
- 2. Approve **Budget Ordinance Amendment B171027** in the amount of \$47,186 to fund a new position in the Public Information Office. Federal Labor Standards Act funds were budgeted at \$100,000; however, the impact of FLSA changes is expected to be just under \$40,000 for FY17 resulting in excess funds of \$60,000. This revision will transfer excess FLSA funds of \$47,186 to the Administration personnel accounts for salary and fringe benefits.

- (1) That the real property on which the work was performed be, and it hereby is, assessed in the amount of \$2,900.00, said sum being the unpaid balance of the cost of the work set forth in the Inspector's Report;
- (2) That as provided in the Ordinance of Cumberland County dated March 21, 2016, and in Section 153A-372 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the amount of the foregoing assessment be, and hereby does constitute, a lien against the real property upon which such costs were incurred, such property being more particularly described as follows:

The structure and premises located at $\underline{2771}$ Clinton Road, Fayetteville, NC, as described in Deed Book $\underline{8620}$, page $\underline{0499}$, of the Cumberland County Registry and identified in County tax records as PIN 0456-48-6704.

- (3) That as further provided in Section 160A-443(6) of the General Statutes of North Carolina, such lien shall be filed, have the same priority, and be collected as the lien for special assessment provided in Article 10 of Chapter 160A of said General Statutes;
- (4) That one copy of this resolution be filed in the minutes of this Board of County Commissioners and another copy certified and delivered by the Clerk as a charge to the Tax Collector, who shall thereupon enter the amount of the assessment set forth above upon the Tax Books of the County as a special assessment against the above described property.

General Fund 101

1) Sheriff's Office - Budget Ordinance Amendment B170254 to recognize insurance settlement in the amount of \$3,801 from Travelers

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B170254 in the amount of \$3,801 from Travelers for the FL213 2006 Ford Crown Victoria. This settlement is for a vehicle submerged as a result of the rain event on September 29, 2016, not Hurricane Matthew.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

2) Sheriff's Office - Budget Ordinance Amendment B170255 to recognize insurance settlement in the amount of \$2,370 from Travelers

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B170255 in the amount of \$2,370 from Travelers for the 1988 FL501 School Bus. This settlement is for a vehicle submerged in the flood waters of Hurricane Matthew while parked in the parking lot of the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office Training Center.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

3) Library - Budget Ordinance Amendment B170165 to recognize a Storytelling Grant in the amount of \$4,000

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B170165 in the amount of \$4,000. The library has been awarded a Storytelling Festival Grant from the Arts Council.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

4) Library - Budget Ordinance Amendment B170166 to recognize an EZ Literacy and Lifelong Learning Grant of \$45,656 with a \$12,500 match of E-Rate funds

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B170166. The library has been awarded an EZ Literacy and Lifelong Learning Grant from the State Library of North Carolina in the amount of \$45,656 with a \$12,500 match that will utilize E-Rate funds. This money will be used to purchase furniture, shelving, iPads, and interactive literacy-based activities for Early Literacy Family Center's at all eight library locations.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

5) Health - Budget Ordinance Amendment B170265 to increase the Dentist III position with benefits above budget in the amount of \$27,292

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B170265 in the amount of \$27,292. The Health Director is requesting to hire this position above the budgeted salary due to difficulties filling the position since June 10, 2016. It is projected that Medicaid fees earned by having a permanent fulltime dentist will offset the increase in additional salary with benefits.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

6) Emergency Services Grants - Budget Ordinance Amendment B171130 to recognize donated funds of \$37,080 from the Fire Chief's Association

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B171130 in the amount of \$37,080 for funds from the Fire Chief's Association. The funds are to be used for an addendum to the Sunguard Maintenance Contract for Computer Added Dispatch (CAD). 8) Inmate Welfare Fund - Budget Ordinance Amendment B170070 to allocate \$210,000 of fund balance

Telephone commissions are no longer available from the telephone provider to the Inmate Welfare Fund. However, the vendor will update and maintain inmate visitation equipment. Therefore, budgeted revenue needs to be reduced and fund balance appropriated as an offset to this reduction. Additionally, funds are requested to upgrade cameras in the inmate pods in the amount of \$65,000. Cameras will be purchased via state contract and tested prior to purchase to ensure needs of the Detention Center are met. This revision also seeks to reallocate salaries into the correct lines relating to the stipend.

