A. Approval of Bond Order authorizing further general obligation refunding bonds to reduce interest expense and resolution providing for public hearing on bond order for \$23,000,000 general obligation

refunding bonds and publication of bond order and notice of hearing and other action.

Commissioner Blackwell introduced a bond order, the title of which is as follows and was read:

BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2004B OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY IN A MAXIMUM AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$23,000,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF REFUNDING, IN PART, CERTAIN MATURITIES OF THE COUNTY'S GENERAL OBLIGATION SCHOOL BONDS, SERIES, 2000

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County (the "Board") has decided to pursue the issuance of general obligation refunding bonds in a maximum aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$23,000,000 under the Local Government Bond Act (the "Act") to refund, in part, certain maturities of the Cumberland County General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2000; and

WHEREAS, the Board has filed an application with the Local Government Commission of North Carolina of approval of such bonds as required by the Act.

BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR THE COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND:

- (1) It is hereby determined necessary and expedient for Cumberland County to borrow money, and there are hereby authorized to be issued general obligation refunding bonds of Cumberland County for the purpose of providing money to refund, in part, certain maturities of the Cumberland County General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2000.
- (2) The bonds shall be in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$23,000,000.
- (3) The bonds shall be general obligations of Cumberland County for the payment of principal and interest on which its full faith and credit shall be irrevocably pledged and taxes will be levied in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds.
- (4) A sworn statement of debt has been filed with the Clerk to the Boad pursuant to GS 159-55 and is open to public inspection.
- (5) This Bond Order will take effect 30 days after its publication following adoption.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON BOND ORDER \$23,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS AND PUBLICATION OF BOND ORDER AND NOTICE OF HEARING AND OTHER ACTION

WHEREAS, there has been introduced to the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County a Bond Order entitled "BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2004B OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY IN A MAXIMUM AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$23,000,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF REFUINDING, IN PART, CERTAIN MATURITIES OF THE COUNTY'S GENERAL OBLIGATION SCHOOL BONDS, SERIES 2000; and

WHEREAS, GS 159-54 provides there shall be a public hearing on the Bond Order and GS 159-56 provides for publication of the Bond Order and notice of the hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Cumberland, meeting in regular session in Fayetteville, North Carolina, on October 4, 2004, does the following:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR THE COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND:

(1) A public hearing on the Bond Order shall be held at 7:00PM in the Board Meeting Room in the Cumberland County Courthouse, Fayetteville, North Carolina on October 18, 2004.

- (2) The Clerk to the Board of Commissioners shall cause the Bond Order, with a statement appended in form described by GS 159-56 to be published in The Eayetteville Observer.
- (3) The County Finance Officer is hereby designated to file the statement of debt required by GS 159-55.
- (4) The completed form of application to the Local Government Commission with respect to the proposed Bonds is hereby approved.
 - (5) This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

E. Approval of Architectural Agreement for Public Health Department Needs Assessment.

BACKGROUND: The Facilities Committee of the Board of Health was tasked with procuring architectural services to assist the Health Department with assessing the physical and operational conditions of the department. A Request for Qualifications was sent to local architectural firms and other firms with known experience in the public health field. Three firms were shortlisted and presentations made to the Health Department Facilities Committee. The firm of Calloway, Johnson, Moore & West was selected by the committee and also approved by the Board of Health.

WHEREAS, the United States Air Force Band and Singing Sergeants will be in concert on October 20, 2004, 7:00PM at Reeves Auditorium on the campus of Methodist College; and

WHEREAS, the Band has been performing and has an outstanding record of achievement for more than 60~years; and

WHEREAS, the Band is known as "America's International Musical Ambassadors" and has toured the People's Republic of China in 1987 and Moscow in 1995; and

WHEREAS, the Band has made more than 25 international concert tours with performances in more than 50 counties and 42 world capitals; and

WHEREAS, the Singing Sergeants perform a wide range of musical repertoire including opera, traditional and contemporary choral literature, oratorio, folk songs, pop standards and musical theatre and jazz with emphasis on the choral music of America; and

- Comprehensive Planning Projects: Cumberland County/Hope Mills PARTF Grant, County Landscape Ordinance, Hazard Mitigation Plan, Military compatible Land Use Plan, Northeast Cumberland (Falcon-Godwin) Land Use Plan, Oversee PARTF Grant for Wade and Stedman, Spring Lake Streetscape Enhancement Grant; Spring Lake Appearance & Landscape Ordinance; Stedman Streetscape Enrichment Grant; Stedman Pedestrian

Plan; Wade Area Detailed Land Use Plan; Wade, Falcon, Godwin, Stedman and Linden Technical Assistance;
