E. Approval of the Cumberland County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council Contracts Representing Funding Allocations for July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008.

BACKGROUND: Cumberland County is projected to receive \$940,867 in state dollars for fiscal year 2007-08. Local matching funds are required in order to receive the state funds. The Match will be \$211,684. The CCJCPC has developed its plan for FY07-08 and requests approval of the Board of Commissioners.

ACTION: Approve the Plan.

F. Approval of Settlement Agreement in Kagan v. Mosley.

BACKGROUND: This lawsuit was filed by the Plaintiff against, among others, the Sheriff's Office and Deputy L. Christian, alleging failure of a state law duty to provide adequate medical care to the plaintiff when he was detained in the Cumberland County Detention Center. Plaintiff was removed from a Greyhound Bus traveling from New York City to Miami by the Fayetteville City Police at the request of personnel in Greyhound's Fayetteville bus terminal, who alleged he was either drunk or otherwise acting in a disruptive manner. While being removed from the bus and placed in a Fayetteville Police Department vehicle, Plaintiff scuffled with the officer and fell over a curb while handcuffed. Plaintiff was processed that night into the Cumberland County Detention Center. In the morning he requested medical care and was referred to Highsmith

Rainey Hospital where it was determined that among other injuries he had a broken collar bone. While the Sheriff's Office vigorously denies that it has any legal liability to the Plaintiff, the costs of continued defense of this action would likely exceed \$75,000, while any conceivable recovery against the Sheriff's Office would, because of the defense of sovereign immunity, be limited to the amount of the Sheriff's Bond, \$25,000. The Board of Commissioners has authorized settlement of this action in the amount of \$25,000. Plaintiff and his counsel have signed the settlement agreement and Plaintiff has signed a comprehensive release and waiver of all claims.

ACTION: Authorize the County Attorney to sign the settlement agreement with no admission of liability.

BACKGROUND: On October 26, 2005, the County acquired by tax foreclosure the above noted property. The amount currently owed on the foreclosure judgment including interest and cost for the property is \$4,737.07. Syeda Chowdhury Gainey, the last and highest bidder, bid \$9,900 for the property and deposited \$990 with the County Finance Department. The tax value of the property is \$22,200. This property is surplus to the needs of the county.