Although the request is not entirely consistent with the South Central Land Use Plan which calls for "farmland," the requested district would restrict development to approximately one acre lots where soil conditions are suitable for septic systems.

The staff recommends the board further find that approval of this rezoning is reasonable and in the public interest because the district requested for the subject property meets or exceeds the location criteria of the adopted Land Use Policies Plan, in that: *individual well and septic systems* are allowed, public water and sewer is not available; *could be located in any defined critical area* as defined by the <u>Fort Bragg Small Study Area</u>; desirable to not be located in an area that is a prime industrial site and may be outside the Sewer Service Area.




The Planning and Inspections Staff recommends the board approve Case No. P16-36 for R40 Residential, in addition to the information above, based on the following:

The R40 Residential district will allow for land uses and lot sizes that exist in the general
area.

The staff's preference would be that any potential development be served by public water; however, public water is not yet available at this location. It should be noted that increased development served by well water runs the risk of exacerbating water quality and availability issues that exist in the general vicinity of Gray's Creek. The A1A district could also be considered suitable at this location.



No one attended the Hearing. It was ordered that the structure be repaired to a minimum standard for human habitation, or be demolished and the debris removed from the premises by a date not later than 11/1/2016. The property owners and parties of interest were notified of the appeal procedures when they were served with the Findings of Fact and Order. (See Exhibit A for Findings of Fact and Order.) 

BACKGROUND: N.C. General Statute 105-317(b)(1) requires that uniform schedules of values, standards, and rules be prepared for each revaluation of real property, one for appraising property at market value and one for appraising agricultural, horticultural, and forest land at its present-use value. Paragraph (c) requires the values, standards and rules required by subdivision (b)(1) shall be reviewed and approved by the Board of County Commissioners before January 1 of the year they are applied. Before the Board gives final approval, certain notices must be published and the public must be given an opportunity to comment on the proposed schedule of values. The schedule of values was presented to the Board of County Commissioners and made available to the public at the November 7, 2016 Commissioner's meeting. On Tuesday, November 8, 2016, an ad was placed in the Fayetteville Observer providing notification that the schedule of values was available for public inspection in the Tax Administrator's office. In the same ad, notification was made that a public hearing concerning the schedule of values would be held at the regularly scheduled Commissioner's meeting at 6:45 pm on November 21, 2016. The statutes also require the Board of County Commissioners wait at least seven (7) days after the public hearing before adopting the schedules.

Once the Board of County Commissioners adopts the schedule of values, the statutes further provide that notice of the adoption and the appeals process for appealing the adoption must be published at least four (4) consecutive weeks and a period of 30 days be given to appeal to the North Carolina Property Tax Commission. The Board will be asked to adopt the schedule of values at their December 19, 2016 meeting. If no appeals are made to the Property Tax Commission the schedules become final on January 19, 2017.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board is requested to hold a public hearing, giving the public opportunity to comment on the proposed schedule of values to be used in the 2017 revaluation of property.


Eligible applicants of the Appalachian Program will have additional funding available for capital projects, limited to items such as computers, tablets, scheduling software, automated passenger counting systems, and other technology related items. Systems must ensure compliance with technology policies set by The Institute for Transportation Research and Education (ITRE). Vehicles, furniture, facility projects, and other capital items are not eligible expenses.

There will be a separate Consolidated Capital Call for Projects for all capital projects.

Grant applications are located on the PTD website, <u>connecting partners</u>, for review beginning **August 29, 2016**. Applications must be transmitted through the online Partner Connect Grants System no later than 11:59 pm, EST, Friday **November 4, 2016**. **Partner Connect will close Friday November 11, 2016** and no applications will be accepted after this date.

For the FY2018 Call for Projects, an interim funding allocation formula will be used. The interim funding formula for Fiscal Year 2017 provides 1) a base level of \$30,000 for each county in the 5311-funded transit system's service area, and 2) allocates the remaining funds based on the amount of funds that were generated by each transit system. The remaining funds are distributed based on the FTA Apportionment formula which is how FTA determines the apportionment to each state. If the formula amount apportioned to a transit system was below FY 2017 totals, state or other federal funds were added to equal the FY2017 total. If you were above the amount, you will receive a slight increase. This interim funding formula will allow for future incorporation of to-be-defined performance criteria.

