1. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Chairman Keefe called the meeting to order and introduced Commissioners Council and Evans. Chairman Keefe thanked everyone for coming to the session and reviewed the agenda for the meeting.

Chairman Keefe thanked board and commission members for serving their county government and being a voice for their fellow citizens. Chairman Keefe advised there are various types of boards such as the Social Services Board, the Board of Health and the Library Board of Trustees that hire and evaluate their director. Chairman Keefe also advised there are joint city and county boards, and boards that function in a quasi-judicial capacity with powers resembling those of a court of law or judge. Chairman Keefe stated these boards, such as the Board of Adjustment, the Joint Planning Board, and the Minimum Housing Appeals Board make legal interpretations of statutes, ordinances and other local regulations and conditions.

Chairman Keefe reviewed what is expected of county board and commission members once they are appointed:

Attend the meetings

Make the time commitment

o Be informed and prepared

Read your agenda, visit the site, speak with those involved

o Give careful consideration to what is being brought before you

Every decision is going to affect someone

Ask questions!!!!

It is your responsibility as a board member.

o Make the best recommendation possible

Chairman Keefe pointed out that should a board member realize he or she is not the right fit for a particular board or commission after being appointed, they will not be disqualified from additional appointments if they resign.

COUNTY'S STRATEGIC PLAN

Sally Shutt, Public Information Director, provided a brief overview of the goals and objectives of the 2013-2014 Strategic Plan as approved by the board of commissioners at its April 15, 2013 meeting.
