The building will house the State Probation Offices and the County's Day Reporting Center. Square Footage: 25,600. Estimated Project Cost: \$2.4 million. Number of people to be housed: 64. The County is applying for \$569,531 to complete construction of the project. The County has already received \$450,000 for the project. The building and the addition will be divided into two sections; (1) Probation Offices; (2) Day Reporting Center. They will be able to communicate with each other via computers. There will be 130 feet of expansion space towards William Street. Once the project is complete the State will pay rent to the county to house the Probation Offices.