BACKGROUND:

The Cumberland County Community Development 2016 Annual Action Plan was submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on May 13, 2016. The Plan allocated the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program and HOME Investment Partnership Act (HOME) funds and other competitive funding awarded in accordance to the Consolidated Plan.

As you are aware, due to the recent devastation caused by Hurricane Matthew, Cumberland County was included in the notice of the Presidential declaration of a major disaster for the State of North Carolina. U.S. Department of HUD has determined that grantees may utilize existing grant funds to address damage in a Presidentially-declared disaster area. It is proposed to amend the 2016 Annual Action Plan to expand our current housing rehabilitation project to include disaster recovery housing repair grant funds to address unmet needs for homeowners in our jurisdiction that are below 80% of the area median income (AMI). Staff proposes that \$300,000 of existing housing rehabilitation funds be specifically earmarked for disaster recovery housing repairs. This program would provide grant funds for disaster recovery housing repairs up to \$10,000 per eligible homeowner. This activity is consistent with our 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan priorities, goals and objectives that include increasing the availability and accessibility of decent, safe and affordable housing.

As part of the citizen participation process, a 7-day public review and comment period is required. An advertisement has been scheduled to run in the local newspaper from November 11 and ending on November 17, 2016 in order to let the public know that the proposed amendment will be available for review at several public locations throughout the County and posted on the County's Community Development website.

RECOMMENDATION AND PROPOSED ACTION:

The Community Development Director and County Management request that the Board of County Commissioners:

- 1. Hold a public hearing on the Substantial Amendment to the 2016 Annual Action Plan.
- 2. Approve the Substantial Amendment to 2016 Annual Action Plan and Submit to HUD.

The Plan allocated the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program and HOME Investment Partnership Act (HOME) funds and other competitive funding awarded in accordance to the Consolidated Plan.

The proposed amendment for the 2016 Annual Action Plan entitled CDBG Disaster Recovery Housing Repair Grant Program and HOME Disaster Recovery Housing Repair Grant Program. Previously budgeted unused CDBG and HOME Housing funds totaling \$300,000 will be reprogrammed and identified for the Disaster Recovery Housing Repair Grant Program for homeowners.

REHABILITATION PROGRAM PENDING FORMAL CONFIRMATION FROM

HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HUD)

BACKGROUND:

Expansion of the Cumberland County Community Development's housing rehabilitation program includes providing disaster aid to those that are eligible as a part of the Amended 2016 Annual Action Plan. This aid would provide for housing repairs to address unmet needs of homeowners at or below 80% of the area median income. This program is specifically designed to address unmet needs of homeowners that require housing renovation as a direct result of Hurricane Matthew in our jurisdiction once insurance and FEMA assistance has been applied. Staff has proposed utilizing \$300,000 of existing housing rehabilitation CDBG and HOME funds for disaster recovery purposes by providing grant funds for disaster recovery housing repairs up to \$10,000 per eligible homeowner.

Prior to the plan amendment, the maximum amount of a single grant for emergency repairs/housing rehabilitation was \$7,500. Staff recommends increasing the maximum per applicant to \$10,000. The reason for this change is twofold: 1) according to our most recent housing needs assessment, housing rehabilitation is still much needed by many low-income residents of Cumberland County, and 2) the cost of completing home repairs has increased over time.

We believe that the changes proposed above will assist low-income residents with disaster recovery repairs as well as homeowners with non-disaster-related repairs.

RECOMMENDATION AND PROPOSED ACTION:

The Community Development Director and County Management request that the Board of County Commissioners:

- 1. Approve increasing the minor repair housing grant limit up to \$10,000
- Approval of a disaster recovery housing repair grant limit up to \$10,000

Applications are to be taken but will not be fully processed, and funds will not be committed, until formal confirmation of approval from HUD has been received in order to help reduce potential delays to disaster aid applicants.

BACKGROUND:

Charles H Gardner, Attorney at Law, represents Grays Creek Properties, LLC, in a request to move three graves in a private cemetery pursuant to G.S. § 65-106. He has provided the complete details of this request in his letter to the Board of Commissioners dated November 7, 2016, which is attached to this memo. Mr. Gardner has also provided a copy of the statute governing this process, a drawing of the location of the private cemetery, an order confirmation for the publication of notice pursuant to the statute, a contract between his client and the heirs of two of the three persons buried in the private cemetery, and copies of the return receipts for notice he provided to fifteen persons who are possibly the next of kin of to the third person buried in the private cemetery.

The last person to be buried in the private cemetery was buried in 2007 after Grays Creek Properties, LLC, had acquired the property on which the cemetery is located. Grays Creek Properties, LLC, allowed the heirs to bury their father in the cemetery where his wife was buried in 1999. The heirs agreed in 2007 to allow Grays Creek Properties, LLC, to move and relocate the graves of their father and mother in the future. The only other person buried in the cemetery was buried in 1887. Mr. Gardner has conducted due diligence to hire a professional genealogist to determine the potential next of kin of that decedent. Those are the fifteen persons to whom notice was given by certified mail for which the return receipts are attached.

Based on the documentation provided by Mr. Gardner, it appears his client, Grays Creek Properties, LLC, has complied with the statutory requirements to move these graves to another suitable cemetery. The Health Director has agreed that he, or his designee, will direct and supervise the disinterment, removal and reinterment of these graves.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

County attorney recommends that the Board approve this request subject to the property owner coordinating with the Health Director for the Health Director, or his designee, to direct and supervise the disinterment, removal and reinterment of these graves to a suitable cemetery; complying with the requirements of G.S. § 65-106 for filing a written certificate with the register of deeds; removing, protecting and replacing all tombstones or markers; and being responsible for all costs arising out of this process.

Dear Mr. Chairman, Mr. Vice Chariman, Esteemed Commissioners, Mrs. Cannon and Attorney Moorefield,

My client, Grays Creek Properties, LLC, owns a large tract of land in Grays Creek Township, Cumberland County (Parcel ID No: 0339-67-3814) and is seeking the Board's permission to disinter, move and reinter three (3) graves of deceased persons currently buried in a small, private cemetery located on said tract. The site of reinterment shall be Adams Cemetery on Shipman Road in Hope Mills, North Carolina or other suitable cemetery as allowed by the statute. My client is respectful of and will give consideration to the wishes of the next of kin of the deceased regarding the site of reinterment. The names of the deceased are Lonnie F. Tew (1939-2007), Hilda Faye Tew (1943-1999), and Egbert N. Beard (1830-1887). North Carolina General Statutes § 65-106 subsection (g) states such act shall be made under the Board's supervision and direction. I, on behalf of my client, humbly ask that this request be brought before the Board for its consideration at the November 21st meeting. If approved by the Board, the disinterment and reinterment will not occur until on or after December 9, 2016, but before December 31, 2016.

My client is seeking the Board's approval for said matter because the tract of land is leased to a long-term tenant, Innovative Solar 42, LLC. The tenant is currently constructing a solar farm and desires that the graves be relocated off the entire tract so more solar panels can be installed on the property, thus increasing the renewable energy output. The tenant also wishes to limit access to the property as a safety and security precaution. They intend on erecting a security gate around the entire perimeter of the property, which would prove difficult for anyone wishing to visit the graves as they are currently located.

I have enclosed a copy of the pertinent statute for your collective reference and intend through this letter to show evidence of my client's adherence to the statutory requirements, namely sections (a)(4) and

(b), which prescribe requirements to be met prior to the disinterment. My client will also adhere to sections (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g) of the statute.

§ 65-106(a)(4) Who may disinter, move and reinter;

My client exists as a Limited Liability Company, organized under the laws of the State of North Carolina, and owns the tract of land upon which the graves are located pursuant to that certain General Warranty Deed recorded in Book 7435, Page 787, Cumberland County Registry, North Carolina.

§ 65-106(b) Notice;

Tew, Lonnie F. and Hilda Faye - On June 22, 2007, in exchange for allowing the remains of Lonnie F. Tew to be buried on my client's property, my client executed a contract with the living issue of Lonnie F. Tew and Hilda Faye Tew stating that my client may in the future move and relocate the bodies of both Lonnie F. and Hilda Faye Tew. A copy of this contract is enclosed. Further, I have sent written notice using Certified Mail, postage prepaid to each of said issue along with another person believed to be next of kin. The letters were delivered to and postmarked by the US Postal Service on November 7, 2016. Copies of said letters and the postmarked receipts are enclosed.

Beard, Egbert N. - No next of kin to Egbert N. Beard were known so I, on my client's behalf, hired a professional genealogist, Carolyn Gibbons to ascertain said next of kin. I located Ms. Gibbons by searching the Association of Professional Genealogists' website: www.apgen.org. Ms. Gibbons is the only member of said association located in our area. After an extensive search (Mr. Beard died in 1887), she produced a genealogy report naming what she believed to be the next of kin of the late Mr. Beard. I believe that this report, coupled with my own extensive research of death certificates, birth certificates, marriage certificates, land conveyances and property tax records, satisfies the "reasonable search and inquiry" element of this subsection. I have sent written notice using Certified Mail, postage prepaid to each next of kin. The letters were delivered to and postmarked by the US Postal Service on November 7, 2016. Copies of said letters and the postmarked receipts are enclosed.

Publication - A legal notice of the disinterment and reinterment is being published in the Fayetteville Observer. The first publication of the notice was on November 4, 2016 and is scheduled to run on November 11, 2016, November 18, 2016, and November 25, 2016, thus satisfying the requirement for said notice to be published once a week for four consecutive weeks. A copy of the receipt for said publication is enclosed.

Thank you all for your consideration of this matter. I eagerly await your response.

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§ 65-106. Removal of graves; who may disinter, move, and reinter; notice; certificate filed; reinterment expenses; due care required.

- (a) The State of North Carolina and any of its agencies, public institutions, or political subdivisions, the United States of America or any agency thereof, any church, electric power or lighting company, or any person, firm, or corporation may effect the disinterment, removal, and reinterment of graves as follows:
 - (1) By the State of North Carolina or any of its agencies, public institutions, or political subdivisions, the United States of America or any agency thereof, when it shall determine and certify to the board of county commissioners in the county from which the bodies are to be disinterred that such removal is reasonably necessary to perform its governmental functions and the duties delegated to it by law.
 - (2) By any church authority in order to erect a new church, parish house, parsonage, or any other facility owned and operated exclusively by such church; in order to expand or enlarge an existing church facility; or better to care for and maintain graves not located in a regular cemetery for which such church has assumed responsibility of care and custody.
 - (3) By an electric power or lighting company when it owns land on which graves are located, and the land is to be used as a reservoir.
 - (4) By any person, firm, or corporation who owns land on which an abandoned cemetery is located after first securing the consent of the governing body of the municipality or county in which the abandoned cemetery is located.
- (b) The party effecting the disinterment, removal, and reinterment of a grave containing a decedent's remains under the provisions of this Part shall, before disinterment, give 30 days' written notice of such intention to the next of kin of the decedent, if known or subject to being ascertained by reasonable search and inquiry, and shall cause notice of such disinterment, removal, and reinterment to be published at least once per week for four successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where such grave is located, and the first publication shall be not less than 30 days before disinterment. Any remains disinterred and removed hereunder shall be reinterred in a suitable cemetery.
- (c) The party removing or causing the removal of all such graves shall, within 30 days after completion of the removal and reinterment, file with the register of deeds of the county from which the graves were removed and with the register of deeds of the county in which reinterment is made, a written certificate of the removal facts. Such certificate shall contain the full name, if known or reasonably ascertainable, of each decedent whose grave is moved, a precise description of the site from which such grave was removed, a precise description of the site and specific location where the decedent's remains have been reinterred, the full and correct name of the party effecting the removal, and a brief description of the statutory basis or bases upon which such removal or reinterment was effected. If the full name of any decedent cannot reasonably be ascertained, the removing party shall set forth all additional reasonably ascertainable facts about the decedent including birth date, death date, and family name.

The fee for recording instruments in general, as provided in G.S. 161-10(a)(1), for registering a certificate of removal facts shall be paid to the register of deeds of each county in which such certificate is filed for registration.

(d) All expenses of disinterment, removal, and acquisition of the new burial site and reinterment shall be borne by the party effecting such disinterment, removal, and reinterment, including the actual reasonable expense of one of the next of kin incurred in attending the same, not to exceed the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00).



- (e) The Office of Vital Records of North Carolina shall promulgate regulations affecting the registration and indexing of the written certificate of the removal facts, including the form of that certificate.
- (f) The party effecting the disinterment, removal, and reinterment of a decedent's remains under the provisions of this Part shall ensure that the site in which reinterment is accomplished shall be of such suitable dimensions to accommodate the remains of that decedent only and that such site shall be reasonably accessible to all relatives of that decedent, provided that the remains may be reinterred in a common grave where written consent is obtained from the next of kin. If under the authority of this Part, disinterment, removal, and reinterment are effected by the State of North Carolina or any of its agencies, public institutions, or political subdivisions, the United States of America or any agency thereof, any electric power or lighting company, then such disinterment, removal, and reinterment shall be performed by a funeral director duly licensed as a "funeral director" or a "funeral service licensee" under the provisions of Article 13A of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.
- (g) All disinterment, removal, and reinterment under the provisions of this Part shall be made under the supervision and direction of the county board of commissioners or other appropriate official, including the local health director, appointed by such board for the county where the disinterment, removal, and reinterment take place. If reinterment is effected in a county different from the county of disinterment with the consent of the next of kin of the deceased whose remains are disinterred, then the disinterment and removal shall be made under the supervision and direction of the county board of commissioners or other appropriate official, including the local health director, appointed by such board for the county of the county board of commissioners or other appropriate official, including the local health director, appointed by such board for the county of reinterment.

Due care shall be taken to do said work in a proper and decent manner, and, if necessary, to furnish suitable coffins or boxes for reinterring such remains. Due care shall also be taken to remove, protect, and replace all tombstones or other markers, so as to leave such tombstones or other markers in as good condition as that prior to disinterment. Provided that in cases where the remains are to be moved to a perpetual care cemetery or other cemetery where upright tombstones are not permitted, a suitable replacement marker shall be provided.

(h) Nothing contained in this Part shall be construed to grant or confer the power or authority of eminent domain, or to impair the right of the next of kin of a decedent to remove or cause the removal, at his or their expense, of the remains or grave of such decedent. (1919, c. 245; C.S., ss. 5030, 5030(a); Ex. Sess. 1920, c. 46; 1927, c. 23, s. 1; c. 175, s. 1; 1937, c. 3; 1947, cc. 168, 576; 1961, c. 457; 1963, c. 915, s. 1; 1965, c. 71; 1971, c. 797, s. 1; 1977, c. 311, s. 1; 2001-390, s. 3; 2007-118, s. 1.)

BACKGROUND

Due to flooding associated with Hurricane Matthew and the catastrophic damage that resulted, Cumberland County solicited two separate requests for proposals (RFP's) to address debris-related issues: one for debris management and monitoring, and another for debris clearance and removal. In order to be eligible for federal disaster reimbursement, and to assure adequate project oversight and accountability, the County had to seek separate contractors in each area. The services being sought in each RFP included, but were not limited to, the following:

Management & Monitoring:

- Coordinating daily briefings, work progress, staffing, and other key items with the County.
- Scheduling work for all team members and debris haulers/recover contractors on a daily basis.
- Hiring, scheduling, and managing field staff.
- Monitoring debris hauler/recovery contractor operations and making/implementing recommendations to improve efficiency and speed up recovery work.
- Assisting the County with response to public concerns and comments.
- Certifying contractor vehicles for debris removal using methodology and documentation practices appropriate for contract monitoring and complying with FEMA regulations.
- Entering load tickets into a database application.
- Digitization of source documentation such as load tickets.
- Developing daily operational reports to keep the County informed of work progress.
- Comprehensive review, reconciliation, and validation of debris removal contractor(s) invoices prior to submission to the County for processing.
- Project and report preparation required for reimbursement by FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency), FHWA (Federal Highway Administration) and any other applicable agency

for disaster recovery efforts by County staff and designated debris removal contractors.

Final report and appeal preparation and assistance.

Clearance & Removal:

- Examining debris to determine whether or not debris is eligible, burnable or non-burnable.
- Loading the debris.
- Hauling the debris to an approved disposal facility.
- Dumping the debris at the dumpsite or landfill. This includes, but is not limited to vegetative debris and construction and demolition (C&D) debris.
- Reducing the debris as appropriate.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

Due to our disaster recovery consultant just arriving on-site Tuesday the 15th, staff needs more time to work with the consultant to make sure our selection process was complete and accurate as we are still vetting the proposers. Staff will prepare and bring forward more detailed information regarding the successful proposers in each category at the Board of Commissioner's meeting.
